Forget accounting: bridge is her passion

The NABCs are all about championships – Vanderbilt, Mixed Pairs, Women’s Pairs and a host of others. If there was an Unbridled Enthusiasm for Bridge trophy, there’s a player at this tournament who would be a heavy favorite to win it.

Meet Heather Waterworth, a 30-year-old former chartered accountant from the Toronto area who can barely contain her hunger for bridge knowledge.

Barbara Seagram, her bridge teacher and mentor, says she’s never seen a player so eager to learn the game. Andy Stark, another of Waterworth’s mentors, says she is “the keenest bridge student I’ve ever met.”

Waterworth played her first game of bridge at the end of November last year. She’s now playing six times a week. At the Spring NABC in Philadelphia, Waterworth and Stark came in fifth overall in Flight A of the Norman Kay Open Pairs last Friday. She has played every day in

Teams captained by Richard Pavlicek, Nick Nickell, Rita Shugart and Mark Gordon will slug it out in today’s semifinal round of the Vanderbilt Knockout Teams. It will be Pavlicek versus Gordon, Nickell versus Shugart.

The top-seeded Pavlicek squad – Lee Rautenberg, Barnet Shenkin, Mike Kamil, Martin Fleisher, Bob Jones – jumped out to huge early lead against the Jimmy Cayne team – Geir Helgemo, Steve Weinstein, Robert Levin, Michael Seamon, Ron Smith, Charles Weed npc– and coasted to a 145-74 win.

No. 2 Nickell – Richard Freeman, Bob Hamman, Paul Soloway, Jeff Meckstroth, Eric Rodwell – had to rally to advance against the Roy Welland squad. Welland and company – Bjorn Fallenius, Howard Weinstein, Steve Garner, Cezary Balicki, Adam Zmudzinski – led by 27 at the halfway point and by 11 with one quarter to go, but Nickell was too much for the underdogs, winning the final set 56-7 for a 136-98 win.

En route to victory - 2

This deal was featured on page 2 of yesterday's Daily Bulletin. However, we have since determined that we misread Barry Rigal's notes, so the play of the deal was attributed to the wrong person and the wrong team.

The deal occurred in the match between Jim Foster's team, the squad that eliminated the defending champions captained by Reese Milner, and the team captained by Richard Pavlicek. Pavlicek took over the No. 1 seed by defeating Foster, but it was Allen Hawkins of the Foster team who found the strip-squeeze on this deal.

Here is a repeat of the writeup putting the players in their correct positions.

Michael Kamil led a heart, and Hawkins won the jack with the queen. Hawkins led the ♣Q, ducked, but the second club went to East's ace. Martin Fleisher tried the ♠J, won in dummy with the queen, and declarer called for a low diamond. Fleisher rose with the king and Hawkins ducked. Fleisher switched back to hearts, leading the 10, and Hawkins took his king.

When Hawkins now cashed his three good clubs, he caught East in a strip-squeeze. If Fleisher discarded down to two hearts, he could be endplayed into leading away from his diamonds. If he sluffed a diamond, declarer could win the ace and jack. Either way Hawkins had his game.

What's that again?

Here's a question a player asked a director:
"If my partner were here, is this where he'd be?"

Overkill

The definition of overkill is a complex one at bridge. Sometimes it could come about as the defensive problem of having too strong a combined holding against notrump. More typically though, it relates to what happens when one side gets two outstanding results on the same deal and the IMP scale does not reflect it. From our second-round Vanderbilt match this example left both pairs feeling very happy.

Taking advantage of vulnerability I guessed to bid 4NT and partner bid 5♦, which was doubled. It was tough for N/S to bid on to 5♠ over 5♦ doubled. We conceded 300, which looked like a fair return against minus 650 in spades.

You may not agree with John Diamond's hand evaluation - it was understandably successful though! Playing in hearts, the club loser in North can be discarded on the long spade. Plus 1430 meant a 15-IMP pickup for the good guys.

Solving the puzzle

Haig Tchamitch, aka Hagar the Horrible, threaded his way through the maze to land a vulnerable game on this deal from the early rounds of the Vanderbilt Knockout Teams.

Tchamitch, South, received the opening lead of the ♣6, which went to the 4, 7 and king. Clearly, there was work to do.

