Meyers, Mohan win Blue Ribbon Pairs

Jill Meyers of Santa Monica CA and John Mohan of St. Croix, Virgin Islands, boosted by a strong first final session, won the Edgar Kaplan Blue Ribbon Pairs. It is the first time either player has won the event, and it is only the second time in the history of the contest that a mixed pair has finished first. Dorothy Hayden Truscott and B. Jay Becker won the inaugural Blue Ribbon Pairs in 1963.

It is Meyers' eighth NABC victory, and the second NABC championship here in Boston — Meyers was a member of the winning squad in the Women's Board-a-Match Teams. In 1987, Meyers won the Lou Herman Trophy, given to the player who earns the most masterpoints at the Fall NABC. With these two victories, Meyers will be in contention for this year's Herman Trophy as well.

Meyers has three world championship victories — the Venice Cup in 1993 and 1997 and the Women's World Pairs Championship, won with partner Shawn Quinn, in Lille, France in 1998.

Mohan is a 16-time NABC champion. His most recent win occurred at the San Antonio NABC with partner

Sam Lev in the Life Master Pairs. With this victory, Mohan moves into the lead for this year's *Player of the Year* contest.

Mohan's best finish in world competition was his third place performance at the World Open Pairs in 1978.

Meyers and Mohan posted a 1239.07 total, finishing more than a board ahead of their nearest competitors.

"John was just wonderful to play with," said Meyers repeatedly to friends and well-wishers who congratulated her after the event.

Mohan said, "We had a nice round in the afternoon — about 60% — but the evening round was just above average. It was enough, however."

In second place were John Sutherlin of Dallas TX and Russ Ekeblad of Providence RI. Both players are many-time NABC champions. It was the highest finish for either player in this event. Sutherlin and Ekeblad finished with 1195.55 matchpoints.

Third place went to Aaron Silverstein of New York NY and Pablo Lambardi of Buenos Aires, Argentina, with a score of 1184.01.

Sternberg squad takes Senior KO

The team captained by Jim Sternberg held off a last quarter rally by Richard Budd's squad to win the Microsoft Senior Knockout Teams 163-151.

Sternberg, of Jupiter FL, led the all-Florida team of Bernie Chazen of Tamarac, Allan Cokin of Palm Beach, Billy Eisenberg of Boca Raton, Richard Reisig of Delray Beach and Robert Lipsitz of Palm Harbor.

This is Sternberg's second NABC victory --- he was a member of the winning team in the 1979 Men's Board-a-Match. Sternberg enjoys the distinction of being the 1977 ACBL Rookie of the Year, the same year in which

he became a Life Master. Chazen, an ACBL Grand Life Master, has previously won the 1971 Men's Teams and the 1973 Mixed Pairs. Cokin is also a Grand Life Master who previously won the 1979 Men's Teams and the 1984 Mixed Pairs. Eisenberg has won five world championships and has 11 previous NABC titles to his credit. Rich Reisig was a member of the winning Senior Swiss team in 1998. Lipsitz, yet another Grand Life Master on the team, is a two-time world champion and has previously won five NABC events --- the 1976 Life Master Pairs, the

Karl Johnson better; Patty misses friends

Patty Johnson of Sebring FL, the tournament director who has been in charge of NACB Tournament Operations for many years, is missing from this NABC. Her husband Karl, a top-flight National Tournament Director for many years, is fighting cancer, and Patty turned down the Boston invitation to stay home to take care of him.

"Karl is doing wonderfully," said Patty when we called her at home to wish her and Karl a Happy Thanksgiving. "He has good days and bad days, but right now most of them are good. The chemotherapy has shrunk the tumor much more than his doctors expected. They've changed their predictions -- now they say that remission is almost a certainty and full recovery has a 25% chance.

"Karl has regained his appetite, but he still lacks strength. But he out-ate me at our Thanksgiving dinner -- he had two plates of food.

"He wants to get back on the golf course, but chances are he'll have to wait until February as his strength returns."

Patty misses being here. "I'm totally broken-hearted," she said. "I miss seeing all my director friends and all my other friends. And my streak has finally been broken -- I had attended 67 consecutive NABCs without a miss. I don't think any director can beat that record."

She closed with this: "Tell all my friends that I'll be back full of vim and vigor for the Cincinnati tournament in the spring."

