Krekorian, Blanchard win Blue Ribbon

New Yorkers Jim Krekorian and Bob Blanchard put together a 63.15% final session in the Blue Ribbon Pairs, holding off a late charge by the defending champions to win by 2.9 matchpoints on a 38 top.

David Berkowitz, Old Tappan NJ, and Larry Cohen, Boca Raton FL, finished second despite racking up 70 out of 76 matchpoints on the final round. In third place were Tony Forrester of Great Britain and Geir Helgemo of Norway, the leaders after the first final session.

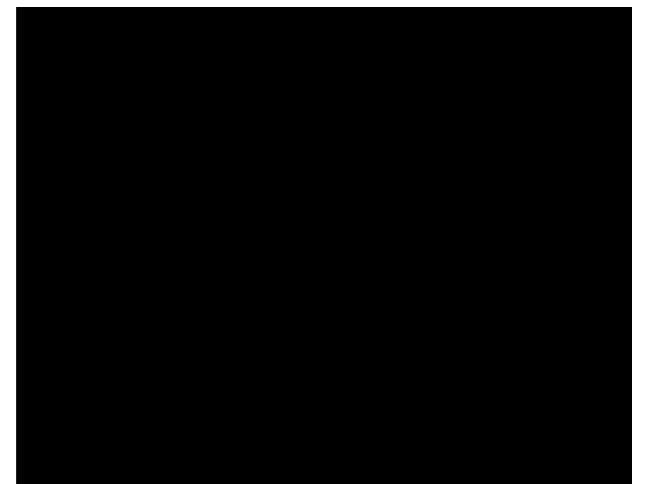
The victory was an emotional one for Krekorian, who dedicated it to four former partners and teammates who have died in recent years -- Mike Smolen, Bob Glenn, Jim Becker and Howard Chandross.

Before the start of play, Krekorian had a feeling about the Blue Ribbon Pairs, so he wrote "For M.S., B.G., J.B., H.C" on the entry. "It was so small no one would have seen it," Krekorian said, "but I felt like they were watching me. They were some of my best friends and partners."

The win was also special for Blanchard, who captured his first North American championship.

Krekorian is an options trader on the American Stock Exchange and a part-time bridge professional.

Chilcote vs. Hertzberg in Senior KO final

Zeke Jabbour and Russ Arnold, playing on the team captained by Mary Chilcote, face only one more obstacle in their quest for their third straight NABC Senior Teams championship. They and their teammates advanced to today's 64-board final by defeating the team captained by Colin Revill, 169-88.

Also on the Chilcote team are Bill Eisenberg, Fred Hamilton and Tom Sanders. All three have won the Senior Teams once previously.

Their opponent today will be the team captained by Howard Hertzberg, which defeated the Virgil Anderson team in their semifinal, 206-142. Playing with Hertzberg are Robert Ryder, William Esberg, Simon Kantor and Martin Baff.

CHILCOTE took an 18-point lead and stretched it to 33 at the half. They added 13 more in the third quarter. The fourth quarter was a blowout as Revill's team attempted to make up the 46-point deficit.

The Hertzberg-Anderson match was extremely

Junior team victorious in morning superflight

A team that didn't even qualify, according to the usual rules, for the superflight in the Morning Knockouts I today reigns as the champion. It's one of the American Junior teams that will represent the United States in the World Junior Championships next August in Hamilton ON, Canada.

Ordinarily the teams with the most masterpoints are assigned to the top flight, and this team had "only" about 10,000 points among the six members. But Captain Bob Rosen and Coach Jeff Meckstroth asked for a special dispensation for the Juniors so that they could test them-

McIntosh credits committee, players for NABC success

Before the first card was turned at this tournament, before the first player arrived, Bill McIntosh had a good feeling about the 1996 Fall NABC in San Francisco.

McIntosh, tournament chairman, hasn't been disappointed.

Attendance at the NABC is heading for the 14,000-table mark, which will easily break San Francisco's previous record of 13,239 tables, set in 1990.

More important than records, said McIntosh, is that the players have found what they came to San Francisco for -- fun.