Tchamitch played the ♠Q to the king in dummy and played the ♥2 to the 5, 9 and king. Another spade put Tchamitch in dummy again, and he played a diamond to the 9 in his hand. West won the ♦J and got out with a trump. Tchamitch won in hand and played the ♦Q, covered by the king and ace. On the third round of diamonds, East's 10 popped up. Tchamitch ruffed, played a heart to dummy's 10 and threw a club on the now-good ♦8.

It might appear that Tchamitch would have gone down had East won the ♣A at trick one to give his partner a ruff. Not so.

If East wins the ♣A and returns a club, Tchamitch ducks, but the defenders get only one more trick. West could ruff and return a spade, but Tchamitch would be in control. He cashes the second spade and plays the ♥A and another heart. West would be endplayed, forced to lead away from the ♦K or give a ruff and a sluff with a spade return.

Plus 620 was good for 13 IMPs for Tchamitch's team. At the other table, North-South were pushed to 5♥ and went down two.

Use the Alert bar

Not everyone has perfect hearing, so when you are making an Alert or an Announcement, please tap or raise the blue Alert bar in the bid box in addition to saying "Alert" or making an Announcement such as "transfer."

Losing tricks

When you take on Malcolm Brachman's team, you have to take advantage of your opportunities. Here's one that got away:

It's not easy to avoid playing 4♥ here, but my 2NT opening bid saw Jeff Aker transfer to hearts and then offer notrump. I was happy to play for a swing by trying the notrump game.

I was favored with a low spade lead to the 9 and 10. Now the obvious thing to do is to play on hearts. But how? I decided to make my best play for holding my losses to two by running the ♥J, losing to the queen.

Eddie Wold found the fine club shift – and I was toast when diamonds did not split and West turned up with the long club and the heart entry.

But of course I had misanalyzed the deal. The right play is to lead a heart to the king at trick two. If I did that, the defense wouldn't be able to stop me from setting up a ninth winner in clubs or hearts.

Even our "triumphs" turned into disasters. I rarely open 10 counts, but late in the match at favorable vulnerability I broke my rule.

6♦ rolled home for plus 1390 – no problem. But I was not expecting it to be easy to reach a grand slam here – especially when Eric Greco/Geoff Hampson started by opening the South hand a Precision 1♦ and North responded 1♠!! Now our teammates played 3NT – can you blame them?

After Judy Gushner of Philadelphia bid diamonds and spades, Jabbour decided to take a chance that the ♥K would cure any heart attack. Sure enough, East led his fourth-best heart and suddenly Jabbour had 12 tricks.

But wait! The ♥J was a threat against East and the ♦J was a threat against West, so neither defender could hold onto spades. So Jabbour wound up with all 13 tricks.

The next deal is an even better illustration of the "real man" theory.

Jabbour didn't want to bid diamonds, so he decided to gamble on his queen doubleton spade. When West led a low spade and dummy was faced, Jabbour gasped. He could visualize ace or king tripleton on his right, which would lead to a three-trick set. But East played the jack! West had led away from the ace-king to maintain communication. Jabbour gratefully took his queen and ran his 11 tricks.



Percent or hunch?

George Rosenkranz carefully worked out the percentages on this deal from a knockout match. But he had a hunch. He argued with himself about whether to play the hunch and finally decided to go with his hunch instead of the percentages.

East led a trump and Rosenkranz drew a second round, learning that West had started with a singleton. The problem, of course, was who had the ♣Q. There were 11 cards remaining that West could hold but only nine for East because East was known to have four trumps. So the odds favored playing the hand with the singleton trump for the ♣Q.

But Rosenkranz had that hunch. Finally he went for the hunch and finessed East for the key card. The hunch paid off – East had queen-third of clubs. 7♠ bid and made.

TOURNAMENT APPEALS

In order to keep the bridge public informed of appeals results in a timely fashion, the NABC Daily Bulletin staff publishes write-ups. Every effort is made to ensure that these reports are accurate and complete. However, before they are published in the NABC Appeals Casebook revisions may be made.

Appeal Case 5

The Facts: 2♠ doubled made two, +670 for N/S. The play had gone: ♦2 to the ace; ♥A; heart to the king; ♦K; ♥2 to the queen (pitching a club); ♠AK; ♦Q ruffed; ♥10 (pitching a second club). The board was scored and later passed to the other table where it was discovered that the South hand contained 14 cards (including five clubs) and the East hand only 12 cards (including only two clubs).

