Said, Russell capture Silver Ribbon Pairs

Chuck Said and John Russell, who placed eighth in last year's event, won the Silver Ribbon Pairs last night and immediately made a date to defend their title next year.

They scored 1198.34 matchpoints to 1182.89 for runners-up Nell Cahn and Becky Rogers. Marvin Talish and Chuck Lamprey were third with 1174.02.

The Silver Ribbon Pairs is limited to players 55 and older who have pre-qualified by placing first or second overall in regional- or national-rated Senior events.

Said, a bridge professional from Nashville, won his second North American championship. He was the victor in the Senior Knockout Teams in 1994.

This was the first NABC win for Russell, a CPA who lives in South Barrington IL.

The pair has played together only four times: the Silver Ribbon Pairs last year, a two-day practice session at the Louisville regional and the Silver Ribbon Pairs here.

Sue Emery, beloved editor of the *ACBL Bulletin* for 24 years and a top-flight regional tournament director before that, was honored by her myriad friends at yesterday's Goodwill Committee reception.

When she was introduced after speaker after speaker extolled her, Sue got a standing ovation. She looked at the admiring crowd for a moment, then said, "I guess I'm not as blind as I thought -- I can see all your smiling, loving faces."

Connie Phillis, her daughter, put it well. "My mother taught me to live with zest, love from the heart and grieve with dignity." Then, with a twinkle in her eye she added, "But she never taught me to cook." After everyone stopped laughing, she added,

Some people don't like to take credit for their good plays -- so in deference to their wishes we will not give East-West the billing they deserve.

Bd: 28 ♠ K 10 8
Dir: West ♥ J 10 7
Vul: N-S ♦ A Q 10 9 7
♣ 8 5

♠ 7 3 2 ♠ A Q 5
♥ Q 9 6 5 ♥ K 8 2

East showed his balanced 18-19 count, but 1NT was a precarious spot on a diamond lead. Declarer won the king and found the ingenious play of the ♥K. You can hardly blame South for ducking this trick, which would have been the right play had declarer held K-J-x or K-10-x.

As it was, though, East led a heart to the queen and played a third heart. South took the ace and exited with a spade to the king and ace. Three rounds of spades put North back on lead to cash two diamonds and get out with a club. Again it was easy for East to cover this with the 10. South won and took the 13th spade, but then had to play a club away from his king. That gave declarer his seventh trick for plus 90 and 22 matchpoints out of 25.

"And she never taught me to play bridge."

Aileen Osofsky, chairman of the Goodwill Committee, said as she opened the meeting, "I'm so crazy about Sue -- she's like my mother." She recalled that Sue was the first person she honored with an honorary appointment to the Goodwill Committee.

Aileen, after pointing out that there were many men, and women, in Sue's life, introduced three men who have been very much a part of Sue's life.

Charles MacCracken, National Tournament Director who worked in the Memphis office for many years, told how he first met Sue. "It was at a regional in Lubbock. Jim Linhart picked her up and held her at his eye level -- I was looking at Sue's knees.

"We came to Memphis at the same time," Charley went on. "It didn't take me long to realize that Sue is the epitome of what this organization is all about. She is a super partner and a great opponent. She welcomes opponents to her table, then rends them tooth and claw."

