Robert J. Dischner

Bob "Dish" Dischner of Santa Ana CA, retired National Tournament Director, died July 17. He was 77.

Born in Nebraska on Aug. 25, 1920, Dischner moved to Santa Ana during the Depression and never left. He served four years (1941-1945) in the Marine Corps during World War II and worked for the U.S. Post Office from 1945 to 1972.

Dischner had a brief fling as a player after the war but he soon became interested in tournament directing. He directed at his first tournament in July 1950.

Dischner was added to the ACBL national staff in 1972. He retired Dec. 31, 1985 but directed six tournaments during the first half of 1986 before cutting back.

Charles MacCracken, National Tournament Director who was ACBL Tournament Division Manager in 1986, remembered Dischner as "never out of sorts. He always had a friendly smile. He had a tremendous work ethic. It was very hard for him not to be busy."

Granovetter text is Book of the Year

The American Bridge Teachers Association, the professional organization dedicated to developing and promoting teacher excellence, held its annual convention here in Chicago directly prior to the NABC.

The organization announced the winners of the ABTA Awards which recognize outstanding bridge books. The 1998 winner in the advanced category is *Forgive Me Partner* by Matt and Pamela Granovetter. *Easy Bridge --- The Comic Book* by Edith McMullin was the winner in the beginner/student category.

The winner of the Appelebasket Award, given for the best teaching tip, was Harry Lampert.

Five professional teachers were elevated to "ABTA Master Teacher". This title requires 100 hours of classroom teaching, three years as a member of the ABTA and successfully passing ABTA testing criteria. This year's Master Teachers are Kathy Betham of Tulsa OK, Carolyn Hodal of Chico CA, Joanne Humphrey of Fort Smith AR, Ed Layton of San Diego CA and Mary Moss of Gaithersburg MD.

Patron Member plays with Dear Billy

Jack Paulus was excited when he heard that he had won the drawing that pairs a Patron Member with a bridge personality to play in the Charity Pairs game at each NABC. "I couldn't believe it, but I was really looking forward to it," said Paulus, a resident of Detroit who is employed in the tool and die business.

His partner for the contest was none other than expert player and teacher Billy Miller, perhaps best known for his Dear Billy column that appears in the *Bridge Bulletin*.

Miller graciously stepped in for fellow expert Larry Cohen, who normally plays with the Patron Member but who was competing in the Grand National Teams. Miller, aware of the situation, recounts the following humorous story when he went to get the entry:

"I walked up to the selling table and I said, 'Hi, I'm Larry Cohen. I'm playing in the Charity Pairs with the Patron Member'. A lady next to me in line said, 'Oh my God! You're Larry Cohen? I've read all your books!' I hastily corrected myself and said, 'No, I was joking. I'm really Billy Miller', and the lady said, 'Oh my God! You're Billy Miller? I've read all your articles!...'"

Paulus and Miller had a 48% game, but Paulus said, "I really enjoyed myself. He's a wonderful man to play with."

Miller was equally complimentary: "Fun-wise, it was great. Our defense was very effective. Jack is good signaller, and if I set the defense, he followed perfectly. Jack's bidding got us a great score on this

California vs. Texas in GNT A final

The West and the South triumphed in the semi-finals of Flight A of the Grand National Teams. The District 22 team from California wiped out the District 3 team from New York and New Jersey, 201-96. The Texas team representing District 16 had a tougher time against the Illinois team representing District 13, coming from behind to win, 135-83. California and Texas will square off in today's final.

The Flight B final is more than national -- it's international. The District 1 team from Quebec will play District 6 (Maryland and Virginia) in today's final.

The host district, District 13, will compete in the Flight C final, opposing the District 12 squad from Michigan.

District 3 jumped into a 7-IMP lead in the first quarter, but that was completely obliterated in the second canto, won by California, 50-9. California got another 55 in the third quarter while holding New York-New Jersey to 28. This made the final canto almost meaningless.

On the winning team are Ross Grabel, Huntington; Jon Wittes, Claremont; Mark Itabashi, Murrieta; Fred Hamilton, Fresno, and Gene Simpson, Redlands.

Illinois jumped out to a 19-point leader over the first 16 boards, then saw Texas reduce that margin to 2 IMPs at the half. Texas then turned on the power, holding Illinois to 23 IMPs the rest of the way while piling up 33 in the third quarter and 44 more over the final 16 deals. On the winning team are Bobby Goldman, Highland Village; John Sutherlin, Malcolm Brachman and Mike Passell, Dallas, and Eddie Wold, Houston.