It doesn't take long to get the bridge bug

It doesn't take long to get the bug -- the bridge bug, that is. Even though the number of tables in the Intermediate/Novice area was small because of the holiday, there were still 20 new players, all with fewer than five masterpoints, playing bridge instead of eating turkey.

The I/N program has been immensely successful all week -- large crowds, fine lectures, excellent hospitality provided by the Boston hosts. Word about the lectures has got around so that many advanced players are dropping by before they go on to the higher-rated games. The lecturer with the biggest turnout of the week to date is Eddie Kantar.

A special 99er game is on tap for today. It will be played over two sessions (1 and 7:30 p.m.), and a portion of the points will be GOLD!

The crowds are not confined to just Americans. Players from as far away as Spain, Australia, Japan, Bermuda, Canada, Mexico, Puerto Rico, Venezuela, England and Austria have found their way to the I/N tables.

The most successful I/N players in games played through yesterday morning are Michael McGoldrick of Medfield MA and Michael Jaw of Watertown MA with 13.68 points. Close behind with 12.70 were Jacqueline and Arthur Bergson of Mammoth Lakes CA. Altogether 21 players have won more than 10 points in I/N games.

Alice Kinningham is the director in charge of the program, assisted by Donna Bowser, Priscilla Smith and Judy Cotterman. These directors have erected what they call a Rogues' Gallery that covers half the length of the wall in Salon G on the fourth floor, the site of the I/N games. They snap Polaroid photos of all winners and paste them on the sheets listing the overall victors in each event.

Attendance declines

The Thanksgiving holiday cut back the size of the crowds yesterday. Only 704 tables were in play for the entire day. Earlier in the tournament there was a single session that drew 821 tables. Tournament officials expect the numbers to rise significantly today. Total to date: 9916 tables.

The 5♥ response to the Roman Keycard Blackwood 4NT inquiry showed two keycards without the queen of trumps. West, knowing that his K-J of trumps were well placed, doubled 6♥. As events unfolded, however, it would have been better for West to remain silent. Wolford knew that his heart spots were suspicious to begin with, so he ran to 6NT. West hit this also, and everyone passed.

West led a low club and Wolford took stock of the situation when dummy came down. The good news was that he had 10 tricks on top, and at first glance it appeared he could establish the spades for two more. There were going to be some entry problems, however, that would prevent him from playing the hand in a straightforward manner. Specifically, if he were to win this trick in hand, test the diamonds and then bang down the ♠A 10, West might be clever and duck. If West started with four or more spades to the queen, there would be no way to establish the long spade in dummy without using up the ♥A as an entry, allowing the defense to cash out for down one or more when they got in with the ♠Q.

So Wolford hit upon another idea. West didn't lead a heart honor, so he probably wasn't holding ♥K-Q-J(x). Why did West double? Wolford reasoned that West probably held broken heart honors, perhaps with some length in the suit to boot. If that were true, perhaps West could be put under some pressure if he was guarding both majors. At trick two, therefore, Wolford played the ♥10. West covered, and Wolford ducked in dummy, rectifying the count for a possible squeeze.

West continued with a club. Wolford won it in dummy and ran the diamonds. On the fourth round of the suit West let go of his last club, but on the fifth diamond he had no good discard.

West eventually parted with a spade, but Wolford was fairly certain of the position at this point and discarded a low heart from dummy. He then picked up the spade suit for four tricks (♠A, ♠10 overtaking with the jack, ♠K) to bring home his doubled slam.

Anaheim to feature new event — Fast Pairs

The Anaheim Summer North American Championships will feature the Fast Open Pairs as an experimental NABC+ event. The Fast Pairs has been a popular secondary event at North American Bridge Championships for many years.

In Anaheim, the Fast Open Pairs will consist of two qualifying sessions on Thursday and two final sessions on Friday of the second weekend. It will run opposite the NABC IMP Pairs.

The Fast Open Pairs sessions will begin at 1:00 and 4:30 p.m. The IMP Pairs will be staged at the usual times, 1:00 and 7:30 p.m. In the Fast event, only 11 minutes will be allowed for each two-board round.

