District 21 victorious in GNT Open

The central California team captained by Rose Meltzer held off a strong challenge by the defending Grand National Open Team champs from Florida to win 135-116. Playing with Meltzer on the District 21 squad were Peter Weichsel of Los Gatos CA, Kyle Larsen of San Francisco CA, Hugh Ross of Oakland CA, Lew Stansby of Castro Valley CA and Chip Martel of Davis CA. This is the same squad that captured the 2001 Bermuda Bowl (with Alan Sontag of New York replacing Ross).

Playing for Florida (District 9) were Spike Lay

and Larry Griffey of Daytona Beach FL, Jeff Meckstroth of Tampa, Michael Seamon of Miami Beach, Russ Ekeblad, and Eric Rodwell of Clearwater Beach FL. Their non-playing captain was Marilyn Garcia. District 9 has won the GNT Open title four of the past five years.

This is the first Grand National victory for Meltzer, and, curiously, for Weichsel, who has multiple victories in world and national events.

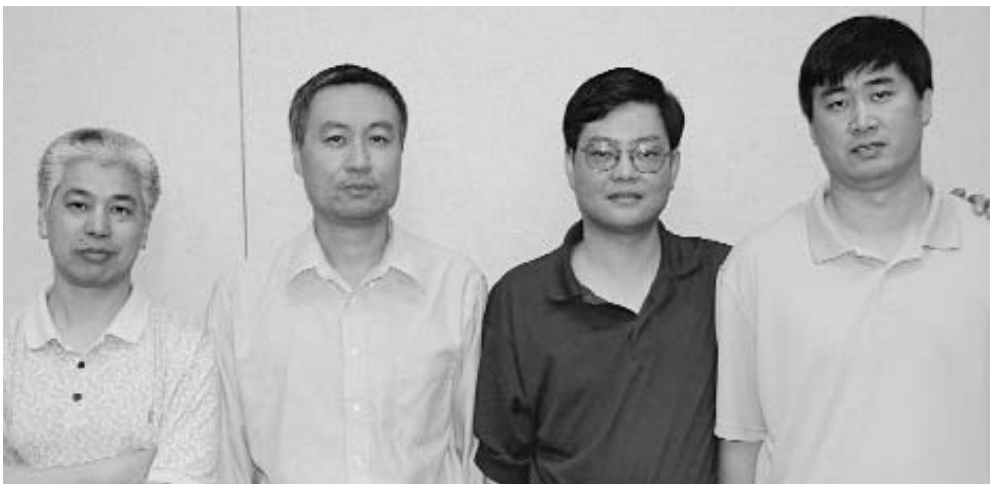
Playing for District 5 were Stan Dub and Niel Waletzky of Shaker Heights OH, and Don and Kathy Sulgrove of Twinsburg OH.

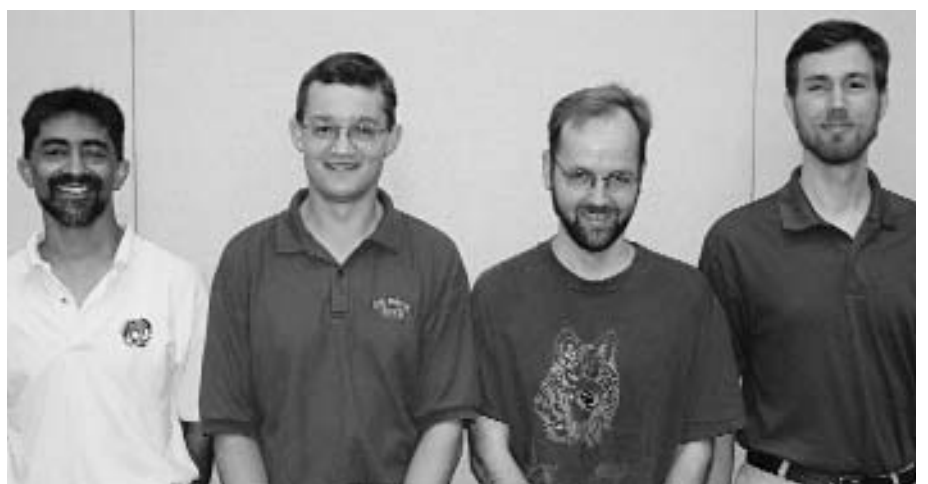

Cohen scores well against a teammate

I played in the Life Master Pairs qualifier with Ralph Cohen, who is the non-playing captain of the American team that qualified in Memphis last month for the Bermuda Bowl in Monaco in November. Incidentally, Ralph looks good and feels great – he has made a remarkable recovery from all the ailments that almost ended his life over the past couple of years.