Comins, who is retired employee from the city of Flint MI, noted that he was Nick IV's original bridge partner in the early Sixties.

The team finished a close second in the event, winning 16 of the 24 boards. First place was 16 1/2.

Poor contract, great result

Tom Fox and Walt Schafer of the District 13 team from Illinois weren't proud of their 7♥ contract on this deal from their Flight A Grand National Teams quarterfinal, but they were ecstatic about the result.

Even if the diamond finesse works, there are only 12 tricks. Schafer and Fox climbed all the way to the heart grand slam, unaware of the duplication of values in the club suit. Neither was particularly anxious to offer the bidding.

West could have led the ♠K, but he opted for a trump, not at all an uncommon lead against a grand slam. However, the spade would have worked and the trump didn't. Schafer won the opening lead in hand, cashed the ♣A and took the successful diamond finesse. Next came the trump ace, the ♦A and the ♣K. When Schafer then ruffed a diamond, the burden of protecting the diamonds was thrust firmly onto West.

Schafer then cashed his trumps, and when he cashed the last one, West was down to the ♠KQ and the high diamond. Whatever he discarded, declarer had the rest and made his unlikely grand slam.

Best defense of the year

My candidate for best defense of 1998 is a misdefense. Yes, you read correctly: a misdefense. Now how could a mistake be the best play of the year? Well, in this case the defender led the wrong suit -- that was his error. But he made up for it by leading back the right card (indeed, a brilliant card) in the wrong suit. Take a look:

This is board 107, the first board of the final set of the 1998 U.S. Team Trials to choose one of the two U.S. teams for the 1999 Bermuda Bowl. At this point in the match, the Nickell team (Nick Nickell, Dick Freeman, Jeff Meckstroth, Eric Rodwell, Bob Hamman, and Paul Soloway) led by a score of 233 to 199 over the Cayne team (James Cayne, Chuck Burger, Mike Passell, Michael Seamon, Larry Cohen and David Berkowitz). With 15 deals to play, 34 IMPs was a huge margin to make up but this deal was worth 10 imps to the Cayne team, who eventually lost by 12.

After a transfer sequence, South reached 4♠ and West led his singleton diamond. Meckstroth, one of the best declarers in the world, made a slip when he ducked the first trick. This is such a common strategy among the top players that it seemed unnatural to win the ace at trick one. At the other table, however, declarer did win the ace and immediately led a club to his king. He could not go down, with one of dummy's clubs ruffed in the closed hand.

At this table, Burger won the first trick with the East hand. Now the winning move was to return a high diamond, a suit-preference signal. West could ruff the diamond and exit with a heart or a spade, eventually scoring two club tricks to set the contract. Burger, however, didn't know that his partner had led a singleton -- perhaps South had ducked the first trick with a doubleton diamond to cut communications early. In any case, Burger decided the right suit to shift to was clubs. He was wrong, but he chose the right card. He led back the 4.

Examine the situation. If he leads back the 10 (there's probably not one in a hundred players who would even think about playing back any card but the 10), what happens? Declarer plays the king and West wins the ace. West now must guess: Did partner start with 10-4 doubleton or 10-9? If partner started with 10-4 doubleton, West must cash two more club tricks (or underlead the third round of clubs for partner to ruff and return a diamond, defeating the contract two tricks). In real life, West would almost surely go wrong on the return of the 10, because Burger-Cayne use frequent count plays on defense, so the switch to a 10 tends to show a doubleton.

Burger's actual ♣4 shift relieved partner of the problem and gave him the opportunity to make a nice play in return. South put up the ♠K on the 4 (yes, he could have played low and made the contract, but how was he to know?). Cayne captured the king with his ace and led back the 5. He knew from the 4-spot that partner held three clubs, and his only hope was that partner held the 10 as an entry. Burger won the 9 at trick three and realized by now that a diamond ruff was available. So he returned a diamond to set the contract (better late than never).

A final thought: Edgar Kaplan once wrote that Norman was a very considerate partner because in a similar situation, when Edgar had underled a string of honors to find his partner with the 10, Norman with the 10-9 won the trick with the TEN so as not to cause the least bit of stress on Edgar (who would have to wait for South to follow if Norman had played the 9).