It didn't happen by accident. "It's been very much a team effort," McIntosh said. "The committee people have outdone themselves -- and the weather hasn't hurt."

McIntosh said serious planning for the NABC has been in the works for 18 months "and the preparation shows."

The NABC chairman said he has been especially pleased with the performances of Dan and

Inimitable Kojak heading for retirement -- sort of

Although he'll be turning in his full-time director's card when the San Francisco NABC is over, the bridge plate will remain full for Bill "Kojak" Schoder.

The colorful, sometimes controversial TD may be cutting back on his work for the ACBL, but he has a full agenda of work for the World Bridge Federation in 1997.

For starters, he's still chief tournament director at WBF tournaments -- and he's made commitments to teach directing or run competitions in Germany, China, Singapore, South Africa, India, Tunisia and Panama.

But is it really true? No more Kojak at NABCs? Not exactly. Schoder and his wife Bud, with a home base in Tampa FL, may well turn up as players. "Bridge has been and still is an important part of our lives," said Schoder, whose resemblance to the late television and film star Telly Savalas earned him his nickname.

After a 25-year career in the U.S. Air Force -- he retired as a lieutenant colonel -

- and an overlapping 36-year career as a tournament director, Schoder figures it's time to ease up a bit.

His primary motivations, he said, are "nine grandchildren, a fishing boat, a wonderful wife and family and a desire to play bridge."

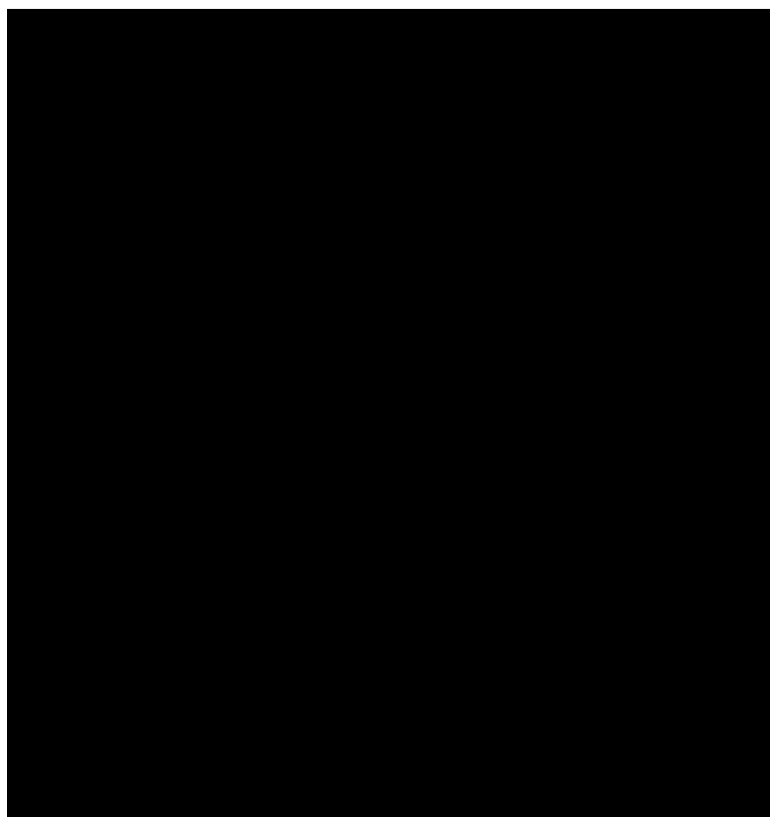
Schoder took up directing in 1960 and became multilingual through his travels while he was in the military. Today, he is fluent in English, French, Spanish and German and can converse in Portuguese.

As chief tournament director for the WBF since 1987, Schoder has traveled the world, making friends wherever he went. Never one to pull punches or shy away from controversy, Schoder has been called a few names in his time, but he has no regrets about his career.

"It's been very interesting and very gratifying," he said.

Schoder, of course, has seen many changes in bridge since he started direct-

Duck, duck, duck!

