## Hamman-Wolff partnership ends as Nickell loses

The Hamman-Wolff era of bridge -- almost 30 years of partnership that produced seven Bermuda Bowl victories, a World Team Olympiad title and a World Open Pairs championship -- is over.

Bob Hamman and Bobby Wolff announced earlier this week that they would go their separate ways at the end of the Vanderbilt Knockout Teams.

For Hamman and Wolff, the end came yesterday when they played their last match as partners. Their team, captained by Nick Nickell (and including Dick Freeman, Jeff Meckstroth and Eric Rodwell), lost to Marshall Miles & Co. 131-140.

Miles (Mark Bartusek, Jim Robison Jr., Robin Klar, Alan LeBendig and Jon Brissman) took the first set 37-8. Nickell, however, came storming back to post a 64-55 halftime score. In the third set, Miles went ahead 91-87. Nobody was counting Nickell out at that point but Miles took the final set 49-44 to post a stunning upset.

Miles will face George Rapee (John Solodar, Bill Eisenberg, Russ Arnold, Jon Baldursson and Magnus Magnusson) in today's round of 16.

The Nickell team had an amazing run in the Nineties that included four straight victories in the

## Who's the luckiest player? Ask bridge pro Grant Baze

More than three decades later, Grant Baze still remembers the conversation.

Baze was a student at Stanford University. Although he had aced his mid-term and final exams in chemistry, his grade for the course was only a C. Okay, so he hadn't gone to a single class. Stanford *did*, after all, have a liberal policy about attendance.

Concerned about the grade, Baze went to see the chemistry professor to talk it over. The man cast an eye at the tall, lanky student and said, "You must be Baze."

The prof explained the C: Baze had missed all the chemistry labs. The abashed student confessed: "I didn't know there was a lab." The reason? That's easy. "I went bridge nuts," Baze recalls.

Starting in his freshman year, Baze played bridge constantly. On one occasion, he and five other students engaged in a 12-day bridge game -- that's right, 12 days of non-stop bridge play in one of the dormitories. The game broke up only when the term was over and students were going home.

## New Yorkers lead NABC Mixed Pairs

A New York pair has a slight lead going into today's final two sessions of the NABC Mixed Pairs, but less than 1 1/2 boards separates first from eighth place.

John Rengstorff and Susan Wexler, both of New York City, have the lead with 2092.17 (top on a board was 64). In close pursuit are Vicki Laycock and Sidney Lorvan with 2052.33; Karen Walker and William Doroshov, 2034.40.

The first eight pairs all topped 2000 and an additional 21 pairs topped the 1900 mark. A total of 406 pairs entered the four-session event.

## Attendance turnout

The crowds were much smaller than anticipated through the early days of this tournament, but there has been a major turnaround in attendance the past two days. Yesterday 1716 tables were in play, the biggest day since the last time we were in Las Vegas.

The table count to date is 7545.5, which definitely puts 1998 Reno within reach of the Spring NABC attendance record, which was set by Reno back in 1989. The 1989 Reno drew 13807.5 tables.

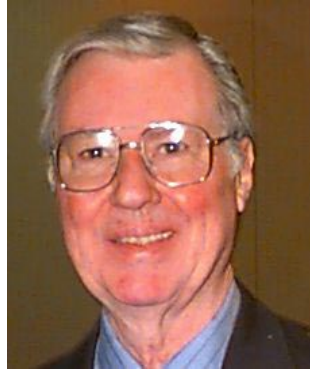

Eddie Wold was playing a 4♥ contract but he was forced to use clubs as his surrogate trump suit to land his contract.

Wold was playing with Paul Soloway in a knock-out match. Their opponents were Curtis Cheek and Hjordis Eythorsdottir.

Cheek led the ♠Q and Wold ducked. Cheek continued with the ♠J and Wold won his ace. He led a low club and Cheek ducked, but Cheek won the next club. He returned a spade, ruffed in dummy.

Wold could draw two rounds of trumps with dummy's ♥A K but would have no way back to his hand. If he played a diamond to his king, West could win his ace and led a spade. Now Wold would be forced to ruff and East would have the long trump.

Playing West for 5-2-2-4 shape ("he had to have two hearts or I had no play," said Wold), Wold led dummy's ♣J -- using clubs as a surrogate trump suit. East ruffed with the ♥6 and Wold overruffed with the 9. Now he led a low diamond, ducked by West and won with dummy's queen.

