### Lille will be biggest and best -- Damiani

The World Championships in Lille, France, this summer are going to be the biggest and best ever. That's the word from José Damiani, president of the World Bridge Federation, and he backs it up with impressive facts.

"The schedule, the ambience, the area, the hotel, the transportation arrangements -- all are very special," said José, who was here in Reno where he addressed the ACBL Board of Directors earlier this week. "More than 5000 bridge players from all

over the world will converge on Lille for a full two weeks of bridge at its best. Make your arrangements now -- the tournament dates are August 21 to September 4."

No matter where I tried to lead the interview, José somehow always managed to turn the conversation back to Lille.

"We're going to have another pair contest like the one that proved so interesting and popular in Geneva in 1990 -- that will be bridge at its

## Helgemo, Forrester end drought, win Open Pairs

Geir Helgemo and Tony Forrester claimed victory in Open Pairs I last night, ending a string of five NABCs where they were runners-up in major national events.

The European pair -- Helgemo is from Norway, Forrester from Great Britain -- were immediately surrounded by well-wishers, some offering a simple "congratulations" and others a kidding jibe: "I knew you couldn't keep coming in second," said one.

Asked the difference between this victory and his previous runner-up finishes, Helgemo just grinned. "I dunno," he said.

Helgemo-Forrester scored 3528.02 matchpoints to 3400.71 for runners-up Michael Becker and Michael Kamil. David Berkowitz and Larry Cohen were third with 3319.56.

Helgemo-Forrester were third after the first final session. With two rounds to go, they had a 79.80 lead over Becker-Kamil (top on a board was 90).

This was Forrester's first NABC win. Helgemo was a member of the winning Open Swiss Teams at the 1997 Spring NABC in Dallas.

Together, the two have been runners-up twice in the Blue Ribbon Pairs, twice in the Life Master Pairs and once in the Open Pairs.

Helgemo, with regular partner Tor Helness, won the Macallan Open Pairs in London in January.

## Wolff challenges Juniors to win '99 championship

Former world champion Bobby Wolff challenged ACBL Juniors Saturday to set a goal of winning the 1999 World Junior Bridge Championship, and the ACBL Educational Foundation donated \$14,000 to this summer's Junior Bridge Camp. These were the highlights of the Junior Day dinner and reception, attended by about 60 Junior players and supporters.

Wolff, chairman of the Junior Team Trials committee, said, "Welcome to the rebirth of Junior bridge in America." Wolff urged the Junior players to work on their partnerships before the Trials at the Summer NABC in Chicago "and be ready to improve from there."

Wolff said the Trials will probably be held Aug. 1-2, depending on the number of teams that enter.

## Judy Tucker

Nov. 8, 1946 - March 21, 1998

Judy Tucker of New York City, one of the strongest woman players in North America, died in her room at the Reno Hilton early yesterday morning, the result of a massive coronary. Only hours earlier she had played in the regional Open Pairs event with Aileen Osofsky, one of her closest friends.

Judy wasn't quite up to par physically during the game, according to Aileen, but she played her usual fine game. "I was supposed to have dinner with her," said Aileen, "but she begged off -- she said she couldn't eat. But this was not that unusual -- there had been many occasions in recent years when she did not feel like eating.

"Then toward the end of the game she had some trouble breathing. She had had a breathing problem for some time due to heart problems, so even this was not all that unusual. Because of the breathing problem and the long distances inside this hotel, Judy had been using a scooter to get around.

"But there was one other key happening -- she went directly to her room after the last round. That was different -- she always waited for her scores."

Irina Levitina, Judy's roommate, discovered Judy not breathing when she returned to their room in the early hours. She and Jill Levin attempted to resuscitate Judy without success.

Judy was active in many phases of bridge. In addition to being a champion player, she was a successful club manager for the Honors Club in New York, a District 24 official, a member of the NABC Appeals Committee, a member of the Nassau/Suffolk board, an active member of the Goodwill Committee and a travel agent.