Duck foils squeeze

Barnet Shenkin provided the following deal that he and partner Steve Levinson played in the first semi-final session of the Edgar Kaplan Blue Ribbon Pairs. Both Shenkin and Levinson are originally from Glasgow, Scotland. Their opponents were Linda and Paul Lewis, West and East respectively, of Las Vegas NV.

After a spirited auction and a well-judged 4NT bid by Linda Lewis, Shenkin led the ♠Q. Levinson made a nice play by ducking the ace. Declarer won the ♠K and crossed to dummy with a high heart to finesse in diamonds. After declarer successfully picked up North's diamonds, he ran the rest of the suit. On the fourth and fifth round of diamonds, Levinson discarded a low heart and a low spade, but on the last round he discarded the ♠A. This holds declarer to 10 tricks.

Note that if Levinson had risen with the ace at trick one and continued the suit, declarer would have had a fairly easy route to 11 tricks. After winning the ♠K at trick two, declarer would have played in the same manner as he did at the table, crossing to dummy and running the diamonds. North is marked with most of the high-card strength for his takeout double, and declarer would have had little trouble working out that North would be unable to protect the ♠K and the ♥Q on the run of the diamond suit.

Levinson's actual choice of defense avoids the squeeze endplay.

Who needs trumps!

The late great Edgar Kaplan was a firm believer in the theory that when partner makes a takeout double, your primary obligation is to take it out. I wonder how he would have reconciled the following two two deals with his theory. The first came up in the Board-a-Match finals.

With our opponents vulnerable, I held the North cards and opened 1♣. When East jumped to 2♦, Danny Sprung as South doubled, negative, and before I bid the reflex 3NT I had to reconstruct the hand. Assuming partner had some fillers in spades, what tricks could declarer take outside trumps? It was hard to see how he could come to more than six tricks -- and at that vulnerability, plus 500 would be just fine.

It worked out precisely as I had hoped. On the ♥J lead we cashed our six top winners and then played a third club to lock declarer in his hand for minus 800—even if he had held the ♦10.

With that relative triumph under my belt, I should have got my next challenge right -- but I did not, I have to admit. This hand is from the second qualifying session of the Blue Ribbon Pairs.

The North hand is a classical problem after 1♦ from South and a (revolting) 2♣ overcall from West. The point though is that even if West had held six solid clubs and partner the typical 4-4-3-2 minimum opening bid, what game can we make? With no eight-card major fit, we would require at least 3-3 trumps to bring home a major suit game (and three rounds of clubs could create a problem in any event). So on reflection it should have been clear to pass out 2♣ with the North cards. Then it would be up to South to determine whether to reopen, given his wasted values in clubs.

If he passes, we take our top eight tricks for plus 300, and if he doubles, I have to guess well and pass again (less clear) for 800. As it was, though, I scrambled something from the wreckage after falling from grace by making a negative double at my first turn, by passing the 2♥ response, and by collecting plus 110. This turned out to be above average.

Shugart squad seeks seconds in Reisinger

Last year, Rita Shugart became the first woman since 1957 to win the Reisinger, a grueling six-session event played in the tough board-a-match format.

The last woman before Shugart to capture the title was the legendary Helen Sobel who had four Reisinger wins: 1941, 1943, 1950 and 1957.

This year, Shugart is looking for a repeat victory. If successful, she would be the first woman to "repeat" since Sally Young (the first woman Life Master) won the Reisinger in 1937, 1938 and 1939. Young also won in 1947.

Shugart & Company -- partner Andrew Robson and teammates Geir Helgemo and Tony Forrester -- were impressive last year, leading after days one and two and after the first final session.

The victory was the first in a major championship for Shugart and Robson, a professional player. Forrester and Helgemo, also bridge pros, won the Reisinger for the first time. Earlier in the year, they had broken through after a series of second-place finishes in North American championships with a win in Open Pairs I at the Spring NABC in Reno.

"I'm extremely delighted with my team," Shugart says. "90-95% of the battle is having a great partner -- and great teammates."

This was a key deal from last year's win. Shugart and Robson were playing against Geoff Hampson and Eric Greco.

Hampson led the ♠A and continued with a spade to Shugart's king. She played the ♣K, won by Hampson, who cleared the spade suit.

The key now was the diamond suit. Shugart was certain that Greco had the ♥A for his vulnerable two-level opener, so she had to find the ♦Q. If she guessed wrong and lost the lead, she was headed for minus 200 or worse.

