## New Goodwill chair makes auspicious debut

Rose Meltzer, knowing she has big shoes to fill on the Aileen Osofsky Goodwill Committee, took over as chair on Monday with strong words for the promotion of friendly behavior at the bridge table – and elsewhere.

“I can think of nothing more important than spreading goodwill,” Meltzer said, “in bridge and in life.”

Jay Baum, ACBL’s chief executive, echoed that sentiment and noted, “We are happy to have Rose as our new leader. Remember that bridge is a game for ladies and gentlemen.”

Meltzer replaces Osofsky, who died last summer after 25 years as the Goodwill chair. She chaired her final Goodwill Committee meeting in Reno last year.

After the CEO said his piece, Meltzer called 2011 ACBL President Craig Robinson to the podium. Robinson introduced several members of the World Bridge Federation executive committee, who had been meeting in Louisville, and he announced that the group plans to meet at the ACBL’s spring tournament each year going forward.

After that, Robinson told a story about a tournament he attended just before the Spring NABC. “The week prior to Louisville, there was one regional in the U.S. – in Wilkes Barre, Pennsylvania,” Robinson said, “and we had a guest at the tournament. It was Patty Tucker, the

## Damage to Japanese bridge clubs not known

Three hours into his flight from Tokyo to Chicago, Tadashi Yoshida found out some disturbing news – the captain announced that a large earthquake and tsunami had struck northern Japan. Yoshida, Secretary General of the Japanese Contract Bridge League, was on his way to Louisville to attend meetings and play.

When he landed at O’Hare airport in Chicago, he watched TV and found out that the northern coast of Japan had been devastated. Millions of people were without water, food or heating in near-freezing conditions. Many were missing. Japan’s Prime Minister, Naoto Kan, called it the “Japan’s worst disaster since World War II.” The quake measured 9.0 on the Richter scale.

Yoshida says that he’s obviously concerned, but doesn’t know much more than what’s been reported in the media. He says that Sendai, a city of more than one million, was hit hard. The extent of the damage to their bridge club isn’t known. The club holds games three times each week.

There is damage to a nuclear power plant.

## Arnold, Kokish honored for long service to bridge

Russ Arnold, Grand Life Master, world champion and nine-time North American champion, has been selected by the ACBL Bridge Hall of Fame Committee as the recipient of the von Zedtwitz Award for long service to bridge combined with expertise as a player.

The same committee selected Eric Kokish as the recipient of the Blackwood Award, given to the player who has served bridge without necessarily being a top-flight player. Kokish is, however, is an accomplished

player, with two North American championships to his credit along with silver medals in the Bermuda Bowl and the World Open Pairs.

Induction ceremonies for the two will take place during the 2011 Summer NABC in Toronto.

Bobby Levin, one of ACBL’s top players, was once a protégé of Arnold, who lives in Sunny Isles Beach FL.

Levin moved to Florida from New York at age 14. A couple of

## Connecticut pair wins Silver Ribbon

Richard DeMartino and John Stiefel had two strong final sessions, 62.89% and 61.16%, to win the Leventritt Silver Ribbon Pairs. They began the day in 50th place, moved up to fourth following the initial final session and were first at the end.

Former ACBL President DeMartino of Riverside CT now has five NABC titles. He has won all three major senior championships: the Senior Knockout Teams, the Senior Swiss Teams and now the Silver Ribbon Pairs. He also won the Senior Pairs at the last world championship.

### Bid Box Alerts and Announcements

When using bid boxes, the ACBL requires that players tap the Alert strip and say "Alert" at the same time.  
 When making an Announcement, use the Announcement word (such as "transfer") and tap the Alert strip at the same time.  
 A player who Alerts or Announces a bid must make sure his opponents are aware that an Alert or Announcement has been made.

### Electronic Device Policy



- For all NABC+ rated events at NABCs: Electronic devices, including but not limited to, phones, cameras, PDAs, and others capable of sending or receiving electronic communication are excluded from the playing areas during any session of play. This does not apply to health-related equipment.
- For all events at an NABC other than a NABC+ rated event: Except for health-related equipment, or by permission of the Director-in-Charge of the tournament, cell phones, audible pagers or similar equipment may not be operated or operable in any manner in the playing area during a session of play. Any such equipment must not be visible during the session. Sponsoring organizations of other ACBL-sanctioned events are encouraged to adopt a similar policy.
- These restrictions in numbers 1 and 2 above apply to all pairs, team members, captains, coaches, play recorders (except those designated by ACBL) and kibitzers and are in force throughout any actual playing session or segment of play.
- A violation of any of the restrictions in numbers 1 and 2 above will result in a disciplinary penalty of one full board (12 IMPs at that form of scoring) for the first offense. A second offense will result in disqualification from the event for the pair/team. Kibitzers violating this policy will be removed from the playing area for the remainder of the session.

