Junior Corps adds 8 members

The Junior Corps, whose members promote the game through their dedication to bridge, inducted eight new members at the Junior dinner last evening.

The ceremony was opened by Aileen Osofsky, chairman of the National Goodwill Committee, who welcomed the large group of attendees. Osofsky also welcomed special guests representing the successful Illinois Youth Bridge Group as well as members of the Swedish and Danish Junior teams who are visiting the U.S.

Osofsky said that the Junior Corps is for those "who not only know how to handle their cards at the table, but also know how to handle themselves."

Osofsky noted that since its incep-

tion in 1990, the Junior Corps has inducted 110 members, 47 of whom are still young enough to be classified as Juniors (under 26).

ACBL President Dick Anderson was also in attendance and was asked to induct the first member, his daughter Erin Anderson.

A joking Anderson began by announcing, "I am delighted to be able to induct Erin into the ACBL Bridge Hall of Fame....Oh, sorry. I'm getting ahead of myself."

Erin, 15, attends Campbell Collegiate School in Regina SK.

District 2 Director Jonathon Steinberg inducted three members from his district.

Levin, Rosenberg lead LMs

Robert Levin of Windermere FL and Michael Rosenberg of Tuckahoe NY led 104 pairs into today's final two sessions of the Life Master Pairs. However, their margin over the runner-up father-son combo of Richard Pavlicek and Rich Pavlicek Jr. of Fort Lauderdale FL was quite narrow, 1735.55 to 1720.80.

The only other pair to break 1700 was a new partnership -- Fred Gitelman of Toronto and Brad Moss of New York

City. Their tally was 1702.76.

Levin won the Bermuda Bowl in 1981, at 24 the youngest player ever to win a world championship. He became a Life Master at the age of 16, the youngest ever to do so up to that time.

Rosenberg, originally from Scotland, came close to winning the World Team Olympiad in 1992, losing in the final to France.

The qualifiers will play two sessions of 26 boards with a 51 top today.

Chicago-based squad wins GNT-C

Chicago bridge players may be graciously welcoming participants to the 1998 Summer NABC, but don't let them fool you --- they still play tough.

That's exactly what members of the District 12 team from Michigan found out when they ran up against a power-

California wins GNT A

The squad from District 22 (California) jumped ahead of their District 16 (Texas) rivals after the first quarter and never looked back to win the 1998 Grand National Teams, Flight A.

The winning team: Fred Hamilton, Fresno; Mark Itabashi, Murrieta; Gene Simpson, Redlands; Jon Wittes, Claremont; and Ross Grabel, Huntington.

The Californians defeated the team of Malcolm Brachman, Mike Passell and John Sutherlin (Dallas), Eddie Wold (Houston), and Bobby Goldman (Highland Village) by a score of 169-108.

"It was very rewarding to win this event," said Itabashi. "We've played several times before in this thing, but this is the toughest field I've ever seen."

Itabashi played the entire match, half with Simpson and the other half with Hamilton, while Wittes and Grabel played together at the other table.

The Grand National Teams is contested for the Albert Morehead Trophy.

The initial stages are played over the course of several months. Originally this was a North American event with all 25 ACBL districts participating. Now it is a U.S. contest, with only the 23 U.S. districts participating. The district winners play off for the championship at the Summer NABC.

This is the first win in the event for each member of the District 22 team. Fred Hamilton was on the runner-up team in 1974 playing with Chuck Burger, Howard Perlman, Stanley Smith, Jeffrey Star and Dick Yanko.

The victors in this year's contest were understandably elated.

"It's an exciting win," said Wittes. "Everyone seemed to play well."

The District 16 runners-up in this year's event graciously congratulated the winners after comparing scores.

"You played an excellent match," said Passell to members of the California squad as handshakes were exchanged.

GNT B title goes to Canada

The winners of the international Flight B Grand National Teams final are the District 1 representatives from Quebec City. They came from behind to score a strong victory, 122-89, over the District 6 team from Maryland and Virginia.

