Nickell rally falls short as Meltzer advances in Spingold

The top-seeded Nick Nickell team, trailing by 52 IMPs with a quarter to go, mounted a furious rally against the Rose Meltzer squad but fell short in losing 116-103.

In today's semifinal round, Meltzer will face the Russian-Polish foursome led by Andrew Gromov, who nipped Victor Markowitz 103-97.

The other semifinal match will pit James Cayne (Weed, npc) against Roy Welland. Weed knocked off Tarek Sadek 156-119, while Welland ousted the John Lusky squad 169-141.

Nickell, (Dick Freeman, Bob Hamman, Zia Mahmood, Jeff Meckstroth, Eric Rodwell) fell behind Meltzer (Kyle Larsen, Alan Sontag, Roger Bates, Geir Helgemo, Tor Helness) in the opening quarter and trailed at the half 64-36. Meltzer held their opponents to 6 IMPs in the third quarter to stretch the lead to 52, then withstood a 61-22 charge by the top seed. Nickell won the Spingold last year in the late Paul Soloway's final NABC. Zia replaced Soloway on the team this year.

Weinstein elected to chair Ethical Oversight

Howard Weinstein of Sarasota FL has been elected chairman of the ACBL Ethical Oversight Committee for 2008. His term runs through the 2009 Spring NABC in Houston.

ACBL bans electronic devices in national events

The ACBL Board of Directors approved a comprehensive ban on electronic devices for all national level events, but not to regional or Intermediate Newcomer contests:

Electronic devices, excluding health related equipment, capable of sending or receiving communication, including but not limited to, headphones, earphones, cellular phones and minicomputers: (1) shall not be allowed in the playing areas, adjacent hallways, restrooms or accessible break areas; and (2) shall not be used during a session.

These restrictions shall apply to all pairs, team members, captains, coaches, recorders and kibitzers and shall apply throughout any actual playing session or segment.

A violation of this policy shall result in a disciplinary penalty of one full board (or 12 IMPs at that form of scoring) for the first offense. A second offense shall result in disqualification from the event for the pair/team.

Kibitzers violating this policy shall be removed from the playing area for the remainder of the session.

The Summer North American Bridge Championships in Las Vegas will be the first NABC impacted by the new policy.

Participants in the following contests will be reminded not to approach the playing area with a personal electronic device in their possession, even if the device is turned off: all flights of the Grand National Teams, the von Zedtwitz, Bruce and Young Life Master Pairs, the Spingold Knockout Teams, both Mini-Spingolds, the Wagar Women's Knockout Teams, the Truscott/USPC Senior Swiss Teams, the Wernher Open Pairs, the NABC+ Fast Pairs, the Mixed Board-a-Match Teams, the Open Swiss Teams and the National 199er Pairs.

The hands are rotated.

After you reject partner's slam try you find yourself in a delicate spot on the lead of the ♦9.

If you were a Scotsman you would be worried that West would lead the curse of Scotland against you from ♦K 9. West, however, has an innocent face. You win the ♦A and hurry to cash the ♠A and ♠K. You breathe again when both opponents follow.

Now you cash the three top clubs, and again your luck is in. Everyone follows and the ♦Q, on which you plan to pitch a heart is covered. You ruff . . . and now?

It would only be human to play a heart to dummy's queen. East wins the ♥A and returns a club. You ruff, play a heart to the king . . . disaster! East ruffs, exits with his last club and you have a heart to lose at the end.

To make sure of your contract, just exit with the third spade after ruffing out the ♦K. The ♥K is then a sure entry to dummy and you live happily ever after.

JUST FOR NEW PLAYERS

Dear New Players:

Getting e-mails from you is like falling down the rabbit hole in Alice in Wonderland . . . you never know where you're going to end up. For example, from Shirley:



Dear Marti,
I'm feeling a little daunted and concerned about my future in this game. I'm working hard to develop as a player, studying and practicing, but I'm having trouble getting it right. Here's what's happened lately.

I was playing with Russell, and bid hearts over his notrump. I forgot to transfer. I had to bid them two more times before he believed me (I had a void in spades!), and we ended up way too deep, but playing in a three-card trump suit would have been worse! Oops!

Then, I forgot that a passed hand shouldn't advance partner's preempt. I didn't consider that my partner had already overbid for both of us. Yup. Way too deep again. Oops.

