Goodwill group honors Kantar, Nussbaum

When Eddie Kantar was introduced to Bill Gates and Warren Buffett, the two biggest money men in the United States, Gates and Buffett were more excited about meeting Kantar than vice versa. That's just one of the things we learned about Kantar as he was honored yesterday at the Goodwill Committee reception, hostessed as always by Goodwill Chairman Aileen Osofsky.

Alan Sontag enlightened us about Kantar's

exploding belt buckle. Kantar was in the middle of bidding a very good hand, but when his buckle exploded, his cards went flying in all directions. Trouble is that most of them fell face up, so the director barred Kantar's partner from bidding because of the unauthorized information he had. So Kantar bid a conservative 3NT and easily made six. At the other table, they reached 7NT which went

Capes may be new, but he shows talent

Tim Capes, a 20-year-old math major at the University of Toronto, has been an ACBL member for only a few months, but he already has scored two triumphs here in Long Beach. He won Bracket 1 of the Morning Compact Knockout Teams and the Flight A Swiss Teams.

Jonathan Steinberg, District 2 director, predicts that Capes will be a strong contender for the 2005 Canadian Junior team. Steinberg was his partner in both victories, and they also played with each other in the first round of the Spingold. Capes came to Long Beach with 80 points, and so far he has won more than 45 – almost all of them gold.

Although he's been in the ACBL only a short time, Capes has been a bridge player for a long time – 13 years. He started playing as a fill-in for his

mother and father in their home games when he was only 7. He got many of his hints on how to play by watching Audrey Grant's show on TV.

His teammates here have been different for each event. In the Swiss he played with David

Where's Deep Finesse when you need it?

The ACBL has outlawed cellphones at the table – but sometimes a pocket computer would be helpful too.

A challenging declarer play exercise presented itself in one of our knockout matches. It took us a long time after the event to determine what the right result should have been. At the table we just took our 11 IMPs.

4♥ was the contract at both tables. The early play was the same at both tables too. South ruffed the ♣K opening lead and crossed to the ♠J to lead a diamond to the king and ace. East continued with a club.

At our table East ruffed a diamond, ruffed a club, then led a third diamond before trying to cash a second spade. That let East, Jeff Aker, pitch his second spade, and the hand fell apart – down two. Ralph Cohen followed a different tack. When East led the second club, he ruffed the queen. He crossed to the ♠A and ran the ♣J, pitching a diamond from dummy. East won and tried to cash a second diamond. Cohen ruffed and led the ♣10, ruffed and overruffed. This was the ending:

Cohen had six tricks in at this point. When he led a diamond from dummy, East had a choice of losing options. If he discarded or ruffed low, Cohen would ruff with the 6, ruff a club with the king and lead a diamond from dummy. If West ruffed high Cohen would discard and later collect the ♥A-7. If East ruffed with 8 or queen, Cohen would overruff, cash the ♣9, pitching the spade from dummy, ruff a spade with the king and collect his 10th trick from the ♥76.

The question is: after the play to the first four tricks, is there a defense to beat 4♥?

We fed the deal to Deep Finesse, and the program says declarer can always make the heart game. However, Cohen's line, although close, did not quite pass muster.

Dummy ruffs the ♣K opening lead and crosses to the ♠J – so far OK. Then a diamond was led and Cohen called for the king. According to Deep Finesse, the contract will go down now with perfect defense. You have to play any diamond but the king to make the hand. Of course declarer doesn't know something that Deep Finesse knows – that the ♦AQ are doubleton over the king.

So why did Cohen make 10 tricks? The defense slipped. When East wins the ♦A and leads a club, West should not play the queen. Now declarer no longer has the timing and the spots to bring in 10 tricks.

Making 6NT the hard way

Once in a while you hear of a team making one or two notrump at both tables. On this deal from a bracketed knockout event, North-South were quite far behind, so they were shooting from the hip to try get some IMPs back. They got 11 of them here by making 4NT at one table and scoring 2NT at the other table. That adds up to 6NT, doesn't it?