The winners, all of Quebec City: Robert Latulippe, Jocelyn Bernier, Richard Wildi, Jacques Carel, René Pelletier and Hervé Chatagnier. They defeated Richard Wegman, Bethesda MD; Kefu Xu, Laurel MD; Yi Zhong - Weizhong Bao, Fairfax VA.

District 6 took a 10-point lead in

the first quarter, but Quebec surged back to lead by 6 at the half. The Canadians had a strong third quarter, pulling ahead by 44. District 6 made a comeback over the final 16 deals, but the surge fell 33 IMPs short.

Wildi and Bernier have been playing together for three years. They play a standard system except for 12-14 notrumps.

Wildi's wife Suzanne is considered by many to be the best woman player in Quebec City, but she prefers social bridge to highly competitive duplicate.

As publicity chairman for the NABC, Suzi Subeck has been extremely busy trying to keep you informed of tournament happenings. Here, she demonstrates her card-playing skill on Board 2 from the first session of the Life Master Pairs.

As many of you know Suzi is not a "shy" bidder. When you bid a lot you must play the cards well. The auction (with Suzi as North):

The opening lead was the singleton ♦8. West won and returned the ♦10, which was trumped by East, who now led ace and a spade to Subeck's king. Suzi trumped a diamond while East discarded his last spade. Subeck next shortened her trumps by ruffing a club back to her hand. Next she led a trump to dummy, felling East's jack. Suzi returned to her hand with a second club ruff, cashed the ♠Q and trumped a diamond in dummy. The end position:

Subeck led the ♠J and showed her hand to West — making 4♥ doubled for +790 and 63 out of 64 possible matchpoints.

Keycard Blackwood and Beyond

I took a walk down the street yesterday with one of the bridge world's favorite writers, Eddie Kantar, and he told me he was currently working on the third edition of Roman Keycard Blackwood. My publishing firm published the first edition of this book and, having proofread the thing a number of times, I thought I had seen the last of this subject -- but this convention seems to be evolving. Board 20 of Friday afternoon is a good example.

At many tables, the auction began with two passes and a 2♣ opening by East. West has a 3♣ positive (especially if his partnership uses 3♣ as a double negative on the next round) and now East has a chance to use the Grand Slam Force, jumping to 5NT over 3♣. If partner has two of the top three club honors, 7♣ is likely to be a fine contract. The board was played in matchpoint events, however, where there's a premium for playing in a major or notrump. So East, at matchpoints, should probably bid 3♠ to get more information.

Upon hearing 3♠, West has a perfect Blackwood hand. His partner has shown a strong two-bid in spades and he has controls in every suit. Many in this situation play the jump to 4NT as Roman Keycard Blackwood for spades, the last bid suit.

Finally, we get to East's problem (we should all have such problems!) East has all the keycards and the queen of trump, yet his partner is asking for keycards! One player told me that her partner (East) bid 5♠ over 4NT, showing 2 or 5 keycards plus the queen of trumps. But she (West) had never heard of this nuance. So I checked with the authority. What would Eddie bid over 4NT with the East cards?

Eddie: "Yes, 5♠ does show 2 or 5 with the trump queen, but I would bid 7NT. If partner is asking for aces and I have this hand, he must have all the rest."

So common sense takes precedence over science. But then Eddie pointed out that the trouble on this deal occurred when North opened 3♥ in front of East. In these cases the bidding usually went:

Now if West bid 5♣, East might try 5NT. But is this the Grand Slam Force? And even if it is, will he convert 7♣ to 7NT? Preempts definitely hurt. Another thought is that West might preempt first.

West's 3♣ opener preempts a preempt. East forces with 3♠ and West cuebids 4♥. West might cuebid 4♦, but some play that the singleton is bid first in this type of auction, since an outside king or ace is rare. Now what does East bid? According to the book, he bids 4NT, Keycard for spades, despite owning all the keycards. Then he rebids 5NT to SHOW partnership possession of all the keycards plus the queen of trump and this allows West to jump to seven "with a source of tricks." This auction works splendidly here, and East can convert 7♠ to 7NT, knowing partner's source of tricks is in clubs. By the way, East should lay down the ace of clubs first in case South holds four clubs to the jack-ten.

