

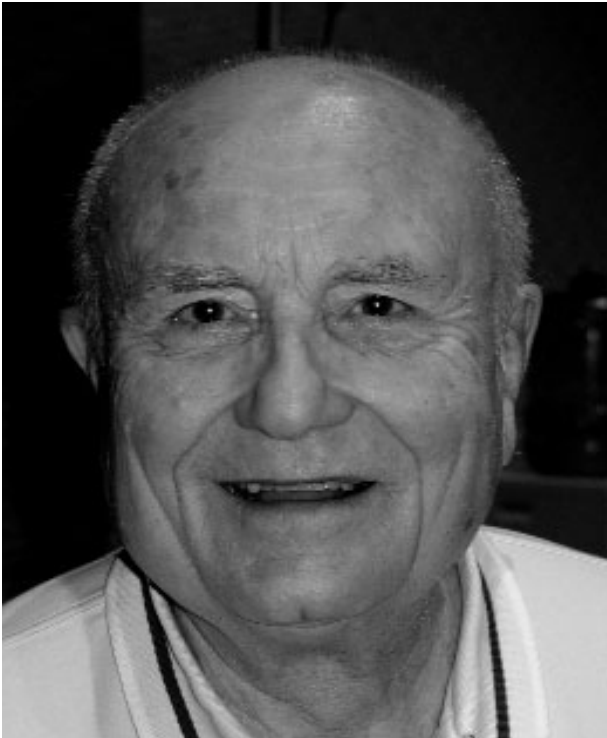

Miles, Sheardown In Hall of Fame

Marshall Miles of Redlands CA, author, columnist, mentor and star player, has been named to the ACBL Hall of Fame as the winner of the Blackwood Award. He is joined by the late Percy Sheardown of Toronto, a superb player, who was the winner of the von Zedtwitz Award. The Blackwood Award is given to a player who has made major contributions to bridge away from the table. The von Zedtwitz Award is given to an outstanding player who has been out of the public eye for many years.

They will be inducted into the Hall in Atlanta at the Summer Championships. The Hall of Fame banquet will take on the first Saturday evening instead of on opening night.

"I didn't even know I was in the ring," Miles said when informed of his latest honor. "I'm very surprised, and I must say that it feels really good."

Miles was an attorney for 40 years, but that didn't keep him away from the bridge table or from his desk where he wrote so many fine books about the game. His books include *How to Win at Duplicate Bridge*, *All 52 Cards*, *Marshall Miles Teaches Logical Bridge*, *Bridge from the Top (volumes 1 and 2)*, *Stronger Competitive Bidding*, and *Competitive Bidding in the 21st Century*. 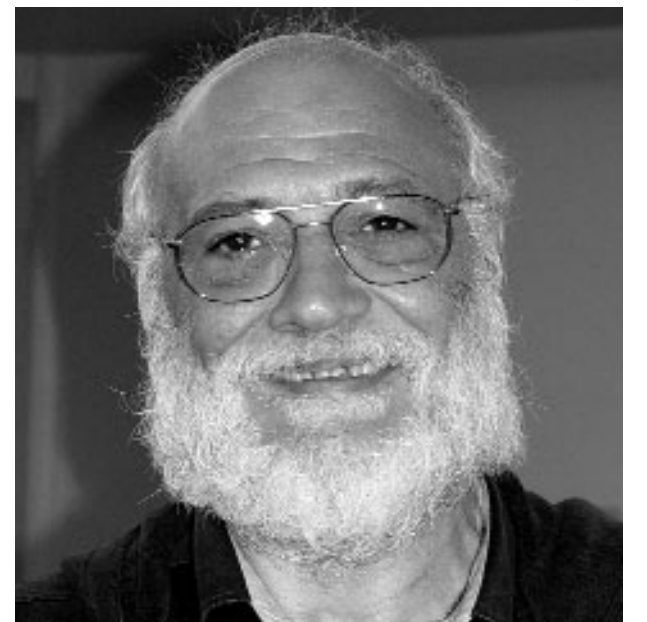
Brachman still leads Reisinger

Brachman, the leaders after the first day, ended the second day of qualifying with a score of 34.50. In second place at 31.66, were Roy Welland, Bjorn Fallenius, Zia Mahmood, Michael Rosenberg, Adam Zmudzinski and Cezary Balicki.