After winning the ♠Q, Shugart cashed the ♣Q and overtook her ♣10 with dummy's jack. She cashed the ♣9, pitching a heart, and called for the ♦J.

When the ♦J held, Shugart had 10 tricks and a win since South at the other table went down in 2NT.

The Reisinger

The event is contested for the Reisinger Trophy (the Chicago Trophy until 1965). It is a six-session open team-of-four event scored by board-a-match with two qualifying sessions, two semifinal sessions and two final sessions. It was contested as a four-session championship until 1966.

The event began in 1929 as the North American Open Team Championship and the prize was the Chicago Trophy, donated by the Auction Bridge Club of Chicago. (In 1928, the open team competition was for the Harold S. Vanderbilt Cup.)

The Chicago Trophy was replaced in 1965 by the Reisinger Memorial Trophy, donated by the Greater New York Bridge Association in memory of Curt H. Reisinger.

Reisinger (1891-1964), of New York City, was a principal patron of contract bridge and the American Contract Bridge League in the early years of both.

Reisinger was a great-grandson of Anheuser and a grandson of Busch, co-founders of the brewery from which he inherited great wealth. That wealth enabled him to become a stalwart financial supporter of the game, as well as a noted philanthropist on a far larger scale.

In the years when there was often a struggle to meet the League's modest payroll, Reisinger was often called upon and never failed to help with a loan or an outright gift. His support made possible several early contract bridge tournaments, clubs and books.

Among the positions in which he served were di-

rector of the United States Bridge Association, president of the Greater New York Bridge Association and chairman of the ACBL. In 1953, Reisinger was named ACBL *Honorary Member*.

Looking back

• The only all-women's team to win the Reisinger -- or any other major open team event -- was Sally Young, Jane Jaeger, Paula Ribner and Kay Rhodes.

They tied in 1947 with John Crawford, Ted Lightner, George Rapee and Sam Stayman; and Robert Appleyard, Simon Rossant, Morris Berliant and M.A. Lightman.

Young, Life Master #17, had four Reisinger wins plus seven wins in the Women's Teams, four wins in the Women's Pairs, five wins in the Mixed Teams and one win each in the Fall Open Pairs and Fall Mixed Pairs. She died in 1970.

Ribner and Jaeger, both now living in Florida, are Gold Life Masters who remain active players. Jaeger was a member of the winning squad in the Grand National Teams in 1973, its inaugural year.

Jaeger and husband Lewis were the first married couple to attain Life Master rank -- #74 and #94, respectively -- and Lewis was a member of the winning Reisinger team in 1934. Together, they were second in the Vanderbilt in 1956.

• Fifty-three years ago, at the Fall NABC in Hollywood FL, Edith Freilich became the 13th woman to win the Reisinger. Her teammates were Mitch Barnes, John Crawford and Al Roth.

Freilich and Roth repeated their victory in 1952. This time, their teammates were Harold Harkavy and Tobias Stone.

• The history of the Reisinger is dotted with back-to-back wins but only the Nickell squad has the threepeat. The team of John Crawford, Charles Goren, Charles Solomon and Sally Young won in 1937 and 1938 -- the same squad, plus B. Jay Becker, also won in 1939.

• Oswald Jacoby won his first Reisinger in 1955, playing on a team with his son Jim -- the only father-son combination to win the event. Jacoby's second Reisinger win came in 1983 when he was invited to join the team of Edgar Kaplan, Norman Kay, Richard Pavlicek and Bill Root.

• John Crawford holds the record for most Reisinger wins with 10. His victories spanned four decades: 1937, 1938, 1939, 1942, 1946, 1947, 1953, 1954, 1956 and 1961.

• A multi-national team won in 1987. Team members included Zia, Jaggy Shivdasani, Billy Cohen and Ron Smith.

Said Zia: "The best thing about this was that we had a black (Smith), a Jew (Cohen, who is a Canadian citizen), an Indian (Shivdasani) and a Pakistani (Zia) playing together." Zia is a Muslim and Shivdasani is a Hindu.

"It's good to show how bridge can bring together people from such different backgrounds," he added. "It just shows a special magic about the game of bridge."