At the bridge table, she was a World Bridge Mas-

**Root** was elected to the ACBL Bridge Hall of Fame in 1997 in recognition of his multi-faceted bridge achievements: as a player, a teacher and a writer. He has won 13 NABC titles and finished second in the 1967 Bermuda Bowl and 1968 World Team Olympiad. Root is perhaps the best known bridge teacher in the world -- and has probably taught the game to more people than anyone in history. His best-selling books include *Commonsense Bidding*, *Modern Bridge Conventions* (co-authored with regular partner Richard Pavlicek), *How to Play a Bridge Hand* and *How to Defend a Bridge Hand*.

## When you overbid, you have to overplay

When both partners fall in love with their hands, the result can often be a perilously high contract.

Nagy Kamel and Mark Bumgardner, representing District 16, found themselves in a 6♥ contract in the first final session of the North American Open Pairs Flight A.

West led the ♣J, ruffed in dummy. Kamel cashed the ♠A, pitching a club, ruffed a diamond and ruffed another club. Now he played a spade to his ace and ruffed a club with dummy's last trump.

Kamel ruffed a diamond back to his hand and cashed the ♥A K. This was the four-card ending:

Kamel cashed the ♠K Q, as East followed. When he led another spade, East was finished -- if he ruffed with the ♥Q, Kamel would discard his losing club and win the last trick with his ♥10. If East ruffed low, Kamel would overruff -- his 12th trick. Whatever he did, Kamel would score his ♥10 en passant.

Plus 980 was worth 12 out of 13 matchpoints.

"The Trials are important," he said, "and how you finish might be important, but there's nothing in stone."

He expects to select 12-16 players and to make a final selection of two six-person teams. Wolff promised a policy of "no politics. We're just trying to field the best team we can. Our goal is to win the 1999 World Junior Championship with honor and bring it back to America."

Wolff named three longtime Junior supporters to the committee: Bob Rosen, Jade Barrett and Charlotte Blaiss, ACBL Junior Programs Coordinator. "Without her," said Wolff, "there wouldn't be a Junior program."

### Educational Foundation grant

The grant will pay \$200 of the \$400 Bridge Camp tuition for 70 ACBL Juniors. The check was presented to Blaiss by Gene Simpson, Foundation president, and Jonathan Steinberg, Foundation vice-president.

### Other Junior news

Al Levy, District 24 representative to the ACBL Board of Directors, told of plans for a second computer bridge challenge at the Summer NABC in Chicago. Baron Barclay and Okbridge will sponsor the Juniors vs. Computers contest.

Aileen Osofsky, chairman of the ACBL Goodwill Committee, welcomed the Juniors. She called for a moment of silence to remember Erin Berry and Aron Pabst, who were killed in an automobile accident in January. "They were two of our up-and-coming young people," said Osofsky. "We're one big family and we have to acknowledge and share sadness."

Osofsky introduced ACBL President Dick Anderson who introduced David Silber, newly appointed ACBL chief executive officer.

Silber spoke of "looking forward to coming on board, probably in July. One of the things I'll work for is the future of bridge --- and youth is that future."

He noted the presence of two toddlers and quipped, "I'm glad we're starting them so young." □

## Said, Russell defend Silver Ribbon title

Chuck Said and John Russell won the 1997 Silver Ribbon Pairs and immediately made a date to defend their title.

They're here in Reno, seeking to become the first two-time winners of the Silver Ribbon Pairs -- open only to players who are at least 55 years old and who have pre-qualified by placing first or second in a regional- or national-rated Senior event.

The Silver Ribbon Pairs, which consists of two qualifying and two final sessions, has been won by three members of the ACBL Board of Directors: Joan Remy Moore, District 12 director, playing with Helen Shanbrom in 1993; and Virgil Anderson, District 15 director, playing with Jayne Thomas, District 9 director, in 1994. (Anderson was ACBL president at the time and the only "sitting" president to win an NABC event.)

The winners will have their names inscribed on the Leventritt Trophy and will receive a certificate of recognition.

The trophy honors Peter Leventritt of New York, ACBL president in 1954 and assistant treasurer 1945-46. He served as president of the Greater New York Bridge Association and the Card School of New York, which he co-founded.

Leventritt (1916-1997) pioneered the use of the *Schenken System* in partnership with its inventor.

He represented North America in the Bermuda Bowl and placed second in 1957, 1961, 1963 and 1965.