Sometimes you win more tricks by not winning tricks -- at least not right away. Watch Eddie Wold and George Rosenkranz do their share of ducking on this deal from the second semifinal session of the Blue Ribbon Pairs.

Rosenkranz led the ♣Q to the king, and declarer shot back a second club. Rosenkranz played the jack (!) and Wold followed with the 9 as declarer ducked in dummy to keep communications open. Rosenkranz led his last club -- but declarer didn't know it was his last club. Declarer finessed the 8 and Wold gratefully took his 10.

He returned the ♠10, and Rosenkranz ducked when declarer played the king. When declarer then put the ♥K on the table, it was Wold's turn to duck.

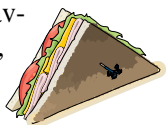
Then the roof caved in for declarer. He tried a heart to the 10, but Wold won the jack and led the ♠9. Rosenkranz overtook with the jack, cashed the ♠A and led his last heart through dummy's queen. Wold took his ♥9 and ♥A. That was down three -- the defense took two spades, two clubs and three hearts. Sometimes duck is better than turkey.

The request seemed totally reasonable to the tournament authorities, so the team was given the dispensation.

On the team are Tom Carmichael, Joel Wooldridge, Scott Lewis, Shannon Lipscomb, Chris Willenken and Eric Greco. Tom and Joel played as partners -- the other four rotated as partnerships.

In a hard-fought final yesterday, they defeated Allan Siebert, John Zilic, Robert Carteaux, David Adams, Sylvia Summers and Jeff Goldsmith by 4 IMPs. Their victims in the semifinal were Cameron Doner, Ron Bishop, Steve Onderwyzer, Ray Grace, Randall Lazarus and Helene Schubert.

Today the Juniors are playing in the North American Swiss, not the Reisinger -- for a very good reason. Sure, the Reisinger is the tougher event, but it's board-a-match. The World Juniors will be an IMP event, so the Juniors want as much practice as possible playing in IMP competition.

The Juniors were subsidized by the ACBL at this NABC to help them get prepared for the world championship. As a result of cost-cutting measures, the team will not be subsidized at the next two NABCs. Wei-Sender hopes some way can be found so that the Juniors can get all the training necessary to make a good showing in Hamilton. □

Player of Year race

From a pickup team to a gold card

From a pickup team at the regional in Little Rock AR to a gold card at the San Francisco NABC -- that's the story of Victoria Castleberry of Houston TX.

Last May Victoria and her partner Linda Paukune, also of Houston, wanted to play in the Swiss Teams in Little Rock. The Partnership Desk put them together with Lillie Inzina of Monroe LA and her brother Jay Frank of Shreveport LA.

The alignment proved highly successful -- they won Flight B. Even better, the tournament was providing free airline tickets to an NABC of their choice to the winners of both Flight A and Flight B.

"That's why we're here," said Victoria. She was walking on air -- she and her teammates placed in the overall in the Swiss Teams and she needed only .51 points to become a Life Master. Now she has her gold card. "I wasn't going to go home until I could go home as a Life Master," she said.

Her teammate Lillie had a strong reason for wanting success at the bridge table.

One day when she went to the bridge club, one of the regulars said to her, "I'm surprised to see you here -- you were so bad the last time you played."

Well, that got her boiling mad. She made up her mind she was going to become a good bridge player -- even a director. As a matter of fact, she is now a director at the Queens Duplicate Bridge Club in Monroe, and her bridge is improving day by day. She's piling up the points and getting ready to confront and laugh at her critic.

Robert (Woody) Woodworth

Robert (Woody) Woodworth, 85, of St. Petersburg FL, one of the area's top players for many years, died this week. He was found sitting in a chair reading a bridge book. Earlier this week he played at the St. Petersburg Bridge Club and had a huge game -- 75.9%, with S. Brasin of St. Petersburg.

A Diamond Life Master with more than 8700 masterpoints, he was Life Master #217.

But he was better known for his bridge newspaper writing. He wrote a bridge column for the St. Petersburg Times for 20 years. He earned several writing awards from the International Bridge Press Association.

He was a past president of Florida Unit 108 and was involved in bridge administration for many years.

