This is part of a series of profiles of tournament directors working at NABCs.

When the ACBL asked Linda Mitchell to work the 2006 Fall NABC in Honolulu, she was only too happy to make the trip from her new home in Scottsdale AZ. After

all, the big tournament would give her a chance to reunite with a lot of good friends she made during her 36 years in Hawaii.

She moved from Hawaii to Arizona less than a year ago, shortly after retiring as a school teacher last December. The decision to relocate came out of the blue, pretty much the way she ended up in Hawaii in 1969.

Originally from Providence RI, Mitchell attended Michigan State University in East Lansing, earning a teaching degree. She had been living in the Detroit area for about 15 years when she decided to drop everything and move to Hawaii.

"I got tired of chipping the ice and snow off my car windshield," she says. "It was pretty much of a lark."

She and her husband at the time packed up their belongings and made the trip across the ocean to their new home, where Mitchell began a career teaching technology and language arts to gifted and talented students.

Bridge was also a big part of her life. Taught the game by her bridge-playing parents, Mitchell still remembers sitting on a stack of telephone books, filling in while her mother made coffee for her social bridge group.

When she was 17, Mitchell's father took her to play at a bridge club in Dearborn MI. "We came in first," she says, "and I was hooked."

She played bridge through college. "I really shouldn't have," she says. "I should have been studying."

New ACBL President plans emphasis on newcomers



Sharon Fairchild remembers the first time she left the newcomer game at her bridge club near Toledo OH and entered the scary world of the "big" game.

"My knees were knocking," she recalls, "and I thought I was going to have a heart

attack."

When she and her partner finished in the middle of the field, her confidence received a big boost, and she was ready for more. She recalls thinking, "I can do this."

As she prepares to begin a 12-month stint as ACBL president, Fairchild is mindful that many inexperienced players do not have such a positive start — through no fault of their own but because of a less-than-pleasant encounter with one or more "better" players.

During her term as president, Fairchild plans to emphasize ways to assure that the new player experience is uniformly pleasant.

"I want to help them get the maximum out of what we offer," says Fairchild, a resident of the Cleveland area who is finishing her third term as the District 5 representative to the ACBL Board of Directors.

Bridge has been a major part of Fairchild's life for a long time.

The native of Denver who spent the early part of her life in Cincinnati was taught bridge by her parents. "They taught both older kids to play so they would always have a foursome," she says.

She earned a degree in languages at the University of Dayton, marrying Stan Fairchild right out of college. She had played some bridge in college but wasn't familiar with duplicate until she and some friends in the Toledo area "got brave and wandered off to the local club."

That happened to be the Maumee Duplicate Bridge Club. To this day, Fairchild remembers how "the players in that game were so supportive."

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Japanese players lead international contingent

The Honolulu NABC has an international flavor as players come from many countries besides the U.S. and Canada. Japanese players lead the way with nearly 200 players. Most noticeable is that about 80% of them are women.

"In Japan the men work long hours and don't take time off for bridge," said Reiko Umylny, the Japanese Publicity Chair. "That means more of the bridge players are women," she explained.

Of the 31 teams entered in the Marsha May Sternberg Women's Board-a-Match Teams, seven of them were Japanese. Three qualified for Monday's final.

"We had more teams than we expected," said

Game tries in competition

Compare these two auctions:

Auction 1

West	North	East	South
1♥	1♠	2♥	Pass
3♥	Pass	?	

Auction 2

West	North	East	South
1♥	1♠	2♥	2♠
3♥	Pass	?	

When should East bid 4♥? The answer on No. 1: when East is at the top of the range for his raise 6 to 9 (or 10) support points. West's 3♥ is a game try in No. 1 because West had the option of passing and playing in 2♥. The answer on No. 2 is that East should never bid 4♥. All West is doing is trying to get the deal played in East-West's trump suit.

What if West did want to make a game try in No. 2? West must bid a new suit. There is plenty of room over 2♠ to do this, so West should try to choose a suit that will help partner make an educated decision. Many pairs bid a suit where opener needs help – a three- or four-card suit that will have several losers unless East can provide high cards or shortness to help out.

Here are some possible hands for West, who wants to make a game try in No. 2. Remember, West cannot make a game try by bidding 3♥ because that is merely a competitive bid.