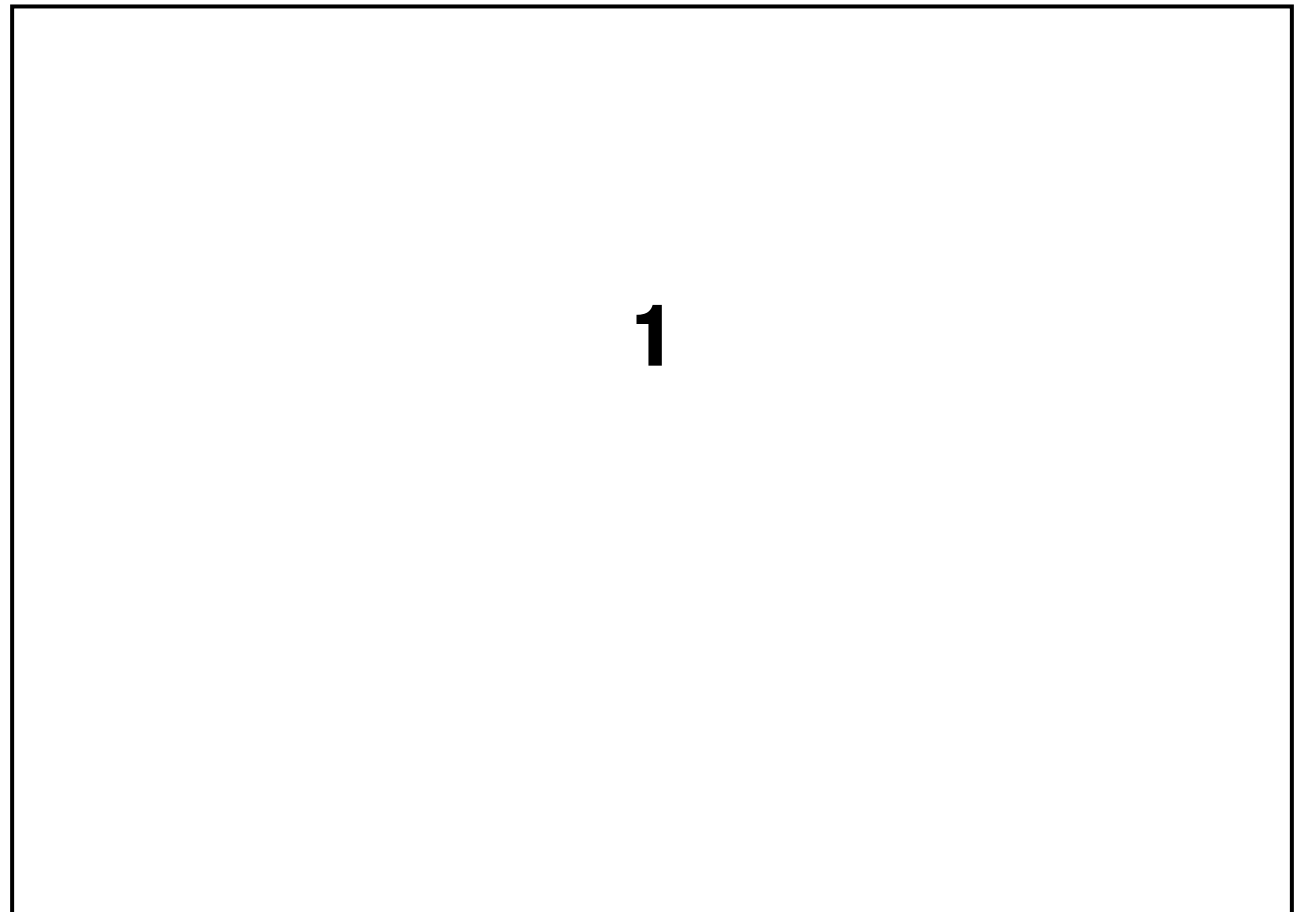
He told how great she has been with young kids -- the college boys always loved her. He also told of her incredible work ethic -- "she never quits until the job is done."

Dan Morse, district director for District 16 (Texas and Mexico), told how he and Sue used to celebrate their birthdays together when she lived in Texas. "We were both born on February 23, and we used to have some great times. In bridge we had a perfect record. We went to a sectional and we won. We went to a regional and we won. But then Sue became a tournament director and I didn't get the chance to play with her again."

Henry Francis, Sue's boss throughout her *Bulletin* career, said it's like a different world to go into the office and not see Sue at her desk. "After almost 25 years of unity, it's tough to suddenly be, well, alone."

According to Henry, "Sue did not fit the mold when it came to bridge personalities. She was a mother to dozens of bridge players and fellow workers. And that is not an exaggeration -- just ask all her bridge children who actually addressed her as Mother."

Henry also told the circumstances under which Sue left Texas and moved to Memphis. "Her husband Big John was the reason Sue came to Mem-

phis. Big John died in 1972 at just about the time the ACBL was moving from Greenwich, Connecticut, to Memphis. Sue and Big John did all the Texas tournaments together, and the idea of going to Houston and Austin and San Antonio and Dallas without Big John was devastating to her. So she decided to change careers -- she switched from directing to editing and from Texas to Memphis."

Her daughter Connie remembered that she got go everywhere because of her mother's bridge activities. "And we were always blessed with good friends. I have made an endless number of friends through my mother."

Sue was presented with several key mementos -- (1) A *Bulletin* with her face on the cover; (2) a scrapbook full of messages from friends (in large type because of her sight problems) and photographs from all through the years; and (3) a sound track with voice messages from dozens of her friends.