Tied for third-fourth were teams captained by James Cayne and Sam Lev, each with 31.33. Right behind them, tied for the next two places, were the Lou Ann O'Rourke and Nick Nickell squads.

EBL president promotes intercontinental challenge



If Giannarigo Rona has his way, bridge players around the world will be entertained next year by a event with the status and appeal of golf's Ryder Cup, the USA-Europe competition which dates to 1927.

Rona, president of the European Bridge League, was in Orlando to meet with ACBL officials to discuss details for the first Intercontinental Bridge Challenge, which Rona hopes will be staged in Rome next year.

The idea, he says, is for Europe and North America to select teams to compete for a prestigious title, with the playing venue alternating between the two continents.

Rona said the EBL established a European Champions Cup three years ago. The winner of that event, he says, would be the European challenger in the proposed new competition. He says it would be up to the ACBL to decide how to select the North

David McLellan liked his chances when he saw dummy on this deal from the second session of the Blue Ribbon Pairs. However, he had heard the double, and he knew that he might run into some problems, especially in the trump suit.

West led the ♥8 to David McLellan's king, and McLellan crossed to the ♥A and ruffed a heart. The finesse to the ♦Q was successful, and Treble cashed the ♦A before ruffing dummy's last heart with the queen. But West overruffed with the king.

The overruff was fatal. West exited with a diamond for the ruff and discard. Declarer ruffed low in dummy and advanced the ♠J to find the expected bad news. He led a club and West correctly discarded rather than ruff a loser. McLellan won the ace in dummy and exited with a club. In the three-card ending, dummy had ♠A-8-6 over West's ♠10-9-7. When East led a plain card, West ruffed with the 9 and dummy underruffed. West was endplayed – he had to give declarer the last two tricks. Making the spade game despite the 5-0 trump break.

New Life Masters

George Delp of Gainesville GA needed only .59 gold points to become a Life Master. In the consolation round of Bracket 8 of the Shopping Season Compact KO, he managed 1.57 to go over the top. He was playing with his wife, April. Their teammates were Leon and Patricia Neuzerling of Venice FL.

Larry Chegwidan of Clearwater FL came to Orlando needing only .66 gold points to become a Life Master. It was the eighth straight tournament he has attended needing just that fraction for his gold card. In the Compact KO on Saturday, he overdid it, earning 2.72 gold to get that letter at the front of his player number. Chegwidan was playing with Doris Houdesheldt of St. Petersburg FL. Their teammates were Tony and Joan Viidik of Waterloo ON.

The bottom line, Rona says, is to attract more attention from the press for bridge and to convince the news media that "bridge is not a minor sport but a big one that is played by millions of people around the world.

Rona says he is optimistic that the ACBL and the EBL can work together to promote bridge. "We have the same objectives," he says.

The current holders of the European Champions Cup are the team sponsored by the prestigious tennis Club from Rome – Parioli. Rona was also in Orlando to help promote the 2nd European Open Bridge Championship, scheduled for June 18 to July 2 in Tenerife, Canary Islands.

The first European championship open to all comers – Americans won two major events – was in Menton on the French Riviera in the summer of 2003.

Rona is careful to note that all playing facilities on Tenerife are completely air conditioned, so no matter what the weather, players will compete in comfort. In Menton in 2003, the playing facility did not have air conditioning, and there was an unusual heat wave in Europe during that time that made playing conditions difficult.

Tenerife, Rona says, is a "fantastic venue, and the weather is always like spring."

Hotels and restaurants are inexpensive, Rona says. "We had the European championships there two years ago and the players loved it."