- ♠72 ♥KQJ63 ♦A5 ♣AQ64
- ♠62 ♥AKJ65 ♦K752 ♣AJ
- ♠74 ♥AKJ84 ♦Q76 ♣KQJ

On 1, bid 3♣ as a game try. On 2 and 3, bid 3♦ as a game try.

It is all well and good to show where you need help when you have room in the bidding. Sometimes you won't have room. Look at Auction 3:

West	North	East	South

What will it mean if West bids 3♠? It's a competitive bid, not a game try. To make a game

try, West can bid a new suit but there is only one new suit below 3♠, so you can't ask East to evaluate his hand by looking at any specific suit. Still, 3♥ in that bidding sequence can be treated as a general game try. It could be even worse:

West	North	East	South
1♠	2♥	2♠	3♥

We know by now that 3♠ by West is merely competitive. But if West bids any new suit, East-West are beyond the point of no return and must get to 4♠. When there is no room between your opponents' bid and three of your own suit, a solution is to agree to use the double as a game try (it has a fancy name, but don't worry about that now). The beauty of it is that East has three choices: carry on to 4♠, sign off in 3♠ or pass and convert the double to penalty when East believes North-South have bid too much. East might do this with a good minimum and only three spades and something in hearts. Please don't pull a game-try double out of your hat without prior discussion with partner or you could find you have given the opponents a top score when they make 3♥ doubled.

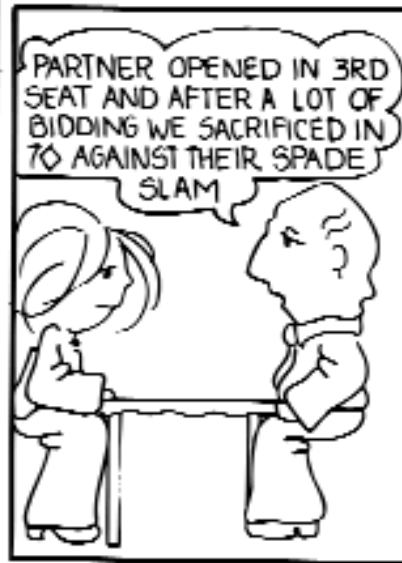
If you don't use game-try doubles in auction 3, you will be forced to guess whether to underbid and settle for a 3♠ contract or to make the possible overbid of 4♠. This may not be a huge problem because there is a lot of bidding, making it less likely that you have a game anyway. While being forced to guess on the few hands where you might have game isn't ideal, sometimes it is best to opt for simplicity because every convention you add increases the

complexity of your system and gives you more room for misunderstandings – especially with new partnerships.

Years ago, in his book *The Secrets of Winning Bridge*, Jeff Rubens gave this advice about conventions (you may have heard it about commas, too) "When in doubt, leave it out." It's my advice, too. Use a simple, consistent system and play your cards well and you will win your share of the time.

Opening lead: ♠Q.

Bidding commentary: Playing "support doubles," North's raise to 2♥ shows four hearts, while a double of 1♠ would shown three hearts. Not playing support doubles, a single raise (as

many play) can show three or four hearts. In any case, South, with a double fit (an upgrade), has a clear cut 4♥ bid.

Lead commentary: Suits headed by the Q-J-9 are normally strong leads. East signals encouragement with the ♠8, the highest equal, at trick one.

Play commentary: The North-South hands have "mirrored" (identical) distribution. Mirrored distributions lead to strip and endplay strategies. Declarer wins the ♠A, draws trumps, strips diamonds from the opponents' hands and exits a spade hoping for something good to happen in clubs.

Defensive commentary: After declarer strips the hand and exits a spade, East wins the ♠K and should have a count of the four hands. Partner has shown out on the third round of each red suit and needs five spades for the overall. Translation: South has exactly three clubs, and three club tricks are needed to defeat the contract. Furthermore, East can lead clubs only once. East must project West to have the A-Q-J-x and lead the ♣10. This lead prevents South from ducking the trick into West, forcing a club lead from the ace.

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children, and she used the duplicate games to help relieve the stress of being a full-time mom. Her husband encouraged her to get out and interact with people. "It was therapeutic for me," she says.

