What's Trump?

An impressive collection of trump indicators — decorative gadgets from the early days of the game that allowed players to “indicate” what the trump suit was on a given deal as a memory aid — is available for all players at the Boston NABC to enjoy. This display, entitled “What’s Trump?” is a treat for all players.

ACBL member Joan Schepps, whose 600-piece collection is on view in the Marriott Exhibit Hall on the third floor, has been a longtime enthusiast of the party-bridge artifacts. Many of the pieces date from the early 20th century, and all of them feature moving parts to indicate which of the four suits is trump, or if the contract is of the notrump variety.

Additionally, Schepps, along with husband Elihu Schepps, has donated the entire collection to

The Bostonians

I guess just about everyone is familiar with the Henry James novel *The Bostonians*. This bittersweet tragicomedy includes a wide panorama of political activists, newspaper people and quirky eccentrics – not unlike your average bridge tournament.



Back in 1999, the last time Boston played host to the Fall NABC, there were not quite so many visitors from overseas, but a few Brits had crossed the pond.

They were hoping to do well in the bridge events, but the city of Boston offered many

attractions – and it was well known thanks to its constant exposure on UK television.

There was *Cheers*, the classic series set in a Boston bar. (*Cheers*, located on Beacon Street across from the Public Garden, is open seven days a week from 11 a.m. Sports fans can catch their favorite teams on one of 10 Direct TVs).

Then there was *St. Elsewhere*, from the same company that produced the superior police drama *Hill Street Blues* and shared many of the innovative cinema verite techniques and edge of gritty realism that marked that as cutting edge drama.

Located in a rundown inner-city Boston neighborhood, St. Elsewhere was the derisive nickname given to St. Eligius Teaching Hospital, a once-great institution long since past its prime,

Welcome, players

IMP strategies

It was in algebra that we first learned the theorem: knockouts = masterpoints. If you want to win masterpoints, play knockouts.

In the bracketed knockouts, you are placed with 15 other teams of similar ability (measured by masterpoint holdings). If you make it through two rounds, there is a big payoff (translation: gold points).

Remember the name of the event, though – “knockout” means that if you lose you are out of the event.

If this is your first NABC, looking at the daily schedule can be confusing. We have teams, pairs – and what the heck is board-a-match? The scoring in these events is completely different, and so is the strategy.

For the most part, in pairs you receive one point for every pair sitting your direction that you beat. You get half a point for tying them. The scoring is called matchpoints, and at the end of the day, the pair with the most matchpoints wins.

In Swiss teams and knockouts, the scoring is by IMPs (international matchpoints). Look at the bottom of the convention card and you will see the IMP scale.

Let's say you bid 4♥, non-vulnerable, and make it for plus 420. The opponents at your teammates' table aren't nearly as astute and end up in 3♥, making four, for plus 170. That is a net gain of 250 for your side. You look at the scale and see that plus 250 is worth 6 IMPs.

At the end of the match, the IMP scores for both teams – plus and minus – are converted to victory points. Look at the convention card again and see the 20-point VP scale. Let's say your team won by 10 IMPs. Look at the scale and next to 8-10 is the distribution of victory points. Your team receives 14 VPs, the opponents 6.

Board-a-match is a team game that combines aspects of pairs and teams. You play as teams. You and your partner sit North-South at one table while your teammates move around the room as East-West.

You compare at the end and receive 1 point if you beat the opponents and half if you tie. Each

deal you play is like a match, and the margin of the difference doesn't matter. Scoring 10 points more on a deal gets the same 1 point as getting them for 1700.

IMP strategy

1. Bid the safest game. At matchpoints, you may get a markedly better score for playing in notrump instead of a major, or in a major instead of a minor. IMP scoring, however, neutralizes the differences between these contracts. Your best strategy is to choose your best (longest) trump fit and bid the game that's most likely to make, even if it's 5♣ instead of 3NT. At matchpoints, you would have to put a gun to my head to play five of a minor instead of 3NT (my partners have done that for other reasons), but in teams do it if it's safer.

If you're not vulnerable, don't stretch to bid a close game – the odds favor bidding only those games that you are reasonably sure will make.

If you're vulnerable, it pays to be a little more optimistic when you're considering a thin game. The IMP odds (your potential gain if the contract makes) favor bidding any game that has even a 40% chance of making.