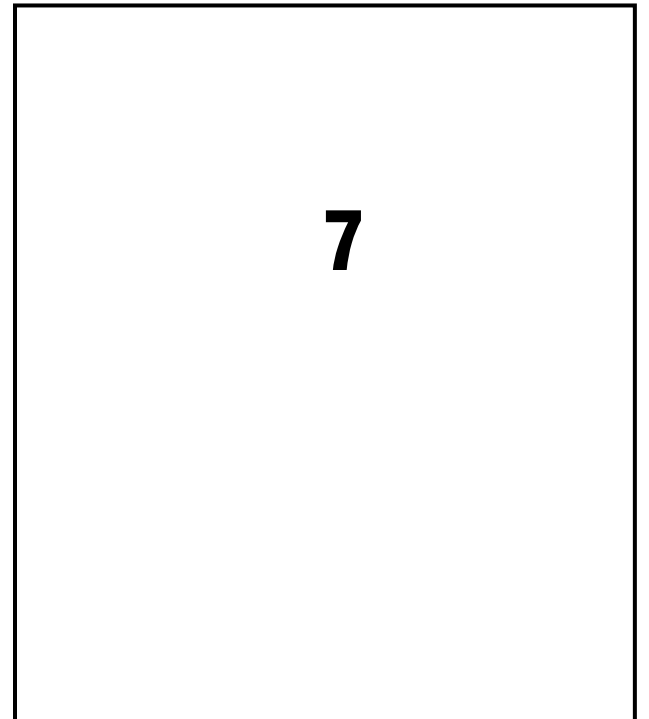
Aileen opened the meeting with tributes to bridge greats who are no longer with us -- Alfred Sheinwold, Kate Buckman and Iona Sutton. Said Aileen, "Iona was Sue's first bridge partner and they won their first masterpoints together."

She also introduced Judy Kay as a new co-chairman of the Appeals Committee.

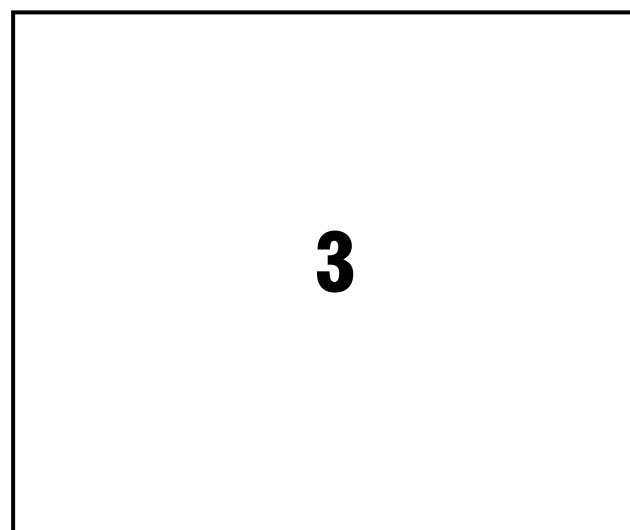
Carol Sanders, president of the ACBL Charity Foundation, told of a special donation made recently by the foundation. "The Foundation donated \$5000 to the Age-Related Macular Degeneration Foundation in Sue's honor," she said. That is the disease that has rendered Sue almost sightless.

Aileen congratulated the Toronto area and District 25 for the strong stand they have taken against rude behavior -- a Zero Tolerance program.

ACBL President Howard Pilch termed Sue "one of the nicest persons in the world -- she knows the true value of friendship."

\$50 deposit for appeals, but only NABC events

Anyone wishing to file an appeal in a North American championship game must put up a deposit of \$50. The purpose is to prevent players from making frivolous appeals. If the committee finds that an appeal is totally without merit, the committee will keep the money and donate it to the ACBL Educational Foundation.

This applies only to appeals in North American championships, not to appeals of regional or sectional ranking.

went over by winning his second-round Vanderbilt match yesterday.

Passell, a 22-year-old enlisted man in the U.S. Air Force, was playing rubber bridge on a Friday night in October of 1969 at Eglin Air Force base in Fort Walton Beach FL. A fellow bridge player, Jim Barrow, happened by. "There's a regional in Daytona Beach," Barrow said.

Never mind that Daytona Beach was 400 miles away --- and that Passell had to be on duty first thing Monday morning. "Let's go," he said, and the two hit the road in Passell's Fiat Spider.

The all-night drive to Daytona Beach was made worthwhile when Passell and Barrow, unknowns at the time, won the Open Pairs in a strong field of 262 pairs. There was little time to savor the exciting victory and the nearly 40 gold points Passell won, however. Passell had to hustle back to Eglin or he was going to be in trouble.