• A multi-national team won again in 1989. Zia was on the team which included Sam Lev, Israel; Michael Rosenberg, U.S. but formerly of Scotland; Chris Compton, U.S., and Mark Molson, Canada.

• Molson scored a rare double at the Fall NABC in Lancaster PA that year. He took top honors in the two premier events of the tournament -- the Reisinger and the Blue Ribbon Pairs.

• The record margin of victory in the Reisinger -- 10 full boards -- was set in 1966 by Kaplan, Kay, Robert Jordan and Arthur Robinson.

Problem on page 2

Clearly you must take the ♠K, lead to the ♣A, and ruff a heart. You throw your remaining spade on the ♣K, but what next?

I led a diamond to the queen, and West discarded a heart. Damn. A contract that seemed cold was now in trouble. After much thought I could not find a way to neutralize the ♦9. This was the full deal:

If I had ruffed a spade at the fifth trick, I could have made the contract. But that would have run the risk of an overruff if I ruffed with the 8. So I should have ruffed a spade with an honor and led a trump to the 10. Then I can deal with East's four trumps because I have shortened myself. I think. But I would still have a problem if East won the sixth trick with the ace and produced a spade. I would still have a problem with the ♦9.

If you can improve on this analysis, which is likely, please do not tell me. I am trying to forget the whole thing.

Honor your partner

Mark Horton is an English bridge journalist who discussed "How to be a good partner" at recent World Junior Bridge Camp.

Consider your partner to be a friend. Treat your partner well, even (especially) if you are playing together for the first time. Always offer your partner a drink -- tea or coffee is a good starting point. This will lead to a relaxed atmosphere, enabling you both to play your best. By the way, always be a pleasant and courteous opponent.

Tolerate errors. Never go on about partner's mistakes -- just forget about them and move on to the next deal. You may be able to make a constructive comment at the end of the session. Your partner will surely show you the same consideration.

Be encouraging. Always be prepared to support your partner -- "well played" always goes down well and a "thank you" for the dummy does not go amiss. In one of my partnerships, if dummy was exactly what was needed, "mille grazie" would let partner in on the good news!

Keep a straight face. Never make the mistake of pulling a face or raising an eyebrow. Apart from hurting your partner's feelings, being deadpan does not let your opponents know that something may have gone wrong.

Win or lose, always stay calm at the end of the session and thank partner for the game. This is especially important if things have not gone so well. In my most successful international partnership, the first time we played together was absolutely hopeless but we stuck with it.

Coping with disaster: The best way to cope with the inevitable disasters is to laugh them off. This tends to disconcert even the best opponents who are used to seeing their opponents argue.

Conventions: Stick to the ones you both feel comfortable with. A player trying to remember some convention he is not familiar with will make errors in other departments.

I recently played in a tournament in the Netherlands with a strange partner. We would have won but for a couple of expensive mistakes when I forgot a couple of things because we were playing some conventions I was not familiar with.

Who's the boss? In most partnerships, one player tends to be regarded as the boss. If you are the stronger player, go out of your way to make life easy for your partner.

Play begins today in six-session North American Swiss Teams

Play begins today in the six-session North American Swiss Teams, the last North American championship won by Bobby Goldman.

Goldman teamed with Mark Lair, John Onstott and Steve Beatty to claim the victory by less than one Victory Point.

Goldman, whose contributions to bridge and multiple victories led to his election to the ACBL Hall of Fame in his first year of eligibility, died in May. He was 60.

Goldman, a four-time world champion and a long-time leading figure in U.S. and world bridge, was named ACBL Honorary Member for 1999. The award is presented for long and meritorious service to bridge.

Goldman played card games with his family as a youngster and began teaching bridge in 1957 while a student at Drexel University in Philadelphia. At the time, he had played duplicate for six months and owned .50 masterpoints.

By 1961, he had earned Life Master status and in 1967 he was recruited as a member of the Aces, Ira Corn's Texas-based squad created to bring the world championship title back to the U. S.

Goldman moved to Dallas on Feb. 1, 1968. The Aces won the Bermuda Bowl in 1970 and 1971, and Goldman won the World Mixed Teams in 1972. He also won the Bermuda Bowl in 1979.