She became involved with bridge administration while the family was living in Toledo – they have been in the Cleveland suburb of Rocky River since the early Eighties.

Fairchild was asked to run for the Unit 105 board in Toledo and became facilities manager for a three-site regional. It was, in a sense, her first job. "It was fun," she says.

In the Cleveland area, she became even more heavily involved with Unit 125, serving in a variety of offices, including three terms as president, and running the Rock 'n' Roll and All-American Regionals in alternate years, which she has been doing for a long time. She will take a break from those duties while she takes care of her responsibilities as ACBL president in 2007.

Fairchild says the role of ACBL president attracted her because "I love meeting players and talking to them – and I enjoy organizing things."

She says she hopes to spread the message of how important it is for more advanced players to make sure newcomers enjoy themselves. "It's the only way for us to grow. It's one of the most positive steps better players can take. We would grow by leaps and bounds if we could keep all the players who try the experience."

Away from bridge, Fairchild enjoys spending time with the family – she and Stan have three children, sons Brian and Evan and daughter Vicki. The eldest, Brian, has two children – Aaron and Tara.

She is also an enthusiastic fan of the three major sports teams in her home town – the Cleveland Indians of baseball, the Cavaliers in the NBA and the NFL Browns.

During her year as president, Fairchild plans to travel a lot and mix with the players. She is a Gold Life Master with about 3000 masterpoints.

With Stan's support – "I couldn't do it without him," she says – Fairchild plans to carry her message throughout ACBL-land: keep the newcomers happy. She says: "I want them to feel really wanted."

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Mitchell's bridge career was on hold more or less until the move to Hawaii, and after she and her husband divorced she found that she had a lot of partners among the many friends she had made, "especially in Kailua."

Two of her friends, Eunice Towne and Joe Baker, encouraged her to learn to be a director, a decision she is glad she made. She now works part time as a TD for the ACBL.

"It's a people-oriented type thing," she says, "and it's an unusual job."

When she retired from her teaching job last year, Mitchell says, she decided "it's time for a new adventure," so she packed up again and headed for Arizona.

From that home base, she has been doing a lot of traveling, one of her favorite pastimes. She just returned from a trip to Europe, covering the Czech Republic, Germany, Hungary and Austria.

She has thoroughly enjoyed revisiting her longtime former home. Just the other day, she says, she went out onto her balcony and took in the ocean view. "I said, 'Oh, my gosh, this is really something.'"

Opening lead: ♦3.

4♣ made four, plus 130 to North-South.

Director ruling: 3♦ by East, down one, East-West minus 50.

Committee ruling: 4♣ making four, North-South plus 130.

The facts: North-South admitted that there was a noticeable hesitation (BIT) before South passed. East/West were not present at the hearing and the director provided no estimate of the duration of the hesitation. North/South said that the hesitation was not extensive but was noticeable.

The ruling: The director ruled that South's hesitation made the 4♣ bid more attractive and was demonstrably suggested by the BIT and that passing 3♦ was a less successful logical alternative (LA). Accordingly, in accordance with laws 16 and 12 C2, the director adjusted the table result to 3♦ by East, down one, East/West minus 50.

The appeal: North/South, the only players to appear before the committee, said that in their methods a change of suit by advancer shows a hand with either a good suit or a suit with support for the overcaller. North said that when she bid 2♠, she was committed to bidding again in a normal non-game forcing sequence.

South added that if the auction had been passed back to her, she would have bid 3♠, which could not be beaten.

The decision: The committee, working from the premise that there had been a BIT, started their reasoning with consideration of whether the BIT suggested a line of action to North. Suggestions that South might have been considering bidding 2NT seemed remote. It was clear that if South had a minimum 2♣ overcall without some spade support or tolerance, South would probably not have broken tempo at all. Therefore, it appears that the hesitation suggested further action – since South probably had extra shape or a little extra in HCP.

The committee then considered whether there was a logical alternative to North's bidding 4♣. Clearly, bidding 3♠ was a logical alternative, but since that bid would have achieved a superior result (plus 140), that alternative was discounted. The committee was split on whether pass was a logical alternative. However, this issue was rendered moot because it was determined that even if North had passed, the committee decided that South would clearly have bid 3♠. Thus the North/South pair would have arrived at an unbeatable and higher-scoring contract. Therefore, if a pass had been forced on North, South's further action would have resulted in a superior result for the offenders. Accordingly, the committee restored the table result.

