It's on to Washington for the second Youth NABC

With the first Youth NABC behind her, Patty Tucker is now looking ahead to the 2009 Summer NABC in Washington DC, where the second tournament exclusively for young people will take place.

As is her wont, Tucker is defying conventional wisdom and predicting that the Youth NABC field in



Washington will represent a huge leap from Atlanta, where the groundbreaking tournament in early July attracted 198 players and 210 tables.

"I say it's going to be double," says Tucker, "but nobody believes me."

Keen observers have learned not to bet against Tucker, who is now concentrating on raising funds to support the next Youth NABC, limited to players 19 and younger and with fewer than 5000 masterpoints.

One assist will come from the ACBL, which is in the process of establishing a foundation to accept tax-deductible donations.

Tucker has again lined up Baron Barclay Bridge Supply to sponsor the pairs game, and she is looking for a sponsor for the Swiss teams. Each is a two-session event.

Most of the funds raised for the first Youth NABC went directly to benefit the players.

Meckstroth passes 60,000 MPs

Jeff Meckstroth, one of the world's top players and a seven-time winner of the Barry Crane Top 500, has surpassed 60,000 masterpoints. He trails only Mike Passell on the list of all-time masterpoint winners.



Although masterpoints are a by-product of Meckstroth's profession, his primary pursuit is major championships, of which he has many.

Meckstroth has won seven world championships and 44 North American titles, including the Grand National Teams, Championship Flight, at this tournament. He will have a chance at an eighth world title in Beijing, China, later this year as a member of the Nick Nickell squad that will be playing in the National Open Teams as part of the World Mind Sports Games.

At the 2008 Summer NABC, Nickell and company are the defending champions in the Spingold Knockout Teams, an event Meckstroth has won 12 times.

Of all his accomplishments, Meckstroth would

Graves captures Truscott Senior Swiss

The team captained by Allan Graves came from behind to win the 74-team final of the Truscott Senior Swiss Teams. Their total of 134.41 victory points was just 2.07 more than the runner-up team captained by Geoffrey Brod.

The winners are Allan Graves, Reanette Frobouck, John Carruthers, Mark Lair and Fred Hamilton.

This was the first national championship for Frobouck, who lives in Pittsburgh PA and Vero Beach FL. It was the second for Carruthers, who

lives in Toronto and is editor of the International Bridge Press Association Bulletin.

Graves, a full-time bridge teacher in Vancouver BC and Vermont, was winning his second North American Championship. He has also won seven Canadian championships.

Mark Lair of Canyon TX and Fred Hamilton of Las Vegas NV are full-time players who have won multiple national championships (20 for Lair, 15 for Hamilton). Hamilton won this event in 1998

High seeds fall in Spingold

A team of Danes, Icelanders and Americans jumped out to an early lead over the Aubrey Strul team and went on to stun the No. 4 seed 149-106 in the second round of the Spingold Knockout Teams.

The winners are Americans Mike Lawrence and Daniel Zagorin, Danes Kasper Konow and Michael Askgaard, and Omar Olgeirsson and Pall Thorsson of Iceland.

Strul was playing with Mike Becker, Larry

Cohen, David Berkowitz, Chip Martel and Lew Stansby.

Another surprise winner was the team led by Barry Goren, seeded No. 52, who knocked off the No. 13 seed, Steve Robinson, 163-143. Goren, Steven Sanborn, Steve and Betty Bloom, Michael Cummings and David Lindop led from wire to wire in ousting Robinson, Peter Boyd, Fred Stewart and Kit Woolsey.

Two Massachusetts players took a narrow lead into the second day of play in the Wernher Open Pairs. The leaders with two sessions to play are Carolyn Sessler of Waltham and Rena Lieberman of North Easton.

Their score of 1285.46 on a top of 25 was less than a board ahead of the score posted by Californians Suresh Mahajan of Del Mar and Edward Frymoyer of Half Moon Bay.