Consequently the Director was called. When he took the board back to the first table and had the South and East players check their hands, East was sure he had held only the ♣Q8 and South was sure she had held only four clubs. (Clubs had never been played.)

The Director ruled that the table result at the first table would stand and that a club spot (the ♣3) would be removed from the South hand and placed in the East hand.

The Appeal: E/W appealed the Director's ruling. Each player was asked if they had counted their cards. N/S said they always counted their cards while East said he usually does but had not this time. East said he had been upset by the defense on the previous board and was distracted. However, he did say he had noticed dummy's clubs. West said he noticed nothing.

The Panel Decision: The Panel decided that the preponderance of the evidence suggested that the conditions of Law 13C (which instructs that when it is determined after play ends that one hand originally contained more than 13 cards and another correspondingly fewer, the result must be canceled and an appropriate procedural penalty applied) should not apply. All the players had seen the dummy and no one had called attention to the presence of an extra card. Thus, both sides were deemed responsible for the problem. With no basis for overturning the table ruling, the Panel decided to allow the table result to stand.

The Facts: 5♣ doubled made five, +550 for E/W. The opening lead was the ♦Q. The Director was called when West explained before the opening lead that he believed their agreement was that 4♣ was natural.

The Director ruled that West had forgotten his agreement, that the 5♣ bid could have been suggested by the Alert of 4♣, and that passing 4♠ doubled was a logical alternative. Thus the contract was changed to 4♠ doubled.

The Director determined that various defenses led to results ranging from 4♠ making to 4♠ going down more than one trick. By ducking two rounds of spades and playing on hearts, the defense would come to five tricks. This was judged to be the most favorable result likely (Law 12C2) for N/S, and both sides were assigned the score for 4♠ doubled down two, +300 for N/S.

The Appeal: E/W appealed the Director's ruling. E/W both admitted that they played cheaper minor for takeout (as was Alerted and explained by East) and that West had forgotten the convention.

West believed that passing 4♠ was not a logical alternative. He knew from the auction that spades were breaking badly and it seemed impossible that 4♠ could ever make. Partner did not overcall directly over 3♦ and therefore could not have a good hand with five spades.

On the other hand he contended that there were many East hands where 5♣ would make and which would provide no play for 4♠. Later on West said he had to bid 5♣ because East did not yet know he had clubs. N/S contended that the West hand was an attractive hand to be dummy in 4♠ and that pass was therefore a logical alternative.

The Committee Decision: The Committee decided that the unauthorized information from the Alert and explanation could have awakened West to

the fact that he had forgotten his conventional agreement. West apparently did not completely understand the rule concerning unauthorized information when he stated that East did not yet know he had clubs. The Committee also decided that pass was a logical alternative to 5♣ which was demonstrably suggested by the unauthorized information.

The Committee then considered the play in 4♠ doubled. The Committee assumed that South would lead his singleton diamond, which gives the defense its best prospects. The declarer play problem on this deal is complex and the Committee considered many reasonable lines of play coupled with good defense, and finally concluded that +300 was the most favorable result that was likely for the non-offending side.

They also determined that some inferior lines of play could lead to +500 for N/S and that these met the "at all probable" standard of Law 12C2. Accordingly, -500 was also awarded to the offenders.

Since E/W were both experienced players (although they had not played much in recent years), the Committee assigned them an Appeal Without Merit Warning.

Score corrections in Mixed Pairs

Score corrections in the Mixed Pairs results changed the positions of several pairs. There were no changes among the top 13 pairs.

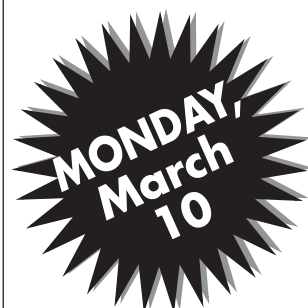

ently still has currency among newer players. “They don’t realize you aren’t going to be in the same room with the experts,” says McCarthy. “You listen to their talks then you go play bridge with other new players.”

Both are fairly new to duplicate. McCarthy says she “came in off the street” as a duplicate player after some years of social bridge. “I’m very competitive,” she says, “and when I realized what kind of an animal duplicate is I was immediately hooked.”

