

40 ACBL Juniors to go to World Bridge Camp

The first 40 Juniors (16-25 years old) who apply and meet the requirements will be eligible to go to Poland for the 4th annual World Bridge Camp and 4th World Junior Pairs Championship. This is a great deal, thanks to the Junior Fund games run by the ACBL. The money raised in these games will be used to pay tuition, room, meals and entries for the 40 Juniors selected. The Juniors will be responsible for their own airfare.

The events will take place July 6-16. The pair tournament will take place June 6-8 in Stargard, located in the north of Poland. The camp, which will start immediately after the pair tournament, will take place at Insko, a beautiful resort about 25 miles from Stargard.

Interested Juniors are urged to get in touch with Charlotte Blaiss at ACBL Headquarters to apply for these special events.

Juniors from all sections of the world will attend both events. Those in charge set up programs that make sure of interaction of all Juniors with youngsters from other countries and other sections of the world. Quite often pairs are made up of youngsters from different countries. Many long-time friendships have been developed at earlier Bridge Camps.

The number of contestants and the number of countries represented have increased each time. 154 pairs from 24 countries took part in the first World Junior Pairs in 1995. Two years later there were 156 pairs from 27 countries. Two years ago in the Czech Republic, the field consisted of 186 pairs from 30 countries.

Junior Bridge Camps have been taking place in Europe for 25 years. The concept was expanded in 1995 to include the rest of the world, a move that gained instant acclaim.

The Junior Fund games have proved a godsend to this program. During the month of February, special games with sectional rating can be scheduled by all clubs, with \$1.00 from each player's entry fee earmarked for the Junior Fund. Results for this year are being assembled by ACBL, and the word is the total should be at least as good as last year's \$50,000.

Many schools offer bridge curriculum

More than 100 schools ranging from elementary to college offer bridge as a course subject. The program is sponsored by the ACBL Educational Foundation.

The annual School Bridge Instant Matchpoint game will take place Saturday, April 28. Both the North-South and the East-West winners will be awarded \$500 scholarships by the Educational Foundation. Usually from 20 to 30 sites take part in this contest.

97 teams in Vanderbilt

The team captained by Nick Nickell, winner of the 2000 Vanderbilt, leads 96 other teams into the 73rd competition for the Vanderbilt trophy today. Nickell (Dick Freeman, Bob Hamman-Paul Soloway, Jeff Meckstroth-Eric Rodwell) won their first Vanderbilt as a team last year.

The #2 seed is the team captained by George Jacobs (Ralph Katz, Alfredo Versace-Lorenzo Lauria, Norberto Bocchi-Giorgio Duboin), winners of the 2000 Reisinger.

Tritt-Meffley win Open Pairs I

Jim Tritt and Richard Meffley overcame "a lousy result" on their last board to claim victory in the North American Open Pairs, the first national championship for each.

Tritt and Meffley, both residents of Fresno CA, won trips to the Kansas City NABC by qualifying to represent District 22 in the North American Open Pairs. They didn't do very well in the NAOP but made up for it in the Open Pairs.

Their score of 2545.5 matchpoints was almost a full board ahead of runners-up Henry Bethe and Varis Carey, who had 2498.22 matchpoints, and just edged Zia and Jaggy Shivdasani who had 2497.99 matchpoints -- good for third place.

Tritt is an attorney who is in practice with his wife,

NABC is 'family reunion' for directors

For many of ACBL's tournament directors, working at the North American Bridge Championships is like going to a family reunion. "The best part of the Nationals is getting to see all the directors we don't get to see other times," says National Tournament Director Betty Bratcher of Vista CA, who also heads the Intermediate/Newcomer program.

"The directors are kind of a family," agrees Chief Tournament Director Gary Blaiss of Memphis. "In the main, they all take up for each other and watch out for each other.

"They have their sibling rivalries," adds Blaiss. "While they may speak harshly to one another, they

don't want someone else speaking harshly to their brothers and sisters."

Associate National Director Patty Johnson of Sebring FL remembers that when directors were paid by the session, there was lots of competition to get assignments. Now that directors are employees, "we have a wonderful working relationship. We're all just friends."

Part of that friendship is due to their shared life style: "traveling, living in hotels, the hours we keep. We totally stick up for each other. We all just flat like each other."

Juniors to compete in U.S. Team Trials

Two Junior teams will compete in the United States International Team Trials, scheduled for Memphis June 3-12. The two top teams in the Trials will represent the U.S. in the Bermuda Bowl in Bali this fall.

The two Junior teams finished 1-2 in last summer's Junior Team Trials and will represent the U.S. in the World Junior Team championship in Brazil later this year.

Playing on U.S. 1 are Joe Grue, John Kranyak, Brad Campbell, John Hurd, Kent Mignocchi and Joel Wooldridge. The U.S. 2 team is Ari Greenberg, Kevin Bathurst, Chris Lubesnik, Paul Bethe and Jason Feldman.