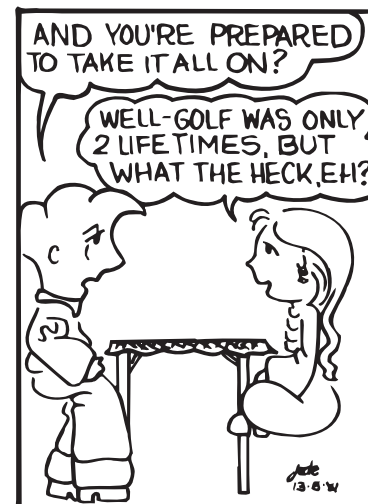
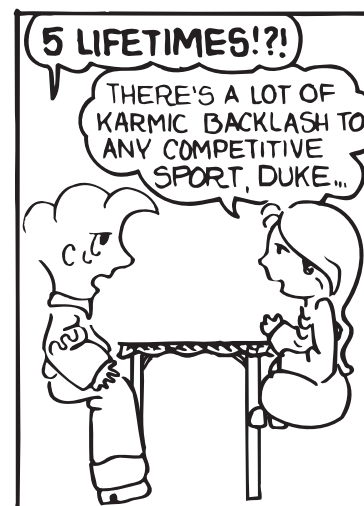
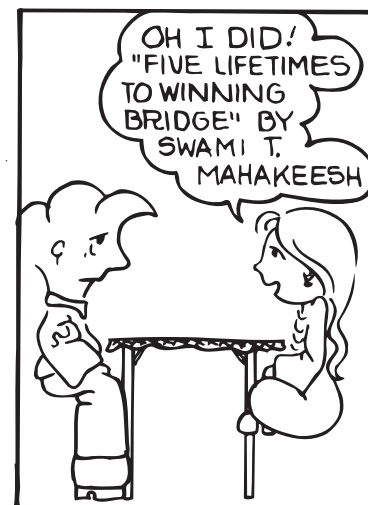
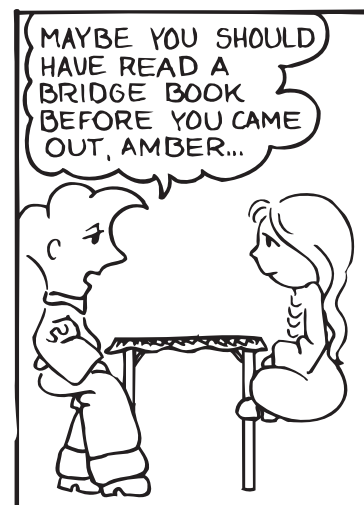
2. Look for the safest part score. Don't worry about searching for a few extra points by playing in notrump instead of a minor.

3. Matchpoint players often make light overcalls, but at IMPs they should be solid. At the one level, you should have a good suit, and at the two level a full opener and a good suit.

4. Don't be too bold in competing and balancing. Unless you have a good suit and good hand, let the opponents play in their low-level contracts, especially if you're vulnerable.

5. There's little to gain and much to lose by making a close penalty double, especially a part score.

6. In the play, when you're declarer, don't risk your contract trying to make an overtrick. Always choose the safest line of play to make your contract, even if it might cost you an

overtrick or two. An optimist sees the glass half full, a pessimist sees it half empty, and a bridge player playing teams sees it cracked with water running out the bottom. Expect the worst and play safe to make the contract. If you lose by 1 IMP, don't call me.

7. On opening lead, be cautious about trying for a swing with an unusual opening lead. In the long run, it's usually best to make your normal lead.

8. As a defender, be optimistic and fairly aggressive. If there's a layout of the cards that will result in a set, choose your leads and plays to cater to that possibility, even if it means you may give up an overtrick if you're wrong.

Opening lead: ♦A.

Bidding commentary: In the modern game, jump raises of opening bids or overcalls in competition (3♦) are preemptive. A cuebid is used to show strong supporting hands. As North, do not count for the ♦J, a secondary honor card in a suit that has been bid and supported. Even so, your hand is strong enough to bid 3♠ and South is strong enough to bid 4♠, attaching extra value to honors in partner's first bid suit. (♣QJ).