Things looked grim when the Spider ran out of gas somewhere between Daytona Beach and the base, but Passell and Barrow were lucky enough to have made it to the parking lot of a service station. All they could do was hope it opened early the next day. It did.

"I'll never forget," Passell recalls, "being awakened the next day by a dog looking into my face."

Passell followed up that first regional championship with about 700 more over the next 28 years.

More than just a masterpoint machine, Passell has forged a reputation as one of the top professionals in the world. Besides the massive collection of regional wins, Passell owns a world championship (the Bermuda Bowl in 1979) and nearly 20 North American titles.

Passell, 49, modestly allows that the masterpoint total is mainly the result of playing a lot, but his record of consistency is remarkable. Remember, too, that when he plays it is always in the top flight or bracket.

For the past 20 years, Passell has averaged 1589 masterpoints a year, failing to top 1000 only twice, once when an injured knee kept him from traveling. On three occasions, his yearly MP total broke 2000. Over the past decade, Passell's worst finish in the *Barry Crane Top 500* has been seventh. He has been second three times.

Ironically, he has won the *Top 500* (the *McKenney Trophy* before 1985) only once --- in 1976, when his 1815 MPs broke the previous *McKenney* record by 200 masterpoints. It is worth noting that 1976 was the only year that Passell sought the *Top 500* title. "It was too much of a grind," he recalls.

When Passell joined the ACBL in 1968, he had some bridge experience but no notion that he was soon to enjoy such success in tournaments. In 1971, the year he left the Air Force, Passell won 462 MPs.

"At the beginning," he recalls, "I thought it would take me about 10 or 12 years, maybe even 20, to become a Life Master."

Passell was born in New York but moved to Florida at age five. He grew up in New Orleans, where his family moved in the early Sixties. His father, Morse, worked for Chrysler Motor Co.

From childhood, Passell was good at games. Once, when he was 10 and living in Bradenton FL, he attended a summer camp and became interested in chess when he watched a tournament. He spent the next two weeks studying the game, then talked his father into taking him to the local chess club.

"I beat everyone in the club," Passell recalls. "It was bizarre, and I sort of picked up bridge the same way."

Passell was visiting his older brother, Bill, in New York during the summer of 1963. Bill taught bridge and Mike sat in on one of the classes. His interest piqued, the 14-year-old Mike insisted on playing. Bill fixed him up with a partner in a tough game at a club in Hartsdale. Mike and his partner won both times they played.

Back in New Orleans, Passell didn't play bridge again until the summer before his senior year in

high school. He was working on a survey team in the Louisiana swamps, and his boss was a bridge player who liked to take afternoons off to go to tournaments. He chose Mike as his partner. Once exposed to the tournament arena, Passell was completely hooked. He began haunting the local duplicate clubs and driving to any sectional within reach on weekends.

Passell, in those days a lanky 6-foot-5, attended Louisiana State University on a baseball scholarship --- he played third base --- but a knee injury cut short his sports career. He also attended Tulane University in New Orleans, but college wasn't his metier, and he joined the Air Force in 1967, spending his entire enlistment as a computer programmer at Eglin.

At the base, Passell discovered that those who donated blood were granted an extra day off, which was convenient for someone who wanted to play in a bridge tournament every weekend. "I held all the records for giving blood," Passell recalls.

When he left the Air Force in 1971, Passell spent the next two and a half years in what he describes as "my Motel 6 zone." Despite having barely enough money to get from tournament to tournament, Passell and partners drove 100,000 miles a year. "I got really good at sleeping in cars," he says.

In 1972, Passell drove non-stop from a regional in Lancaster PA to another in Stockton CA. "We got there 20 minutes before game time," Passell recalls.

That same year, Passell was in Oklahoma City when he ran into Mark Lair, a struggling bridge pro, at a rubber bridge club. The two hit it off instantly and soon formed a partnership that lasted more than 20 years.

Their first tournament experience was slightly rocky, however. At a sectional in Wichita Falls TX, Passell overcalled 2♣ after an opening 1♠ bid. Lair jumped to 5♣ at his turn, and when the opponents bid 6♠, Passell doubled with visions of a huge set. When Lair pulled to 7♣, Passell got up from the table and left the hotel room.

"Big John" Emery, the director in charge, found Passell sitting on the diving board of the hotel swimming pool. It took several minutes of cajoling to get Passell back into the game.

From there, Passell and Lair formed what became one of the top partnerships in ACBL, and Lair --- a family man --- became a stabilizing influence on Passell. "Mark is a great guy," says Passell. "In my early, struggling days, his emotional support and strength of character helped me tremendously."