U.S. 1 had a training session in Memphis last weekend under the direction of npc Bob Rosen and Coach Dennis McGarry. They played against an array of local players. One full day was devoted to critiquing hands and doing other forms of hand analysis.

The second training session will take place immediately before the ITT. Two days will be devoted to partnership understandings and agreements, defense to special conventions and how to fill out the World Bridge Federation convention card.

e-Bridge will pay the hotel and entry expenses for the Junior teams in the ITT.

The bridge of fools

As I recall, the title refers to a mathematical proof which you have to master to be considered a real pro. Maybe the following deal is the bridge equivalent.

Do you have what it takes to be a real number 9 seed? Check out Board 28 from the second qualifying session of Open Pairs I.

♠ Q 8 3
♥ 10 9 7 4 2
♦ 8 7 3
♣ 4 3

♠ A 6
♥ A 8 6
♦ Q J 10 9
♣ K J 10 2

♠ J 10 7 2
♥ Q 5
♦ K 5 2
♣ A Q 9 6

♠ K 9 5 4
♥ K J 3
♦ A 6 4
♣ 8 7 5

Virtually everyone bid to 3NT by West after a Stayman inquiry came up empty. If you checked the frequencies afterwards, you would see that this deal made at upwards of 95% of the tables where it was played.

Not surprisingly, most of the pairs who beat 3NT were number 9 seeds – so add yourself to the list (or pat yourself mentally on the back) if you too managed to beat it.

Two of the pairs who did set the contract were Marc Jacobus, playing with Richie Coren, and Drew Casen, playing with Lee Rautenberg.

Jacobus (North) led the ♥10 to dummy's ♥Q and Coren's ♥K. Declarer ducked and when Coren pressed on with the ♥J, Jacobus gave deliberate false count with the ♥2. Coren read this as asking for a switch, and a spade seemed the obvious one. He duly shifted to the ♠4 and when declarer ducked, Jacobus won his ♠Q and returned a spade. Coren ducked as declarer won his ace. When Coren won his ♦A, he had a good spade to cash for down one.

Casen led the ♥9, promising the ♥10, and when Rautenberg played the ♥J, declarer ducked. Rautenberg continued with the ♥K, declarer ducked again and Casen played the ♥10, suit preference for spades. Rautenberg got the message and shifted to spades to beat the contract.

If you lead the ♥4, fourth highest, and follow with the ♥2 next, I think you say, "Continue the suit." Other cards are either suit preference or obvious shift, depending on the context of the hand.

How International Fund cash will be allotted

The 2001 International Fund monies totaled \$57,177. The money will be distributed as follows:

Entry fees for the two Bermuda Bowl teams and the two Venice Cup teams – \$10,000.

35% of the balance to the teams (one-seventh to each player plus the npc) winning the 2001 ITT and the 2001 WITT (\$33,023.90).

15% of the balance to the teams (1/7 to each player plus npc) placing second in the 2001 ITT and the 2001 WITT (\$14,153.10).

The entry fee for the Zone 2 Senior team will be paid from the 2002 Senior International Fund.

World-wide Internet Junior Championship

Junior players (25 years of age or younger) will sit down at their computers on April 21 and 22 to compete in the 2001 OKbridge World-wide Internet Championship. The tournament is being organized by the Fifth Chair Foundation and OKbridge.

Registrations are now being accepted for this event which is sanctioned by the ACBL. Masterpoints will be awarded. There is no registration fee.

Fifth Chair will provide hosts for each team to help them become familiar with the OKbridge program.

At least two members of each team must be students at the same school. All participants will be given a temporary free membership in OKbridge to enable them to learn how to handle the program efficiently.

On April 21 the pairs forming the teams will compete in a 30-board IMP Pair contest. The four top teams will qualify to play in Sunday's semifinals.

College teams vie for Toronto trip

Six college teams will win an expense-paid trip to Toronto to compete in the final sessions of the National Collegiate Bridge Team Championship. The semifinals and final will take place on Friday and Saturday, July 20 and 21, during the Summer North American Championships.

North America has been divided into three zones, and each zone will have a qualifying session that will be played May 19 on ACBL Online. Teams must register by May 14. To register, contact Charlotte Blaiss at ACBL Headquarters.

The event is open to college students who were born in 1975 or later and who are carrying a minimum of seven semester hours. Two teams will qualify from each zone.

The covered expenses will be provided by the ACBL Educational Foundation. For further information check the ACBL web site – www.acbl.org. All kinds of relevant information, including the conditions of contest, are located at this site.



In fact, Johnson recalls a regular golf foursome at NABCs years ago: her husband, Karl Johnson; Harry Clark of Boles AR, Johnny Wisner of Montreal and Larry Graft of Sacramento.

Ron Johnston, an associate national director who lives in Waterloo IA, says directors have "something special. Players get together and talk about hands. We get together and talk about ruling situations or the technical aspects of the game."