Taking stock

It's important to be aware of what's going on and to pick up clues wherever you can. Mark Itabashi made use of his skills in that area to earn a win on this deal from the first final session of the Mitchell Open Board-a-Match Teams. He was playing with Rhoda Walsh.

East's double showed some values.

Itabashi started with the ♠J, which held the trick as Walsh played a suit-preference 2. Itabashi paused to take stock.

The auction indicated that West had a long diamond suit, but his initial double gave a strong clue that he also held four hearts. If so, Itabashi reasoned, Walsh had at most a singleton in hearts. Accordingly, Itabashi switched to the ♥6. Declarer

won in dummy and, quite reasonably, took the diamond finesse. Itabashi won his singleton king and played a second heart, ruffed by his partner for down one and a win on the board because teammates Mark Lair and Neil Chambers bid and made 5♦ at the other table.

Hawaii for Dummies

"And the air is so soft!" You can hear people saying that a lot in the islands.

What is "soft" air? Why does Hawaii have it and, say, Chicago doesn't?

When you strip away the obvious differences: the temperature (which is quite temperate here), clarity (very few "smokestack" industries here, except our biggest one – our volcanoes), you still sense the air is gentler here.

It could be just a "sense of mind:" mix in a bouquet of thousands of flowers, add a steady little breeze, and raise the humidity a smidgeon, and you've got it!

Hawaii's air is softer. It just is!

Shimamura, one of Japan's leading players. "Before I came I thought of Hawaii as a place for a honeymoon," she said, "but after coming here I've found Hawaii is for everyone." Other Japanese players apparently feel the same way.

Bridge in Japan

Bridge is flourishing in Japan, according to Tadashi Yoshida, Secretary General of the Japanese Contract Bridge League. (The position of Secretary General is similar to a CEO.)

There are both similarities and differences between the ACBL and the JCBL. The JCBL has a masterpoint plan with black points and red points. To be a Life Master, a player needs 300 points, and 50 of those have to be red.

"We have national, regional and sectional tournaments just like the ACBL," Yoshida said.

The JCBL has a bridge magazine called *The JCBL Bulletin*. It is published six times per year. Annual JCBL membership dues are 7500 yen which translates to about \$60 per year in U.S. dollars. Players who are 70 years or older get a 50% discount. The average age of a JCBL member is between 55 and 60. The average age of an ACBL member is about 10 years older. The JCBL also gives junior players a 50% discount on entry fees to sectional tournaments.

"In Japan we have club games that we call 'local games,' or 'weekly games'" said Yoshida. "Some bridge games are held in bridge centers, which are permanent sites. They may have many games during the week. Other games are played at bridge clubs and they have one or two games each week"

"Women's events are very popular in my country," said Yoshida. "It's not uncommon for women to have long-standing partnerships of 20 years or more."

Team games are also popular in JCBL tournaments. They have Swiss, knockout, round-robin and double-knockout team games. For the largest team games at the JCBL national tournaments, the winners get 400 masterpoints that are divided among the team members. If a team has four members, each member gets 100 masterpoints. But if the team has five members, for example, then each would get 80 masterpoints.

Japan has four national directors. Two of them, Masato Suzuki and Atsushi Nakamura, are directing here.

The JCBL has a web site: www.jcbl.or.jp. At the top is a link for English speakers.

A quick look

There are many top Japanese players attending this NABC. Here are short profiles on three of them:

Tadashi Teramoto – He lives in Japan, but attends each NABC and often comes to U.S. to regional tournaments. In Dallas last April, Teramoto was on the team captained by Rita Shugart that finished tied for third in the Vanderbilt Knockout Teams. He has served as non-playing captain of Japanese junior teams.

Kyoko Shimamura – She played extensively in international competition. Shimamura first attended the world championships in 1980 and has played in each Olympiad since then. She was a silver medalist in the Pacific Asian Championship earlier this year.

Ruri Ohte – This young lady is 25 years old and has played for Japan's Junior team. She won a gold medal in the Pacific-Asian Championships in Seoul Korea.