Defensive commentary: As East, when partner leads a winning card in a suit you have bid, and a suit in which you have strength, check dummy to determine whether you want a continuation or prefer a shift. If you want a shift, play your lowest card. Good partners can usually work out the "shift" suit. It is usually dummy's shorter side suit. You want a heart shift, so play the ♦2. If you get the shift, you can take two hearts and two diamonds and defeat the contract

one trick. If you don't ask for a shift and partner returns a diamond, you only get one heart trick as declarer can rattle off five spades and five clubs for 10 tricks.

items of interest to bridge players: bridge artifacts, works of art, literature, photographs, memorabilia and related materials which focus on the history of the game.

The sheer variety of the trump indicators is amazing. In one, a kitten's tail may be pointed to the club, diamond, heart, spade or "NT" symbol. In another, a witch's broomstick performs the same task. Ballerinas, devils and a host of other characters point and kick to help declarer remember the trump suit.

Other indicators feature a different design, where a rotating wheel allows the trump suit to be displayed through a "window" on the object. Schepps even has a funny story about such a design, one found on the pendant of a necklace she owns. Once, while playing in a tournament, Schepps was wearing the pendant with the heart symbol exposed, and on a particular deal, she and her partner bid to 4♥. An overly suspicious opponent, who noticed the necklace during the auction, called the director to object! (Schepps removed the necklace to avoid any appearance of impropriety.)

Many famous cartoon characters of the Twenties and Thirties are also featured in the collection, including Mickey Mouse and Betty Boop.

which serves the urgent medical needs of the inhabitants of an area that is in the same predicament.

Hill Street Blues was set in an unnamed Eastern City, but I always assumed it was Boston and the show featured one great line that every bridge player should take to heart at the start of an event – "Let's be careful out there."

My motley crew was led by The Rabbi – Leonard Helman, and much to our surprise (I had to change my flight home twice and spent one night sleeping on a sofa in the Daily Bulletin office) we made it all the way to the final of the Reisinger Board-a-Match Teams.

Just in case you don't know the Rabbi's Rule, this reprise from the 1999 Bulletins, reported by Phillip Alder, will enlighten you:

North thought about bidding 3NT, which probably would have been a success. On a club lead, declarer has no choice but to lay down the ♠A, with gratifying results for our side.

I am not a fan of weak jump shifts – in competition or otherwise – but it facilitated the auction here. Against 4♠ West led the ♣Q for the king, ace and 9.

East cashed the ♣10, then continued with the ♦A followed by the ♦Q.

The declarer, Rabbi Helman, used the Rabbi's Rule to land his contract. Winning with the ♦K, he continued with the ♠J, rising with dummy's ace when West played low.

A priori, this is only a 13% shot, but East's two-level vulnerable overcall increased the odds.

The Reisinger was won by a team that included two prominent Englanders – Tony Forrester and Andrew Robson, aided by Rita Shugart and a "promising" Norwegian, Geir Helgemo (they had won the previous year!).

Having risen to second place after the first quarter, we gradually fell away, but we had the

consolation of being on the right side of the most spectacular deal of the final:

The vugraph commentators were having a ball with this one. It appears that East-West can make a small slam in either major. But what about North-South?

Where are the losers if North-South play in diamonds? The only loser is a heart, so 6♦ is cold.

But let's look at those East-West slams again. It appears that 6♠ is fine as long as declarer doesn't cash the ♠K first. But what about 6♥? If North leads a club to South's singleton ace, and South finds the spade switch North can ruff, and if he leads a second club, South gets a ruff to inflict a two-trick defeat.

The result on vugraph was as prosaic as the commentators were poetic. Both East-West pairs got to 6♥, and neither North-South found the killing defense.

But at our table the defenders followed the maximum line.

Drew Casen got off to the club lead, and Lee Rautenberg found the spade switch, which Casen ruffed and in turn led a club that was ruffed, so that was a two-trick set.

This is what happened when Augie Boehm and Richard Margolis held the North-South cards.

Rabbi Richard Margolis produced a brilliant bid at his second turn which would have seen his partnership match the result at the other table. However, when East decided to play for penalties North-South recorded plus 1540, more than sufficient for Boehm and Co. to win the board.

If you can come up with something even half as spectacular, make sure you bring it to the attention of the Daily Bulletin!

West leads the ♦6. Do you see a way to make 12 tricks? Think about it before reading on (hint: trumps are not 4-0).

Twelve tricks are available if you can find one of your opponents with the ♥A or ♥K singleton.

Win the diamond lead in either hand, pull trumps in two or three rounds, then cash all your minor-suit winners before exiting with a low heart from hand.