When Ralph and I ran into one member of his Bermuda Bowl squad, Ralph naturally wanted to see his protege in good form – but a good result for us was not going to go amiss.

North naturally led a low heart. Ralph won with the king, cashed the ♦A and continued with a diamond to North's ♦K. North made the natural play of the ♠K, and Ralph followed with the 10 as South encouraged. So North continued with a low spade – and Ralph ducked again! Yes, we can maybe blame South (who is NOT on Ralph's squad) for continuing with a third spade. That let Ralph take his ace, use the heart entry to dummy and steal a precious overtrick with the 13th spade.

Key Card Blackwood is a complex mechanism – but it's a fine deal for the nuances that come up.

At this point in the auction, a 5♠ call from East asks West to pass with no key cards and to answer



whether he has the trump queen if he has three. So the auction continued:

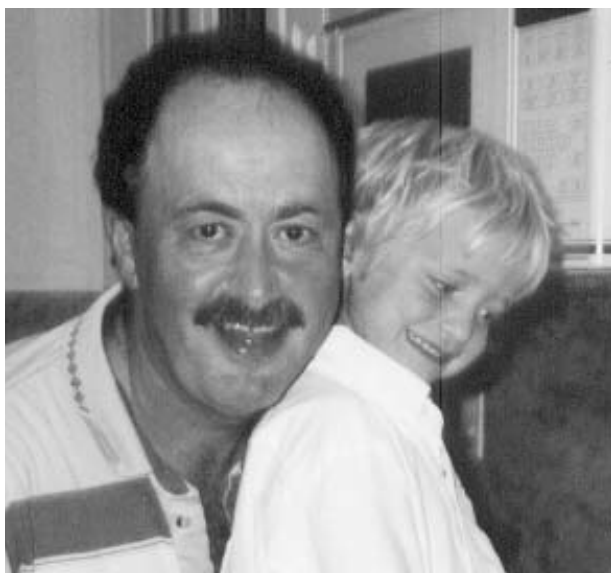
5NT (2) Pass 5♠ Pass
 6♦ (3) Pass 6♣ Pass

(2) ♠Q but no kings.

(3) Third-round diamond control – either the queen or a doubleton.

Now East knows the grand slam in spades is laydown. A practical player would just bid it! However, an idealist wants to get to 7NT to glean all those precious extra matchpoints. But how do you do it? After all, the purist wants to reach 7NT with ♦A-K-x-x facing ♦Q-J-x as well as the actual holding.

Maybe a 7♦ bid here asks West to bid 7♠ with a doubleton diamond, that is, a ruffing value. Now does 7♥ show Q-x-x and 7NT Q-J-x? Maybe it's not worth the effort to find out (or maybe only Eddie Kantar knows!)

Declarer could have made his notrump game on this deal from the semifinal round of the Grand National Teams, but he didn't have the advantage we have – he didn't know that the ♥J was going to drop singleton,

North-South got to game after Rose Meltzer of the District 21 team, the event champion, opened the bidding with 1♠. She got the defense off to a good start by leading the ♣9. Declarer could have won this, set up hearts with the drop of the jack, and set up a spade for nine tricks, but he actually ducked the first club. Meltzer and partner Peter Weichsel took full advantage.

Meltzer continued with a low club to dummy's king, and declarer led the ♥K, ducked by Weichsel. When declarer then led the ♥Q, Weichsel ducked again, but he took the third round of the suit. Meltzer discarded spades on these tricks.

Weichsel shifted to the ♠10, and this was ducked to the king. Declarer cashed his good hearts as both defenders discarded clubs. When declarer tried the ♦A, Meltzer was johnny-on-the-spot, carefully unblocking the jack. Declarer then led a low diamond, and Weichsel had the picture: he climbed with the 10. His spade continuation let Meltzer win two spade tricks to set the contract.

Grove receives Johnson Service award

National Tournament Director Doug Grove has been named the recipient of the 2003 Jane Johnson Employee Recognition Award for outstanding service and special performance.