When declarer now led the ♣9, Eythorsdottir ruffed with her ♥8 and Wold overruffed with the ♥Q. He exited with a low diamond and Cheek won the ace.

This was the four-card ending:

If Cheek returned a heart to dummy's high trumps, Wold could cash both hearts and the good club and come back to his good ♦K.

If Cheek exited with a spade, Wold could pitch a diamond and be poised over East's ♥4 2 with his ♥5 3.

4♥ was down two at the other table, so the Wold team gained 13 IMPs.

# Close shaves

In our second-round Vanderbilt match, we ran into a squad playing well and in good luck. We eventually squeaked through, but it was certainly not comfortable. Here are a couple of hands showing some fine points of technique.

Avril Rodney declared 3♠ from the South seat after a transfer auction. I led a diamond to the 9, queen and ace, and Avril decided to scramble some ruffs in dummy. She played off the top hearts and ruffed a third, then crossed back to the ♦A to ruff the fourth heart. The best I could do was to pitch a diamond and a club. Now Avril ran the ♠J to my king. I cashed the ♦J and exited with a club to the 8, 9 and ace. This was the position:

When Avril led her losing club, I had to ruff and was endplayed in trumps. Avril had her contract for a 6-IMP pickup. This line was not found at the other table.

The second hand was a nice theme, demonstrating that jiu-jitsu bridge can be a game where you make the opponents do all the hard work.

3NT is by no means a trivial contract, but I was favored with a low spade lead to the 9 and 10. Now I could play a heart to the jack, and when that held I was very well placed. I cashed the ♦A, and when both opponents followed low (West might have played the 10 to prevent me from unblocking), I could lead a diamond to the king and the ♦9 to the ace. Then I could lead a spade to the king and ace. West could duck this, but would subsequently have been endplayed in spades to open up clubs or hearts.

West actually took the ♠K and shifted accurately to the ♣10, covered by the jack and ace, and back came a heart. I rose with the ace, crossed to dummy with a fourth round of diamonds, squeezing West out of a low club, and cashed the ♠Q. Then I cashed the ♣K, and the ♣9 was my tenth



# Going south pays off with two gold cards

It's not too easy to become a Life Master when you live North of 55. That's why Doug and Gail Shotton of Thompson, Manitoba, were so deliriously happy when they visited the Daily Bulletin office to announce their new honor. They both became Life Masters Sunday when their team finished third in B and second in C in the BCD Swiss Teams.

"We have a weekly game that draws four tables, and that's all the bridge available to us for hundreds of miles around," said Doug. "It's really hard to win any masterpoints under conditions like that."

"Thompson is 1000 miles north of Minneapolis and 500 miles north of Winnipeg. We're north of 55 degrees latitude," offered Gail. "There's lots of snow up there, but not much bridge."

Not many folks have heard of Thompson, but the town has its own airport, with five flights daily to Winnipeg. That's their connection with the outside world.

The play in the other room was more interesting after the challenging diamond lead (a club is best perhaps, but it's tough to find). Declarer won the diamond lead and played a heart to the jack, which won the trick. Then a spade went to the 10 and jack, and the defense got out with a second diamond. Declarer cashed a third diamond, on which East pitched the ♠9, and led a spade to the king, which was allowed to hold. Now declarer cashed the fourth diamond and led the ♠Q. This was the ending:

There is now no winning play by West. He must shift to a club. If he leads a low club or the 10, East will have to win the ace. On the next trick, whatever East leads, South can rise and endplay West in that suit. West's best play may be the ♣Q. South wins the king and exits with the ♥A and a second heart, getting a club trick if he guesses the position correctly.

However, another option was for East to keep three hearts and two clubs, and for West to exit with a heart. To come home from here declarer has to lead the ♣K from his hand now.

# Good judgment leads to Silver Ribbon win

Bill Sides and Eli Borok combined good judgment and good card play in scoring a close win in the Silver Ribbon Pairs.

West led the ♦K and another diamond. East won the ace and led the ♦Q, as Sides pitched a spade. East shifted to the ♠Q and Sides ducked again.

When East continued with the ♠J, Sides won the ace and led the ♥J. West erred by ducking and Sides continued with a heart to dummy's 10. He cashed the ♥A and led a club to his queen and West's ace. When West led the ♠K, Sides ruffed and cashed his ♥K, dropping West's queen. His clubs were good for the last two tricks.