Notice to players

Each player must have an ACBL convention card filled out and on the table. Please note that other types of convention cards, such as the WBF convention card or homemade cards that do not sufficiently resemble the ACBL convention card, are not acceptable substitutes.

Edgar Kaplan Blue Ribbon Pairs

Shattering the record for youngest pair ever to win the Edgar Kaplan Blue Ribbon Pairs, Gavin Wolpert and Jenny Ryman -- fiances who were 23 and 20, respectively, at the time of the event -- won the 2005 edition of the contest in Denver. Wolpert, of Canada, and Ryman, of Sweden, finished just ahead of German superstars Sabine Auken and Daniela von Arnim. Wolpert and Ryman have since married.

The six-session event started on Tuesday.

The event

The Edgar Kaplan Blue Ribbon Pairs ranks with the Life Master Pairs as one of the most prestigious - and toughest -- pair events on the ACBL calendar. Like the LM Pairs, the Blue Ribbon Pairs is played over three days and includes two qualifying, two semifinal and two final sessions.

Entry is restricted to winners and runners-up in regional championships -- plus high finishers in North American championships, members of current Grand National district championship teams, members of current official teams representing ACBL and the top 100 lifetime masterpoint holders.

The Blue Ribbon Pairs was renamed the Edgar Kaplan Blue Ribbon Pairs in 1999 to honor one of bridge's all-time great players, writers, administrators and *the* authority on the laws of the game.

Kaplan (1925-1997) won his first North American championship in 1953 -- the Vanderbilt -- and his last in 1997 -- the Open Swiss Teams at the Spring NABC in Dallas.

Kaplan was recognized as the world's foremost authority on the laws of duplicate and rubber bridge. He became co-chairman of the ACBL Laws Commission in 1978 and was co-chairman of the WBF Laws Commission at the time of his death.

He was named ACBL Honorary Member in 1993. In 1995 he was inducted into the ACBL Bridge Hall of Fame and the WBF Hall of Fame.

The trophy

The event is contested for the Cavendish Trophy, awarded for the National Open Pair Championship and donated by the Cavendish Club of New York in 1928. Since 1963, the trophy has been awarded to winners of the Blue Ribbon Pairs.

More diamonds

Have you noticed how many of the more interesting deals this week seem to have featured long diamond suit? After some of the earlier examples, today's exhibits, featuring mere six- and seven-card suits, are almost mundane.

This one is from the Mitchell Open Board-a-Match Teams.

East does well to lead the ♥2 to the jack and queen, ducked, and the ♥7 is covered by the 8 and 9. East clears hearts, and declarer leads the ♣J to dummy's queen, then plays the ♠8 to the queen, ♠A and ♠10 to the king.

Maybe this isn't too difficult, but an unthinking West will return a club, which presents declarer with an overtrick. He simply cashes all his black winners and squeezes East in the red suit. If West returns the ♦Q, there is no squeeze.

This next deal is from the second final session of the same event.

At the other table, East-West played a heart partscore. Declarer won the diamond lead and played three rounds of spades, ruffing, as North (Paul Hackett), discarded a club. A club to the jack and queen allowed Hackett to return a club, and John Armstrong gave him his ruff. Plus 140 was at best an average-minus board for East-West.

At our table, Andrew Robson psyched a 1NT overcall, and Rita Shugart doubled by 2♥ for takeout. Jack Mizel showed a strong hand by redoubling, and I doubled 3♦ on the assumption that Jack was strong and balanced.

We had missed our game, but the available plus 300 would have won the board.

I led the ♦6, which had suit-preference overtones, and the sight of dummy made it clear that something odd had happened. However, we messed up. Jack won the ♦A and played the ♠K, then the ♠A. At this point, he needs to cash our heart winners – I surely have precisely ace to four. That part should be achievable, but a heart to the ace, back to the king and a spade through, is down only one as my diamonds are not good enough for a promotion. Declarer ruffs the spade high, draws trumps and crosses to the ♣A to get the major-suit winners. That is down only one for minus 100 and a win for North-South.

Mind you, that would have been better than the actual continuation of a third spade. Robson ruffed high, drew trumps, crossed to the ♣A and threw his heart losers on the spades before leading a club up – plus 470.