As Passell made a name for himself, he began to get more and more good partners --- among them Paul Soloway, Jim Jacoby, Fred Hamilton, Hermine Baron and the legendary Barry Crane, with whom he won three national Open Pairs championships.

"I loved playing with Hermine," says Passell. "She was the most fun person I ever played bridge with."

One of Passell's early partners was a fellow by the name of Joe Miller who had a most curious approach to bridge. In Miller's system, all first- and second-seat openers had to contain 15 high-card points or three and a half quick tricks. "You had to open almost anything in third seat," Passell recalls.

In the Spingold Knockout Teams, playing against the powerful B.J. Becker team, Passell picked up

Passell recalls that Becker, who was playing

with Andy Bernstein, laughed when dummy went down. "He quit laughing when Joe ruffed the opening club lead, played a heart to the ace and claimed," Passell remembers. Miller's hand:

♠8 ♥K J 7 6 5 4 3 ♦A K 9 5 2 ♣---

Passell's team lost the match and the Becker team went on to win the event. Passell was disappointed to lose, but the thrill of high-level competition left him wanting more.

Passell got his first big break in 1974, when he was hired to play on the team put together by Malcolm Brachman, a Dallas businessman. The squad for the Vanderbilt was Brachman, Passell, Paul Soloway, Jim Jacoby and Lazard.

"I was a nervous wreck," Passell recalls. "We didn't do well in that tournament, but I've had a lot of success over the years playing with Malcolm." Indeed, Passell played with Brachman on the winning team in the 1979 Bermuda Bowl in Rio de Janeiro. In fact, they were playing together when the American team, facing Italy in the final, blasted their opponents, 72-3, in one 16-board segment.

"It was unbelievably exhilarating," Passell recalls. "At one point the match got very close, and I had to go for a walk three different times."

At the Spring NABC in Norfolk in 1979, Passell met his future wife, Nancy Timberlake, who had traveled from Indiana to the big tournament. "I was told I could watch the top players," Nancy recalls. "So I kibitzed this big tall guy. I wasn't impressed."

Mike made a better impression at a tournament in Indianapolis later that year and they were married in December of 1979. They have the distinction of being the only American couple to win the Bermuda Bowl and the Venice Cup (Nancy won in 1991 with Mike as coach of the team).

Today, the Passells live in a modern subdivision in Dallas, where they spend a lot of their time with daughter Jennifer, now 14 and the leading scorer on her middle school basketball team.

Passell, who once envied Lair's settled lifestyle, now enjoys the same things. He plans his tournament schedule around Jennifer's activities and has coached her basketball and softball teams.

Passell is also handy in the kitchen --- says Nancy: "He's a great cook" --- and enjoys a weekly basketball game at the local YMCA. "I'm in pretty good shape for an old fat guy," he said.

Tournaments and masterpoints are fine, says Passell. "But family and friends are a lot more important to me now."

Among Passell's closest friends is Gene Freed, a Los Angeles physician with whom Passell has won countless regionals and the national IMP Pairs in 1988. "Gene is almost like a surrogate father," Passell says.

Passell credits Fred Hamilton with helping him develop mental toughness and for recommending Passell for some top teams. Passell and Hamilton played as partners in the 1977 Bermuda Bowl in Manila. "Fred is one of the greatest competitive bidders at high levels," Passell says.

Through the years, Passell has learned from mistakes and adjusted to the changes in tournament play, particularly regarding advances in bidding.

"In the old days," he says, "you could survive by just being a good card player. That doesn't work any more. At high levels, bidding is 80 to 90 percent of the game."

Passell has also observed marked improvements in the quality of bridge at the upper intermediate levels and higher. "You used to be able to coast into the round of 16 in the Vanderbilt or the Spingold," Passell notes. "Now there are upsets all over the place and you almost always have five or six tough matches to win. It's a tough world out there."

Passell said he has learned a lot from observing Bob Hamman and Bobby Wolff, with whom he has played on many teams in major events. "I used to be like a lot of young players you see today --- we call them steamers. If they get a bad result, they try to get it back immediately. Hamman and Wolff never let a bad result affect them."

As coach of the U.S. team in the 1991 Venice Cup, Passell honed his people skills. At one point

during a trials event, he found it necessary to go into a women's restroom to coax a player back to the table after she became upset at finding herself in a grand slam in spades with only eight trumps, missing the queen.

"I finally got her to come out and she made a great play to pick up the queen and land the slam," Passell recalls.

Passell presents an imposing figure at 6-foot-5, and his intense concentration at the table belies a friendly, approachable personality with a surprisingly droll sense of humor.