If either opponent has a singleton high honor, he will be forced to give you a ruff-sluff for your contract.

If trumps are 3-1, the contract can still be defeated if East has the singleton spade and the singleton heart honor. When you play the second or third round of trumps, East will have a chance for a brilliant play, discarding his singleton heart honor. West will then be poised over your ♥Q 8 with the A-J or K-J to defeat your slam.

The deal came from the first round of the Senior Knockout Teams, but it was not exactly as depicted above when played by England's Mark Horton.

This was the actual deal, with North holding the ♠J rather than the queen. On the lie of the cards, however, the slam could have been made as long as West didn't start with a heart.

Horton received the lead of the ♦6. Had he guessed the spade position, he could have made the slam on the line already stated. Horton, however, played the ♠K and a spade to the ace. At that point, he was playing for one down, and he achieved it by cashing his minor-suit winners and exiting with a low heart. East won the singleton ♥A, cashed the ♠Q and then had to give Horton a ruff-sluff with a diamond.

Fortunately for the team, the board was a push because Horton's teammates (Jan van Cleeff and David Kendrick) defeated 5♠ one trick.

In the post mortem, Horton said he nearly took the spade finesse because he could see that it was necessary for one opponent to have a singleton heart honor, making it slightly more likely that the same hand would have length in trumps. The unhelpful diamond lead, however, left declarer on a complete guess as to which way to finesse if he decided to do so.

Magic tricks

Zia Mahmood has a well-deserved reputation for manufacturing tricks, seemingly from thin air. In this deal from the first qualifying session of the Nail Life Master Open Pairs, he sowed a little confusion and reaped a bushel full of matchpoints. His partner was Bob Hamman.

West started with a low diamond, not much of a risk considering dummy figured to have a lot of high cards. Zia took the ♦9 with the jack, cashed two hearts and exited with a diamond. West won the ace and played a third round. Zia then ran some trumps, putting East in a bit of a bind when the signaling with his partner was not clear.

East didn't know his partner had clubs under control, so he pitched one club and then the ♠10. Zia cashed the ♠A and played another to East's queen. The ♠J was trick number 11 for 22.5 matchpoints out of 25.

Hamman appreciated the good result, but he

grumbling good-naturedly: "They never discard like that when I'm playing it."

Three boards later, Hamman was proved wrong when both opponents erred in defense against his 2♠ bid.

East's takeout double with doubletons in two unbid suits would not be everyone's choice, but he did have an opener and four of the other major.

East started with the ♦A, continuing with the ♦8. Hamman considered his play for some time before going up with the king, discarding a heart. He then cashed his top clubs and ruffed a club. The picture of East's hand was becoming clearer when he discarded on the third round of clubs.

Hamman then innocently called for a low diamond, and West erred by playing low. Hamman tossed his ♥K. East could have helped his side after ruffing by exiting with a trump, depriving Hamman of a second club ruff, but East tried to cash the ♥A. Hamman ruffed, played a fourth club and ruffed in dummy, then ruffed another heart to hand, leaving East with nothing but spades.

When Hamman exited with his now-good ♣10, East had to ruff and was on lead with ♠Q J 7 while Hamman remained with ♠A 10 8. Hamman had to get two of the last three tricks for plus 140, good for 20.5 out of 25 matchpoints. Plus 110 would have been average.

Second place went to Lunhui Lin of Westborough MA and Dawei Qi of Framingham MA.

The winners are from Summit NJ. Crisfield is a free-lance writer, part-time bridge teacher, "but mostly a mom" to 16-year-old Jay and 13-year-old Cori. Haines works for a non-profit organization called NJGASP – for New Jersey Group Against Smoking Pollution. Her daughter, Sarah, is a freshman at New York University. Her son, Michael, is a high school sophomore.

The two have been playing together about five years. Crisfield said she learned to play bridge at her mother's urging. "She told me everyone at college plays bridge," Crisfield said. When she got to Williams College in western Massachusetts, Crisfield said, "no one played." So she started teaching.

Crisfield and Haines play 2/1 game force. Both have lots of pigmented masterpoints but are shy of overall points needed to make Life Master. Crisfield has about 230, Haines 210.

