## Weichsel elected to Hall of Fame

Peter Weichsel has been elected to the ACBL Hall of Fame in his first year of eligibility for the honor. Weichsel, 60, will be officially inducted into the Hall of Fame at the Summer NABC in New York.

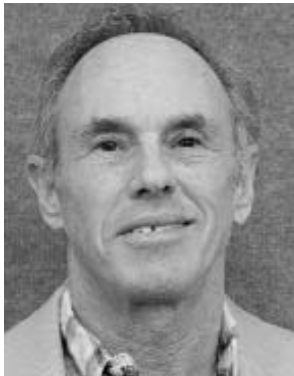
A WBF Grand Master, Weichsel has four world titles: the 1983 and 2001 Bermuda Bowls, the World Mixed Pairs in 1990 and the World Transnational Teams in 2000. He is also an ACBL Grand Life Master with more than 27,000 masterpoints and 25 national victories: Vanderbilt Knockouts (four wins), Spingold Knockouts (six), Reisinger Board-a-Match Teams (one), Open Board-a-Match Teams (four), Mixed Teams (three), Grand National Teams (one), Life Master Pairs

(two), Life Master Open Pairs (one), Open Pairs I (one) and Open Pairs II (two).

Weichsel enjoyed meteoric success in his early career of part of the Precision Team that dominated nationally rated knockout contests in the early Seventies.

Weichsel is a professional player who lives in Encinitas CA.

## East Coast duo leads Open Pairs I

Linda Maloney of Rockville MD and Robert Gookin of Falls Church VA posted a huge total in Friday's two-session qualifier of the Silodor Open Pairs I to lead the field of 416 pairs. With a 66.77% game in the afternoon and a 67.85% in the evening, the pair finished with 875 matchpoints on a 650 average — nine boards above par.

In second with 836 were Brad Moss of New York and Fred Gitelman of Las Vegas, followed closely by defending champions Michael Rosenberg of New York and Ralph Katz of Chicago with 833.5.

Two hundred eight pairs made the cut to play in today's two-session final in the Reno Ballroom on the Casino Level.

## Hamilton collects his 30,000th point



Last year Fred Hamilton was inducted into the Bridge Hall of Fame. This year he became only the 10th person in history to go over the 30,000 mark in masterpoints. Among living

players, he now ranks eighth.

Two happenings stand out in his memory of his bridge career which extends back into the Fifties.

The first was making a spade slam when the trump suit was five to the 7 opposite K-10-third. Sound impossible? It isn't because he actually did it against Easley Blackwood back in 1959. Hamilton wasn't even a Life Master at the time. These were the cards:

- ♠ K 10 4
- ♥ Q 7 4
- ♦ J 8 5 3
- ♣ A K 7 2

- ♠ 7 6 5 3 2
- ♥ A K J
- ♦ A K
- ♣ Q J 6

The 6♠ contract looked hopeless, but Hamilton never gives up. The opening ♦10 lead went to the jack, queen and ace. He led a club to his queen, and now it was time to go after trumps. He led the ♠2, and Blackwood had to make a decision. It appeared to him that Hamilton had a singleton ♣Q and was getting back to dummy to discard a loser or two on the top clubs. So Blackwood did exactly what Hamilton wanted him to do — he went up with the

## Kennedy tops 15,000

Five-time world champion Betty Ann Kennedy has crossed the 15,000-masterpoint plateau. Kennedy, whose most recent world title is Venice Cup champion from the world championships in Monte Carlo in 2003, is one of ACBL's top masterpoint holders. Fewer than 120 players have attained 15,000 points.

Kennedy, of Shreveport LA, is a WBF Grand Master. She also won the Venice Cup championship in 1974 and 1976, the World Women's Pairs title in 1982 (with Carol Sanders), and the 1984 Women's Olympiad Teams.

Kennedy has 12 NABC titles as well.

Besides being an active player, Kennedy has been involved in bridge administration with her home unit (170), and has also served as a member of the national appeals committee.

Willy Ehlers found a triple squeeze to earn a fine result on this deal from the second final session of the Flight A North American Pairs.

On the lead of the ♠3 to the 8 and ace, South returned the normal ♠Q. Ehlers won and ran all the hearts to reduce to this ending:

Notice that North still has six cards and has yet to discard on the last heart. Whether North discards a club or a diamond, declarer gets one trick in that minor. Of course the ♠J would allow the squeeze to repeat. North duly ditched a diamond and Ehlers claimed his 11 tricks.

## Junior scholarship opportunities

A new scholarship program is available for ACBL Junior players. The program, which owes its funding to generous external donations, is available to college and high school bridge players who actively seek others to teach others bridge. It is open to any and all Juniors still involved in the educational system.

The initial program will award a \$500 scholarship to those who teach a class of at least eight students, all under 25 years of age, the equivalent of the ACBL Bidding Series (Club Series) or 16 hours of lessons.

The ACBL Educational Foundation and the ACBL Education Department will provide books, T-shirts and an additional stipend of \$350 for teaching the course.

The scholarship is payable only to an accredited college, university or trade school for high school graduates.