His NABC wins include the Spingold in 1956 and 1960, the Chicago (now the Reisinger) in 1941 and 1949, the Vanderbilt in 1953 and 1964, the Life Master Pairs in 1944 and 1951, the Master Mixed Teams in 1949, 1950 and 1959, the Mixed Pairs in 1950 and the Men's Teams in 1966.

When dummy comes down and you realize you are in an inferior contract, desperate measures are called for.

Ralph Katz, playing with George Jacobs and representing District 13, salvaged this board by leading his weakest suit and catching the defenders napping. The deal is Board 25 from the second qualifying session of the North American Open Pairs Flight A.

North's offbeat 3♦ opening gave Katz a problem. A takeout double with a singleton spade was out of the question but the hand was too strong to overcall 4♣. 3NT looked the best.

North led a low diamond and Katz captured South's queen with his ace. He realized that 6♥ was cold with a normal 3-2 trump break. Even if the field was only in 4♥, plus 480 would be a better score than his plus 460.

Accordingly, Katz attacked spades at trick two by leading to dummy's queen and South's king. South exited with a club and that was all the help Katz needed. He ran five clubs and four hearts, ending in dummy.

North, down to the ♠A and ♦J 10, was squeezed on the last heart. When he discarded a diamond, Katz cashed his ♦K and ♦7 for his 12th trick.

Plus 490 was good for 18.5 out of 25 matchpoints.

**Penni Fromm.** We were very best friends -- as far as I am concerned, she was a member of my family. What I remember best is the way she always started a phone conversation. I'd say "Hello" and she'd say, "What's up, Doc?" That was Judy -- she cared more about other people than she ever did about herself. It was difficult to find out what was going on in her life. Mark (Penni's husband) and I wanted to adopt Judy -- that's how much she was a member of our family. She always was able to get far beyond bridge -- she was a real person with her smile, her perky look, her red cheeks.

For the past 20 years, Judy and I had a black-jack pact. Any time she went to a tournament in a casino town, she made her first bet for me. I'm sure she laid down a bet for me in Reno, but I'll never know how we made out.

Judy was ever so generous. Every time she went to a tournament, she thought more about the children of her friends than she did about her personal performance. She made sure she found the time to go out and find presents for those children. She was a wonderful person.

**Gail Greenberg.** The bridge world without "Tuck" -- without her laugh, without her quick wit, without her unbelievable sense of humor -- it can't be!

And then the other side of Judy's lovable personality -- her remarkably sharp tongue. Judy was a square shooter all the way -- you always knew when you were in her good graces and BOY! did you know when you weren't! Her occasional disapproval, expressed with total abandon, made her usual approval all the more precious.

How lucky I was that Judy was a part of my extended family -- how lucky I was that she was as close as any sister I might have had.

**Aileen Osofsky.** Judy was like a daughter to me -- I always thought of her that way. She was a wonderful friend and a very caring person. Despite her expertise, she never talked down to her partners. She was one of my favorite partners for the past 19 years. She was everything a Goodwill

person should be.

**Joan Gerard.** Judy loved the game. She hadn't missed a North American Championship forever. She was very proud of the heritage she inherited from her father, Morris Elis -- she was a wonderful player. But there were many times she regretted not using her education for something other than bridge. She always advised young players to get their education and play bridge only for leisure. Even though she was a star, she was always willing to play with her friends. And she was totally supportive of ACBL activities -- 200 percent!

**Irina Levitina.** Judy, the perfect roommate -- kind, generous and a great sense of humor. The Nationals, my life, won't be the same without her.

**Sol Weinstein.** Judy was a friend to everyone. She took care of the sick, and she went to wakes and funerals. She was always sympathetic to people who were having troubles. She always helped anyone who needed help.

**John Solodar.** I was deeply saddened to learn of the sudden death of my long-time friend Judy Tucker. Although always forthright, she had an underlying patience and kindness. She was all heart. As a player, Judy was first-rate -- a tough and consistent competitor. She had a way of getting people to follow the rules with a smile. We will miss her in New York. I will miss her as a friend.

**Karen Allison.** Judy was my friend and frequent bridge partner for more than 30 years. She was, like her beloved father Morrie Elis, a "natural" -- a player who never read a bridge book. She never remembered a hand once it was over, and she would ask me, "Alan (Truscott) wants a hand -- what did I do?"