"Well, if we are a family," says a grinning National Tournament Director Chris Patrias of St. Louis, who is the Director-in-Charge of the Spring NABC, "we have a lot of cousins."

John Ashton of Portland OR, the assistant DIC, characterizes the TD occupation as "the under-appreciated, under-paid job that we all enjoy."

Guillermo Poplawsky of Mexico City worked his first NABC in 1978 and began working all three tournaments in 1988. "I personally look forward to the NABCs," he says. "Some of the directors never see the other guys except at the Nationals. It's a very nice experience."

Carey Snider of Atlanta says directors at the NABC "hug each other, pat each other and ask about families. One reason we get along so well is that we don't see each other every day, we don't work together every day."

Peter Marcus of Bolton CT said the NABC is "a chance to renew friendships three times a year and that's 90% of the fun."

"Some of these people I've known for years and years," says director Jay Magid of Hayward CA, "and I still like them."

"This is better than my family," said one director. "We don't always laugh in my family."

I/N directors Bratcher, Judy Cotterman of Kokomo IN and Alice Kinningham of Denver are also family-oriented. "Going to the Nationals is like going home to see

family," says Cotterman.

There are bonds of friendship and shared experiences, agrees Kinningham.

Tom Whitesides, National Tournament Director from Dallas, recalls his first tournament years ago. The DIC was Mary Stone of Fort Worth, who is now retired. "I was working my very first tournament and she said to me: 'You have the floor'. She said that to me every session for the next 20 years."

Pat Jackson of Huntsville AL, an associate national director, remembers that her first tournament was Julie Greenberg's last tournament (Greenberg is now manager of the ACBL Education Department). "In those days, we scored by hand," says Jackson, "and Julie said to me, 'Go home and practice matchpointing on a 25 top and you'll do just fine'."

Jackson began directing full-time in 1985 and still feels that the NABC "is like coming to a family reunion. We all feel like that."

War of 1898 Coup works in 2001 too

More than 100 years ago during the War of 1898, the battleship Merrimac was deliberately sunk in a Cuban harbor. This act was intended to prevent enemy boats from using that area. The Merrimac Coup is now a part of bridge. By sacrificing a high card, you prevent declarer from establishing a long suit.

The following hand came up Friday in the first session of Open Pairs I.

Zeke Jabbour, the declarer, won the opening ♠2 lead with the jack and led the ♥K. Bob Brandow won the ace. At this point any lead but the ♣K allows Zeke to unblock the ♥Q, cross to the ♠Q and ruff a heart. After pulling trump, Zeke would get to dummy with the ♣A to run the established hearts and make two overtricks.

But Brandow found the Merrimac Coup – he led the ♣K. After winning the ace, Zeke gave it his best shot by continuing with a club to the queen and ruffing a club. However, since Zeke had to use the queen to ruff the club, West eventually came to a trump trick. So Zeke was held to 11 tricks instead of the 12 he would have had if Brandow had not made the club sacrifice.

Seems as if we should have had a great board, right? Wrong! We got a dead average!

An elegant ending

East got off to the unfortunate lead of the ♣A and shifted to a diamond. Herrmann won the ♦A and led a heart to his ace and a heart to dummy's ♥9. East should split, I guess, but he did not.

Now a diamond ruff and a spade to the 10 saw West force declarer again with a third diamond.

Herrmann cashed his two spade winners to reach this ending with East holding the long hearts:

Herrmann cashed the ♠3, pitching a club, as East ruffed and was helpless now. A trump back leaves declarer in dummy to cash his spade, so East led a diamond instead. Herrmann pitched a club from dummy and ruffed in hand. He cashed the ♣K and drew the last trump at trick 13 with the ♥K.

1. The Albert Morehead Memorial Library is the largest bridge library in the world, containing more than 2,000 different volumes in addition to many artifacts and historical items. The library was dedicated by the ACBL in memory of Albert Morehead, a bridge bibliophile. His excellent collection of bridge books provided the ACBL with an excellent basis for the library.

In later years the ACBL acquired the personal libraries of Edgar Kaplan and Alfred Sheinwold.

In addition to rare books, the library houses a fine collection of games, teaching aids, cassettes, records and magazines. The memorabilia include five-suit decks of cards, score tallies of all kinds, top-score pins, all kinds of duplicate boards, Culbertson bridge chips, dealing machines – even a copy of the 1958 *Time Magazine* that featured Charles Goren on the cover as the King of the Bridge Aces.

The library is located in the ACBL Headquarters building in Memphis, Tennessee, near the ACBL Hall of Fame display. Also nearby is the ACBL's magnificent collection of trophies. Five of the most prestigious are in glass cases in the library. The remainder are in two large glass display cases adjacent to the library. The trophies are valued at more than half a million dollars.

2. Judge Carl Rubin. He was ACBL president when the vote was taken. When the tie vote became known, he quickly announced, "My vote is for Memphis," and immediately went on to the next order of business with nary another word. Rubin later became a federal judge.