Thinking that his partner must have something in clubs because he was so quiet throughout the auction, West led his singleton club. Declarer won with the king and led a spade to the king and ace. East had to decide between the red suits and he made the wrong selection – he led a diamond. West won the king and returned the suit to East's king. Suddenly declarer had 10 tricks.

This was the bidding at the other table:

Not surprisingly South led the ♦Q. Declarer knocked out the ♦A and South continued his attack on diamonds. That was all declarer needed – he had four heart tricks, two diamonds and two spades when the finesse worked. Declarer would have been limited to just five tricks if South had either opened a club or shifted to a club – but he didn't.



How to win 16 IMPs by going down 4

You don't get a hand like the West hand very often. Imagine getting to your grand slam and then not being allowed to play it there. On top of that, imagine losing 16 IMPs by getting to the best contract possible for your side. But that's what happened on this deal from Bracket 6 of the Ice Dogs Knockout Teams.

Beverly sat South on this auction. The 2♥ bid set up a game-forcing auction. Beverly decided that hearts were out on this auction. Al's failure to double meant that he was unlikely to have much there. So she tried the ♠Q!

That allowed the defense to cash seven tricks on the go. If Beverly had led a heart, declarer would have taken the first 12 tricks.

Jacobs vs. Moss, part 3 - your Spingold pick?

If teams captained by George Jacobs and Mike Moss meet in the finals of this year's Spingold, no one will be surprised – it's happened for the last two years.

Jacobs (Ralph Katz, Giorgio Duboin-Norberto Bocchi, Lorenzo Lauria-Alfredo Versace) knocked out Moss (Fred Chang, Kerry Smith and Jeff Schuett) in 2001 and a different Moss squad (Martin Shifko, Allan Graves and Bryan Maskymetz) last year.

This was a key deal in Jacobs' win last year.

The opening diamond lead was covered by the king and ace as Katz ruffed. After unblocking the ♥K, declarer crossed to the trump king (North splitting his honors) and cashed the ♥A, pitching a spade. Katz tried the ♥Q next. When South discarded the ♦Q, declarer knew the whole layout.

After pitching a spade on the ♥Q, Katz ruffed another heart. This was the position:

Katz cashed the ♠A and ruffed a spade. He then played dummy's good ♥7, discarding his last spade. North ruffed but the defense was finished. Making six for plus 920.

At the other table, Moss chose a different line of play and failed by two tricks.

History of the Spingold

The Spingold Master Knockout Teams, first known as the Challenge Knockout Teams, was contested for the Asbury Park Trophy in the early days.

The runner-up team in the regularly-scheduled portion of the event had the right to challenge the winners to a playoff. This right was never utilized.

In 1934, 1936 and 1937, the Masters Teams-of-Four and the Asbury Park Trophy were separate events, providing two sets of winners.

In 1938 the event became the Spingold Master Knockout Teams and a part of the Summer NABC.

At one time, the Spingold was a double elimination event, usually lasting nine or 10 sessions. It was scored by International Matchpoints and was restricted to players with 100 or more masterpoints.

In 1965, the double elimination method was replaced by three qualifying sessions (subsequently reduced to two), followed by single elimination knockout matches. The preliminary qualifying sessions were dropped in 1970.

The Spingold Trophy, donated by Nathan B. Spingold in 1934; the Vanderbilt Trophy, awarded to the winners of the Vanderbilt Knockout Teams at the Spring NABC, and the Reisinger Memorial Trophy, donated by the Greater New York Bridge Association in memory of Curt H. Reisinger and awarded to the winners of the Reisinger Board-a-Match Teams, are ACBL's most highly prized team trophies.

Spingold (1886-1958), a New York publicist, motion picture executive and patron of the arts, was one of the most influential men in bridge administration from 1937 to 1943.

Born in Chicago, he became a reporter on The Chicago Examiner, The Chicago Record Herald and The Chicago Tribune. Spingold's interest in show business brought him to New York City in the Thirties.

In 1932 he joined Columbia Pictures in a public relations capacity. He was named to the board of directors in 1940 and three years later was appointed vice president in charge of advertising, publicity and development. He became a vice president of the company in 1954.