# JUST FOR NEW PLAYERS

## Developing a winning attitude

I'm so glad you've joined me today for more Louisville guidance. You're having a great time, aren't you? If this is your first NABC, you're probably slightly stunned by those huge rooms, filled from wall to wall with players.



You're trying to come up with the right words to describe it all to your friends at home. You're running up against tricky hands, and trickier opponents. And at some point, you surely have asked yourself, "What does it take to win at this level of competition?"

The answer to that question (and many others!) can be found at the racetrack.

Let's take a look at one of those gorgeous racehorses close up...he's a 2-year-old colt...let's call him Grand Slam. It's his first racing season and he's been doing a little winning. How did he get to be the promising athlete he is?

First, his very existence was planned scientifically. His mom and dad were chosen to provide the best possible genetic matchup. His dad was quite the winner, and his mom has already produced two stake winners, and that's a good thing! At least on paper, he looks like a winner.

Every moment of his life has been directed and programmed toward victory. Every mouthful of food has been chosen for its nutritional content, measured to the last grain.

And his training...designed to guide him to his full potential. And boy oh boy, does our little Slammy love every moment of it. He jogs his hundreds of miles needed to build his endurance and breathing so he won't come up "short" at the end of the race. He is a Standardbred, and he can tell by what equipment the trainer is putting on him whether today is a workout day or a day where he will be asked for speed. He loves to run!

He loves to run, but he doesn't love to win. Here's something I bet you didn't know. By nature, horses like to be deep in the herd where it's safe. Slammy doesn't want to be in front of the pack where it could be dangerous. In this respect, Slammy, like most athletes, is his own worst enemy. Does this apply to bridge players?

Hmmm...think about it.

Slammy has to be trained to love to win. His people bring him on slowly, encouraging the will to win, and give him the techniques. He learns to work with his driver and trusts his driver. As time goes by, he develops the will to win. But I want you to know it isn't necessarily there to begin with...it's the nature of the beast. Again, this is why I encourage beginners to play in the wonderful Newcomer games the ACBL provides...so you can learn to win.

And now, let's look at you! Are you your own worst enemy? Did you put in your hundreds of training miles at the bridge club before coming here? Do you play faithfully, working with your partner to develop your skills? Do you review hands? All of this is routine to the serious player. Let's look at some other factors.

When you're here at the Big Time, are you out partying or, like Slammy, are you tucked in your stall to get a good night's sleep? Are you eating right? Do you plan a perfect balance of table time and recreation time? You are the athlete and the trainer, so you need to keep in mind what it takes to win...if you are serious about it.

A horse-training friend of mine said he'd much rather train horses than humans. The horses might not be as bright...but you never have to bail them out of jail, and you can be fairly sure they won't be partying at a club the night before a big race.

And from last night's e-mails: "Hi Marti! Can you please help me explain to my partner what he did wrong? Here's the hand and bidding. I was South

Who made the error? Why didn't my partner bid? With the right line of play, 6♦ is possible, 5♦ is cold. Regards, Bob"

Oh Bob, Bob, Bob...you're trying to get me to play the "blame game." Not nice. There's



plenty to go around, including your share! I can't understand all the passes. West, sure. North? Not vul, I would encourage North to preempt in diamonds. East, in third seat, can certainly come up with a 2♥ bid.

Over your 1♠ opener, North should bid something. With an ace, I don't encourage people to use weak jump shifts, so I like 1NT. Assuming no interference by the opponents, if South rebids 2♠, North can pass, confident of an eight-card fit. Over 2♣, North can bid 2♦ to show a long suit and a hand not strong enough to bid 2♦ directly. Over 2♥, 3♦ should be the choice. In a diamond contract, the North hand can take a lot of tricks even if South doesn't have great trump support. In some other contract, the North hand might take only one trick.

South's double is okay. The high-card strength makes up for the fact that South is not 4-4 in the minors, which the double suggests.