There are two ways to get the contract two down. After the top spades, West can lead the ♥K then a heart to the ace, forcing East to lead a club through – or West can lead a low heart and hope that East can work it out for himself. As the ♣K and ♣Q could easily be switched, East may go wrong, returning a heart, so the ♥K followed by a low heart is the better defense.

Get out of the way!

On this deal from the first final session of the Mitchell Open Board-a-Match Teams, Mark Itabashi, playing with Rhoda Walsh, made an opponent pay for failing to unblock (hands rotated).

West has a tough opening lead – he doesn't want to lead either suit bid by the opponents, and leading from ♦K J 3 has little appeal, so he selected the ♠10 for his opening shot.

Itabashi won the ♠J in hand and played a heart to the queen. When that held, he tested the club suit. Three rounds of clubs showed that suit was behaving nicely, and Itabashi cashed one more club and his two top spades, reaching this position:

When Itabashi led the ♣2, West had to pitch a diamond, otherwise declarer could simply pitch a diamond from dummy and play a low heart from hand, ducking. He would then take the rest of the tricks. He took all but one anyway, however, because on the last club, West erred by not playing his ♦K. Itabashi discarded a heart from dummy and played a diamond from hand, playing low when West produced the king. West was then forced to lead away from his ♥K in the end. That was plus 490 and a win for Itabashi's team.

Cohen reports that Fantoni took five minutes to find his opening lead – a heart. Cohen wrapped up 13 tricks rather quickly, shuddering to think of his fate had Fantoni started with a low spade instead of the heart. As you can see, the defenders have 13 tricks available to them on the lead of a spade. In practice, of course, the defenders would be more likely to take their spades before playing on diamonds, limiting them to a mere eight tricks for plus 700 instead of plus 1200.

At the other table, East-West reached 6♥ off three tricks, but North-South saved at 6♠ for minus 500.

Mini-Blue Ribbon Pairs concludes today

The Mini-Blue Ribbon Pairs, a national-rated four-session event limited to players with fewer than 5000 masterpoints, got underway on Tuesday. The contest features a two-session qualifier and a two-session final today.

The inaugural Mini-Blue Ribbon Pairs was held last year at the Fall NABC in Denver. The winners were Marty Harris of Chicago IL and Jacob Morgan of Madison WI.

There is a pre-qualification requirement: players must have earned a Blue Ribbon qualification to participate.

Ruff-sluff times two

To give one ruff-sluff could be regarded as a misfortune. To give two looks very much like . . . genius?

Jon Wittes and Ross Grabel have just qualified for the Seniors. Here they are at work on defense, generating tricks from nowhere, in the Senior Knockout Teams. It was only an extra undertrick, but it was elegant nonetheless.

Wittes led the ♦Q to the king and ace. On the ♦10, Wittes dropped the ♦9, so Grabel played a spade to the 8 and ace. Declarer ruffed a diamond to hand and played a heart to the 10 and queen. The defense took two spade tricks. The defense had five tricks in with this ending:

Wittes led a diamond – the first ruff-sluff – and declarer elected to ruff low in dummy. Grabel overruffed as declarer pitched a club. Grabel then returned the 13th spade, the second ruff-sluff, as declarer pitched another club. Wittes did likewise as dummy ruffed with the ♥A. In the four-card ending, declarer cashed the ♣A and played a second club. Whether declarer ruffed high or low, the ♥7 was going to score the seventh trick for the defenders.

Entry fees

Players must be ACBL members whose service fees or dues are current in order to compete in any of the following nationally ranked events: Nail Life Master Open Pairs, Smith Life Master Women's Pairs, Reisinger Board-a-Match Teams, Keohane North American Swiss Teams, Kaplan Blue Ribbon Pairs, Mitchell Open Board-a-Match Teams, Marsha May Sternberg Women's Board-a-Match Teams and the Senior Knockouts. The entry fees for these contests are **\$18** per player per session.

Players must also be current ACBL members to play in the Mini-Blue Ribbon Pairs, Miles Non-Life Master Pairs or National 99er Pairs. The entry fee is **\$16.50** per player per session.

Regional championships are **\$15.50** per player per session for ACBL members, **\$17.50** for non-members.

All other events are **\$14.50** per player per session for ACBL members, **\$16.50** for non-members.