Wagar in round of 8

The Wagar Women's Knockout Teams enters the quarterfinal stage today with all but one of the top seed still in the running for the championship.

The Phyllis Fireman team, seeded No. 1 as the defending champions, had an easy time on Tuesday, dispatching a team from Mexico when the No. 16 seed withdrew after three quarters. Fireman is playing with Mildred Breed, Tobi Sokolow, Janice Seamon-Molson, Jill Meyers and Jill Levin. Meyers and Levin were not on the team last year.

No. 2 Lynn Baker also had it easy as their opponents called it a night after three sets. Baker is playing with Karen McCallum, Lynn Deas, Beth Palmer, Kerri Sanborn and Irina Levitina.

The only high seed to fall was the Chinese team captained by Zhang Yalan, who were ousted by the Carol Simon squad 143-113.

Mini Spingolds advance

The Mini-Spingold II (0-1500) enters the quarterfinal stage today. The matchups, by captain, are John Scibelli vs. Catherine Miller, Brian Duran vs. Mitch Towner, Jared Markowitz vs. Justin Graver and Thomas Trudeau vs. Robert Forster.

Thirty-two teams are still in the hunt in the Mini-Spingold I (0-5000), including teams from Iceland and China. The Mini-Spingold I will end on Saturday.

NABC Insider

Not having any of the Hog's knowledge or wit, the Insider is still bold enough to predict that several matches in both events will not finish until after midnight. Further, the winning teams in both events will have at least one player whose name will be detected as an error by the Bulletin Boys' spell-check program and a whole slew of masterpoints will be thrown around the room.

Tables in play have increased dramatically after the Mitchell Report/Baum Ruling on steroid-enhanced estimates came to light. Obviously, the bridge-playing public's faith in the integrity of estimates has been restored and we will sail on towards our goal, fully cognizant that the 2008 Las Vegas NABC will not exceed 1991's total but will be plenty big in its own right. Judi Radin of New York City has advanced past the 15,000 masterpoint level. She is a full-time player who holds the rank of Grand Life Master. She is one of the leading American players and a many-time NABC event winner. She is a World Grand Master and won the Womens' Teams at the World Championships in 1984, 1987 and 1994. Radin won the Womens' Pairs in 1978 and was second in 1990. She will represent the U.S. in the Womens' Team event at the first World Sports Mind Games to be held later this year in Beijing, China.

Weinstein of Sarasota FL has won multiple NABC championships including the Vanderbilt Knockout Teams and the Blue Ribbon Pairs. In international play, Weinstein is a World Life Master. He was second in the Bermuda Bowl in 2007 and third in the World Team Olympiad in 2000.



ACBL bans electronic devices in national events

The ACBL Board of Directors approved a comprehensive ban on electronic devices for all national level events, but not to regional or Intermediate Newcomer contests:

Electronic devices, excluding health related equipment, capable of sending or receiving communication, including but not limited to, headphones, earphones, cellular phones and minicomputers: (1) shall not be allowed in the playing areas, adjacent hallways, restrooms or accessible break areas; and (2) shall not be used during a session.

These restrictions shall apply to all pairs, team members, captains, coaches, recorders and kibitzers and shall apply throughout any actual playing session or segment.

A violation of this policy shall result in a disciplinary penalty of one full board (or 12 IMPs at that form of scoring) for the first offense. A second offense shall result in disqualification from the event for the pair/team.

Kibitzers violating this policy shall be removed from the playing area for the remainder of the session.

The Summer North American Bridge Championships in Las Vegas will be the first NABC impacted by the new policy.

Participants in the following contests will be reminded not to approach the playing area with a personal electronic device in their possession, even if the device is turned off: all flights of the Grand National Teams, the von Zedtwitz, Bruce and Young Life Master Pairs, the Spingold Knockout Teams, both Mini-Spingolds, the Wagar Women's Knockout Teams, the Truscott/USPC Senior Swiss Teams, the Wernher Open Pairs, the NABC+ Fast Pairs, the Mixed Board-a-Match Teams, the Open Swiss Teams and the National 199er Pairs.