Next, I forgot I was playing party bridge where a jump-shift shows a strong hand. Once again, we were on the bottom of the ocean.

And then there was the time when Edward asked me how many aces I had. I told him I had two but I was confused about the responses and only had one. Do I have to tell you what happened that time?

Miraculously, I haven't run out of partners yet, but I fear the day may come soon.

Do you have any words of either comfort or wisdom?"

Dear Shirley,

Good for you! You are suffering the growing pains that highlight the "coming of age" of a bridge player. I want you to think about something: When you learned to play golf, how long did it take for you to hit the darn thing straight? How many slices, how many hooks? When you learned to ride a bike, did you get away without at least a skinned knee or two?

No new skill comes without many failures.

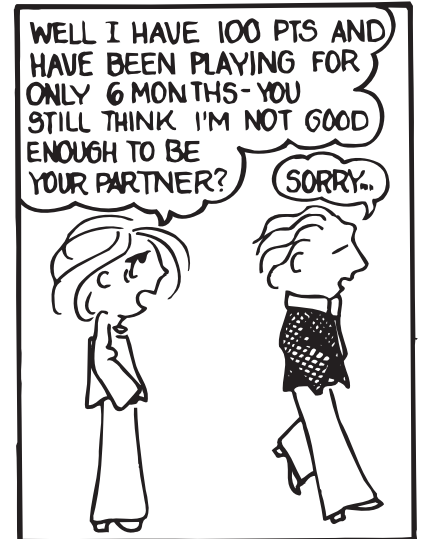
Edith McMullin once wrote that you don't own a convention until you've done it wrong 10 times.

The good news is that each failure brings you closer to getting it right. The first step is recognizing that you did it wrong. The next step is figuring out why it went wrong. Then you begin to do it right. Sometime. Often. Almost always. Keep trying, keep failing and prepare for success.

Oh, by the way, your partners don't mind. They are struggling, too, and hoping you don't mind their boo-boos.

Now, an important word of caution to all you who are in the same spot as Shirley: What should you do when you realize you've goofed? For example, pard opens 1NT and you bid 2♥, forgetting that you are supposed to transfer? Banging your head on the table and wailing that you did it wrong will bring the director to your table at just under the speed of light.

If you have made an error, you have the right to correct it with future bids, if (and this is a huge "if") you haven't drawn attention to your error by body language, moans or groans. You must bid in tempo and without making faces. Like Shirley's situation with Russell where she forgot to transfer, you may bid those hearts again (and again) to get your side to a reasonable contract. You may have a confused partner, but what else is new? The important thing to remember is that

there is no penalty for bad bids, but there are penalties for passing unauthorized information through body language and facial expressions--what I call the "Kabuki" of bridge.

Thinking bridge

Responding to an opening bid

Opening lead: ♠J.

Bidding commentary: As North, you have a maximum raise to 2♥. It is not a good idea to start with 1♠ when holding three hearts and fewer than 10 HCP. If you do, and partner bids 2♣ or 2♦ you are not well placed. You aren't strong enough to jump to 3♥ (11-12 support points), and if you return to 2♥, you show a doubleton heart! As East, a non-passed hand, you

are not strong to make a takeout double of 2♥. If you were a passed hand, you might chance it, but the double would be flawed lacking four spades.

Defensive commentary: As East, ask yourself how can declarer use this dummy profitably? There are three possibilities: (1) long-suit establishment, (2) ruffing losers in the dummy and (3) Neither.

Dummy is balanced. On this deal, long-suit establishment can be eliminated. You have the clubs covered and partner appears to have the spades. However, there is a possibility that declarer can ruff a diamond or two in dummy. Your counter move is to shift to a low heart at trick two. As West, if partner switches to a low heart and declarer ducks, win the king and follow partner's defense by continuing with a heart. When later on lead in diamonds, play a third heart, killing any possible diamond ruff in dummy.

Play commentary: As South, if the defense plays a heart and a heart at tricks two and three, give up on trying to ruff a diamond and try to set up clubs instead. Lead a club to the queen and later the ace and a club hoping for a 3-3 break. Sorry, not this time. You gave it your best shot, but you are slated to lose two clubs, two

diamonds and a trick in each major for one in the ashcan.