Active in bridge from its earliest days, Spingold was named ABL Honorary Member in 1936. He was instrumental in effecting a peaceful merger between the American Bridge League and the United States Bridge Association in 1937 and became president of the newly formed American Contract Bridge League the following year.

He served for many years on the League's Board of Governors and Board of Directors. Spingold was also president of the Cavendish Club in New York.

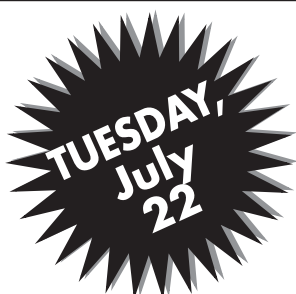

On the auction, Hamilton was wishing for a heart opening lead, and he got it. East took his ace and fired back a diamond. Hamilton tried the queen and it held. The club suit was the best source of tricks, but if Hamilton played ace and another, communications would be fatally destroyed.

He found the answer – he led a low club to West's singleton queen. Hamilton ducked the diamond return but won the next diamond, pitching spades from dummy. He now cashed the ♣A and the ♥K, then drove out the last club.

East was fixed. If he returned a heart, Hamilton would win his queen and pitch another spade from dummy. And of course a spade would be into dummy's tenace. So Hamilton made his game and his team won the event. If he had gone down, his team would have finished third.

GNT-Flight A Refund

At one table, Gene Freed opened the South hand 5♦. West doubled, ending the auction, and led the ♥A. Freed ruffed and played a low club to East's king.

East exited with a low trump but Freed judged correctly to put up the ace, dropping West's singleton king. Freed then cashed the ♣A and ruffed a club. He pulled the last trump and conceded a spade. That was good for plus 550.

At the other table, South also played 5♦ but undoubled. West led a top heart, ruffed by declarer, who then played the ♠A and a low spade. West won the ♠Q and continued with a high heart.

Declarer ruffed and played the ♣A, followed by a low club. Childs (East) overtook West's ♣Q with the king to play a third round of the suit. That promoted West's king to the setting trick. Down one.

“There were tears in my eyes as I watched the Spingolders sit down to play,” he said. “I really didn't think it would bother me. But now I regret my decision and I'm upset with myself.”

Moysian fit pays off twice in the minors

When Alphonse Moysie was trumpeting the virtues of the 4-3 fit in the pages of the Bridge World magazine a half century ago, he was of course referring to the 4-3 fit in a major that would produce a game that could not be made in any other strain. Every month, it seemed, he would come up with another example that demonstrated the beauties of the 4-3 major suit fit and wax eloquent in its behalf.

The Moysian principle, however, left open a vast and uncharted area: the 4-3 fit in a minor that would also produce a game, especially when notrump would fail. Although such deals are admittedly quite rare, two of them, incredibly enough, arose in the same session of the Grand National Teams, and were instrumental in the New England team's reaching the quarterfinal (and subsequently the semifinal) on Thursday. Oddly, the two hands were the first and last of the day, and both involved John Malley (who became a Grand Life Master at this tournament) of Pascoag RI, and myself.

This was the first of the two deals:

As can be seen, 3NT, the contract reached at the other table, has no chance after a spade lead. Malley, North, visualized that Becker would have no play in notrump unless he could run nine tricks at the start. So he cuebid spades twice, ostensibly guaranteeing at least four-card diamond support, and when South could do nothing but repeat diamonds, opted for the 11-trick diamond game. Declarer ducked the opening spade lead, taken by East, who shifted to a heart. West won and returned a heart, and declarer cashed the ♠A, crossed to his hand with a club, ruffed a spade with the queen, drew trumps and claimed.

To make Moysian disciples eternally happy, it will be noted that the 4-3 heart fit would also have produced a game.