All events are transnational – players may be from any country – and there are no restrictions on the number of players from particular countries.

Rona notes that there is now a direct flight to Tenerife from Miami

The schedule of events, he says, is the same as in Menton – Mixed Teams, Mixed Pairs, Open, Women's and Senior Teams and Open, Women's and Senior Pairs, plus side games every day. The program includes opening and closing ceremonies.

Playing detective

This deal from the Blue Ribbon Pairs shows how important it is to count and to pay attention to the information provided. The hero of the piece is Bill Pollack, playing with Mark Cohen.

Pollack's 3♣ bid showed some values, but Cohen couldn't get too excited opposite a passed hand.

South started with a low heart to North's ace, and there would be no story if North had played a diamond – the defenders would have taken all the tricks due them. North could not see all the cards, however, so he made the reasonable return of a low spade. Pollack took full advantage, inserting the ♠Q. He then took a club finesse. In with the ♣K, North had another chance to hold declarer to nine tricks with a diamond switch, but he continued with a spade to Pollack's ace. Pollack played the ♣J, a club to the ace, cashed the ♥K then ruffed a spade to hand.

With the trumps drawn and spades eliminated, Pollack reviewed the information he had to decide what to do about diamonds.

North had shown up with the ♥A, the ♠K and the ♣K – and he was a passed hand. There was no way he could have the ♦K.

That made it easy for Pollack to decide what to do. He played the ♥J from hand, and when South covered, Pollack discarded a low diamond from dummy. South was now on lead with the choice of leading away from his ♦K or giving Pollack a ruff-suff. Either way, Pollack had his 10th trick – and you know how important those overtricks can be at matchpoints.

Diamond Life Master

George Retek of Montreal, former president of the ACBL and former treasurer of the World Bridge Federation, went over the 5000-point mark yesterday and is now a Diamond Life Master. At present he is the District 1 representative to the ACBL Board of Directors.



King still working on major pro tour

Nearing the end of the fourth year of his efforts to promote cash-prize bridge, Larry King still has his eye on a major sponsor for a pro tour that he believes will put bridge on the national map. King believes it's only a matter of time before it happens.

"We were close to getting a major sponsor this year," he says, "but the company suffered a major financial reverse and it didn't work out."

King envisions a professional tour much like the women's tennis circuit he put on the map decades ago. As he sees it, there would be weekly contests, played as individuals, with the winner each week earning \$50,000 to \$100,000.

That kind of competition could give bridge the kind of credibility that poker is currently enjoying.

All his work with the BPT – Prize Money Bridge has been done with that goal in mind.

It's been slow going so far, King acknowledges, but he isn't discouraged, in part because the games are still growing.

In the first year, BPT put on four events. There were six in the second year, 10 in the third year, and when the circuit is complete in 2004, there will have been 23 different events awarding about \$70,000 in prizes.

King wants what he terms "recreational" cash prize events to continue growing to attract the attention of potential sponsors for the bigger tournament.

A major sponsor, King says, "is out there." Despite the disappointment of losing out on the almost-committed sponsor this year, King says, "I've got other irons in the fire, and if one of them comes through it will change the face of bridge."

West had enough to open 1NT, but two things persuaded him to start with 1♠ — the 5-4-2-2 distribution and the five spades. Disa Eythorsdottir naturally overcalled in hearts, and George Rosenkranz passed the first time around. He passed again over 3♣, but he ran to 3♠ when Eythorsdottir bid 3♦. He knew 3NT was hopeless – no entries to his hand – so he pulled 3NT to 4♠.

He teased his partner. His first spade play was the 10 and the second was the king – he concealed the ♠9. Eythorsdottir squirmed in her seat as she had visions of the contract going down because of the S9. But finally, with a twinkle in his eye, Rosenkranz produced the 9 and claimed his game. He made game in the suit in which his opponent had made a legitimate opening bid.