Haines credits Crisfield with the play that won the event for them. This was the deal:

Haines led her fourth-best club, taken by declarer with the ace. Instead of going after diamonds, South played a heart to the ace and a heart to the jack. Haines won the ♥Q and cleared the club suit (she knew declarer had a doubleton because with three, she would probably have played the ♣J at trick one).

Declarer cashed her hearts and, belatedly, played a low diamond to the 10 and jack. Crisfield won the ♦K and played the ♠A and another spade. Declarer could have ducked to the jack, but she went up with the king and played the ♦Q from hand. Haines' hand was now good if she could only get in. Her wish came true when Crisfield underled the ♠Q to Haines' 10. Haines cashed out for plus 50 and 5.5 out of 7 matchpoints, enough to surge into first.

Today's Sponsorships and Memorials

With a delightful demeanor and great interest in the game, **Ethel Keohane** had a well-deserved reputation as the First Lady of New England Bridge. Never has bridge had a more respected representative! Her local and regional wins are too many to list, but more important were her "non-table" accomplishments. Her contributions to the game were recognized by District 25 in 1982, when she was the recipient of the Larry Weiss Trophy given (among other things) for "superior behavior and gracious presence at the bridge table." Ethel was also an active contributor to the success of EMBA (Eastern Mass Bridge Association), serving as Unit Secretary for 18 years and on the Unit Board for many more. Particularly interested in EMBA's newcomer programs, Ethel worked tirelessly for new players and provided financial support when necessary. She encouraged new players, bridge teachers, and club owners, doing everything possible to grow the game she loved.

On the national level, Ethel served as Assistant Chairperson of the National Goodwill Committee. In 1973, she donated the Keohane Trophy, in memory of her late husband William Keohane, to be awarded to the winner of the New England Open Individual. In 1995, the ACBL Board of Directors re-designated it to be awarded to the North American Swiss Teams champion. Bridge

was a major contributor to Ethel's entire life and she was an outstanding contributor to bridge.

Al (Alexander J.) Oszy was a longtime director of the Winchester Duplicate Bridge Club after directing previously at several other clubs, including games at the Belmont Women's Club. Born Oct 3, 1920, Al started to play bridge while studying for his electrical engineering degree at M.I.T, where he was a squash champion. His wife of 65 years, Vera, recalls that when they were dating during their student years, Al would play money bridge, and when he won, he would use the winnings to take her out for a nice dinner. They married during his senior year at MIT. He subsequently received a masters degree from Steven's Institute. They moved to Newton in 1953 which began his New England bridge career and launched him on several regional event victories in the 1950's, Sixties and early Seventies, including the Open Teams at the New England Spring Regional (twice) and the Men's Pair at the Bermuda Regional.

In addition to being an expert player, Al was a master bridge teacher, who taught many the finer points of the game. He was unflinching in his willingness to share his expertise with anyone who asked him about a hand. A familiar figure at all New England tournaments, Al also sold bridge books and supplies for many years. From his friends at the WDBC, Arlington, MA (www.acblemba.org/winchester).

Maureen Plerotti is remembered lovingly by her aunt Sandra Drum, who for many years was

the proprietor of the Westwood Bridge Club. At her aunt's suggestions, Maureen took bridge lessons from Randy Fadema and started playing. During her battle with lung cancer, bridge helped her cope. She leaves behind a loving son who just became a lawyer.

Joe Vaas. We all knew him a "Mr. Duplicate Bridge" of Westwood MA. For more than 30 years, Joe held the torch that lights the gateway to the Westwood Bridge Club. He welcomed everybody graciously into his world — his bridge club was his home. Joe paved the way for our bridge lives, giving us the gift of bridge and friendship. Teaching, encouraging, and embracing new players with kindness and patience, Joe inspired everyone he met to learn bridge. Joe was our celebrity and he is remembered fondly by his friends at the Westwood Bridge Club.

Tom Wilder. Seldom has anyone worked harder for New England bridge than Tom, former president of the Eastern Mass Bridge Association (EMBA). Always a gentleman, Tom was the last EMBA recipient of the Larry Weiss Trophy, given annually since 1981 by District 25 "For Grace and Skill at the Bridge Table." His many contributions to EMBA are too numerous to list. He was always the first to volunteer and provide help when it was needed. One of his many accomplishments was the growth in attendance at the EMBA qualifying game of the North American Pairs from 35 to 115 tables. Tom was one of the most respected presidents of EMBA and did an outstanding job in that capacity. *By Bill Hunter.*