Grove, of Silver Spring MD, began his tournament directing career in the early Eighties, and worked at his first NABC in the fall of 1983. He has served as the Assistant Director-in-Charge for the Summer NABCs (working with DIC Sol Weinstein) since 1999. Grove has an MBA from the University of Maryland.

"I'm honored to have my name mentioned in the same sentence as Jane Johnson," said Grove, referring to the longtime manager of ACBL's Club Membership department in whose honor the award is given. Johnson died in 1999 during the Fall NABC. ACBL bestows the award annually to one Headquarters employee and one tournament director who demonstrates excellent customer service. (Memphis staffer Rosie Fairchild was the other recipient of this year's Johnson Award.)

"In a way it's sort of embarrassing to be named the recipient when there are so many excellent directors who should be considered for this award," said Grove.

But Grove's self-deprecation is unwarranted according to Rick Beye, ACBL's Chief Tournament Director.

"I received an unsolicited comment from a player here in Long Beach who complimented Doug as being 'aggressively helpful'. This is a well deserved honor for him," said Beye.

"Customer service is an ever expanding goal," said Grove. "You can always be better."

If your partnership plays special overcalls, you must fill out a new pre-Alert/Disclosure form and make it available to your opponents when you play in events that allow Mid-Chart and Super-Chart conventions.

This applies to NABC+, regional or higher knockout and Flight A Swiss games. Look for the light blue forms on the table where convention cards are available.

Convention card reminder

Each player is required to have a convention card filled out legibly and on the table throughout a session. Both cards of a partnership must be identical and include the first and last names of each member of the partnership.

If a director determines that neither player has a substantially completed card, the partnership may play only Standard American Yellow Card conventions and may use only standard carding. This restriction may be lifted only at the beginning of a subsequent round after convention cards have been properly prepared and approved by the director. Further, the partnership will receive a 1/6 board

matchpoint penalty for each board played, commencing with the next round and continuing until the restriction is lifted. In IMP team games, penalties shall be at the discretion of the director.

If the director determines the partnership has at least one substantially completed convention card but has not fully complied with ACBL regulations, the director may give warnings or assign such penalties as he deems to be appropriate under the circumstances.

The objective of these warnings and penalties is the encouragement of full compliance with ACBL regulations.

Turn 'em off

Cell phones, audible pagers and any similar communication equipment may not be operated or operable in the playing area during a session of play at NABCs except for health-related equipment or by permission of the director-in-charge of the tournament or event.

Three-session KOs complete in one day

A new regional event — one-day, three-session knockout teams — will debut at this tournament. They will be held today; Wednesday, June 23, and Friday, June 25.

Make your plans now. These events have proven very popular at our local regionals because:

1. No handicapping, no round-robins. Each bracket has only eight teams. Therefore the masterpoint differential between the teams is very narrow. Your team will compete against other teams of equal ranking. There are only head-to-head matches, no round-robins.

2. No uncertainty. You complete this KO in one day and do not have to worry about canceling your bridge date for the next day. There is no uncertainty about tomorrow's game or partner.

3. Daily bridge options. This first session of the three-session KOs is held in the morning. If you happen to lose in the first round, you can still play in the two-session main event (national or regional) gold-point event that afternoon and evening.

NABC+ entries

In order to play in NABC+ events (nationally rated events with no upper masterpoint limit), a player's ACBL membership dues or Life Master service fees must be current.

These events pay platinum points and the entry is \$15.50 per player per session.

Other nationally rated events (those with an upper masterpoint limit, such as the 0-1500 Mini-Spangold Knockout Teams) pay red and gold points. The entry is \$14 per player per session for players whose ACBL membership dues or Life Master service fees are current — or \$16 per player per session for all others.

Smoking

Smoking is prohibited within the Long Beach Convention & Entertainment Center. This is in accordance with Long Beach City Ordinance No. C-6916.

Smoking is permitted outside the facility only.

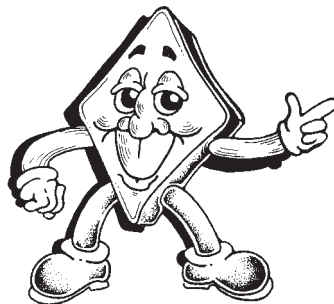