Size not important

The Fast Pairs on Thanksgiving brought one player an early present in terms of the best hand he had seen all tournament. – but there was no joy in Mudville.

Wouldn't you hope to get a bid in edgewise with this hand? Mike Whitman, South, had his chance at this reporter's table – he was in second seat at unfavorable vulnerability. He was treated to a 4♥ opening bid on his right. Plan your campaign!

Whitman tried 5♥, and then bid 6♥ over the expected 5♠ response. The bad news was that his LHO doubled – now he knew there would be heart ruffs against 6♠, so he tried 6NT. That ended the auction. Facing

1 + 1 = 50

This deal from the first qualifying session of the Blue Ribbon Pairs was, in the considered opinion of Robert Levin, a beauty to behold. On the surface, it seems to be a rather mundane partscore that failed. There was much more to it than that, however, and the result helped Levin and Steve Weinstein to second place in the event.

Levin didn't want to make a negative double with the South hand because he had so much in hearts, and he was void in his partner's suit.

When 3♣ came back around to him, however, Levin was willing to bid 3♠ because he could draw the inference from the bidding that his partner almost certainly had four of them. "I figured it was about 90% that he had four spades," Levin said. For one thing, considering his own length in clubs, Levin was sure that Weinstein was short in that suit. It was also unlikely, considering that he and East had at least 10 hearts, that Weinstein had very many of that suit. That left room in the North hand for diamonds and spades.

Levin was correct, of course. That was inference No. 1, the first "1" of the equation in the headline.

The auction was over and now it was Weinstein's turn to do some thinking. He had to figure out how Levin could infer that he, Weinstein, held four spades. With due consideration, a savvy player like Weinstein was sure to work it out. Weinstein reasoned that Levin could infer spade length in the other hand only if he, Levin, was looking at length in clubs and hearts, meaning Levin was very short in diamonds.

Weinstein's inference about Levin's inference – the "1 + 1" – led him to find the best opening lead: the ♦9, suit preference for spades. Declarer could have made the contract by inserting the ♦10 at trick one – he should have been working on his own inferences – but he went up with the ace. Levin ruffed and made the killing return of a low spade. Declarer had to go up with the ace or Weinstein would win and give his partner another diamond ruff, with the ♥A to come. Declarer won the ♠A and played the ♣Q to the king and ace. He could pull trumps and take a diamond finesse, but he had no fast entry back to hand to take a second one. West tried to sneak a heart past Levin, but Levin went up with the ace and returned a spade. The defense collected a diamond ruff, one heart and two spade tricks for plus 50, the last part of the equation. So there you have it: 1 inference plus 1 inference equals plus 50. Easy!

Facts: According to the table director, the players at the table agreed that there was a break in tempo of approximately 30 seconds before West bid 5♣.

Director's Ruling: The director ruled that passing was not a logical alternative for East. Therefore, there could be no adjustment under Law 12.

The Appeal: North-South appealed on the grounds that passing 5♣ was a logical alternative and should have been the adjusted result on the board.

The Decision: The case was not screened and East-West could not be located to be notified of the existence of the appeal. The screening director was even unable to identify the parties sitting East-West. The table director reported that East made no statements as to their methods while West said that the pass of 3♥ showed some values, but West was unsure about whether 4♣ was forcing.

The committee found that there was a break in tempo. The break in tempo did convey unauthorized information. The UI did suggest bidding 6♣. The committee reasoned that the break in tempo certainly did not suggest that West's choice was between bidding and passing; it reflected West's uncertainty about what to bid. The committee decided that since most of the bidding options other than 5♣ suggested a greater likelihood of the success of a 6♣ bid by East, 6♣ was demonstrably suggested by the break in tempo.

The committee believed that while passing would likely not be a good matchpoint result – bidding on in a BAM was also problematic. Therefore, the committee found that pass was a logical alternative to bidding 6♣ and it reverted the contract to 5♣, making six for plus 420 for East-West.