Says Freed: "He's always courteous and lovely to everyone."

Nancy adds that her husband is happy to respond to questions at tournaments. "His mind is so quick," she says. "I love to pick his brain."

One of Passell's greatest assets at the table, says Freed, is "an incredible sense of what's going on." Passell demonstrated that on this deal from a knockout teams at the 1991 Vancouver BC regional. His effort won the International Press Bridge Association prize for best defense in 1991. Passell was playing with Dennis Sorensen.

At the other table, West led the ♣Q to the king, and declarer played a diamond to the ace and a spade to the king and ace. Declarer later played a low spade to dummy's 9, losing to the jack but establishing two tricks in the suit without letting West in. Nine tricks duly made.

At Passell's table, Sorensen led the ♣Q to dummy's king. Declarer followed the same game plan, leading a diamond to his ace, followed by a spade to the king --- except that Passell followed with the *spade jack*.

Declarer was now convinced that Passell had started with a singleton ♠J or J-10 doubleton or tripleton. South returned to hand with a diamond to the king and played a spade to the queen. Passell won the ace and returned his club, allowing Sorensen to clear the suit and wait to get in with the ♠10. With diamonds breaking 4-2, the seemingly cold contract failed.

You don't pile up nearly 40,000 masterpoints without good partners and teammates, and Passell is quick to give credit. He has had considerable success playing on the Jimmy Cayne squads. In Las Vegas in 1995, the Cayne team marched through an extremely tough field in the International Team Trials to win a spot in the Bermuda Bowl.

Despite all his success, Passell is still keen to compete and mindful that it is impossible to master the game. "You never stop learning," he says.

What keeps Mike Passell going? "I hate to lose. I hate to lose more than anyone."

is caddying here.

That's not unusual -- all seven Shipley children "have caddied at some time or another -- and all the eligible grandchildren," says Shipley.

Daughter Dena caddied all through high school and college -- mostly in the Chicago area -- and worked at one NABC. During graduate school, she worked as head caddy and as a typist.

Her son Perry is working his second NABC (San Diego was his first). He first worked only at tournaments where his grandmother was directing but now caddies at sectionals and regionals around the Dallas area. "He got himself a job when I'm not here," says the proud grandmother.

Perry's spring break coincided with the NABC and he's working every session. "It's good money when you're in high school," said his mother, who dropped by Shipley's office yesterday and was pressed into service as a substitute caddy.

Is it still good money? "Not compared to what I hope to make," replied Dena, holder of a Ph.D. degree.

For Perry, the NABC is a chance to spend time with his grandparents (one grandchild refers to Bobbie and husband Dean as "Grandma and Grandpa Motor Home").

Perry and his younger brother Caleb are the only grandchildren currently interested in playing bridge. "All the way from San Diego to Dallas, Perry sat in the front (of the motor home) between Dean and me and dealt out bridge hands," said Shipley.

The grandchildren caddy just during the summer except for local tournaments and they enjoy caddying with varying results. Jeremy was a little too young, Shipley recalled. "The first time he caddied, he fell asleep during the eleventh round."

Naps aside, there's always a demand for caddies. "Lake Geneva (Wisconsin regional) never has enough caddies and there are always calls at the last minute asking how many grandchildren can you bring?"

The answer is usually two, says Shipley. "Eventually I'll retire and we'll go play some and they can go with us -- but only two at a time."

On this deal from the first session of Open Pairs I, I pictured our contract of 5♦ doubled as a sacrifice against the opponents' 4♠ game. When my partner, Jacqui Sincoff, tabled the dummy, several prospects for 11 tricks appeared.

West led the ♠6, and I took the queen with my ace. I led a diamond to dummy and called for a low club. I hoped that, after losing this trick, I could establish a club via a ruffing finesse for a heart discard. This plan would succeed when East held both honors. There was an additional chance -- East, holding the king but not the ace, might duck the first round and leave her king vulnerable to the ruffing finesse.

East, Shawn Quinn, went up with her ♣K and quickly shifted to the ♥A and a low heart. Almost as quickly I took the king, crossed to dummy with a diamond and passed the ♣Q, pitching the ♥J. West, Toby Deutsch, won her ace for down one. The ♥Q was finessable but I had been hoodwinkable.

Although I was depressed by our matchpoint score of 1.5 matchpoints on a 51 top, I was equally impressed by the alert and thoughtful defensive play.

Much ado about nothing

Feelings were running kind of high during the late stages of the Sunday Vanderbilt match at the table where Mike Lawrence and Hugh Ross were playing.