Defenders go for third win in North American Swiss Teams

The five-man squad which won the North American Swiss Teams the last two years will go for a third win in this year's event.

Team members are Jack Coleman, San Francisco; Drew Cannell, Sweden; Mark Molson, Cote St. Luc PQ; Boris Baran, St. Lazare PQ, and Mark Stein, Montreal.

"I'm certainly planning on winning again," said Coleman. "Every time I sit down to play, I expect to win."

The team won in Minneapolis in 1994 and in Atlanta last year.

They'll be vying for the Keohane Trophy, which was donated by Ethel Keohane in 1973 in memory of her husband, William H. Keohane, one of the leading New England bridge personalities.

The trophy was presented for the Open Individual Championship until it was re-designated in 1995 by the ACBL Board of Directors for the North American Swiss Teams.

Let there be light

Most bridge players in national events are familiar with and have played against Michael Levinson, a player of the highest caliber despite an extreme visual disability which requires extra lighting and the verbal assistance of the other players. In the first semifinal session of the Blue Ribbon Pairs, my wife Gail and I played the following board against Levinson.

After Gail's thoughtful opening lead of the ♠3, declarer was in jeopardy of losing three tricks -- a club, a heart and a spade ruff. Even looking at all four hands, not everyone would "see" a counter-play to attempt to avoid the ruff.

Imagine playing the contract -- and every contract -- where your partner and the opponents must cooperate by verbally telling you what cards are played and are in dummy. Imagine the mind and the ability that then permits you to (a) remember every spot card and (b) then attempt to counter the defense.

After winning the first trick with the ♠A, Levinson played the ♦A at trick two and the ♦J at trick three, pitching dummy's ♣2 in an attempt to cut the defenders' communication.

This theoretically prevented Gail from reaching my hand for the spade ruff. There is a reason Gail is a many-time world champion, however. Having seen me play up the line in diamonds -- showing an odd number of diamonds -- she played a high diamond, forcing dummy to ruff.

When the ♥4 was played to the 9, queen and ace, Gail now applied to *coup de grace* -- she led a fourth diamond, creating a trump promotion for my ♥J. Levinson could have made his contract by playing the ♥K from dummy and exiting with a heart, preventing the spade ruff, but he was due to succeed and make an overtrick if he put in the ♥10 and it held.

As it was, of course, Levinson played the ♥10 to my jack and I was able to give Gail her hard-earned spade ruff for down one.

All in all, it was an enjoyable bridge experience where two brilliant bridge players parried each other in an attempt to gain the upper hand.

Losing bet

The so-called gambling 3NT is self-descriptive. Players who employ the convention are betting, in a way, that their solid minor suit will take lots of tricks. On this deal from the second final session of the Non-Life Master Pairs, West lost his bet. North and South, who came out on top, were Brian Kemper of Mountain View and Rupert Brauch of Palo Alto, who finished third in the event.

Kemper led the ♥A, getting the 10 from partner and reading it as suit preference for spades. Accordingly, Kemper switched to the ♠K, ducked by West. Kemper knew he was on the right track when he saw the ♠J appear from West's hand, and he continued with the ♠10. Again, declarer ducked. West won the ♠A when Kemper persisted in spades. West then cashed all five of dummy's hearts, coming down to the ♣A K and the ♦K J in his hand.

After running dummy's hearts, West played a diamond and, thinking that North had started with four spades to the K-Q, thought he couldn't make the contract if North held the ♦A. So West went up with the ♦K. Kemper won the ace and played a diamond to partner's queen. Brauch then cashed the ♠Q for down two.

Nickell team shooting for Reisinger "four-peat"

The Nick Nickell team -- fresh from their fourth consecutive Spingold win at the Summer NABC in Miami Beach -- will try for a record fourth consecutive victory in the Reisinger Board-a-Match Teams starting today.

Trying for the "four-peat" will be Nick Nickell, Raleigh NC; Richard Freeman, Atlanta; Jeff Meckstroth, Tampa; Eric Rodwell, Naperville IL, and Bob Hamman and Bobby Wolff, Dallas.