After West bids 3♥, it's tough to get to notrump. North should certainly bid diamonds with a seven-card suit opposite a takeout double, but that goes past 3NT – and if North passes, bidding 3NT is a big position for South to take. It works on this deal, but what if North's diamonds are seven to the Q-J? Now 3NT has no play whatsoever.

The bottom line is that North should have a winning attitude and simply bid 5♦. After all, South's double does show extras. He's forcing North to bid despite the fact that North did not keep the bidding open. Getting to slam is another issue, but North should definitely look at his hand as much more powerful with a known fit.

So, go forth and conquer. Have the winning attitude. And let me know how you're doing! mronemus@comcast.net

## Thinking bridge

**Bidding commentary:** South has a reasonable passed-hand takeout double, somewhat flawed lacking four spades. West's passed-hand redouble is limited to 10-11 HCP. North has an automatic 1♠ response, and both you and East have nothing more to say. As East, do not bid over 1♠ unless you have an unbalanced hand. West promises at least one more bid if you pass. West competes with 2♥, showing a minimum redouble with three hearts. East is thrilled to pass.

**Defensive commentary:** After the normal lead of the ♠Q, it is likely that declarer will play low from dummy. If so, North signals with the ♠10, the higher equal to show interest. If that happens, South continues with the ♠J (the higher of two remaining cards) and North winds up taking the third spade trick.

**Further defensive commentary:** As North, peering at this dummy, it is clear that clubs is the suit to attack, but which club? When the dummy

to your right has the 9-x-(x)-(x) and you have the Q-10-8-(x) or K-10-8-(x), attack with the 10, your second-highest honor, called a "surrounding play." You have the 9 surrounded with the (10 8) plus a higher non-touching honor, the definition of a surrounding play. It also applies when East, the dummy, has the 10-x-(x)-(x) and you, North, have the K-J-9-(x) or the A-J-9-(x). This time you have the 10 surrounded with the J-9 plus a higher non-touching honor and again you must start with the second-highest honor, the jack.

If North leads the 8, East plays low and South wins the king, but East remains with the A-J hovering over the queen and the defense gets one trick. If the 10 is led and East covers with the jack, South wins and returns a club, North having the Q-8 sitting over the 9-7. The defenders establish two club tricks to go along with three spades and the ♦A, down one.

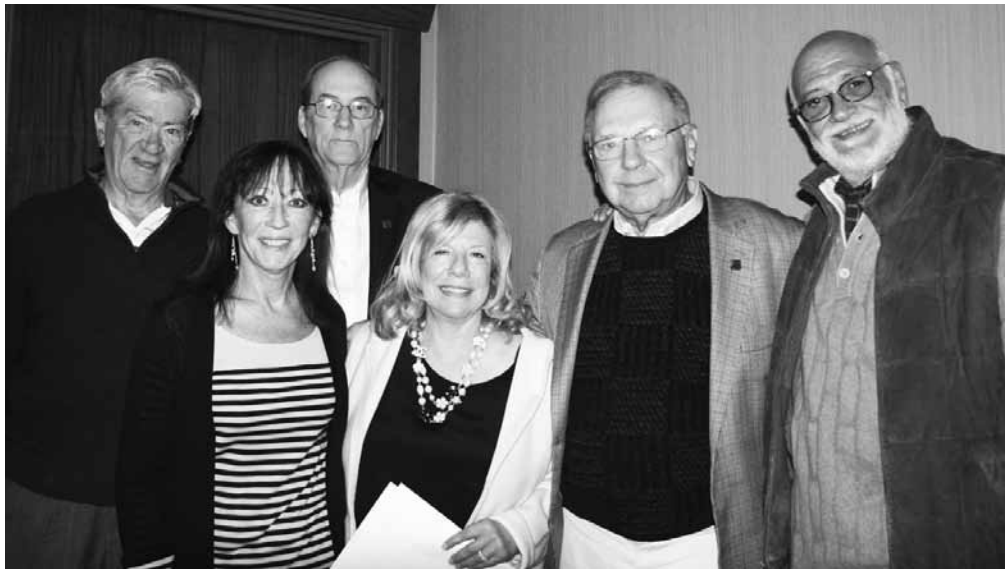

According to Yoshida, that has resulted in rolling blackouts in Tokyo. This means that the electricity is shut down for several hours each day.

Japanese players are regulars at NABCs. Yoshida says that more than 150 players attended the Hawaii NABC in 2006. There are only four players in Louisville. “It’s hard to fly here,” says Yoshida. “When tournaments are on the West coast, we usually send 40 to 50 players.”