JUST FOR NEW PLAYERS

Dear New Players:

Today we're going to talk about The Care and Feeding of Partners. Get a cuppa and pay attention.



Not long ago, Gary and I got a new puppy, a chocolate and white male Chihuahua, Ozzie. (Gary sez it takes a big man to walk a small dog, especially true with Ozzie, as he is about the size of a robust, well-fed hamster.) As my Faithful Readers can imagine, the arrival of a new puppy was a Very Big Event at our house. (Ozzie even has a godmother, Shirley, if that gives you a clue.)

When we took Ozzie for his first visit to the vet, we received a pamphlet, "Welcoming and Training Your New Puppy." Determined that, just once in our lives, we were going to have a well-behaved, obedient dog, we read this with care. "Marti, listen to this: 'Treat your new puppy with respect and love if you want an enduring relationship.' Doesn't that apply to bridge, also?" Well, as we read our way through, we realized this little pamphlet was a Bible for bridge partnerships. See if you don't agree.

Treat your new puppy with respect and love if you want an enduring relationship. Look, you picked this person to be your partner. While it is certainly crucial to discuss hand treatments, it is more important to respect your partner's point of view. Compromise. Play Inverted Minors if Pard will play Roman Key 1430 instead of 0314. You are *partners!*

Catch your puppy doing something RIGHT. It's so easy to say, "Why did you do that?" or "Where is the hand you were bidding with?" or "What were you thinking?" All unanswerable, except, "It seemed like a good idea at the time." It is a much better idea to remark when Pard makes a shrewd move. Our puppy book pointed out that, if you can expand your pup/Pard's good behavior, it will push out the bad behavior. Remember to do this out of hearing of the opponents. Otherwise it could be mistaken for gloating. "Pard, you did a masterful job of establishing those long diamonds! It worked so well and gave you a dumping ground for the spades." Pard may not have any idea what the heck you are talking about, but next time she has a long suit, she'll see if she can drop losers on

it. **Remember, sometimes you need to leave your puppy alone to play.** While we know that you can give your partner ideas to improve on every single hand, it's important to just enjoy the game. Remember, the word is *partner!* Just relax, and have fun.

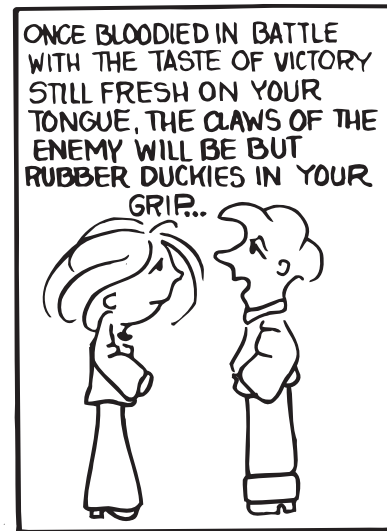
Keep training sessions short, otherwise your puppy will lose interest. Just how much of your good advice can any one person absorb! Circle the *three* boards you'd like to discuss *after* the game. Get a nice drink and review them for a few minutes. Then move on . . . to something interesting, like that strange couple at table four.

Small morsels of food are useful in modeling good behavior. This doesn't mean we fill our pockets with Oreos (although you could do worse). Think of compliments as the Partner version of dog biscuits. Give pard many small rewards. "Great lead!" "Thank you for that switch to diamonds. We couldn't have set them without it." Watch how pard reacts!

Your puppy can not learn a new command right away. Repetition is the key to success. It takes at least half a dozen mishaps with Stayman and Transfers before getting it right. Remember when you were trying to learn Drury? Be honest. MORE than half a dozen!

Never use harsh words. **Your puppy is trying to do the right thing. If he isn't learning, it's YOUR fault!** Nobody wants you to win more than your partner. Keep that in mind. And remember that your partner is putting up with a lot from you, too. Put away that rolled up newspaper!