At one point Lawrence made a jump that sounded like a splinter, but he actually had a singleton in a different suit. Lawrence and Ross got to the routine slam and made it, but one of the opponents called the director and told about the non-splinter bid, saying that it was made because Lawrence was annoyed at some of the happenings at the table.

The director carefully explained that no infraction had occurred, but it took some time to resolve the situation. Finally the opponent accepted the director's ruling . . . but then Lawrence insisted on an apology.

This caused another five minutes or so of argument and controversy, but the player finally apologized. At this point the director said, "This makes me think of Shakespeare."

Immediately everyone said almost in unison, "Much Ado About Nothing!" Then Ross added, "Or maybe The Taming of the Shrew."

To which the director retorted, "Well, it certainly hasn't been Romeo and Juliet!"

The Facts: 4♠ made four, plus 420 for E/W. East Alerted West's 2♥ bid and explained that it showed a "good" (constructive) raise with three pieces of trump. In fact, the bid, according to West and later confirmed by East, showed a limit raise or better with three-card support. West stated he did not think he was entitled to bid over 2♠ because of the unauthorized information that was present from partner's explanation. He admitted he had broken tempo to arrive at that conclusion.

North, aware of the hesitation by West, felt justified (at matchpoints) to bid 3♣, vulnerable, even though his partner had taken no action over 2♠ (surely a questionable decision.) Now, when East, because of his extra trump competed to 3♠ ("The Law"), West thought he was now entitled to do what he really wanted to at his previous turn, bid again, this time by raising to four.

The Director decided that although North had chosen to ignore the break in tempo by bidding 3♣, he might have chosen to pass if he had been given the correct explanation. The Director changed the contract to 2♠ made four, plus 170 for E/W.

The Appeal: E/W appealed the Director's ruling. The N/S pair did not appear before the Committee; no explanation given. E/W, though experienced players and an experienced partnership, explained that they had recently added this 2♥ bid to their system, which accounted for East's misexplanation.

The Committee Decision: The Committee decided that the misexplanation and inadequate agreement as to what in fact was a "good raise" influenced North's decision to bid 3♣. Though aware that West was clearly considering taking some action over 2♠, the Committee decided North was sufficiently damaged to entitle him to protection.

While the Director had changed the contract to 2♠ made four, plus 170 for E/W, the Committee was divided as to what the final contract should have been. Some thought that the Director's ruling was correct, others that both the 3♣ bid and 3♠ bid should be allowed. The Committee unanimously agreed that the 4♠ bid should not be allowed. Since E/W would receive plus 170 in either case and the matchpoint result would be the same, the Committee was unanimous in its decision to award E/W plus 170 and N/S minus 170.

The Committee decided that the appeal by E/

Play in the round of 16 continues at 1 p.m. today.

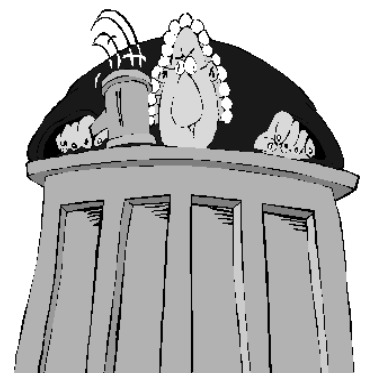
Bridge on Internet: intro to OKbridge

The Facts: 2♠ doubled made three, plus 870 for E/W. After the 1NT call, East inquired about the range, counted her points again and decided to pass after a few seconds. The length of the pause was disputed. The players were sorting their cards on the next hand when N/S called the Director and stated that they believed West's 2♠ bid may have been suggested over other logical alternatives after the alleged break in tempo. The Director ruled that West's 2♠ bid was a violation of Law 73F1 when pass was a logical alternative without the unauthorized information. The Director changed the contract to 1NT but since the result of that contract could not be determined, assigned N/S Average Plus and E/W Average Minus.

The Appeal: E/W appealed the Director's ruling. N/S, an experienced pair (about 16,000 masterpoints between them) did not appear and no explanation of how they won only four tricks was presented. West was adamant that he would always bid 2♠. The Committee asked East what action she would have taken had she held the South hand and heard her partner open 1♠ and her RHO overcall 1NT. She stated that she would just pass and would not even inquire about the opponents' range. East also stated that she needed to know North's range in order to decide her appropriate action, but also admitted that she would still have passed even if she had been told that the 1NT call was a weak takeout of the 1♠ bid. E/W, a regular but not very experienced partnership (about 350 masterpoints between them) thought that N/S's double and misdefense were the causes of N/S's poor result.