It took Dorothy Truscott 30 years to produce her newest book, and it isn't about bridge. The work required mountains of research.

The title is "Hell Gate." It's the story of the family that settled Harlem as part of the Dutch colony that became New York.

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Bridge World, American Bridge Digest and Bridge Today. In addition he also helped out with the early edition of the *Official Encyclopedia of Bridge*.

"I'm playing bridge more than ever these days," Miles said. "My wife died four and a half years ago, so now I don't have any major responsibilities. My other activity is taking my dog for walks."

He started playing duplicate in 1946. He remembers his first duplicate vividly.

"I had just got out of the Navy, and I heard about a club where I could play bridge there in San Diego. I went there and they got me a partner, a friendly elderly lady. We came in next to last. We played again about a week later, and this time we came in last. We played one more time, and once again we were last.

"Many years later I was at the NABC in Coronado, and I saw the same woman. She recognized me as well and came over to talk a bit. 'I remember you so well,' she said. 'I remember we played a few times in San Diego way back when, and we won. Remember?'"

Miles' favorite partner is Eddie Kantar, but Mark Bartusek and Bill Hanna are close behind. He has an outstanding play record – two Spingolds, two Men's Pairs, Reisinger, Life Master Pairs, the Chicago (now the Reisinger), the Fishbein Trophy and the Lou Herman Trophy. He also placed third in the World Bidding Contest.

Percy Sheardown

Sheardown was winning countless bridge events even before the advent of masterpoints. He won his first North American championship in 1936 — the Chicago, now the Reisinger. He became a Life Master in 1948, the first Canadian to make the grade.

"Percy Sheardown was the greatest player Canada ever produced," said Ralph Cohen of Memphis, a mighty good Canadian player in his own right. Cohen quickly pointed out that Sami Kehela is not a Canadian product – he was born in Baghdad. "Sheardown was one of the greatest players in the Thirties, Forties and Fifties. He was brilliant. He also was a fine teacher, and he was a mentor to many of Canada's leading players."

Cohen recalled kibitzing Sheardown in a Spingold in 1947. "He played with two women as partners, Charlotte Sidway and Mildred Cunningham. He was absolutely imperturbable. No matter what happened, he never made a wrong bid, never made a wrong play. His performance was awe-inspiring."

Sheardown represented Canada in two Olympiads – 1960 and 1968. He won two Chicagos, two Spingolds, the Life Master Pairs and the Fishbein Trophy plus many other titles back in the early years of contract bridge.

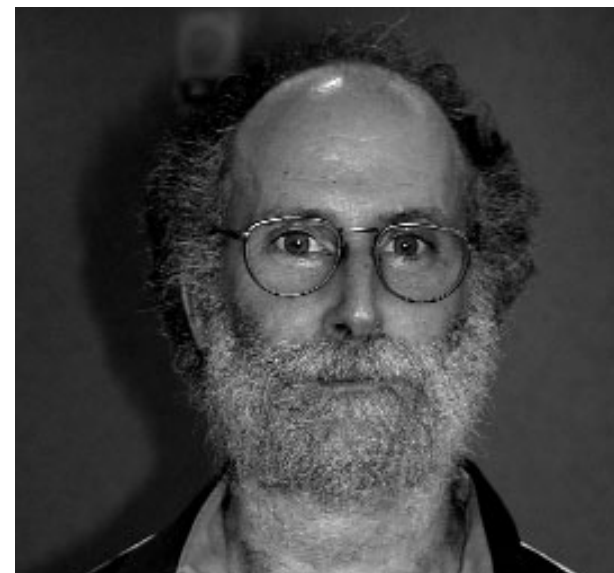

playing on the Nick Nickell squad in the Reisinger Board-a-Match Teams, so Rodwell will not be able to catch his partner. Meckstroth's platinum-point total is 684.87 to 640.31 for Rodwell.