Sides was pleased with his partner's bidding on Board 19.

"Eli made a great decision when he bid 5♦," said Sides. "We didn't know we were sacrificing but we can't beat 5♣."

At 5♦, Sides lost one spade and three hearts for minus 300. Note that East-West will score plus 600 at 5♣ by playing Borok, the notrump bidder, for the ♥Q.

## It's your lead

Jay Apfelbaum looked at his hand, then turned to his left-hand opponent and said, "No matter what you do, it's your lead. Now, what am I going to bid?" This was his hand:

"Seven notrump," Jay said to open the bidding.

# Arvedon, Falk defend Open Pairs II title

Lloyd Arvedon and Allan Falk -- two for two in pairs competition at NABCs -- will contend for a repeat title when Open Pairs II begins today.

Arvedon and Falk won Open Pairs II at the 1994 Spring NABC in Cincinnati and Open Pairs II at last year's Spring NABC in Dallas.

Open Pairs II consists of two qualifying and two final sessions. The reward: the Wernher Trophy, donated in 1934 by Sir Derrick J. Wernher, one of the originators of the masterpoint system, and presented to the winners of the National Men's Pairs Championship.

The event was contested at the Summer NABC until 1962 and subsequently at the Spring NABC. From 1969 through 1971, it was a three-session championship.

In 1992 the event became Open Pairs II.

Wernher (1889-1947) was a resident of London, England and Deal NJ. He succeeded to his title in 1912 and lived in the U.S. between the two world wars.

He served as British representative with the International Red Cross in Geneva during World War II and subsequently returned to London where he died.

He was president of the American Bridge League (ABL) in 1933, chairman of its Master Plan committee and a director of the American Whist League (AWL).

Wernher was also a player -- he placed second in the Asbury Challenge Teams in 1936 and won the Reisinger (played in conjunction with the New York regional) in 1930.

Thirty-seven years later, Baze -- still in love with the game -- is a full-time bridge professional who is regarded as one of the tops in his field. Baze has won seven North American championships -- including the Spingold Knockout Teams last summer -- and hundreds of regional titles. Sometime this year, his lifetime masterpoint total will pass 30,000.

Baze holds the record for masterpoints won in a year -- 3270 in 1984, when he won the McKenney Trophy, now known as the *Barry Crane Top 500*.

He has also won the admiration of his colleagues and partners, who regard Baze as not only a top player but also as one of the most honest and ethical players in the world.

Tipton Golias, a regular Baze partner for about 10 years, recalls an incident during an open pairs championship at a regional in Baton Rouge LA in the late Eighties. Baze was declarer in a 3♦ contract. He claimed for plus 110 and the opponents agreed.

While he was taking a smoke break, Baze thought about the deal. When he realized that his claim had been invalid and that he should have gone down, Baze sought out the opponents and had the score changed. Baze and Golias finished third in the event. Had Baze not spoken up, they would have won. "He didn't hesitate," recalls Golias. "He is scrupulously honest."

### Pain was from cancer

Golias also admires Baze's courage, which was manifest during the Spingold last summer -- and afterwards.

Baze played the entire Summer NABC in agony from what he thought was a kidney stone. "A couple of times," Golias says, "he almost passed out. I would have gone home, but he didn't want to miss the Nationals." The team -- Baze, Golias and four Polish bridge pros -- won the Spingold, and Baze went home to La Jolla CA to see his physician.

It turned out that the pain was not from a kidney stone. It was cancer -- a tumor near his kidney. At first, his doctors weren't sure if anything could be done. Despite the grim news, Baze remained upbeat. In fact, he decided that if the cancer was inoperable, he was going to go back on the road to try to win the 1997 *Barry Crane Top 500*. At that point, he was still in contention.

Even after chemotherapy had reduced the tumors to the point that surgery was possible, Baze's doctors advised against the risky procedure. Undaunted, Baze opted for a chance to live. Besides, he figured, the odds were in his favor no matter what the doctors said.

"I was born under a lucky star," Baze maintains, "and it's great fun knowing that." On Dec. 2, the day before major surgery, Baze was married for the seventh time, to Wendy Brown, whom he met when he and Golias were trying to make a go of Tel-a-Bridge, now part of OKbridge.