A final thought: I once discussed the idea of playing "zoom" in Roman Keycard auctions. "Zoom" applies when you want to show your keycards instead of asking partner for them; you do this by bidding at the five level over 4♥, pretending that your partner has bid 4NT. For example, in our last auction, over West's 4♥ cuebid East wishes that partner would use keycard, so that he could show five keycards and the queen of trumps. To get his wish, he "zooms" to 5♠ over 4♥ to say "This is what I would have bid, if you had bid 4NT."

I mentioned this idea to Eddie to see if he would like to include it in the third edition of the book. Eddie turned to me and said, "Matthew, that's for the twentieth edition."

Appeals deposit rescinded

The ACBL Board of Directors has rescinded the regulation requiring a \$50 deposit for any appeal filed in an NABC+ event at an NABC. In the past, whenever such an appeal was found to be lacking merit, the \$50 deposit was forfeited and donated to the ACBL Education Fund. Appeals Committees at NABCs are now empowered to issue a special kind of points (see below) for appeals lacking merit.

New Point System for NABC Appeals

A new point system for tracking appeals without merit is being adopted for use at NABCs beginning here at the Summer NABC. This system is modeled after point systems used by state Motor Vehicle Bureaus. It will enable league officials to deal more effectively with players having a history of multiple convictions for filing appeals lacking merit.

Under this system the string of offenses can be dealt with as a pattern of abuse of the appeal process. Until now each incident has been treated as an isolated infraction. Appeal Without Merit Points may be issued to players (and their team captain, if the appeal was filed in a team event) by an Appeals Committee whenever it is judged that the appeal lacks substantial merit and it is deemed that the player(s) involved possess the experience to have known better than to file the appeal.

The accumulated points will form a record of the frequency of such offenses so that, should the players commit infractions of a similar nature in the future, a Conduct and Ethics Committee will be in a position to take appropriate disciplinary action. An official record of all Appeal Without Merit Points will be kept by the ACBL Office of Recorder and will be readily available and accessible at all NABCs in the future. Points may be assessed for appeals filed in any event held at an NABC.

Players should be aware that filing an appeal requires the concurrence of both members of the pair, or the team captain in a team event. Players or team captains who fail to exercise their right to prevent an appeal which they believe to be non-meritorious from being filed are considered to have concurred with the appeal. They are subject to the same point assessments as the player who actively pursued the appeal.

The level of the player(s) involved in an appeal will always be considered before Appeal Without Merit Points are assessed. Novices or inexperienced players will almost never be assessed such points while those with more duplicate experience will be held to a higher standard. Experts will be held especially responsible for not abusing the appeal process.

A written description of the offense, suitable for use in a future disciplinary hearing, must accompany each point assessment. The Appeals Committee Chairman's case report will be used for this purpose.

If a player accumulates three (3) or more Appeal Without Merit Points within a three-year period a disciplinary hearing may be scheduled by a National Appeals Committee Co-Chair, the Director of Appeals, or the ACBL Recorder. This hearing should be held at the NABC at which the third "precipitating" point was assessed if possible, or at the next NABC which the player attends otherwise. Where a hearing at an NABC is impractical or would involve an unacceptable delay, the charges may be referred to the player's home Unit or District judicial body for possible disciplinary action. At the hearing the player must show reason why they should NOT be sanctioned for exhibiting a pattern of abuse of the appeal process. A charged player is entitled to all of the rights due any defendant in a C&E proceeding including (but not limited to): representation by counsel, receipt of written notice of the charges, and the right to call witnesses in his own defense. He should also be provided with documentation for all of the points accumulated and included in the charges.

Disciplines which may be imposed by C&E Committees in Appeal Without Merit cases shall include those specified in section 5 of the ACBL Code of Disciplinary Regulations. These include: reprimands, probation, suspension, exclusion from events, and reduction or forfeiture of masterpoints or tournament rank or disqualification.

Only points assessed within the most recent three years shall count toward "triggering" a disciplinary hearing.