After a good training session, you should have a nice cuddle with your puppy. While this is the best advice in the whole pamphlet, you might have to be careful. I'm not sure that all bridge clubs would approve of this.

I must admit that we gave up training Ozzie. We found that it was stifling his creativity and personal expression trying to mold his behavior and saying no to him, but Gary and I have applied this in our bridge lives and we have the best partners in the world.

Thinking bridge

Maintaining communication

Dlr: East ♠ 9 6

Bidding commentary: As North, after an opposing takeout double, any jump by the responder (you) is preemptive. Don't worry about partner having three diamonds. That will

be the case about 5% of the time. Do not play for exceptions! Would you rather be right 5% or 95% of the time?

As East, your double, called "responsive," is for takeout after partner makes a takeout double and the opponents support each other. Your double shows the ability to play in hearts and spades plus 7-10 HCP. As West, after partner makes a responsive double, bid the full value of your hand. 3♥ is plenty. As East, you have told your story with your double, and if all partner can do is bid 3♥, call it a day.

Defensive commentary: As South, before blindly playing the ♦8 to encourage partner, check dummy to see if you want some other suit more than diamonds. Your eyes should come to rest upon your clubs. A club shift would be great, so play a low diamond asking for a shift, usually to dummy's shorter side suit. If partner shifts to the ♣J and declarer plays low from dummy, win the ♣Q, cash the ♣A, and lead a low diamond to partner's known jack to get a club ruff. Nice defense.

Defensive commentary #2: As third hand, do not signal partner encouragement in the suit

that is led if you want a shift. Play low and hope partner works it out.

Play commentary: As West, if North shifts to the ♣J, play low from dummy. The bidding marks South with the ♣A Q and it may be doubleton!

the Youth NABC, you can contact Tucker directly at patty.tucker@acbl.org. You can also visit the web site: www.youthnabc.org.

Looking back on the first tournament, Tucker can't help remembering her own start in bridge and how much she would have enjoyed such an event. "Most of our kids," she says, "were in the 10 to 14 age range. When I was 11, 12 and 13 and playing bridge, there wasn't anyone out there doing it. There was no place for me to go."

That was Tucker's inspiration for the Youth NABC. "If you want kids to continue to play and stay with bridge," she says, "you have to give them a community on a local and national level."

Tucker says it thrilled her to see that the young players at the Youth NABC were getting the same things out of bridge that adults do.

One misconception about the field at the Youth NABC is that the kids were mostly from bridge-playing families. "Eighty percent of the kids at the tournament are not the children of bridge players," she says.

In fact, she notes, there were five tables of parents of the youngsters at the Youth NABC taking bridge lessons on the Saturday of the tournament.

Tucker says surveys taken at the Youth NABC indicate everyone enjoyed themselves, and she has received e-mails from many saying thanks for the effort.

Now that the Youth NABC is a reality, Tucker has one more prediction: "It's going to become a better and better event as we go along."

Don't doubt Patty

I've had my share of thrills in bridge – playing against the best in the world and having what many would consider major wins among them. None of them can rival what I experienced on Saturday, July 5, at the first Youth NABC in Atlanta.

First, a bit of background.

Late in 2005, Patty Tucker, a close friend and well-known player at both the local and national levels, came to me and said she had an idea. She wanted to develop an organization to teach bridge to kids in metro Atlanta for free. She hoped that it would attract enough attention that it would succeed in Atlanta and lead to something that would flourish nationwide.

Patty talked about the day when there would be youth national championships, although frankly, no one that I knew really believed her. She asked me to be treasurer. It was easy to start with – we had no money.

Well, many of us were wrong and Patty was right. Between her tireless work, and the support of many others from the bridge community, the first Baron Barclay Youth Open Pairs was held in conjunction with the Atlanta Sectional. To say that it was a success would not nearly do justice to what I witnessed.