Death to Deep Finesse

Thanks to the miracle of computerization, perfectly reasonable plays are now fodder for losing post-mortem analyses. Deep Finesse will report that some contract in which I failed miserably was always cold on any defense.

Example one is from the Von Zedtwitz Life Master Pairs qualifying.

After an inverted minor auction, I found myself declaring 3NT as South, against the ♥J opening lead. Dummy followed low, and East unhesitatingly played the ♥2, allowing me to win. Not wanting to catch a heart through my remaining honor and having a serious shortage of tricks, it seemed a good idea to take advantage of my diamond spots combined with an avoidance play by crossing to dummy in clubs and playing a diamond to the 10. This lost to the jack, and back came ♥10 to the ace, and a diamond return.

I now had a tenace in hearts against LHO's remaining ♥9 6. If my left-hand opponent had the ♠A, I had a chance for an endplay.

So, needing clubs 3-3 anyway, I crossed to dummy and led ♦Q. RHO won the king and returned a diamond. I cashed two clubs, coming down to ♠K and ♥K 8. LHO, after much thought, discarded two low spades. Continuing my play, I led a spade, but RHO rose ♠A to cash the long diamond for down one.

Of course, Deep Finesse says 3NT is cold—against the actual defense, I have to play ♦A, ♦10 at tricks two and three, then play RHO for both major-suit aces. No one else to whom I spoke encountered RHO's low heart play at trick one, however. And note how playing diamonds from the top would have fared if East held ♦K J 6 3 2 and either major-suit ace. But according to Deep Finesse, I plumbed the play and went down in a cooler.

Example two is from the second final session of the Wernher Open Pairs.

North led a heart, ruffed in dummy. As West, I could see that 5♦ is cold if diamonds are no worse than 3-1, and there was substantial danger of a club ruff, so at trick two, I called for ♦K. Disaster! North won the ♦A and played a second heart, establishing ♦9 as the setting trick.

Deep Finesse reports 5♦ is cold, which is true in a fashion. To make 5♦, I must play for diamonds 4-0 and clubs 3-2 and the ♠Q onside. At tricks two through four, I must play three rounds of clubs, throwing my second heart. Now I must play the ♠J.

North wins and can do no better than a ruff-sluff by leading a second heart. I ruff in hand and play a diamond; North wins and leads a third heart, ruffed

by West, reducing both West and North to three remaining diamonds. However, a diamond to dummy, spade finesse, and when next in, I can draw the outstanding trump. Why take a 90% line (diamonds no worse than 3-1) when a 0.85% line (clubs 3-2 with North holding three, diamonds 4-0 with North and ♠Q with South) is available?

Example three also comes from the second final of the Wernher, and features Deep Finesse showing equal disdain for defenders as well as declarers.

According to Deep Finesse, as East and on opening lead, I can somehow hold 3♦ to nine tricks. Looking at all four hands (as Deep Finesse does), I still don't see it, but my partner is left thinking I dropped yet another trick on defense.

Deep Finesse also says that North-South can make 4♠ or 5NT, so in terms of matchpoints, the difference between minus 130 and minus 110 on a 90 top was not large.

So here's hoping that Deep Finesse and Chthonic* soon kill each other in a blood feud!

(*Bridge World readers know that Chthonic is a bridge-playing computer that insults its partner and opponents incessantly.)

From the editor: For those who are curious, East-West can hold declarer to nine tricks in this fashion: ♥A opening lead, low club from the ace. West covers the ♣8 with the 9 or the ♣10 with the queen. Declarer plays the ♦J to the queen and ace. A second diamond goes to the 9, 10 and king, and East underleads the ♣A again to put West in for a heart ruff. That defense would be found at the table only by the Rueful Rabbit or someone who could see all the cards – but that's the advantage Deep Finesse has over mere mortals.

Sharon Osberg, Warren Buffett's partner, was the hero on this deal.

After his partner opened 4♠, Buffett sportingly raised to 6♠, knowing Osberg had an eight-card suit or a side card or perhaps a two-suiter, considering his great trumps.

West obligingly led the ♣Q. Osberg won in dummy, ruffed a low heart, then played a trump to dummy. She cashed the ♥A, pitching a diamond, and ruffed a heart. If the king had not fallen, she would have crossruffed for 12 tricks. As it was, she could switch to drawing trumps and pitching her three losers on hearts for plus 1010.