Picking our spots: how cities are chosen to host NABCs

Part 1

It has been nine years since Chicago hosted an NABC. In the meantime, the ACBL has conducted tournaments all over North America -- from Boston to Seattle, San Diego to Miami Beach and Minneapolis to Albuquerque.

In the fall, the ACBL will set up shop in Orlando. Next spring, the show will go to Vancouver BC for the second time.

You may be wondering how a city is selected to host an NABC. Nancy Foy, ACBL's director of meeting services, explains how it works.

Question: What do you look for when you're searching for a place to host an NABC?

Answer: There's no one answer to that question, but we take a number of factors into consideration.

On the short list, it's most important that the hotel or convention center have suitable playing space. That doesn't just mean enough square footage to hold all the card tables we'll need. It means that the meeting space breaks down into rooms appropriately sized for the different events at an NABC, that the lighting is at least adequate, that the atmosphere is esthetically pleasing and that sound won't bounce all around the room.

Second, will players enjoy the city? We look for cities that offer full-service and lower-cost hotels, a variety of shops and restaurants and other attractions such as theme parks, golf and touring opportunities.

Next, we must consider cost. Since many of the cities bridge players enjoy -- such as Chicago -- are more costly, we will never be able to get an \$89 room rate in a convention hotel that could host a tournament as large as an NABC. Our goal is to negotiate rates that are comparatively lower than they would be for other convention groups or individual travelers. We must also offer destinations that are less costly for players who might never go to an NABC if they were always held in top-tier, somewhat expensive destinations. That's why you'll see cities like Kansas City, Cincinnati and yes, even Birmingham, on the schedule.

Q: Since you mentioned Birmingham, some people don't think it's such a great idea to go there. Why did you recommend it to the ACBL Board of Directors?

A: Birmingham is scheduled for November 2000 and falls among three great destinations -- Anaheim in the summer of 2000, Toronto in the summer of 2001 and Las Vegas in the fall of 2001.

We knew whatever we scheduled in the fall of 2000 and spring of 2001 would likely be a bit smaller in terms of attendance, so we looked for cities with strong local support -- by the local bridge community and by the city's hospitality industry. We wanted a location that would offer lower hotel rates for players and lower overhead costs for ACBL.

The Birmingham Sheraton Hotel is connected to the convention center where we'll be playing and is as fine a convention hotel as can be found. The room rate will be less than \$85 in 2000, and another hotel across the street from the center will be offering a rate in the \$50 range. The city offered the convention center on a complimentary basis and is supplying carpeting for the exhibit hall at no cost to ACBL. Southwest Airlines serves Birmingham, so you can get there easily and inexpensively.

Birmingham is a large regional medical center. As a result of all those doctors in town, the city offers a wide range of restaurants and boutique shopping areas that are just delightful. The local bridge players made it very clear that they want to show off their home town and welcomed the opportunity to host an NABC. They've raised quite a bit of money to add to the funds ACBL provides and plan to ensure that no one goes home disappointed.

Q: You mentioned room rates. How can you be sure we have the best room rates?

A: You do your research and ask lots of questions. Many hotels will do a printout that shows what rates other groups have during the same time of year or they'll refer me to another meeting planner for a reference and I'll ask what their rate was. I'll even ask other hoteliers in the city what their best rate is to see

if our host hotel's rate is not just competitive, but better for us.

Q: Any guarantees?

A: As a matter of fact, yes. Our standard contract includes a clause that asks the hotel to guarantee that we have the lowest publicly offered rate in the hotel.

Q: Publicly offered?

A: Well, many hotels have corporate or airline crew contracts that are incredibly low and which they could not match for a large group. Those rates, however, are not available or sold to the public -- only to those who work for that particular business or airline.

Q: What about entertainment cards?

A: Oh, yes. Hotels sell rooms in similar fashion to the way airlines sell seats. You may pay \$500 for your ticket and the guy sitting next to you paid \$750, but the guy on the other side paid \$250. Hotels want to achieve an average daily rate -- some rooms are higher, some are lower -- but mostly they want to sell rooms. A hotel may put aside a few rooms to be sold at a great discount as with an entertainment card, but that would generally be available only when the hotel has plenty of rooms to sell. They would never sell more than a limited number of rooms at such a discounted rate.