I had the distinct pleasure of being a vugraph operator for the event as it was broadcast live around the world at BridgeBase Online (BBO). Round after round, I had four (usually new) young players come to my little vugraph table. Between my vugraph table and the other one operated by Richard Starr, there were sometimes as many as 800 spectators, in addition to a packed auditorium of spectators watching at the playing site.

Players at my table ranged in age from 8 to 19 (the upper age limit for the event). Many played with siblings or other regular partners. Some played with partners they had never met before. Some were pretty experienced (a few Silver and Bronze Life Masters) and some had rarely, if ever, been at a real table.

Many were from metro Atlanta, but some were from as far away as Hawaii, California, New Mexico and New Brunswick.

So what made this so special? Sportsmanship was beyond reproach. Players made new lifelong friends. And, I saw sheer joy on the faces of more than 100 youngsters playing a game that we all love.

Here are a few examples of the sportsmanship that I saw. An 11-year old player saw that his opponents held their cards well forward from them. He put up an arm to shield the cards and asked the opponents to hold their cards back so that he "wouldn't have an unfair advantage."

A fairly experienced pair playing more complex methods than most had a bidding misunderstanding, where one incorrectly explained his partner's Alerted bid. The partner, knowing that he had unauthorized information from the explanation that he heard, made the ethical decision at his next turn to bid.

A 13-year old girl watched her opponents claim all but one of the remaining tricks in a deal. She pointed out to the opponents, however, that no play could possibly lose a trick and conceded all the remaining tricks.

How keen was the interest in the outcome? At the completion of the last round, I informed the vugraph commentators that I would keep one vugraph "room" open to announce results when they came out. When I started to post those results, I noticed that more than 290 spectators had remained in that room and that those 290 represented at least 10 countries outside of North America.

As I'm certain that you will read elsewhere in this issue, the winners were Eli Jolley and Jake Olson from Alabama and Minnesota, respectively.

Were they an experienced partnership? In the sense that we would think of experienced pairs, they certainly were not. In fact, these two players both made plans to come to the Youth NABC before having partners. They were among many who had separately contacted Carolyn Eckert, the partnership chair (Carolyn is also the secretary and one of the hardest-working teachers of Atlanta Junior Bridge), seeking suitable partners.

Upon learning that they would play together, they practiced regularly on BBO. Their 66% game in the morning followed up by their 80% monster in the afternoon showed that practice had paid off.

Even though they were the pair who was handed the first-place trophy by ACBL Goodwill Chair Aileen Osofsky, they were only two winners among 34 tables full of them. Further, anyone who witnessed the event was a winner, as was the ACBL and the game of bridge.

By the way, the next time Patty Tucker comes to me with some wild idea that everyone knows will never work, I'm not going to doubt her. Thanks, Patty, for your vision and hard work, thanks to all the volunteers whose efforts made this a reality, and thanks to all the kids without whom the reality of this event never could have been.

West's hand is so strong she couldn't resist the off-shape takeout double. Before the play was over, however, she had ample reason to regret the action.

By agreement, North's redouble showed spades. Looking at six solid trump tricks, Miller decided to take a chance on being able to eke out one more. 1♥ redoubled is, after all, game. He was handsomely rewarded for his judgment.

West started with two high clubs before shifting to a trump. Miller pulled the rest of the lurkers and put the ♠K on the table. West won perforce and could have held Miller to nine tricks, but she tried another club. Miller could claim at that point for 10 tricks and the unusual score of plus 1920. Their teammates at the other table played in a club partial, making 11 tricks for plus 150 and a 19-IMP gain for the Miller squad.

Deep Finesse shows the way

The Sunday evening pairs game showed a couple of deals where the result as presented by Deep Finesse was rather surprising – and worth a second look.

I was East and my partner, Eric Leong, found the best defense against 4♠.