Yoshida attended the Competition and Conventions meeting and the ACBL Board of Governors meeting. Besides being an administrator, Yoshida plays — today his squad is in the Vanderbilt KO Teams.

## Trying for a plus

A 4♦ contract might be makeable at double dummy, but in practice North-South's best chance to go plus might be defeating 4♣. Normal, if uninspired, defense is for South to lead a low diamond.

The defense at this point tended to see North win the ♦A and cash the ♣A to avoid subsequent endplays. North then played a second diamond, covered by the jack and king and ruffed in dummy. A low heart saw the queen score, followed by a heart pitch from dummy on the ♦Q. A second heart endplayed North to give a ruff-sluff or lead a spade around to dummy's queen.

Does that mean the defenders cannot prevail?

One possible defense is for South not to cover the second diamond. Declarer has to take a discard from the West hand prematurely, but he can survive by pitching a spade from dummy, ruffing the last diamond, playing a heart to his queen and running the trumps. In the three-card ending, North has to bare his ♠K or ♥A. Either way, he scores only his ♥A if declarer reads the position.

So what is the defense?

A mundane heart lead from South lets North insert the 10 and later play low when the diamond is led from dummy. South wins the ♦K and continues with the ♥J to kill the heart menace and allow the defenders to collect a spade trick at the end.

If South leads a club, there is a defense – but not one that any mortal would find! North wins the ♣A and must shift to a low heart.

months later, he was playing in a team event at a tournament. His teammate was in a suit contract with a side suit of K J 10 9 8 x opposite a singleton. At one point, the teammate played the singleton to the jack and right-hand opponent's ace. Later, the teammate cashed the king and played a third round, ruffing, only to see LHO show out. Down one in a cold contract.

Levin asked who his teammate's RHO was and was told it was Arnold.

Levin recalls thinking, "That is the partner for me."

At age 17, Levin started playing regularly with Arnold, and by the time Levin had turned 22, he and Arnold had been on winning teams in the Bermuda Bowl, Vanderbilt Knockout Teams and the Reisinger Board-a-Match Teams.

"He has been a brother and a father to me," Levin says of Arnold.

Arnold, Levin says, always put ethical behavior first, and he proved to be "a tremendous competitor and a great declarer. I put him in some 4-3 fits that aren't even printable, and he brought them home. He is a fantastic player and a great guy."

Levin says that when he moved to Florida, "Billy Seamon was the Pope of bridge, and Russ Arnold was the Godfather."

## Kokish

Although Kokish has many accomplishments as a player, he is best known today as the coach of the Nick Nickell team, arguably the most dominant force in bridge for the past couple of decades. He has coached the team since 1998.

Away from the table and his coaching duties, Kokish has many other accomplishments, including work as editor and writer of the world championship books produced by the World Bridge Federation. He is also heavily involved in the experts' publication, The Bridge World, serving as Master Solvers director and Challenge the Champs.

For many years, he contributed a column in the ACBL Bridge Bulletin, Our Readers Ask.

He is also a former bridge columnist for the Montreal Gazette in his former home town, and the Toronto Star Syndicate.

He is a regular vugraph commentator at world championships.

In the mid-Nineties, Kokish was hired to coach the Indonesian national team and had moved his family to that country but had to leave after a few months because of a political upheaval.

Besides the silver medals in world competition, Kokish has two North American titles: the Vanderbilt and the Men's Open Board-a-Match Teams (now the Mitchell Open BAM).

Kokish enjoys coaching players with potential, and he gets a lot out of his job with the Nickell squad, although he acknowledges it can be taxing to try to get a relatively new partnership on the squad - Bob Hamman and Zia Mahmood - on the same page. "Zia and Hamman are great players . . . from different planets."

Mostly, Kokish says, "I really miss playing."

Josh Parker and Bruce Rogoff play a strong club system. Parker's The 1♠ showed a balanced positive response, so Rogoff bid what he thought his partner could make. Now the contract was played the "wrong way" up. On the lead of the ♣J, Parker put up dummy's queen. South took the ♣A and continued with a club to remove the entry to the West hand. Parker won, went to the ♥A to unblock the suit, then led the ♠9 from dummy. South put up the ♠Q.

Parker then was able to get to hand with the ♠10 to pitch two of dummy's diamonds on the top hearts, then led up to the ♦K for plus 420. If South ducks the first spade lead, declarer might well go wrong.