## Four named to USA-I

Four “veteran” Junior players – they won gold medals in world competition in 2001 and bronze medals in 2003 — have been named as members of USA-I and will compete in the 2005 World Youth Team Championship.

The announcement, made by the United States Bridge Federation, names Joe Grue, John Hurd, John Kranyak and Joel Wooldridge to the team. Bob Rosen will be their non-playing captain.

A third pair will be augmented from the 2004 Junior Swiss Pairs, scheduled July 17 and 18 during the Summer NABC in New York City.

The Swiss Pairs will also determine USA-II. Pairs placing first and second will become USA-II. If either the first- or second-place pair is augmented by USA-I, the third-place pair will be offered a place on USA-II. The team will then select an npc. After consultation with the npc, the team may augment another pair from any pair participating in the event.

Participants must be born in 1979 or later, citizens of the United States and ACBL members in good standing.

## Junior coupons

With student coupons, the cost of entries is \$6 per session for any event at the North American Bridge Championships.

Student coupons will be available to players who have not had their 22nd birthday or who offer proof that they are full-time students and have not reached their 26th birthday.

The coupons are available to all Junior players whose ACBL dues are current. The coupons must have the Junior player's name, event and ACBL number on it.

## Junior Madness: NYC

The Summer 2004 NABC is going to be full of exciting Junior events – including a brand new world championship event. Here is the schedule:

Friday and Saturday, July 9 and 10: North American College Bridge Team Championship final.

Sunday, July 11: Stratified Junior Scholarship Game (open to Juniors born in 1979 or later; scholarship awards for ACBL members only). Scholarships are \$500 for the highest ranking players, \$300 for the second highest and \$200 for the third.

Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday, July 12, 13 and 14 (five sessions): World Scholastic Youth Team championship, sponsored in part by ACBL (for youths born Jan. 1, 1983 or later). The United States Bridge Federation is expected to name two U.S. Junior teams while here in Reno. The Canadian Bridge Federation is also expected to name a team.

Wednesday, July 14: Opening ceremony for individual championship. (ACBL Juniors must register with Charlotte Blaiss at [Charlotte.Blaiss@acbl.org](mailto:Charlotte.Blaiss@acbl.org) by May 15.)

Wednesday, Thursday and Friday, July 14, 15 and 16 (four sessions): World Junior Individual Championship, sponsored by the World Bridge Federation (open to Juniors born in 1979 or later).

Friday evening, July 16: Prize-giving ceremony.

Saturday and Sunday, July 17 and 18: USA Junior Team Trials (for Juniors born in 1979 or later).

Saturday – Saturday, July 17-24: World Junior Bridge Camp, Nyack NY.

## Canadian Junior Team Trials Set for May

Kingston ON will host the 2004 Canadian Junior Team Trials May 22–24. The event will be held concurrently with the Kingston Regional, May 18–24.

Teams must pre-register for this event prior to April 15. A deposit of \$100 (cheque), payable to the Canadian Bridge Federation, should be mailed to Jan Anderson, 2719 East Jolly Place, Regina SK S4V 0X8. Teams must submit their deposits by the deadline to be eligible for any subsidy money (for travel and accommodations to the trials) from the CBF.

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## Sometimes it's right to trump partner

Declarer set up a position on this deal from the first final session of the Flight A North American Pairs that gave him a chance for an overtrick. South didn't see the trap.

North led a diamond to South's ace, and South switched to a club to the jack and ace. Declarer called for a diamond which ran to North's 10 – perhaps it would have been better for the defense if South won the jack and led a second club. North led a heart, ducked to partner's king and South switched back to clubs, declarer taking his king. He led and passed the ♥ J, then ruffed a diamond. After taking the ♥ A, he ruffed dummy's last heart, leaving this position:

He got out of his hand with the ♣ 10 to North's queen, South discarding his diamond. Now North was endplayed – he had to lead a trump away from his queen. Declarer had no problem putting in dummy's jack because of North's 1NT bid during the auction. Making plus 140 was a fine score.

So what could the defenders have done about this? South erred on the last club trick. Instead of pitching his diamond, he should have ruffed his partner's trick. Then he could lead a trump and take his partner off the endplay, holding declarer to only eight tricks.

ace, dropping his partner's jack, and led a diamond to his partner's ♦ K.

But Hamilton had that card. He led a trump to the king and down came the queen from East. Making 6♠.

Blackwood's comment to Hamilton: "Young man, if you ever learn to bid, you're going to be a hell of a player."

The other high point in Hamilton's bridge life occurred in 1976 in Monte Carlo. "We beat Italy's

Blue Team and won the Bermuda Bowl. It was the first time the Blue Team had ever lost. It was the thrill of a lifetime. I can still feel it."

Hamilton has had many other successes at the world level. He won the World Senior Pairs in 1994 plus seconds in the 1977 Bermuda Bowl and the 1980 Olympiad. He had several other high finishes. At the NABC level, he has won 13 championships and has finished second 13 times.

Hamilton is here in Reno, but he's not playing bridge today. He entered a poker tournament yesterday that continues today. But starting tomorrow he'll be back at the bridge table.