A memorable battle

Walter Schafer made a reopening bid on this deal that most players would not even consider, but he made it pay off for Illinois (District 3) in its battle with Texas (District 16) in Flight A of the Grand National Teams.

Bobby Goldman opened with a weak two-bid despite holding two aces, and this ran around to Schafer. He had the equivalent of an opening bid -- 12 high card points -- but he had no suit really worth mentioning. But he wasn't about to let Goldman steal the hand, so he reopened with 3♦. When Tom Fox cuebid hearts, Schafer decided to go for the notrump game.

There would be no story if Goldman had woodenly led a heart, but he found the most damaging opening lead, his lowest spade. After considerable thought, Schafer ducked in dummy and won Eddie Wold's jack with his ace. He led diamonds, and Goldman was forced to win the second round. Once again Goldman led a spade, ducked to Wold's queen. Wold correctly switched to a heart, but Schafer found the key play -- he went up with the king. Goldman took his ace and continued with still a third spade.

Schafer carefully won this with the king and then made another key play -- the ♥Q. This pulled Wold's last heart. Now Schafer cashed the high diamond and led the ♠8 from dummy, forcing Wold to win his 9. After Wold studied the situation for a while, Schafer showed him the ♣Q. Wold folded his cards -- Schafer had overcome an ingenious defense with superb declarer play to make his contract and earn 7 IMPs for his team. At the other table, the opening bid of 2♥ was passed out and defeated one trick.

The hand just before this one also had its points of interest.

It's nice to have 21 high card points when your partner opens the bidding. When the dummy went down, Schafer observed, "Well, at least we arrived in the par contract." However, the contract was doomed to failure because of the 3-1 spade break. But Schafer was right about the par contract -- the contract was the same in the other room for a push.

Morehead Trophy honors Grand National Teams victors

Originally the Grand National Teams was a North American contest with all 25 ACBL districts participating. Now the Flight A division is a United States event, with only the 23 U.S. districts participating. The event was subdivided into three separate events in 1985.

Qualifiers earned their right to compete by winning at the grassroots level earlier this year.

Winners will have their names engraved on the Morehead Trophy, donated by *The New York Times* in memory of its longtime bridge editor, Albert H. Morehead.

The trophy was originally awarded to the winners of a special knockout team event that followed the Reisinger team contest at the Fall NABC in 1967 but was withdrawn when the event proved unpopular.

Since 1973 the trophy has been awarded to winners of the Grand National Teams.

Albert H. Morehead

Morehead (1909-1966) was born in Flintstone GA and educated at Baylor and Harvard. Ely Culbertson hired him in 1932 because of his outstanding ability as a player and analyst and made him technical editor of *The Bridge World* in 1933. He proved so invaluable that in 1934 he was made general manager of all Culbertson enterprises. He was only 25 when he played on the Culbertson team that defeated the British in the second international match for the Schwab Cup.

Morehead was the first bridge editor of *The New York Times* with a Sunday column from 1935 and a daily column from 1959. He resigned from the *Times* late in 1963 to devote full time to writing, editing and publishing of the dictionaries, encyclopedias and thesauruses that made him one of the foremost American lexicographers.

During those years, Morehead found time for tremendous service to organized bridge. He was an officer of the United States Bridge Association when that organization amalgamated with the American Bridge League in 1937.

He became a governor of the newly formed ACBL and served as president in 1943 and chairman of the board from 1943 to 1945. He was named *ACBL Honorary Member* in 1946.

Morehead was a member of the National Laws Commission and was in charge of production of the International Laws of Contract Bridge. He was also the author of the constitution of the World Bridge Federation -- the first formal definition of the scope, structure, powers and duties of that organization.

Morehead was named to the ACBL Bridge Hall of Fame in 1996.

Some insight into the man behind all this talent can be found in his obituary in the November 1966 issue of the *Bulletin*. Editor Dick Frey wrote:

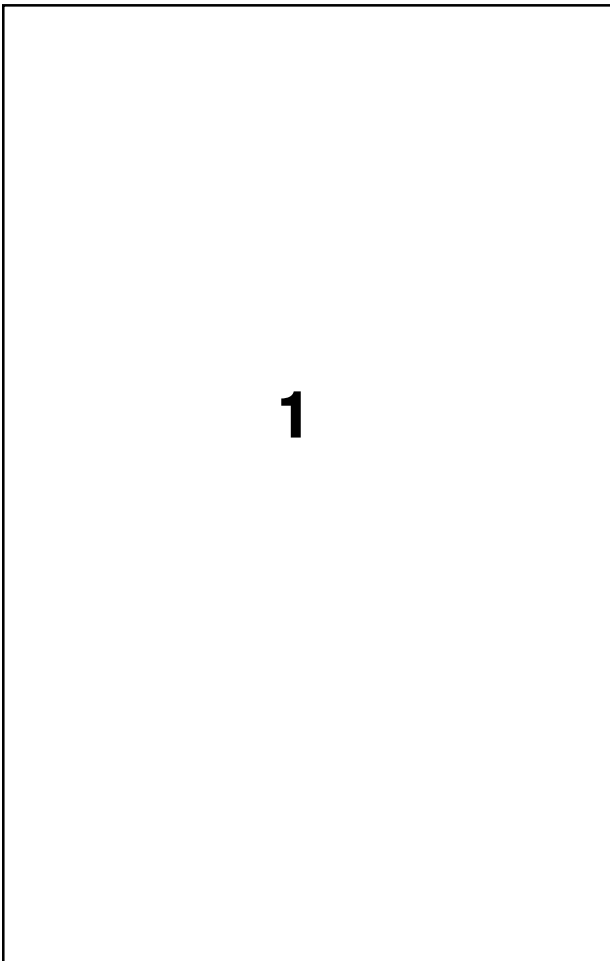
"No one ever saw him lose his temper at the bridge table or heard him speak an unkind word to a partner. He smiled often, but the only player he ever laughed at was himself.

"Rarely if ever did he turn down a plea for help. Writing this, I am proud to acknowledge the debt I owe him and to claim that he was my best friend. The secret of his greatness was that there are scores of others who will truly say exactly this of Albert Hodges Morehead."

Remembering Waldemar von Zedtwitz

Waldemar von Zedtwitz, Life Master #4 and donor of the Gold Cup that goes to the winners of the six-session Life Master Pairs, won the World Mixed Pairs championship with Barbara Brier in 1970 when he was 74.

Because he overcame the handicaps of age and failing eyesight, *The Bridge World* called it "one of the most spectacular victories of any sport, any time."

This deal from that event was reported in *Sports Illustrated* by Charles Goren.

Note the accurate bidding. 6♠ would be defeated after a diamond lead because of the bad spade break.

Von Zedtwitz won the opening diamond lead with the ace, ruffed a diamond in dummy and cashed the ♣K. The ♥A was followed by a heart ruff and von Zedtwitz noted the fall of the ♥J. He ruffed his last diamond with the ♣Q and returned to hand safely with the ♠A. The fall of the ♠8 from East tended to confirm his suspicion about the distribution, so he drew the remaining trumps, throwing hearts from dummy.

Von Zedtwitz led a spade toward dummy at this position:

West put in the queen and Waldy *ducked!* Now he could ruff West's diamond exit with his last trump and take the proven finesse against the ♠J to win the last two tricks with dummy's ♠K 10.

Note that it is essential to duck West's ♠Q. If declarer wins the queen with dummy's king and returns to the closed hand by ruffing a heart, West will discard the ♠9. Now when South leads a spade, West wins and has a diamond for the setting trick.

•••

Tommy Sanders of Nashville played on a Spingold team with von Zedtwitz in 1963. They finished second.

Sanders remembers von Zedtwitz as "a very interesting man -- well read, well informed, well educated. He and Al Morehead wrote children's Bible stories together."

Sanders said von Zedtwitz reminded him of the typical absent-minded professor. "Either he wore the same suit all the time or they all had the same cigarette burns."

This story about von Zedtwitz was given to Sanders and wife Carol by Morehead in 1966 "with the proviso that we never tell the story while von Zedtwitz was alive."

It seems that Morehead and von Zedtwitz were very close friends. Von Zedtwitz never imposed on the friendship except once a year -- usually two days before Christmas -- when he insisted that Morehead accompany/assist him Christmas shopping.

The two would go into stores in Manhattan with von Zedtwitz pointing to one item after another -- "wrap that and deliver it to so and so."

Once done, the two would adjourn to the Oyster Bay at Grand Central Station when they would lunch and celebrate both the season and the completion of their Christmas shopping.

It seems that one year -- about 10 days into January -- Morehead chanced to find himself in the same general area around lunchtime. He decided to lunch at the Oyster Bar.