Nickell & Co. won Reisinger titles at the Fall NABC in Seattle in 1993, in Minneapolis in 1994 and in Atlanta in 1995.

Along the way, the team -- with non-playing captain Edgar Kaplan -- won the Bermuda Bowl in Beijing, China, in 1995.

History of the Reisinger

The event is contested for the Reisinger Trophy (the Chicago Trophy until 1965). It is a six-session open team-of-four event scored by board-a-match with two qualifying sessions, two semifinal sessions and two final sessions. It was contested as a four-session championship until 1966.

The event began in 1929 as the North American Open Team Championship and the prize was the Chicago Trophy, donated by the Auction Bridge Club of Chicago. (In 1928, the open team competition was for the Harold S. Vanderbilt Cup.)

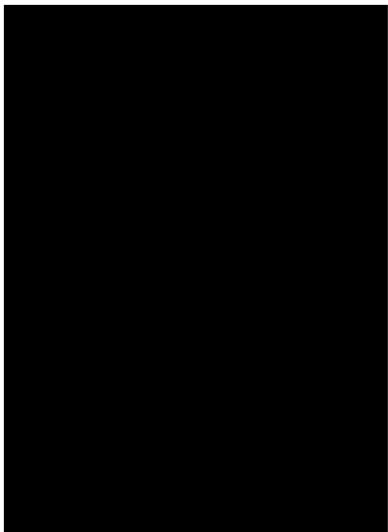
The Chicago Trophy was replaced in 1965 by the Reisinger Memorial Trophy, donated by the Greater New York Bridge Association in memory of Curt H. Reisinger.

Reisinger (1891-1964), of New York City, was a principal patron of contract bridge and the American Contract Bridge League in the early years of both.

Reisinger was a great-grandson of Anheuser and a grandson of Busch, co-founders of the brewery from which he inherited great wealth. That wealth enabled him to become a stalwart financial supporter of the game, as well as a noted philanthropist on a far larger scale.

In the years when it was often a struggle to meet the League's modest payroll, Reisinger was often called upon and never failed to help with a loan or an outright gift. His support made possible several early contract bridge tournaments, clubs and books.

Among the positions in which he served were director of the United States Bridge Association, president of the Greater New York Bridge Association and chairman of the ACBL. In 1953, Reisinger was named ACBL *Honorary Member*.

Looking back

► The only all-women's team to win the Reisinger -- or any other major open team event --- was Sally Young, Jane Jaeger, Paula Ribner and Kay Rhodes.

They tied in 1947 with John Crawford, Ted Lightner, George Rapee and Sam Stayman; and Robert Appleyard, Simon Rossant, Morris Berliant and M.A. Lightman.

Young, Life Master #17, was the first woman to earn Life Master rank. Among her successes were three additional wins in the Reisinger, seven in the Women's Teams, four in the Women's Pairs, five in the Mixed Teams and one each in the Fall Open Pairs and Fall Mixed Pairs. She died in 1970.

Ribner and Jaeger, both now living in Florida, are Gold Life Masters who remain active players. Jaeger was a member of the winning squad in the Grand National Teams in 1973, its inaugural year.

Jaeger and husband Lewis were the first married couple to attain Life Master rank -- #74 and #94, respectively -- and Lewis was a member of the winning Reisinger team in 1934. Together, they were second in the Vanderbilt in 1956.

Jaeger recalls that the 1947 Reisinger was "pretty close. We were on pins and needles for a while."

1947 champs -- The only all-women's team to win the Reisinger Board-a-Match Teams was made up of (from left) Kay Rhodes, Sally Young, Paula Ribner and Jane Jaeger.

Ribner remembers that the four "were all very good friends. We all played with each other."

Rhodes, a Silver Life Master who died earlier this year in California, recalled in a 1995 interview that the three-way tie "had us all checking our scores, trying to find a win."

► Fifty years ago, at the Fall NABC in Hollywood FL, Edith Freilich became the 13th woman to win the Reisinger. Her teammates were Mitch Barnes, John Crawford and Al Roth.

Freilich and Roth repeated their victory in 1952. This time, their teammates were Harold Harkavy and Tobias Stone.