There are two stories here: How to defend 3NT and how to play 6♠.

In 3NT, Osberg got a spade lead, taking away any guess in that suit. She ran four rounds of spades and ducked a club. Then she cashed her diamond winners. East kept his clubs, so he unguarded hearts. That was worth 490 to North-South and a near top.

The play in 6♠ is complex. If trumps are 3-2, you have 12 tricks if you can guess the ♠Q. If trumps are 4-1, you need to find West with the trump length. A heart lead sinks 6♠, but only if South is declarer. On a diamond lead, you have to ruff a club in dummy and guess spades twice. The entries are delicate: Win the diamond lead in the South hand, finesse spades, then duck a club. Win the diamond return in hand. finesse spades again, play the ♣A and ruff a club, cash the ♠K and play a heart to the ace, draw trumps, pitching the losing heart from dummy, and claim.

Bid Box Alerts and Announcements

When using bid boxes, ACBL suggests that players tap the Alert strip and say "Alert" at the same time.

When making an announcement, use the announcement word — such as "transfer" — and tap the Alert strip at the same time.

A player who Alerts or announces a bid should make sure his opponents are aware that an Alert or announcement has been made.

Red card stays put

Mark Itabashi has been around long enough to know when to keep his mouth shut – figuratively speaking, of course – at the bridge table.

In the NABC+ Fast Open Pairs, Itabashi was playing with Ross Grabel and held this hand

It looks like a juicy penalty in 4♠ doubled, right? Itabashi looked at it a different way, figuring that if he pulled the red card, West was sure to run. Itabashi's judgment proved accurate on inspection of the full deal:

As you can see, 4NT by East-West cannot be defeated. Doubling would have turned a plus score into minus 630. In the actual play, Itabashi passed and East finished two down for minus 200.

Later in the session, Itabashi benefited from an opponent's poor judgment regarding the red card.

Without the double, Itabashi would have made the standard play of a low club to the king and a low club from dummy, going down one on the unlucky split in trumps.

After the double, Itabashi took a different approach, starting with queen from hand. West won the ace, and Itabashi was delighted to see the ♣9 fall on his right. It was trivial from there for Itabashi to finesse in clubs, ending with 12 tricks and a score of plus 1090 – a clear top.

The moral of the story is that when you feel like doubling for penalty, be sure the opponents have no escape in the bidding or play before you pull out the red card.

Notice to players

Each player must have an ACBL convention card filled out and on the table. Please note that other types of convention cards, such as the WBF convention card or homemade cards that do not sufficiently resemble the ACBL convention card, are not acceptable substitutes.

Time for bed

Alan Malloy of Santa Clara CA and Laura Rassbach of Boulder CO, two caddies, played in a Midnight Zip Knockout and found an unusual way to be sent to bed after the second round.

There would be no story if West had led a trump, but the defense started with a low spade (perhaps West took the double as calling for a spade). Malloy took full advantage. He ended up pitching three clubs from hand on top spades while ruffing two clubs in dummy. The defenders got only the trump ace and Malloy scored up plus 1090, which must have felt like a big swing.

Not.

At the other table, East opened 1♠. South bid 2NT for the minors, and West made the dubious decision to raise to 3♠. North knew what to do with that, and the result was minus 1100 for 3♠ doubled.

For IMP purposes, at least, it was a push (1090 vs. 1100), but the 10-point difference was huge later on.

When the teammates compared, they had four pushes, including the doubled slam and minus 1100, to go along with a 1-IMP gain and a 1-IMP loss. It was a tie.

One team had to be eliminated, however, so the comparisons were done as in board-a-match. Still tied.

The only thing left was to compare the total scores, and the 10-point difference allowed the other team to advance, while Malloy, Rassbach and teammates got the rest of the night off.

two and a half boards.

Second place went to Brian Platnick of Evanston IL and John Diamond of Boca Raton FL. Their score of 2539.64 was well behind the winners' total of 2726.08.

In the Fast Pairs, players have 11 minutes per round instead of the usual 15.

The leaders after day one finished in third place with a score of 33.49 (including carryover). They are Janet Ju and George Wang of El Monte CA and Phil and Nell Schaefer of Los Angeles.