Her father expresses similar sentiments, allowing that both of them began bridge lessons after a few duplicate games to try to speed up their improvement.

Both said the tournament directors running the I/N games are a huge part of their success. “The directors are fantastic,” says Edwards. Echoes his daughter: “They are friendly, funny and fair. We’re having a blast.”

The two I/N players with the most success at the Spring NABC are a pair from Connecticut: Bill Filip of New Canaan and Warren Williams of Wilton. Through Thursday afternoon, the retired IBM employees had racked up 19.34 masterpoints in I/N games even though they had played in some other events as well.

Both described the atmosphere as ideal for new

players. “It’s a very friendly, relaxed game,” says Williams. Adds Filip: “We like to play for fun as opposed to heavy competition.”

They, too, praised the I/N directors. “I’m really impressed with the skill they show,” says Williams.

The pair, who learned bridge many years ago but returned to the game only after retirement, say they have been to every NABC since the 2001 Summer NABC in Toronto.

Larry Gomberg, who drove from Fairfax VA Thursday morning to play with J.J. Armour, a long-time partner, says he was pleased to run into several players he met in Phoenix at the 2002 Fall NABC there. He enjoys the I/N games, he says, because “it’s not intimidating at all. It’s just fun.”

Two locals – Diane Davis of Penn Valley and Suxan Baxter of Gladwyne – describe their experience at the NABC as “amazingly exciting.” Says Davis: “We get to play with people from all over the country.”

Baxter says she likes bridge so much because “it’s a thinking game, and defense is a lot of fun.”

Betty Bratcher is one of the tournament directors running the I/N games. She has high praise for the members of the NABC organizing committee for getting the new players out to the I/N games. “The locals have done a great job,” says Bratcher.

Other I/N directors are Judy Cotterman, Alice Kinningham, Donna Bowser and Priscilla Smith.

Women compete for Whitehead Trophy

Play continues today in the Women’s Pairs with the two final sessions.

Cheri Bjerkan and Sue Weinstein, seventh going into last year’s finals, had two strong sessions to win by almost a full board.

This was a key deal from the first final session.

Weinstein led the ♥Q and Bjerkan decided that, with no redouble or heart raise, her partner had the singleton queen or queen-doubleton. Accordingly, she won her ♥A and shifted to the ♦J. When that held, she continued with the ♦K and a low diamond.

Weinstein cashed two diamond tricks and declarer was already down one. Noting that declarer had pitched one spade and two clubs from dummy on the diamond tricks, Weinstein shifted to a low club. Declarer won dummy’s ace and cashed

two more club tricks.

When the suit did not run, she mistakenly cashed her heart tricks before reverting to spades. As a result, Bjerkan was able to win her ♥A and cash a long heart for down three.

* * *

This is the 73rd Women’s Pairs. At stake is the Whitehead Trophy, donated in 1930 by Wilbur C. Whitehead of New York, a great bridge authority and a member of the team that won the Vanderbilt Cup in 1928, the first year it was in play.

Whitehead (1866-1931) was president of the Simplex Automobile Company, but bridge held such a fascination for him that he retired from business in 1910 to devote his life to bridge.

He was the inventor of many bidding and play conventions, the quick-trick table of card values, the Whitehead system of requirements for original bids and responses and the Whitehead table of preferential leads.

Whitehead was instrumental in standardizing procedures in auction bridge and later in contract bridge.

Section top policy

Tournament Chairman John Marks notes that when scores are determined across two or more sections, section top awards will be issued to the same number of places that there were sections. In other words, if an event is scored across three sections, the first three places in the section (North-South and East-West) will be entitled to section top prizes.

In stratified events, first place in Strats A and B will be entitled to section to prizes.

Philadelphia so far.

Before last year, Waterworth, 30, didn’t know anything about bridge. She did know about competition, however.

Waterworth went to the University of South Carolina on a tennis scholarship in 1991, earning a business degree upon graduation in 1994. She later became a chartered accountant and was working in that field before deciding it wasn’t for her. One good thing about that field, she says, is that she met her husband, Bob, also a chartered accountant.

In a major career change, Waterworth went from accounting to working in a golf shop. It was there that she was steered to bridge. “All my golf friends said I had to learn bridge,” she says.