He cashed the ♥K, the ♦A, ♥K, then played a second diamond. Declarer won the ♦Q, led the ♠5 to the king and tried to cash red-suit winners. East ruffed in and was overruffed, but without the ♠5, declarer could not get to dummy, so there was a club to lose at the end.

The best way to play the contract is to assume 3-2 spade with the queen onside. You lead the ♠8 to the king and start leading winners from dummy. When East ruffs in, high or low, you overruff and draw a second trump then go back to dummy with the ♠6 to take your last discard and take the club finesse.

On the next problem, your answer to the question of what to lead will determine which religion you adhere to. You hold these cards as East:

With the ♦K Q J 4, does your religion tell you to lead from a sequence? But what about clubs? Partner bid that suit, after all.

Rena Hetzer, who is an Episcopalian, argued for hearts ("We like to be different"). Karen Walker says an atheist would lead a trump – when you've tried everything else, fall back on what's left.

Brent Manley asked what the "substitute defenders" would lead. "That's no problem – their partners would have led out of turn already."

In fact, the deal is over quickly on the club lead.

On the lead of the ♦K, declarer must play for diamonds to be 4-1. Declarer wins, draws trumps and passes the ♥J to West. What can West do then? If he does not cash his ♣A, declarer's singleton club goes away on the long heart. If declarer does cash the ♣A, there are two discards for diamonds on the ♠K and the long heart.

I'm not sure what the deal proves, but I doubt it's anything important.

Costly lead

Perhaps because East did not double the 5♦ cuebid, West started with the ♣Q, ultimately to his regret (a diamond lead eliminates any chance for 12 tricks).

Hanby won in hand with the ♣A and advanced the ♥9, slightly worried about a possible club ruff by East. West was on the same wavelength, so he hopped up with the ♥A and continued with the ♣J. Hanby was relieved when the ♠K held the trick, but there was still a lot of work to do.

He ran some trumps, reaching this position:

On the next trump, West had to pitch a diamond. A club discard would allow Hanby to enter dummy with the ♦A and ruff a club, making the 9 good, while a spade discard would allow Hanby to establish trick 12 by playing the ♠A, a spade to the king and then ruffing a spade.

When West pitched a diamond, Hanby discarded dummy's ♦7, played a diamond to dummy's ace, ruffed a club and ran trumps. In the three-card ending, South led his last trump with the ♠A 2 and ♦9 in hand. West had to keep the ♣10, so there was room in his hand for only two spades. Declarer pitched the ♣9, keeping the ♠K 9 8. East was down to the ♠Q 10 3 and the ♦K and could not make a good discard. Contract made!

Melih Ozdil played this slam from the first round of the Spingold Knockout Teams. The defense started with the ♦A (necessary or the diamond losers go away) and shifted to a deceptive ♠7. Ozdil won the ♠A and cashed the top clubs in his hand, then ruffed a club, West pitching his diamond. Reading the position precisely, Ozdil cashed the ♠K to pitch a diamond, then he ruffed a spade low, ruffed a club and could play on a high crossruff, scoring his black ace-kings and eight trump tricks for plus 1430 and a 17-IMP gain because in the other room, 6♥ was down one.

South's perverted mini 1NT bought the contract, and West led an uninspired low spade (hands rotated). Declarer wrapped up plus 120 and might have done better.

This looked to be a reasonable result. After all, 2♠ appears to bring in plus 140. So how do you fancy your chances for nine tricks in spades?

Answer: with one diamond, one club and two hearts, the defenders' only chance for a fifth trick is via a trump promotion, and hearts is the only way to get it.

Imagine that the play starts with the ♥A, followed by the ♥10. Declarer ducks and wins the third round of hearts in dummy. Declarer needs to give up a diamond to arrange a ruff, so when East gets in, a fourth round of hearts promotes West's ♠9 to the fifth defensive trick.