She was funny ("what part of NO didn't you understand?"), smart, generous, and a loyal and loving friend. She never stopped missing her two dearest friends, Jim Becker and Howard Chandross. I will miss Judy with the same intensity, and so will her many, many friends.

ter, with a victory in the Pan Am Women's Teams in 1992 and several high-ranking finishes in world events. At the ACBL level, she was a Diamond Life Master with several NABC victories and innumerable regional triumphs.

Judy always was dedicated to her father, former bridge great Morrie Elis. No question about it -- he was always her hero. Penni Fromm of Milford PA, who considered Judy as part of her family, told of Judy's devotion to her father. "When Judy held an opening hand with four diamonds and five clubs, she always opened one club. When asked why, Judy's

answer always was that one club is what her father would have bid."

Gail Greenberg, when she heard the news in New York that funeral services were going to be held in Reno, immediately hopped a plane to Reno so that she could help with the arrangements for her very good friend. Funeral services will be here in Reno. Her friends will hold a memorial service for her Monday after the evening session in Roy Green's room, 2463.

Osofsky echoed in words what all of Judy's friends were thinking. "She was where she wanted to be, with her friends at a bridge tournament. She was doing what she loved with the people she loved." □

Kamel, playing with Mark Bumgardner, said his 3NT bid was "a little risky but not too much. Partner wasn't a passed hand."

As the cards lie, if North leads the ♠A and another spade, North-South will take four spades and five hearts for down five -- minus 1400 for Kamel and Bumgardner.

Instead, North -- playing Kamel for the ♠K and another -- tried the surprise attack of a low heart.

Surprise! Kamel won his ♥K and rattled off eight club tricks. North-South, trying to protect hearts and spades, forgot about diamonds and Kamel scored three tricks in that suit for plus 1350 -- an eight-trick difference -- and all 103 matchpoints.

"My idea is to see how creatively you can raise money for these charities," she said.

toughest, the most challenging test ever devised. The schedule is set up so that there is always an event for everyone, no matter whether or not they qualify in the main events. Everyone will have their evenings free for socializing and dining -- play will finish by 7 o'clock most nights. Our transportation arrangements with Air France mean a low fare to Paris followed by a free 45-minute ride on a high-speed train -- 180 miles an hour -- to Lille for Air France passengers."

Yes, we managed to get José to talk about other things -- the 50th anniversary of the Bermuda Bowl in Bermuda in 2000, the future of bridge as an Olympic sport, the new ideas for the World-wide Pairs, a Grand Prix of Bridge, the new transnational championships, a satellite TV bridge program. But clearly Lille was the main item on his mind. So back to Lille we go.

### All about Lille

"Don't worry about hotels," said José. "Even if you're some distance from the playing area, no problem. There will be frequent shuttles -- and if you have a car, it's a quick drive down the street. I'm working with some folks in the Lille area to find sponsors for some free cars for use during the tournament.

"I'm really excited about the par contest. We're going to give out \$70,000 in cash prizes, with \$35,000 going to the winners. The 24 top world players who will be invited to compete will attack five problems per session for four sessions. The problems were conceived by Pietro Bernasconi of Switzerland, the same man who set up the par contest in Geneva eight years ago. The minds of the competitors will be locked on their computers for hours at a time as they try to unravel the best lines for each problem. Benito Garozzo was the winner in Geneva, followed by your own Bob Hamman. We plan to have both of them back for more in Lille.

"We're going to be through playing by 7 o'clock all but one night. Of course it's possible that some of the team matches will run a little longer, but in general you're going to have your evenings free. Play will start at 11, and there'll be a one-hour break for lunch.

"Lille is going to be bigger than Albuquerque was in 1994. We had 4500 players in Albuquerque, but we're expecting more than 5000 in Lille."

### Olympic hopes

Two major events will showcase bridge for the International Olympic Committee.

"We're going to stage a demonstration match in Bangkok in December during the Asian Games. And we're going to stage a Grand Prix event for Lausanne, Switzerland, shortly after the World Championships in Lille. This is still in the planning stage -- we're in contact with Juan Antonio Samarranch of the IOC concerning the details. Perhaps we'll invite one team per zone, and I'm expecting that there will be cash prizes.