Her teacher turned out to be Seagram. “Barbara and Alex (Kornel, Seagram’s husband) made it fun for me. They told me diamonds are for your fingers and clubs are for golf. They’re no good in bridge.”

Waterworth’s typical day now is to get up early, sign onto the computer, exchange a few e-mails with Eddie Kantar (yes, *that* Eddie Kantar) and check out one of the many bridge software programs she owns. “I’ve got every disk,” she says.

She also plays regularly at club games. Stark reports on a very creative play by Waterworth on this deal from one of their club sessions.

Waterworth cashed her top spades, declarer pitching a diamond from dummy, and switched to the ♥6. Declarer played low from dummy and Stark, thinking declarer had the jack, put in the king. There was no point in continuing hearts, so Stark switched to the ♦Q, which held. West took the next diamond trick with the ace and cashed the king, noting the 3-3 split. Declarer, obviously eyeing the club suit for tricks, threw the ♥9 on the third round of diamonds and the ♥10 on the 13th diamond.

When West, who had neglected to cash the good ♠J, played a low club from hand, Waterworth smoothly played the queen. West won in dummy, returned to hand with the ♣A, and, still neglecting the ♠J, played a club to dummy’s 9. Stark won the 10 and Waterworth’s ♥A J took the last two tricks for plus 200.

“One of Heather’s assets,” says Stark, “is her smooth play on defense.”

Waterworth has had so much fun at the Spring NABC in Philadelphia that she’s planning on making every NABC for the foreseeable future. She’s really keen to meet Kantar.

By the time she gets around to that, she may be winning major championships. She certainly has the desire: “I want to be good at this game.”

Says Stark: “She shows a lot of promise.”

Open Pairs II was exciting last year

First-time partners Curtis Cheek and Eric Greco built on a monster game in the second qualifying session to win Open Pairs II last year in Houston. (The final two sessions of this year's event are taking place today.)

Cheek and Greco had never played together before, making the Open Pairs II date at the last minute. They were the leaders after two qualifying sessions, thanks to a 75.58% game in the second qualifying session. "You wouldn't believe the things we didn't know we were doing," said Cheek.

Greco went after an opponent's one-level overcall to gain most of the matchpoints on this deal from the second final session:

Greco made a good decision to convert the negative double at these colors. The opening lead of the ♣2 went to Greco's king. The spade return was won by declarer's king (West ducked the ace).

South tried a low diamond toward dummy and the ♦Q was captured by the ace. Greco exited with a diamond to Cheek's king. The ♠A was next (East pitching his last diamond) and Cheek continued with a diamond which Greco ruffed low.

Declarer ruffed Greco's ♠A and played the ♥9. East won the king and returned the ♣3. Declarer pitched the ♠10, allowing dummy's ♠J to win the trick. The ♣9 was next and declarer shed the ♠K.

West ruffed and returned a spade, which Greco ruffed high. He then led the last club to promote West's ♥J. Down three, plus 800.

* * *

Play begins today in the four-session Open Pairs II with the Wernher Trophy, donated by one of the originators of the masterpoint system, as a reward for

the winners.

The Wernher Trophy was donated in 1934 by Sir Derrick J. Wernher and presented to the winners of the National Men's Pairs Championship.

The event was contested at the Summer NABC until 1962 and subsequently at the Spring NABC. From 1969 through 1971, it was contested as a three-session championship.

In 1992 the event became Open Pairs II, a four-session event which consists of two qualifying rounds and two finals rounds.

Wernher (1889-1947) was a resident of London, England and Deal NJ. A leading personality in American bridge in the Thirties, Wernher was president of the American Bridge League (ABL) in 1933, chairman of its Master Plan committee and a member of the board of directors of the American Whist League (AWL).

Wernher placed second in the Asbury Challenge Teams (now the Spingold Knockout Teams) in 1936 and won the Reisinger (played in conjunction with the New York regional) in 1930.

It takes two!

Each player is required to have a convention card filled out legibly and on the table throughout a session. Both cards of a partnership must be identical and include the first and last names of each member of the partnership.

If a director determines that neither player has a substantially completed card, the partnership may play only Class A conventions and may use only standard carding. This restriction may be lifted only at the beginning of a subsequent round after convention cards have been properly prepared and approved by the director. Further, the partnership will receive a 1/6 board matchpoint penalty for each board played, commencing with the next round and continuing until the restriction is lifted. In IMP team games, penalties shall be at the discretion of the director.