"I remember you," said his waitress. "Weren't you in here just before Christmas with an elderly gentleman?"

Morehead agreed and the waitress continued, "Let me tell you about something that happened with that man the other day.

"He came in and ordered a very expensive lunch (a \$20 lunch in the early Sixties was an expensive lunch) and he ate most of it. Then he just sat and looked out the window and twirled his hair.

"He looked kind of ruffled and he just sat for the longest time.

"The other waitresses and I were concerned that he didn't have the money to pay for his lunch, so we got together and collected enough money to pay his bill.

"We didn't want to embarrass him so we put the money in a bread basket and put the bread basket on his table.

"He didn't notice it for the longest time but finally he did. He reached in his left pocket and had no money. He reached in his right pocket and pulled out a little change.

"I tell you, our hearts just felt good that we had been able to help him.

"Then he reached into an inside coat pocket and pulled out his wallet. He reached into the wallet and pulled out a \$100 bill.

"He put the money in the bread basket and passed the basket to the next table."

Goodwill candidate ... Deciding that they needed a spot of practice, Edith Kemp and Waldemar von Zedtwitz took a session off from the Vanderbilt and entered the side game.

They got to their stations late and started to play without introducing themselves. On the first deal, when Waldy started his usual hair-twisting performance, one of the opponents leaned toward him kindly, patted his arm and reassured: "Don't be nervous. It's only a game!"

Von Zedtwitz donated LM Pairs trophy, then won it

This six-session event with two qualifying, two semifinal and two final rounds is restricted to Life Masters and is contested for the von Zedtwitz Gold Cup.

The cup was donated by Waldemar von Zedtwitz in 1930 and was won by von Zedtwitz and P. Hal Sims that same year.

Until Life Masters became numerous, the trophy was contested by master players who had qualified by winning a national championship. It was then a four-session event, and the field was limited to 64 players so that a complete movement could be played.

The trophy was originally presented on the basis that three wins by one player would secure him outright possession of the trophy. This feat was achieved by Howard Schenken in 1934. (Schenken won in 1931 and 1933 with David Burnstine and in 1934 with Richard Frey. He also won in 1941 with Merwyn Maier and in 1943 with John Crawford.)

The cup, put back into competition by the donor, was stolen in 1954 while in the possession of John Hubbell, who held the LM Pairs title. The theft followed a television appearance during which Hubbell had exhibited the trophy and given the address of his bridge club where the cup was normally displayed.

The trophy was never recovered and the present cup is an exact replica.

Women have been occasional winners in the LM Pairs -- Helen Sobel, playing with Charles Goren, won in 1942 and 1958; Ruth Gilbert and Leo Roet, 1949; Helen and Morris Portugal, 1960; Dorothy Truscott and B. Jay Becker, 1964; Hermine Baron and Meyer Schleifer, 1966, and Barbara Rappaport and Al Roth, 1971 and 1972.

Mary Jane Farell and Marilyn Johnson made history in 1978 when they became the first women's partnership to win the event.

Active Ethics 51 years ago

The history of the Gold Cup, awarded for the six-session Life Master Pairs, would not be complete without a sidelight published almost 51 years ago in the November-December 1947 *Bulletin*.

The LM Pairs was then a four-session event called the "World Masters" Pairs Championship and qualification was limited to winners or runners-up in a National Open Pairs contest.

Here is the *Bulletin's* account:

After the third session of the World Masters Pair event, the score showed Allen Harvey and Frank Weisbach leading with 619. Waldemar von Zedtwitz and William Seamon were second.

At the start of the fourth and last session, after most of the contestants were seated for play, von Zedtwitz was carefully studying the score from the previous day. He discovered that an adjustment in his score had not been carried through correctly, and he should have 600 points instead of 610.

Not only did he demand that the correction be made but he insisted that the leaders be notified at once before proceeding with play.

It is recorded that Harvey and Weisbach won the event by a margin not requiring the 10-point correction. Nevertheless, as they entered the fourth and crucial session, the knowledge that they had a substantial lead of 19 points -- instead of 9 -- may have been an important factor.

At any rate, it stands to von Zedtwitz's credit that he went to great lengths to protect his opponents' interest even though by the same act he damaged his own.

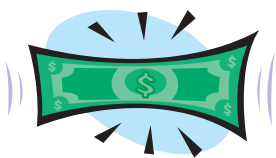
Juniors celebrate Junior Day