With 250 masterpoints available for winning the Reisinger, there are many other contenders for the top prize, including Ralph Katz, whose total is 612.17. Behind Katz are David Berkowitz and Larry Cohen, both with 610.91.

In sixth place, with 589.56, is Zia Mahmood, followed by Steve Robinson, 558.89; Fulvio Fantoni, 555.67; Walid Elahmady, 552.73, and Paul Soloway, 516.76.



Steve Bloom now is Grand Life Master

Steve Bloom of Duaneburg NY got the final points he needed in yesterday's Compact Knockouts, and today he is the ACBL's newest Grand Life Master. He went over 10,000 masterpoints, and he has two North American championships to his credit – Swiss Teams and Mixed Teams.

His regular partner is his wife Betty. They have been playing together since 1975 and they've been married for 26 years. Betty is closing in on Grand Life Master – she needs about 600 points. They play the Precision system.

Steve is a professor of mathematics at Siena College. Betty is a retired professor – she taught sociology at Southern Illinois University.

she told Thomas, "You're the only person I'd do this for."

Besides learning from Thomas, Raphaelson said, she has had the experience of her life.

For starters, she said, "I can say only wonderful things about the hotel. They have dealt with problems with humor, competence and eagerness."

She said she is especially thankful to Bill Hurst of the hotel staff for providing her a special parking pass so that she could get in and out quickly. That has been important, Raphaelson said, because she has had to leave the playing site regularly during the tournament.

Raphaelson also had high praise for the tournament's legion of volunteers. "Every one of them has gone out of their way to accommodate people."

She also said that Jeff Johnston of ACBL Meeting Services has been invaluable. "Whatever he makes," she said, "it isn't enough."

Raphaelson also mentioned her husband, Elliott, "who has been so patient and supportive."

Having played several sessions, Raphaelson has had considerable interaction with players. "Everyone has told me how much they've enjoyed the tournament and that they can't wait to come back," she said.

Compared to Thomas, Raphaelson said, "I've put in minimum work, but everything I did was worth the effort. It's been a wonderful experience."

106 Platinum boards

Gene Simpson of San Rafael CA believes he set a record Friday when he played the first 34 boards of the Senior Knockout Teams final. Then he sat down for 28 boards of the North American Swiss. Next came the last 30 boards of the Senior KOs. Then he went back to the Swiss and played 14 boards. Add it up - it's 106 deals.



JUST FOR NEW PLAYERS



'Judge Judy' Cotterman popular with newcomer crowd

Judy Cotterman remembers her introduction to tournament directing very well. Her husband, David, already a TD, was retaking the director's course during the 1991 Fall NABC in Indianapolis.

Judy was interested and thought she would enjoy sitting in on the class. When she arrived for the first session, TDs Betty Bratcher and Edith McMullin were there. "You're not sitting in," they told Judy. "You're taking the course."

From there, Cotterman went home to Kokomo IN and started a club game, now in its 12th year. In Orlando, she is in charge of the I/N speaker program.

Cotterman has been involved with bridge nearly all her life. All her family played. Her mother had six sisters and two brothers, and all but one sister were bridge players. After she and David were married, they often played foursomes with their parents. The two have been married 41



years. Both were born and raised in Kokomo.

After Cotterman became a tournament director, she got an assignment to work a sectional in Kokomo, giving her double duty – she was the tournament chairman as well.

Cotterman loves working with the new players – "I call them all my kids."

At the annual Houston regional, Cotterman has been running the I/N games there for years. "They call the I/N program Judy-land," she says, "and the new players have taken to calling me Judge Judy."

Cotterman enjoys seeing the new players progress and move into the open games, and she loves hearing about their successes. At the 2003 Summer NABC in Long Beach, she and David were having dinner on their 40th wedding anniversary when they discovered that a group of her former I/N players had bought their dinner out of appreciation for all she had done for them.

She wouldn't do the directing if David wasn't doing it, too, and the bottom line is simple for her: "I have a lot of fun."