Still not fully recovered from the surgery, Baze played only one tournament in 1998 -- the Houston regional in February -- before heading for Reno. He wasn't about to miss the Spring NABC. Bridge, after all, is still lots of fun for the man once described by his mother as a "riverboat gambler born 150 years too late."

### Right next to the funnies

By the time Baze entered Stanford in 1961, he was well acquainted with bridge, having first read the bridge column in *The Washington Evening Star* at the age of four. "It was right next to the funnies," Baze says. "I read the column every day and had a pretty good grasp of what was happening." He also had read lots of bridge books by this time.

His major was "this and that" -- and changing all the time, from general engineering to electrical engi-

neering to math to history finally to political science. Baze left school four years later one quarter short of his degree.

What got in the way of his studies was bridge. Baze recalls: "All of the fun was learning: figuring things out, seeing things I hadn't seen before. It was more fun than winning. Of course, a much less intense phase of learning in bridge goes on forever."

Baze was smart enough to earn passing grades despite almost never attending lectures. He was too busy playing rubber bridge at one of the clubs in San Francisco. When people asked him what he did for a living, Baze often said, "I'm retired." Retired? "Well," he said, "if you were retired, wouldn't you sleep until noon and play bridge all day and night? That's what I do."

### Just one long bridge game

After leaving Stanford, Baze's life was more or less one long bridge game. He arose at noon, found his way to a rubber bridge club, played until at least 2 a.m., went home and read bridge books until the sun came up. He did this practically seven days a week for about 15 years with some tournaments thrown in (he won the Reisinger Board-a-Match Teams in 1970 and the Spingold in 1975).

In 1976, he became part owner of the club where he played. He didn't really want to buy into the club, but his girlfriend at the time talked him into it. That pretty much curtailed his bridge playing. Then in 1979, at the urging of his mother, Baze went back to Stanford to earn his degree. It took him five months to qualify for a bachelor's degree in political science.

Before re-entering Stanford, Baze had rejected a job offer from Joe Conforte, who wanted Baze to work at the infamous Mustang Ranch as a cashier and as Conforte's bridge partner.

After earning his diploma from Stanford, Baze stayed "respectable" for three years, working as a computer programmer for Lockheed.

Finally, however, the lure of bridge was too strong. With encouragement from Rhoda Walsh, Baze's new love interest, he decided to become a professional on the tournament circuit. On Jan. 1, 1983, Baze moved to Los Angeles and started preparing for the Spring NABC in Honolulu.

With high ambitions in the bridge world, Baze saw no reason not to start at the top -- he talked to the legendary Barry Crane about playing. In fact, he and Crane helped Ron Andersen win a hotly contested battle with Linda Peterson (now Lewis) for the McKenney Trophy that year.

Crane was to have returned the favor for the 1984 race, helping Baze win, but the two had a falling out early in the campaign and Crane became Baze's rival for the trophy.

### His secret weapon

Baze had one secret weapon, however -- incredible stamina, a necessity in the grueling, year-long contest. Baze figures he has played well over 1.5 million bridge hands and easily more than 200 sessions of 72 hours straight or longer. "After 24 hours," Baze says, "your mind goes into a fog for about an hour, then it snaps back and everything is wonderful. You're as fresh as you can be for another day."

The pitched battle with Crane spurred Baze to a record performance -- 3270 masterpoints for the year. It was the first time any player had surpassed the 3000-point barrier. Richard Hunt of Las Vegas is the only other player to top that barrier. He won 3149 MPs in 1994.

Baze's accomplishment is all the more impressive because he had to overcome cancer that year, too. He had noticed a bump on his head in March. When an examination determined that it was cancer, Baze had to decide which was more important, winning the masterpoint race or living.

He opted for both, scheduling surgery during a regional in Wichita KS. His appointment was set up so that he could play a morning knockout one day and get back for the next day's session.

During the episode, Walsh had to help Baze's physicians understand how much the McKenney race meant to him. Baze had been insisting he could not take time off, as his physicians recommended. "Yes," Walsh told one doctor, "Grant is nuts, and he means exactly what he says."

Baze and Walsh, playing together, won 143 points at the Wichita tournament, and he went on to trounce Crane in the McKenney race.

Baze won again the following year, but some of the luster was lost because of Crane's mysterious death. He was found slain in his Studio City CA home in the summer of 1985. The case remains unsolved.