Who were those masked men?

Looking at all four hands, the notrump slam looks hopeless, but West, in a charitable mood, led a spade, and Grue took the ♠9 to repeat the spade finesse. He then ran six club tricks. This was the ending:

Note that East still must make a discard. If he discards a spade, Grue cashes the ♠A and ♥A, then runs the ♦8 to East for the endplay. If East discards a heart, the ♥A would force the same decision: a diamond discard would allow Grue to duck a diamond and take the rest, and if East parted with a spade on the ♥A, Grue leads a spade to dummy's ace and plays a low diamond from dummy. Curtains!

Convention card reminder

Each player is required to have a convention card filled out legibly and on the table throughout a session. Both cards of a partnership must be identical and include the first and last names of each member of the partnership.

If a director determines that neither player has a substantially completed card, the partnership may play only the Standard American Yellow Card and may use only standard carding. This restriction may be lifted only at the beginning of a subsequent round after convention cards have been properly prepared and approved by the director. Further, the partnership will receive a 1/6 board matchpoint penalty for each board played, commencing with the next round and continuing until the restriction is lifted. In IMP team games, penalties shall be at the discretion of the director.

Psych backfires

Steve Becker and Rich DeMartino had trouble exposing an opponent's psych on this deal from the Grand National Pairs, but the story has a happy ending.

When East heard his partner overcall the strong 2♣ opener with 2♠, he could hardly wait his turn to “steal the opponents’ suit,” expecting to retreat to 3♠ when 3♥ was doubled. Well, Becker didn't double. He thought 4♥ would expose the psych, but DeMartino thought differently and leapt to 6♣. Becker “corrected” to 6♦ and played there.

The psych drove them into a slam they might not have reached on their own power as it would not be pessimistic to double the vulnerable opponents in a black-suit contract. So, even though they played the “wrong” slam, they collected 940, which was worth 10 matchpoints out of 12.

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How to foil a trump stack

Mark Lair thought at first he was playing a perfectly normal 4♥ contract, but the double made him suspicious. When the defense got off to the obvious lead, instead of the most effective, he took full advantage and scored a doubled game. The deal took place in a final session of the Men's Pairs.

A diamond lead would have guaranteed a set, but the ♥Q was the actual lead. Lair let this ride around to his king, not at all happy that East showed out. He quickly cashed the top three clubs, pitching his diamond and a spade. Then he ruffed a diamond, noting the fall of the 9 from West. Next came the ♠A and a spade ruff and another diamond ruff.

At this point, Lair knew he had the hand made. West had either a club or a spade left, and it didn't matter which — he was going to be able to score another ruff. He led a spade from his hand and West ruffed with the 9. But Lair overruffed with the ace and led dummy's last club for the ruff that gave him his 10th trick, and a well-earned plus 590.

Edith Neff

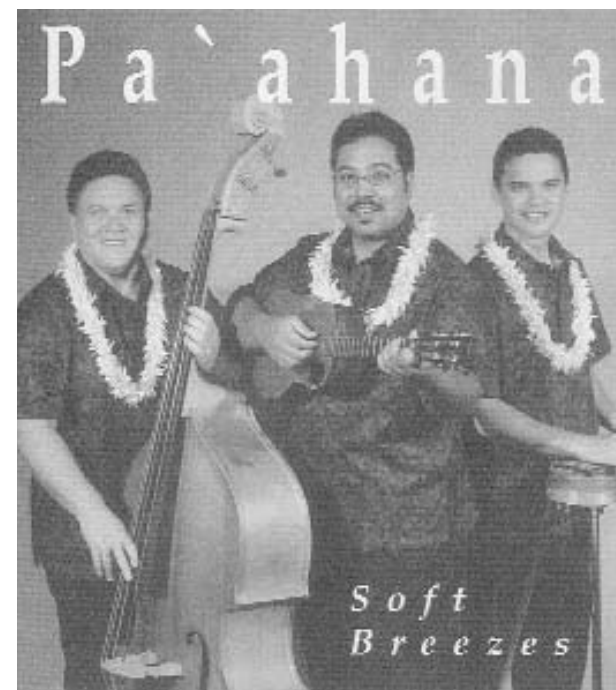