Q: Didn't some people have lower rates at the Reno Hilton?

A: Yes, they did. Because of the nature of the gaming business, casino hotels will generally not guarantee the lowest rate. Let's face it -- they're giving away rooms. While we had the lowest group rate, some people called the casino directly and got lower rates. Dealing with a casino is far different from dealing with other convention hotels. Casinos earn most of their revenue from gaming, whereas convention hotels earn most of their revenue from selling guest rooms, so casino hotels are less concerned about their average daily rates. They're happy as long as they fill their rooms with guests and their casinos with gamblers.

We also have to deal with the way hotels keep their inventories. It's another situation comparable to buying airline seats, but as you get closer to arrival, hotels generally discount their rooms. Airlines increase the price of seats as the departure date nears, but no matter how far out you book your seat, they will sell only a certain percentage of their seats at the low supersaver fare.

At the Reno Hilton, we had 1200 rooms blocked for ACBL at \$79. Some folks got \$59 rates. The Hilton sold only about 50 rooms at \$59. For every one they sold at \$59, believe me, they sold another at \$99. Their normal rates range from \$49 during the week up to \$119 on weekends, so for a group as large as ours, \$79 was a great rate.

Steve could have doubled instead of bidding 5♦, but he decided on the overcall because the suit was a six-carder. It looks as if West had a double, but he was much better off passing since he didn't find the killing opening lead -- the ♥A followed by a second heart.

Instead he led the ♣10, taken with the queen. Steve cashed the ♦Q, noting the fall of the 9 from East. Next came a heart to West's ace, and West continued with his other club. Steve took this in hand and cashed his two top diamonds. Then he led another diamond to drive out the jack. He won the heart return and ran the rest of his red cards. As he cashed his last trump, he was left with a club and the ♠8 in his hand and the ♣A-9 in dummy. East had to make a discard holding the ♠9 (he had discarded all his high spades, hoping declarer didn't notice that the 9 was still out) and the ♣J-8. No matter which card he discarded, Steve had the remaining tricks -- 5♦ bid and made.

Why did he wish he had had the deuce of spades instead of the 8? Because of the thrill he would have experienced taking the last trick with the good deuce in a suit that had never been led.

Novices ask questions -- Rodwell answers them

When you're a novice and you have a bridge problem, wouldn't it be wonderful if world champion Eric Rodwell were there to answer your questions? Well, that's exactly what happened yesterday at the Novice-Intermediate reception. Rodwell spent a full hour on the podium answering all manner of questions concerning problems encountered by novices and intermediates at this NABC.

As most people know, Rodwell plays some of the most involved methods to be found anywhere in the world. But you wouldn't know it from the way he answered. He kept his answers simple, using the bids and terminology familiar to his audience.

David Silber, the new CEO for the ACBL, welcomed the crowd, but left the podium after a few words to leave more time for Rodwell to answer questions.

As your reporter wandered about the room, he met several interesting people. The first were Sandra Silver and Charles Gianasi of Chicago, both 0-5 players.

Sandra has been playing bridge a long time. She used to have a bunch of friends who just loved to play card games -- any card games. If she wanted to be a part of the group, she had to play cards. So she did -- and she liked it. For many years she played social bridge, but then she met Charles, and they decided they wanted to try the challenge of duplicate.

Chris learned the game from her parents. Quite often she heard the words, "Come on, Chris, we need a fourth." Later she and her husband and a couple of friends started reading books on the game, then playing a few

hands to practice what they had just read. "But that ended -- we moved on but they didn't."

"Once I discovered this was a game of skill," said Jim, "I had to keep on playing. The mental challenge is a thing of wonder."

Carel gives a great deal of credit for the success of the partnership to Raymond Fortin, who has represented Canada internationally. Fortin helped them build their system and has given them the benefit of his experience. They play a modified form of Kaplan-Sheinwold.
