Norman Kay honored at memorial service



Many memorable thoughts about the late Norman Kay were voiced at Monday's special memorial service to one of bridgedom's greatest stars. The one that brought tears to the eyes of many of the hundred-plus attendees was delivered by Mike Becker.

"The Twin Towers of New York will live in our memories forever," he said. "The Twin Towers of bridge were Edgar Kaplan and Norman Kay, and they too never will be forgotten."

Before saying that, Becker told how he was told long ago how easy Kay and Kaplan were. His informant added, "The problem is they don't make mistakes."

Altogether 16 bridge people with close connections to Kay spoke about their friend as Judi, Norman's wife, and Robin, his daughter, listened. The video clip of the night when Norman was inducted into the Hall of Fame was shown. Henry Francis, the master of ceremonies, read a warm tribute from George and Edith Rosenkranz, who were unable to be present.

Hemenway, Albert top Silver Ribbon

Two players from Omaha NE who have grown accustomed to the winners' circle did it again Monday, winning the Silver Ribbon Pairs by less than one-third of a board.

The win by Mike Albert and Marilyn Hemenway was their third North American championship playing together. They won the IMP Pairs in 1996 and the Senior Knockout Teams in 1997. He also has a win in the Open Swiss Teams in 1983.

Second place in the Silver Ribbon Pairs -- restricted to players 55 and older -- went to a California pair, Diane Shannon of Saratoga and Donald Rothschild of Sunnyvale.

Albert, former businessman, now spends his time teaching bridge. Hemenway is retired from her job as director of taxes for U.S. West, a communications company.

Morse, Blaiss surprised by Goodwill tributes

Any meeting that includes a limerick in tribute to Gary Blaiss can't be all bad.

In fact, Monday's Goodwill Committee reception was outstanding, featuring tributes to District 16's Dan Morse as well as to Blaiss, former chief tournament director and now a special assistant to the ACBL's chief executive officer.

Blaiss and Morse were surprise recipients of thanks for their many contributions to bridge, particularly in Texas.

Morse has been District 16 representative to the ACBL Board of Directors since 1993. Before that, he had established himself as one of the top players in North America. He has served bridge in many capacities, including representation on the World Bridge Federation executive committee.

ACBL President George Retek was among sev-

eral figures who thanked Morse for his many contributions. "It is very, very rare to find a person who combines so many things as does my good friend Dan Morse," Retek said. "He is an expert player, organizer, administrator, member of the ACBL Board of Directors and the WBF executive committee. He does everything extraordinarily well."

Another longtime friend of Morse, Dr. Gil Micheletti, regaled the Goodwill crowd with several stories of his and Morse's adventures at the bridge table, with an emphasis on Morse's skill and partnership habits. Micheletti was followed by Harris County Treasurer Jack Cato, former television newsman and another longtime Morse friend.

Cato said he and Morse started playing bridge at the same time at the University of Houston. "He

Summer NABC plans two new LM events

Two more special events for Life Masters will be added to the Summer NABC schedule for Washington DC this year. In addition to the usual six-session Life Master Pairs, there will also be a Life Master to 5000-point Pairs and a Life Master to 1500-point Pairs. The games will be played on an experimental basis for two years at which time the Board of Directors will decide whether to make the events a permanent part of the Summer NABC.

Except for the masterpoint restrictions, the condi-

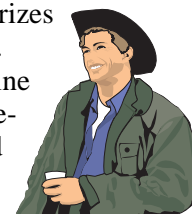
tions of contest will be identical to those for the Life Master Pairs that has no upper masterpoint limit. The maximum number of points (it could be less if the turnout is small) will be 50 for the game with the upper limit of 1500 and 75 for the event with the 5000-point limit.

If the attendance should be below 60 tables, the events will be reduced to four sessions with appropriate adjustments made to the overall masterpoint awards.

Kantar's answer: Lead a low heart at trick two. You can then win any return and cash the ♥A-K to see if the suit breaks 3-3. If it does, discard your losing club on the fourth heart. If the hearts don't split, fall back on the club finesse. If you took the club finesse prematurely or played the ♥A K and a third round of hearts rather than a low heart first (this loses if hearts are 4-2 and the ♠Q is onside), forget about having a good night's sleep. You don't deserve it.

(Morse) didn't like me much," Cato said, "because he thought I was a better player than he was, and he was right." Cato did acknowledge that things have changed a lot since that time.

Morse thanked his friends for the tribute and congratulated the organizers of the Spring NABC for the excellent tournament.

As Blaiss sat blissfully unaware in the audience, Goodwill Chairman Aileen Osofsky eased into the portion of the program dedicated to him.