"In general things are moving along quite well as far as Olympic recognition is concerned. I believe our chances of gaining a spot in the Winter Olympics

are quite reasonable."

### World-wide Pairs

The World Bridge Federation has big plans for the World-wide Pairs (formerly the Epson Pairs), starting in 1999, according to José. The 1998 tournament will be like past events -- an Instant Matchpoint formula. But 1999? Well, hold onto your hats!

"We're going to matchpoint across the field," said José, "and that means across the whole world. All the scores from games all over the world will be matchpointed together, so that top on a board could be some astronomical number.

"How can we do such a monumental thing? Well, we have the Internet to thank for that. Anyone who has Internet will be able to send his results directly to our headquarters in Paris. But we can handle everything even if they don't have Internet capability. The game director can send his results by fax and we can enter them in Paris. As far as the ACBL is concerned, those who don't have Internet can fax their results to Memphis where they can be compiled and sent along to Paris."

Now just a minute, José. How soon will the winner be determined? It's going to take time to get all these scores together and matchpoint them. In the past you've declared a winner ver soon after the game was over. What's going to happen with across-the-world matchpointing?

"Not to worry," said José. "Yes, of course it will take longer. But we should be able to send out the final results to the world in just two days. I don't think anyone will mind the two days when the final results will really represent how you've done against all the rest of the world." Certainly an interesting, in fact a fascinating, concept.

"I think a lot of players are going to be very surprised. We will also offer the usual Instant Matchpoint results so the players can have some idea of how they've done. When they get their final results from the world scoring, they're going to be surprised that their percentage is going to be just about the same as it was in Instant Matchpoints."

But that's not all. José wants the second world-wide contest to be run on an IMP basis. His plan is to have two pairs of the highest possible world ranking

play against each other on the same deals the rest of the world are playing. Then each pair would IMP their score against the scores of the world-class pair that played in the same direction. Another highly interesting idea.

### Bermuda Bowl Golden Anniversary

"The Golden Anniversary of the Bermuda Bowl is going to be a great event," said José. "It's going to be held in Bermuda, which is where the first Bermuda Bowl was held in 1950. The Bermudians are extremely excited, and they've already got a major sponsor. There's no question about it -- they're going to do this tournament right.

"I want to see a lot of American teams there. We're going to continue with our transnational events at the major world team championships, and I'm expecting a lot of American teams to make the short hop to Bermuda to play.

"I'm more than happy with the way the transnational events have been accepted. We had 86 teams in Rhodes and 75 in Hammamet. What is especially interesting is that very few of the teams are those that took part in the main event and were eliminated. Only five or six join in the transnationals -- all the others are teams that made a special trip just for the transnationals.

"It's clear that the people like these new events. We're still looking for ways to make the format even better, but the transnationals as they are have become a terrific hit with the bridge players of the world."

No question about it -- bridge is on the move all over the world. □



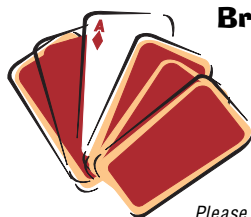

# The opening lead

By Barry Rigal

One of the elements of the game that new players love to use is the opening lead from a sequence.

The idea is that when you have a run of three honors, you should lead the highest one. This is standard practice but there are exceptions to every rule.

- Dlr: North     ♠ K 8 6
- Vul: N-S       ♥ 8
- ♦ A Q 3 2
- ♣ J 10 9 4 3

At many tables, East-West bid 1♥-1♠; 2♣-2NT; Pass, leaving North with an awkward lead. On this particular auction, if you are going to lead clubs, there is a strong argument for leading a low one, not the jack.

With so many potential entries, you do not mind blocking the suit and you want to avoid wasting a high card if either South or West has a singleton honor.

On this occasion, the low club worked well. West had a difficult play at trick one. It was entirely reasonable to play the queen from dummy. Now South could win the king and set up clubs at once.

Declarer won the third club and tackled hearts but to no avail. South won the second heart and led a diamond through declarer's holding. North won and cashed his clubs, forcing West to come down to five cards: three spades and two diamonds. Now a low spade from North set up two more winners for the defense for plus 150.