Thinking Bridge #10

(1) Played as "waiting" to an artificial 2♣ opening bid. Some use 2♦ as a positive response reserving a 2♥ response to show a terrible, terrible hand (no ace or king and no more than 4 high-card points).

(2) 22-24 HCP but some play it 23-24.

(3) Opting not to use Stayman with this distribution, usually the right thing to do.

West leads the ♥2. You (South) are declarer; plan the play.

Play low from dummy at trick one, hoping that West has led from a Q-10-x-x or K-10-x-x combination. If so, East will have to play an honor to prevent your 9 from winning a trick.

If East plays an honor, you should win the ace because the jack in dummy will likely provide you with a second trick.

No such luck. East plays the ♥10. It should be noted that when partner leads low, dummy has an honor card in the suit and you have both a higher and a lower honor in that suit, you should play the lower honor if dummy plays low.

The most common positions are this one and when dummy has Q-x-x and you have the K-10 or the A-10 with almost any length. Another common position is when dummy has the king and you have the A-J or the A-10, again with almost any length.

Nothing is 100% in this game but the normal play is the lower honor when dummy plays low. Just do it. You have no idea how many thousands of tricks are lost each hour by misguided third-hand players who play "third hand" high when they should be inserting the lower honor. No idea.

Back to the play: If East plays the ♥10 at trick one, you are basically reduced to needing five club tricks to make your contract. Looks easy enough with the A-K-Q between the two hands, not to mention the 10.

There is, however, a catch. Look at the way the clubs are actually divided. Say you lead a club to the ace and a club to the king. You see West show out but the lead is in your hand and you can't get to dummy with a crowbar to take the marked finesse against East's remaining J-x.

The solution: start with a high honor from the long side, say the king, and then cross to dummy with the ace. Now you are in dummy and can lead low, taking the marked finesse.

Points to remember:

1. As third hand, when holding a higher and a lower honor than dummy, play the lower honor if dummy plays low.

2. When attacking a long suit that looks like: A-Q-10-x (x) facing K-x-x, A-K-10-x (x) facing Q-x-x or K-Q-10-x (x) facing A-x-x, start with a high honor and then cross to the remaining honor-doubleton.

With similar looking holdings such as: A-K-9-x (x) facing Q-x-x, A-Q-9-x (x) facing K-x-x or K-Q-9-x (x) facing A-x-x, play the same. If your left-hand opponent has a singleton 10 or jack, you will be in the proper hand to take a marked finesse by leading low to the 9.

Cultivate good habits

As new players, it is important to develop good habits and follow proper etiquette at the table. When you arrive at a table, or when new opponents come to your table, stop your conversation and greet them.

When polling players to find what their biggest bridge pet peeve is, slow play was unequivocally the winner.

You are given seven and a half minutes per board, which should be plenty of time for even the toughest hands.

Bidding too fast or thinking too long before bidding could send unauthorized messages to your partner. If you pass too quickly, it seems that you have no interest in this deal. If you pause for a long time, you probably have choices to make and can't decide which is the best action. Even if you have nothing to think about after the jump, study your hand for 10 seconds and don't show disinterest during the pause.

Remembering Alice

Alice Kinningham, who is in charge of the Intermediate/Newcomer program for the NABC, relates that a married couple approached her during the Fall NABC to remind her of something that involved the three of them at the 2003 Spring NABC in Philadelphia.

The two, Carl and Anita Gutschick of Arnold MD, were playing in a knockout teams when they learned that Kinningham was looking for them. "Are you Carl and Anita?" Kinningham asked when she found their table.

"Maybe," they said with trepidation. They had played in an I/N game and were fearful they had done something wrong.

"Well," said Kinningham, "you won and you forgot your trophies." With that, Kinningham presented the trophies to the couple, advising them that they should leave the hardware on the table the rest of the game "for intimidation value."

In Orlando, the couple told Kinningham they were so relieved when they found out they weren't in trouble that "we'll never forget you."