Although relations between Baze and Crane were strained, Baze maintains that the man many consider the top matchpoint player of all time was good for the game. "Barry was the most exciting and charismatic personality I have known in my life," Baze says.

Since turning pro, Baze has never wanted for professional dates. "He has a sense of humor," says frequent partner and longtime friend Michael Whitman of San Francisco. "Grant is fun to play with."

### Lightning - fast play

Whitman says his only problem playing with Baze is when he tries to keep up with Baze's lightning-fast card play. "You have to be careful," says Whitman. "If you try to play at his speed you're going to make a lot of mistakes."

Golias, recalling the Spingold, was surprised at Baze's reaction to defeating the high-powered Nick Nickell team in the semifinals and ultimately capturing the trophy. "I was walking on clouds for a month," Golias says, "but as thrilled as I was, Grant was even more excited."

More often than not, Baze stands out in a bridge crowd, and not just because of his 6-foot-3, 165-pound frame. He is almost always one of the few players to dress for the game. He is usually seen in a suit and tie. He does it, he says, out of respect for the game. "When I started playing," he says, "there was a Mixed Pairs on Friday at every regional and you dressed up for it. I liked that. I like the idea that bridge originated in a time when everyone dressed well. The way some players dress, if they showed up at your door, you wouldn't let them in your house."

### Revamp committee structure

Baze also dislikes some trends he has observed in the bridge world. He is especially irritated to see players trying to win in committee what they could not win at the table. "It's a terrible way to play bridge," he says. In fact, he says, the committee structure should be completely revamped. Committees, he believes, should be composed entirely of tournament directors.

He also objects to the proliferation of events, the apparent objective being to assure that everyone can win masterpoints. "I don't understand the psychology of people who would rather win than learn," he says.

Baze is remarkably candid in discussing his most interesting life. Many of the episodes are recounted in his "messages" on the OKbridge web site. There are some stories, however, that will never be told, principally "the important points in my life that had mostly to do with girls. There have been lots of ups and down," Baze says, "but most of the time it's been a ball."

His partners feel the same way. Says Whitman: "I would rather lose with Grant than win with some other guy." □

"The 1♠ overcall was not my best overcall ever," said Cohen, "but Ray wasted no time putting me in game."

North led a low heart to South's ace, and South shifted to the ♣K. Cohen realized that if spades were 2-2, he would likely make 12 tricks since he could ruff two hearts in dummy. If spades were 3-1, however, he could not afford that line of play since an opponent's third spade would be promoted.

Taking out insurance, Cohen won the ♣A at trick two and led to dummy's ♠A. He ruffed a club and led to dummy's ♠K, as South showed out. He ruffed a club and returned to dummy with the ♦Q. Now he ruffed dummy's last club with his last spade.

A heart ruff followed and Cohen cashed the ♠Q, pitching his third heart. When diamonds split 3-2, he had 12 tricks -- good for plus 480, a good score.

**Turner surpasses 10,000-point mark**

Liane Turner, the only *Senior Player of the Year* who received the George Burns Trophy from Burns himself, has surpassed the 10,000-masterpoint plateau.

Turner still remembers meeting Burns in early 1994. "It was a day unlike any other," she said. "I've never been in an earthquake before."

Turner and ACBL officials, including CEO Roy G. Green and District 23 Director Cecil Cook, were in Los Angeles for the trophy presentation when an earthquake struck. Because of damage to Burns' country club, the presentation had to be held outdoors. Burns was disappointed, Turner said, because the group could not play bridge. "He loved to play bridge. I've never known anyone who loved to play more."



Turner, a Kansas City MO resident, may come close. She's been playing since high school and makes annual appearances high on the Senior masterpoint and the *Barry Crane Top 500* lists.

Late in the hand on the third lead of trumps, West "won" a trump with the ♠A. However, the revoke was never established -- no one ever played a card to the next trick. The director was called, and West was instructed to follow suit. At the same time the director pointed out that the ♠A now was a penalty card and had to be played at the first legal opportunity.

West then won the trick with the right black ace. Since he was then on lead, he had no choice but to lead the ♠A, since this was his first legal opportunity. It was just the rub of the green that this play happened to help East-West to find the best possible defense.

Everything was done exactly according to bridge law. It was just an unlucky set of circumstances for North-South.