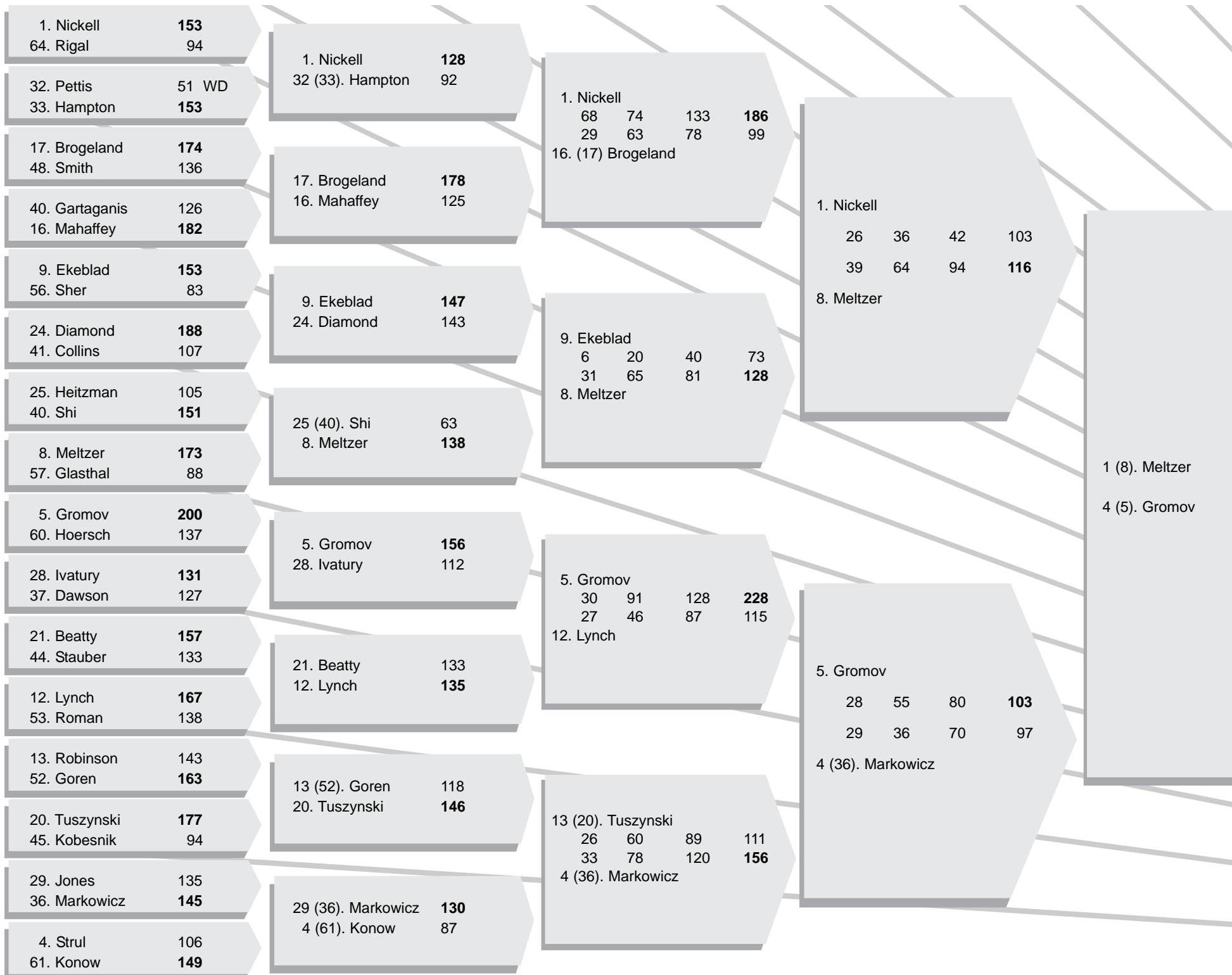

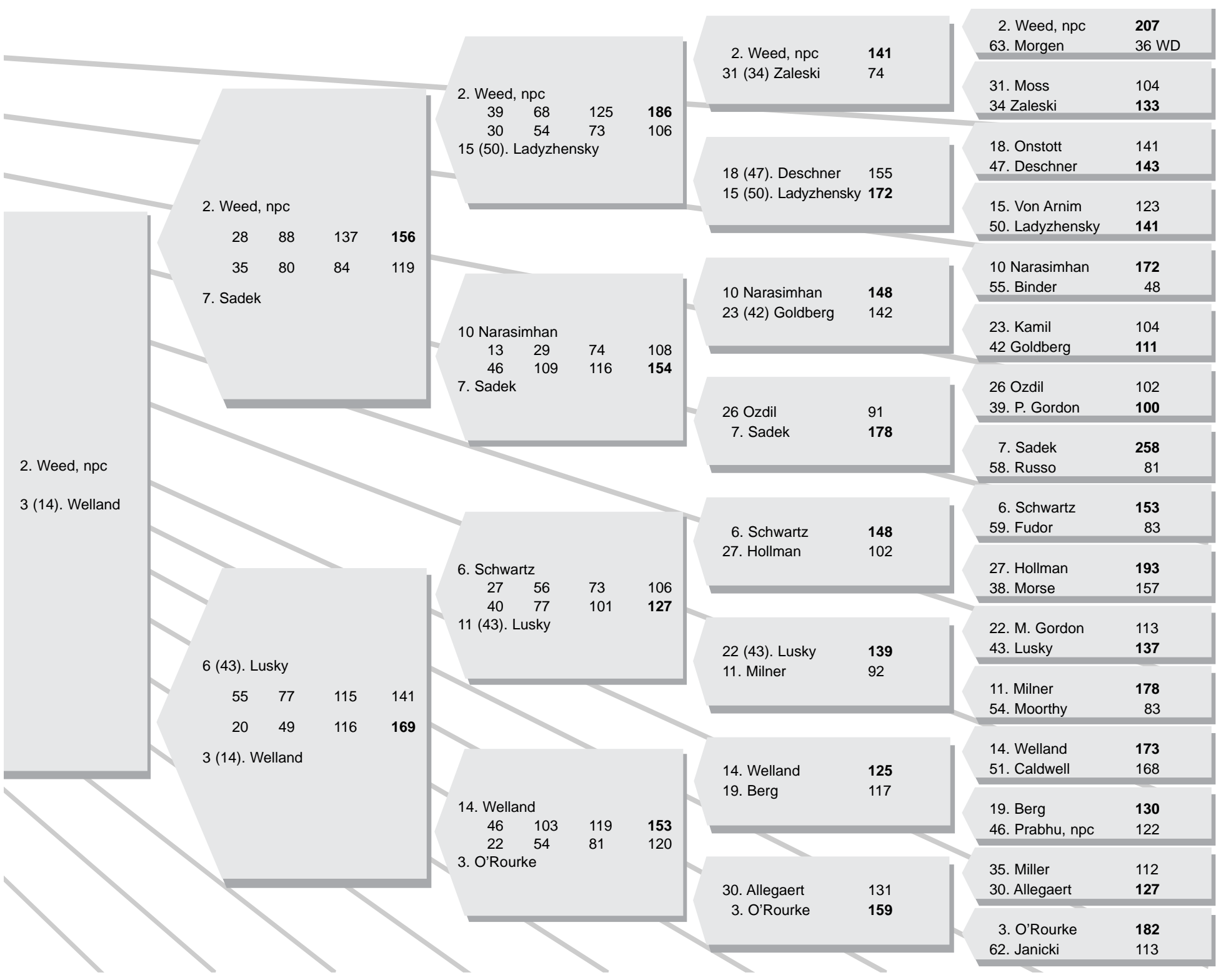

from the round robin play. Wbridge5 overcame that and took the lead at halftime 97—71. Jack was never able to regain the lead.

Wbridge5 won last year and in 2005. When asked about Wbridge5's success, Computer operator Yves Costal says, "Our robot made less mistakes in the bidding. It had fewer misunderstandings." Robot is the term for the computer software that drives the bridge play.

Jack is a five-time winner. Computer operator Wim Heemskerck says, "Jack made too many mistakes on defense." He says the programming team will regroup for next year. Heemskerck explained that testing is hard to do, however, because the practice sessions are against another version of Jack, and therefore, some bridge mistakes go unnoticed.

Al Levy started the Championship 12 years ago at the suggestion of the late Alan Truscott. "The ACBL gave some money to get the competition started," says Levy "and it has grown from there." It is held in different cities each year.

Levy says that "The robots often play strangely by human standards. They may be in an end position, and, instead of cashing top tricks, the robot plays for a double squeeze that it 'knows' must work."