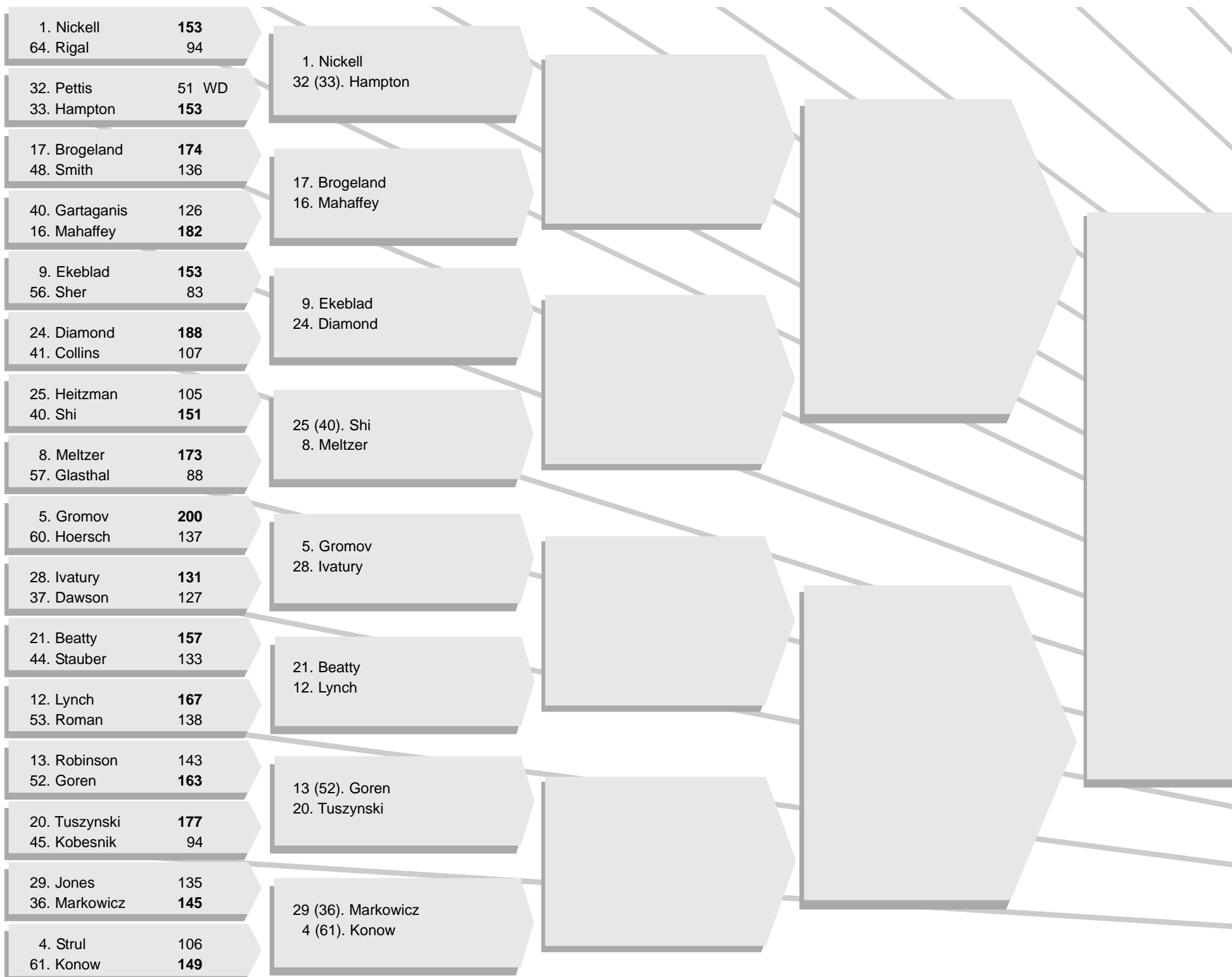

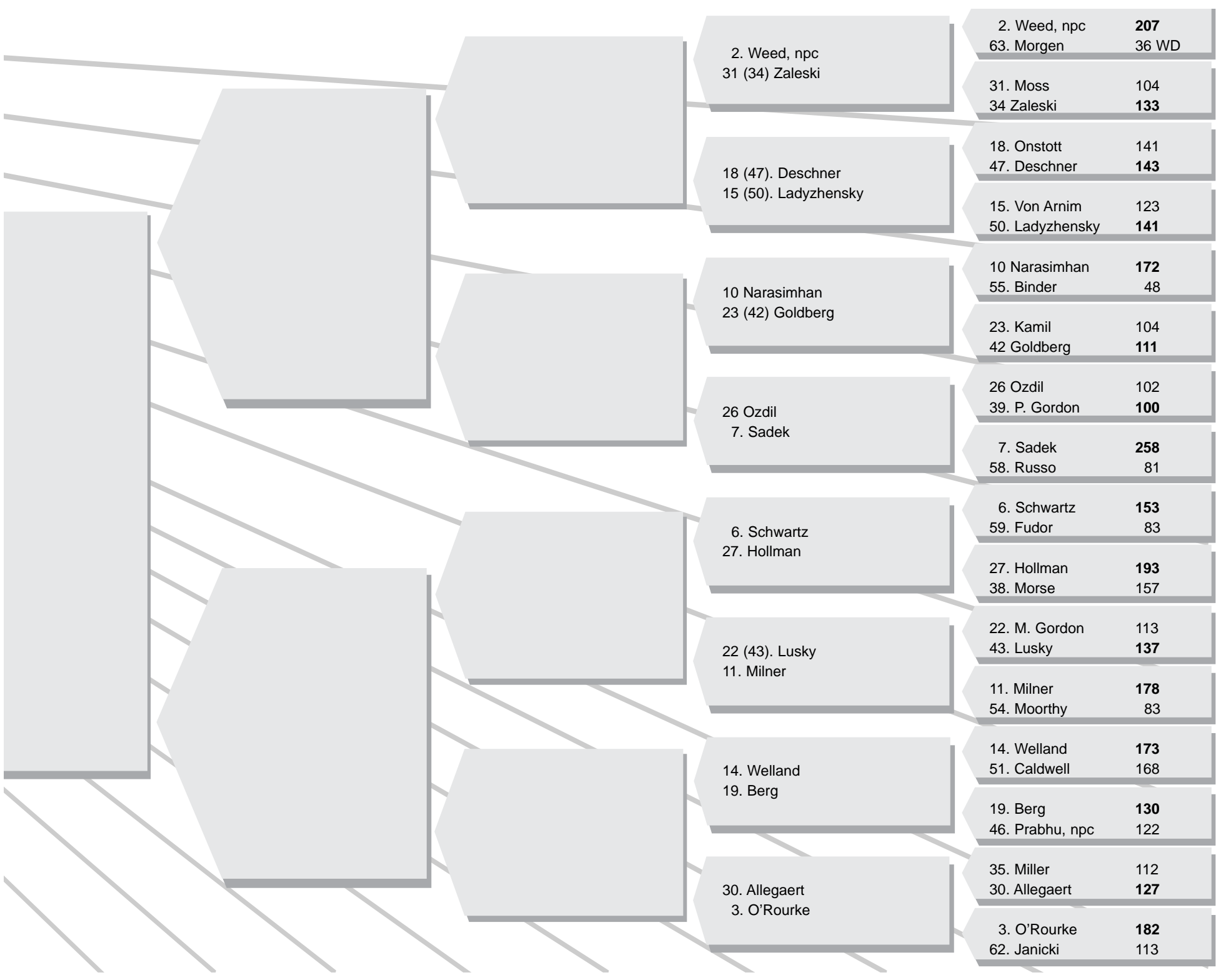

Declarer fell for the bait and pitched his diamond on the ♣Q. But when he next played a heart to the king, the defense won and could play clubs. Declarer lost control and had to go down three.