The Committee Decision: The Committee assigned Average Plus to N/S and Average Minus to E/W. Unfortunately, E/W did not graciously accept the Committee's decision. (West had walked out after hearing the first few sentences of the decision.) The Committee spent much time explaining its rationale and attempted to educate East. The time spent talking to East probably was a wasted effort. She remained unwilling to accept or unable to understand that her responses to the Committee's questions demonstrated that she had conveyed to

her partner by her inquiry and tempo that she had some values and that it was this presence of unauthorized information that made West's reopening decision easier. She still believed she was being punished solely for a hesitation. The Committee attributed the E/W attitude to inexperience.



The Committee was greatly troubled by the timing of the Director call. The Committee believed the appropriate time to call the Director was immediately after the hesitation occurred so the facts could be established and the Director could disclose to E/W their ethical responsibilities. There was some discussion about allowing N/S to retain their minus 870 result. However, the Committee recognized that N/S was in a likely position to be plus 90 until the unauthorized information facilitated the 2♠ call. Once West bid 2♠, N/S's best possible result was minus 110. The Committee decided that N/S should not be saddled with a negative score when, but for unauthorized information, they may have obtained a plus score. Nevertheless, the scenario smacked of "double-shot" tactics.

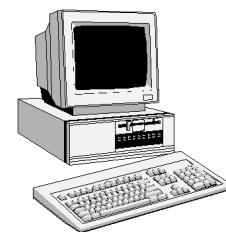

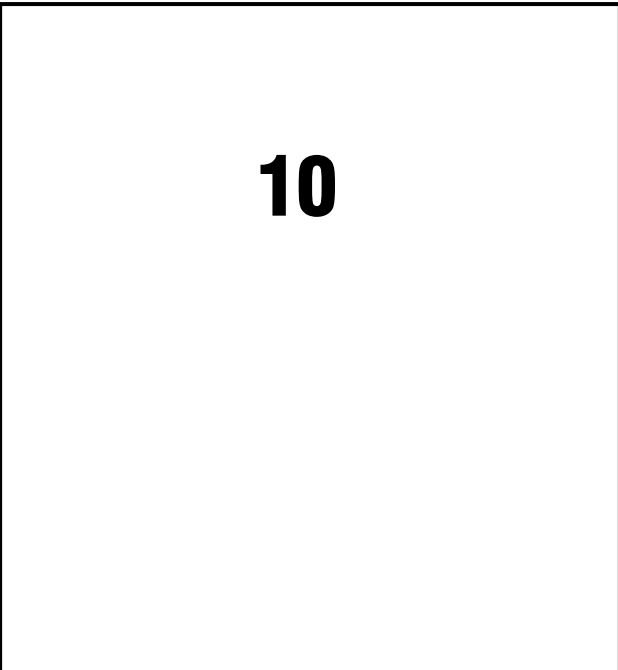

 Said-Russell were seventh after two qualifying sessions Sunday and second after yesterday’s first final session. With one round to play in the second final session, Said-Russell were first and Cahn-Rogers were seventh.
 Their second-place finish clears the way for Cahn-Rogers to compete in the Women’s Team Trials, scheduled later this year. The pair had been asked to augment the Women’s Board-a-Match Teams (Fran Dickman, Jyme Schmieder, Diane Shannon and Sherie Greenberg, who had played four-handed when they won the title at the Fall NABC in San Francisco).
 Cahn, who won the Venice Cup in Yokohama, Japan, in 1991, qualified automatically as a former world champion but, according to ACBL regulations, Rogers would have to place first or second overall in a national event here at the Dallas NABC. She has done so.

The Alert strip

It is ACBL policy to have players tap the Alert strip and say Alert out loud at the same time. When an announcement is made, once again the player should tap the Alert strip.
 When using spoken bidding, players are required to announce and Alert aloud. If there is some reluctance about complying, players should summon a tournament director rather than get into a hassle with an opponent.

Morse, North, led a club, which was ducked to Gunnell’s king. He got out with a club to the queen, and declarer lost a spade finesse to the king. Once again Gunnell exited with a club as declarer pitched a heart. He drew trumps with the ace and jack and led a heart.

Gunnell, fearing an endplay, put in the king and declarer won the ace. He led a heart and finessed the 10. Gunnell took his jack and immediately led back a heart, pinning declarer in his hand. Declarer had to break diamonds away from his ace-queen, so he lost two diamond tricks for down two.