Besides his bridge prowess, which included 20 North American championships, Goldman made major contributions in the areas of teaching, writing, administration, theory, computer bridge, bridge on television, appeals and ethics.

The game

The first qualifying session in the North American Swiss Teams will be today, with semifinal matches on Saturday and the final matches on Sunday.

Players will be vying for the Keohane Trophy, which was donated by Ethel Keohane in 1973 in memory of her husband, William H. Keohane, one of the leading New England bridge personalities.

Bill Keohane was elected in 1972 to a one-year term as District 25's first District Director. He died later that year, just before he would have attended his first Board meeting.

The Keohane Trophy was presented for the Open Individual Championship until it was re-designated in 1995 by the ACBL Board of Directors for the North American Swiss Teams.

The event has two qualifying sessions, two semifinal sessions and a two-session final with Victory Point scoring. Previous winners:

The Facts: 5♦ doubled made five, plus 750 for N/S. The Director was called after the 5♦ bid. N/S told the Director that 2♦ had been explained as at least 4-4-1-4. E/W said the 2♦ bid had been explained as a three-suiter with short diamonds. The Director ruled that there was unauthorized information (Law 16), that pass was a logical alternative, and that 5♦ was suggested by the hesitation. The contract was changed to 4♥ doubled down one, plus 200 for E/W.

The Appeal: N/S appealed the Director's ruling and were the only players to attend the hearing. The 2♦ bid was alerted as a three-suiter with short diamonds, usually 4-4-1-4, with normal opening bid strength.

When West doubled 4♥, North broke tempo for perhaps one minute before passing. South argued that bidding 4♥ was a matchpoint decision, and that his partner was known to hold very short hearts, likely a void after the double by West. South also pointed out that the free bid of 3♦ likely showed at least six diamonds and that after the double the defense could get at least one diamond ruff in against 4♥. If North indeed held a void, more likely with the double, then bidding 5♦ was indicated by both the 3♦ bid and the double and not by the hesitation, as South already knew about the short hearts and long diamonds in North's hand. E/W did not lead clubs and North was able to discard a losing club when he took the ruffing heart finesse.

The Committee Decision: The Committee believed that there had been a considerable break in tempo. However, the test after a tempo break is whether or not the break in tempo suggests a successful call over another losing logical alternative. The Committee agreed that after the double, the South hand itself and not the hesitation strongly suggested the successful bid. Pass was not deemed to be a logical alternative. Therefore, the Committee allowed the table result to stand.

The Facts: 6♦ made six, plus 920 for N/S. South had taken about 15 seconds to decide to raise 4♦ to 5♦ (he was considering passing). The Director was called when North bid 6♦. East believed the 6♦ bid was suggested by the slow 5♦ bid. The Director ruled that the break in tempo demonstrably suggested extra values (Law 73F1) and changed the contract to 5♦ made six, plus 420 for N/S.

The Appeal: N/S appealed the Director's ruling and were the only players to attend the hearing. South stated that his hand was absolutely minimum for his negative double of 3♠. He would not have doubled without one of the kings, because he would be forcing his partnership to game with less than an opening bid.

The Panel Decision: The experts consulted all believed that pass was not a logical alternative to 6♦. One believed a 5♠ bid might have been warranted. None believed the slow 5♦ bid demonstrably suggested bidding on. North made the 4♦ underbid because he did not know which suit to play in. Once his partner showed diamond support, North's hand demanded a slam bid. There was no violation of Law 16 so the table result of 6♦ made six, plus 920 for N/S, was allowed to stand.

North had asked the meaning of 3♦ before she bid 3♥ and was told the bid was weak. Both E/W convention cards were marked that the bid was weak. The Director ruled that since both cards were marked that way, that East had forgotten and misbid. The table result was allowed to stand.

The Appeal: N/S appealed the Director's ruling. Only South attended the hearing. E/W had gone home. South said he did not know the law, but it seemed very unjust that his partner had made a bid based on what the opponents had told her and then was set 800 when East had a lot more than she was supposed to. He also thought East had taken advantage of the unauthorized information from her partner's Alert and explanation. Both pairs were eligible for the B or C Flight, so they were less experienced than one would expect, given the event. East, who plays one or two times per year could not remember how to bid the hand.

The Panel Decision: The Panel decided that there had been no violation of law or regulation and allowed the table result to stand.