On the final deal of the session, Malley and Becker arrived at 5♣ on a sequence too hair-raising to be included in this space. This was the hand:

Again, it will be noted that 3NT cannot be made against a heart lead followed by best defense (East has to shift to the ♠J after he wins the second heart lead with the 10). In 5♣, Malley won the opening heart lead with dummy's ace, discarding a spade. He then played the ♦AK, discarding a spade from dummy, and continued with the 10. West could not be sure whether the 10 was high, so he discarded a heart as Malley pitched another spade from dummy. Next came the ♦Q, ruffed low by West and overruffed by dummy.

Malley now ruffed a heart and played a fifth diamond, on which West and dummy discarded spades as East ruffed with the 7 for the defenders' first trick. East returned a heart, ruffed by Malley, who led a spade to dummy's now-singleton ace, ruffed a heart in his hand (leaving him with the blank king), ruffed a spade in dummy and led a heart from the table. No matter what East did at this point, Malley could not be stopped from scoring his singleton king behind East's ace for declarer's 11th trick, and the game was home.

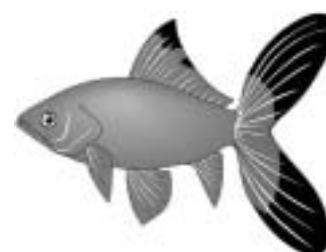
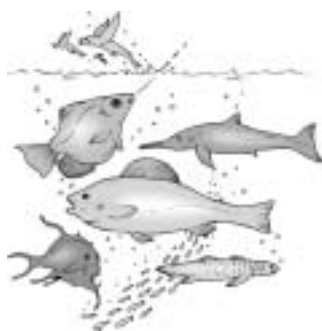
Purists will of course point out that the defenders could have done better in a couple of places along the way, but that would have ruined both the point (and the symmetry) of the story. And it might also have diminished the knowing smile on Moysie's face, wherever he may be.

When Erik Paulsen says that strange things happen in the Fast Pairs, he isn't kidding. He was telling Hugh Ross about the bidding on a deal a couple of days ago. The cards don't matter – it's all in the bidding.

West could have played the hand in 1♥ doubled, making with an overtrick. Instead he went down two doubled in 4♥. We agree with Paulsen – that 3♥ bid was really strange.

Ross played with Paulsen the next day and he too is now a believer in the "strange."

But first we have to set the stage with a deal played by Grant Baze in partnership with Ross.

Baze as South opened 1♦, West overcalled 2♣ and Ross made a negative double. Baze tried the least of evils with 2♥ on his three-carder, and Ross raised to game. Baze went down one. The deal reminded Ross of something his wife Min had told him. Min had been kibitzing Sidney Lazard, and

Lazard had said, "When you're very balanced you should be defending."

Ross told Baze about this, pointing out that they could have scored plus 800 against 2♣ doubled. "Passing never occurred to me," said Baze.

This is all leading up to a deal that Paulsen and Ross encountered in the "Strange" Fast Pairs.

Ross was in the South seat, and he remembered what his wife had told him. His hand was certainly balanced, so he decided to test the Lazard theory – he passed.

But West ran from the double – sort of. Two days in a row a player raised his own bid after being doubled! Paulsen heard Ross's pass of the double, but he didn't double. And West was willing to bid to an unnecessarily high level. So Ross thought it wise to let declarer play undoubled. Everyone looked at him as if had lost his mind when he passed. Declarer went down one – he raised himself one level too high.

Richard cashed a top club, and switched to a spade. Declarer called for dummy's ace and then for the ♣J. Mary made the key play of ruffing with the trump ace, and then cashed the ♠K for down one. Note that if East does anything else at trick three, declarer will ruff in the closed hand and discard dummy's last spade on a high diamond. This is exactly what happened at the other table, allowing the Oshlags' team to pick up 11 IMPs.

NABC+ entries

In order to play in NABC+ events (nationally rated events with no upper masterpoint limit), a player's ACBL membership dues or Life Master service fees must be current.

These events pay platinum points and the entry is \$15.50 per player per session.

Other nationally rated events (those with an upper masterpoint limit, such as the 0-1500 Mini-Spingold Knockout Teams) pay red and gold points. The entry is \$14 per player per session for players whose ACBL membership dues or Life Master service fees are current – or \$16 per player per session for all others.