"For years," she said, "I've been wanting to do something special for a special guy. The Goodwill Committee kept telling me to wait until the Houston NABC."

The reason? Blaiss spent most of his directing career in Texas.

Two of the figures who paid tribute to Blaiss were the NABC's associate chairman, Toni Snow, and former ACBL chief executive Roy G. Green.

Snow said she and Charlotte Blaiss, Gary's wife, won their first gold points together in west Texas, where she first met Gary.

At one point in his directing career, Toni related, Gary wore his hair long and in a ponytail. "Whenever he got on an airplane to go anywhere," Toni said, "they always searched his luggage for drugs." Finally, she related, someone told Blaiss that he could cut out a lot of the hassle by just cutting his hair.

Toni, a gifted limerick writer, offered this one for her longtime friend:

*There once was a director named Gary
Whose wit would disarm the unwary
Now the locks on his head
Have mostly all fled
Although his face is still hairy*

Green said that when he took over as CEO at ACBL

Headquarters in Memphis, he needed a chief tournament director. He selected Blaiss for the job and "I was and still am very pleased with my decision. Gary guided us through some difficult times, and he exemplifies the spirit of goodwill."

The pin which is symbolic of membership on the Goodwill Committee was attached to Gary's shirt by another longtime member of the committee - Charlotte.

Blaiss' only comment on the honor: "All my accomplishments, as few as they might have been, are because of the staff I have worked with."

Before the tributes to Morse and Blaiss, the Goodwill gathering heard from NABC Chairman Eric Snow, who welcomed everyone to Houston and thanked his volunteers for all their hard work.

Jay Baum, chief executive officer of the ACBL, reminded everyone that "the ACBL is the greatest bridge organization in the world. Keep that in mind and repeat it."

Baum thanked the Goodwill members for "living the spirit of what the ACBL is all about, which is spreading goodwill."

New Zealand's John Wignall, in Houston to work on possible revisions to the laws of bridge, took the podium briefly to make an offer to the bridge players at the NABC.

Wignall told the crowd of part of his speech to the Board of Governors Sunday, when he reminded them that the America's Cup (the sailing championship trophy) now resides in Auckland, New Zealand.

This was Wignall's proposal: "If I don't take away any of your masterpoints, can we keep the America's Cup? In spite of having some good partners, I'm keeping up my end of the bargain."

Albert said he came to Houston to win two events, starting with the Flight A North American Pairs. He made the mistake of flying in the same day he was to play. That, he said, ruined his game. "We didn't make the first cut," he said. "My concentration wasn't there."

Albert said the key to his and Hemenway's success lies in the bidding. "It isn't even close," he said. "You have to be disciplined and get to the right spot - and get the opponents to the wrong spot."

The two play 2/1 with 11-14 INT openers when they are not vulnerable.

Hemenway agreed with Albert on the importance of bidding in their partnership. Although their opponents probably would disagree, Hemenway said that when it comes to card play, "we're just so-so."

Marge Overly Stratified Senior Pairs

By her children

Marge played bridge with anyone, at any time, anywhere. The level of play did not matter, the game was always fun for her.

There were times when her husband, Bob, got her dander up with his bidding antics, but she was used to his "style" of play. Marge told her children they would always have friends if they could play bridge. The game allowed her to meet some of the nicest people in her life. Marge and her husband traveled all over the world during Bob's oil business career and she played bridge with other "rig widows" during the whole time. She is greatly missed by her family, her bridge partners and her opponents alike.

Carole and George Dawkins

Carole and George Dawkins died in May 2000 in an automobile accident while on vacation in Spain.

The Dawkins, who lived in Austin, were vacationing with a friend, Inez Beckley, also of Austin. Relatives said all three were killed when their car ran off a highway between Valencia and Barcelona and hit a concrete embankment.

George Dawkins graduated Phi Beta Kappa from Princeton University in 1953. He earned his PhD in chemical engineering from the University of Illinois in 1957. He worked as a chemical engineer for Shell Chemical in Houston and taught chemical engineering at Rice University, industrial engineering at the University of Houston and business operations research and statistics at St. Edward's University in Austin.

He also had two books of poetry published.

George, winner of the Mixed Pairs in 1970, was an ACBL Grand Life Master. He won more than 13,000 masterpoints and more than 60 regional titles.

Longtime friend Bob Munday remembered Dawkins: "A lot of people think of George as a university professor who played bridge. Actually, he was a bridge player who happened to teach university courses on the side."

Carole Dawkins was a Gold Life Master. After surviving leukemia and a bone marrow transplant a decade ago, she regained her health and was a successful real estate agent.