If the director determines the partnership has at least one substantially completed convention card but has not fully complied with ACBL regulations, the director may give warnings or assign such penalties as he deems to be appropriate under the circumstances.

The objective of these warnings and penalties is the encouragement of full compliance with ACBL regulations.

The Gordon-O'Rourke match went right down to the wire. Gordon - Richard Zucker, Winthrop Allegaert, Jaggy Shivdasani, Mark Molson, Boris Baran - jumped out to a 44-7 lead after 16 deals, but Lou Ann O'Rourke - Billy Miller, Curtis Cheek, Mike Passell, Peter Fredin, Magnus Lindkvist - rallied to pull to within 16 at the halfway point and actually took the lead, 100-99, after three quarters. This applies to any event, NABC+ or regional, which permits Mid-Chart or Super-Chart methods. Look for the light blue forms on the tables where convention cards and pencils are located.

Red Ribbon Pairs moves to Spring NABC

The Red Ribbon Pairs, an ACBL event with national rating open to players with fewer than 2000 masterpoints, has moved to the Spring NABC.

Players earn qualification by placing first or second overall in regionally rated events of at least Flight B status. Neither member of a qualifying pair may hold more than 1500 masterpoints at the time of qualification.

The four-session event began in 1986 and winners have their names inscribed on the Percy X. Bean Trophy.

Bean Trophy

The trophy was designated by the ACBL Board of Directors in 1996 to honor Bean, ACBL president in 1972 and chairman of the Board in 1973.

Bean (1916-1992) represented District 19 on the Board from 1964 until 1988 and served as president of the ACBL Charity Foundation from 1974 until 1981. He was a member of the National Goodwill Committee and the National Board of Governors and general chairman of arrangements for the World Team Olympiad in Seattle in 1984.

Bean and his wife, Anne, were named ACBL Honorary Members for 1992, the first time that honor was bestowed on a husband-wife combination.

Bean was the editor of *Mad, Mad World of Bridge*, a publication that strongly championed players of less than expert class.

Bid box Alerts

When using bid boxes, ACBL suggests that players tap the Alert strip and say "Alert" at the same time. When making an Announcement, use the Announcement word — such as — and tap the Alert strip at the same time. A player who Alerts or Announces a bid should make sure his opponents are aware that an Alert or Announcement has been made.

Turn 'em off

Cell phones, audible pagers or any similar communication equipment may not be operated or operable in the playing area during a session of play at NABCs except for health-related equipment or by permission of the director-in-charge of the tournament or event.

When the ♣J held, Whitman ruffed a low club and played a trump to his ace, discovering the bad break.

Next came another low club ruffed in dummy, then the top diamonds and a diamond ruff. This was the position:

That only postponed the inevitable, however, as Whitman discarded the ♣A and had the ♥K 9 over East's ♥J 4 in the end for plus 980 and an 11-IMP swing on the way to victory.

Honor your partner

By Mark Horton

Consider your partner to be a friend. Treat your partner well, even (especially) if you are playing together for the first time. Always offer your partner a drink — tea or coffee is a good starting point. This will lead to a relaxed atmosphere, enabling you both to play your best. By the way, always be a pleasant and courteous opponent.

Tolerate errors. Never go on about partner's mistakes — just forget about them and move on to the next deal. You may be able to make a constructive comment at the end of the session. Your partner will surely show you the same consideration.

Be encouraging. Always be prepared to support your partner — “well played” always goes down well and a “thank you” for the dummy does not go amiss. In one of my partnerships, if dummy was exactly what was needed, “mille grazie” would let partner in on the good news!

Keep a straight face. Never make the mistake of pulling a face or raising an eyebrow. Apart from hurting your partner's feelings, being deadpan does not let your opponents know that something may have gone wrong.

Win or lose, always stay calm at the end of the session and thank partner for the game. This is especially important if things have not gone so well. In my most successful international partnership, the first time we played together was absolutely hopeless but we stuck with it.

The best way to cope with the inevitable disasters is to laugh them off. This tends to disconcert even the best opponents who are used to seeing their opponents argue.

Stick to the conventions you both feel comfortable with. A player trying to remember some convention he is not familiar with will make errors in other departments.