Marion Strunk of Corpus Christi remembered Carole Dawkins: "When George and Carole came to Corpus Christi for tournaments, Carole always had George stop on the way home so they could visit my father in the nursing home. Carole would also send him cards. She did this for a man she had only met once when they stayed with him during a regional."

Tim Willis Memorial Pairs

Tim Willis was born in 1913 and left us in 2000. He was married to Fran, his favorite and most frequent partner, for 59 years.

Tim began his duplicate career in 1946 and amassed more than 4,000 masterpoints. He retired from the Army in 1957 as a Lt. Col. In 1952 he helped found the Japanese Bridge League and won a championship game in that league.

When he and Fran moved to Houston, they ran the Kings and Queens Bridge Studio for 18 years. His favorite win was at the 1961 NABC in Houston when his Houston team beat the LA team in an inter-city match.

Tim played every week at the Ace of Clubs until his death. Fran continues to play.

Who needs 13 cards?

Darwin Afdahl got to 3NT, and with the help of a friendly opening lead made nine tricks. But he couldn't follow suit on the last trick. He counted his cards and found he had started with 12. A search uncovered the club deuce on the floor. Afdahl was doubly lucky - he never failed to follow suit so not playing the club deuce did not cause a revoke, and the card he was missing had no effect on the play.

In 4NT Norberto Bocchi led a heart to the king and ace. Cohen returned a heart and Norberto Bocchi won and led a third heart, leaving Cohen unsure who had the 13th heart. Anyway he won the ♥10 and cashed the ♦K-Q, prepared to claim. He was severely disappointed when Bocchi pitched a spade. At this point Cohen could infer that Bocchi had five spades. He crossed to the ♠K and passed the ♦8 to Polowan as Bocchi pitched a club. Cohen won the club return and crossed to the ♠A.

Here are brief excerpts from each speaker:

Sidney Lazard: "Norman had a remarkable will to win. He was the best partner anyone could hope to have. All the tributes we have heard today are fully deserved."

Bart Bramley: "My aunt who lived in the Philadelphia area was so proud back in 1960 when she read in the paper that her neighbor, Norman Kay, was a bridge expert. I wasn't impressed then, but I felt honored many years later when I was asked to form a partnership with Sidney Lazard and play with Edgar and Norman. One of the highlights of every tournament for me was the opportunity to go to dinner with Edgar and Norman."

Joan Gerard: "The bridge game in the sky is getting better all the time."

Gail Greenberg: "It may be true that there's no such thing as a modern saint, but we all had quite a problem when we tried to do a party roast for Norman. There just wasn't any little foible to tease him about except his slow play."

Bruce Keidan: "Thirty years ago when I had one masterpoint, the Sharif Bridge Circus was coming to Philadelphia, and I, a cub reporter, saw the chance for my first byline. I wanted to feature Sharif, of course, but I was intrigued by Norman Kay. Later I pestered Norman, trying to get an interview. I finally succeeded by following him onto a train to New York City. That was the beginning of a wonderful friendship."

Bobby Wolff: "Norman never intimidated anyone, he never needled anyone. There have been precious few like him."

Larry Cohen: "I got to know Norman and Judi through my friendship with Robin. Somehow Norman made me feel like a celebrity even though I was still a virtual newcomer to the game. That's how Norman was."

Aileen Osofsky: "Norman had a good life with his wife, his children, his work, his hobby and his friends. He was the embodiment of goodwill."

David Berkowitz: "I'm going to talk about Judi. I have found her to be domestically challenged – she uses her stove for a planter. She was with Norman all the way – they were a great combination."

Ralph Cohen: "Norman was called the Babe Ruth of bridge. Let's see what that means. We all remember Cy Young, Ty Cobb, Christy Mathewson and those

other baseball great, but when it came down to the greatest, it was Babe Ruth. That's the way it is in bridge – there have been many great stars, but when it comes down to the greatest, it was Norman Kay."

Richard Freeman – "Whenever Norman started to think, I knew he would always find the right answer. I believe I knew him longer than anyone else here, and I found him to be unfailingly kind."

Roy Green: "I remember one time when I was kibitzing Norman and Edgar. As usual Norman was giving long and careful consideration to a play, and one of the other kibitzers was getting restless. Edgar turned to him and said, 'I've put up with this for 40 years. You can do it for 15 minutes!'"

Alan LeBendig: "It's good that we remember Norman for his humanity. He was a very special person."

Alan Truscott: Alan read a poem that embodied the essence of Norman.

Brian Glubok: "Norman was a wonderful teammate. He was a pleasure to have as a friend."