► The history of the Reisinger is dotted with back-to-back wins but no three-peats or four-peats. The team of John Crawford, Charles Goren, Charles Solomon and Sally Young won in 1937 and 1938 -- the same squad, plus B.J. Becker, also won in 1939.

► Oswald Jacoby won his first Reisinger in 1955, playing on a team with his son Jim -- the only father-son combination to win the event.

► Jacoby's second Reisinger win came in 1983 when he was invited to join the team of Edgar Kaplan, Norman Kay, Richard Pavlicek and Bill Root.

Kaplan recalled that Jacoby had been a very good friend to all of the group. "When I was a young man, he played a lot with me. Jake was very good to me when I was a kid. We've been friends a long time and I've played on teams with him before, but I hadn't played as a partner with Ozzie in 30 years."

Jacoby was battling cancer but he was a vital part of the team effort that won the Reisinger.

On this deal, Jacoby was plus 450 at his table while Pavlicek-Root scored plus 100 at the other table. Pavlicek doubled 4♠ and they beat the contract one trick.

Jacoby played 4♠ undoubled and made five without any warning about the trump suit.

The opening diamond lead went to dummy's ace, and Jacoby played a heart to the king and ace. East thought it was a good idea to underlead his ♣A. It wasn't.

Jacoby put up the ♠K, then cashed the ♥Q J to pitch his last club. Then he ruffed a club and ruffed a diamond, ruffed another club and ruffed another diamond.

Next he led the fourth heart from dummy and when his right-hand-opponent followed, he ruffed with the ♠9,

over-ruffed with the jack.

East led a trump (perforce) and Jacoby was down to the ♠K 8 in his hand and the ♠A 10 in dummy. He won the 10 and had a high crossruff with the ace and king, East futilely under-ruffing at the end.

► John Crawford holds the record for most Reisinger wins with 10. His victories spanned four decades: 1937, 1938, 1939, 1942, 1946, 1947, 1953, 1954, 1956 and 1961.

► Helen Sobel and Sally Young share the record for most Reisinger wins by women with four.

► Sobel was the last woman to win the Reisinger -- her victory came in 1957.

► A multi-national team won in 1987. Team members included Zia, Jaggy Shivdasani, Billy Cohen and Ron Smith.

Said Zia: "The best thing about this was that we had a black (Smith), a Jew (Cohen, who is a Canadian citizen), an Indian (Shivdasani) and a Pakistani (Zia) playing together." Zia is a Muslim and Shivdasani is a Hindu.

"It's good to show how bridge can bring together people from such different backgrounds," he added. "It just shows a special magic about the game of bridge."

► A multi-national team won again in 1989. Zia was again on the team which included Sam Lev, Israel; Michael Rosenberg, U.S. but formerly of Scotland; Chris Compton, U.S., and Mark Molson, Canada.

► The record margin of victory in the Reisinger -- 10 full boards -- was set in 1966 by Kaplan, Kay, Robert Jordan and Arthur Robinson.

► A handful of ACBL presidents and members of the Board of Directors have won the Reisinger: Charles Solomon, Jeff Glick, Waldemar von Zedtwitz, Bobby Wolff, Lew Mathe, Peter Leventritt, John Gerber, Ira Corn, Don Oakie and Edgar Kaplan.

Betty Richard, who were in charge of volunteers; Judy Lowe, Intermediate/Novice chairperson; Ron Zucker, who handled the registration desk; Barbara Prior, partnerships, and Jackie Cornfoot, who did the restaurant guide and has worked to provide information and set up tours.

"They have really knocked themselves crazy," McIntosh said. "For example, our I/N games are running at 10% of total attendance. Judy has done an outstanding job."

McIntosh also credited the bridge players of District 21 for supporting the NABC. "At these tournaments, 60% of the attendance usually comes from the area. We've been promoting the tournament to the players of the district for a year and a half, and that has paid off."

McIntosh said he is proud of the work done by committee members and volunteers -- some of whom have come to help out even when they weren't scheduled to.

All the plans, he said, were made with the players in mind. For example, he said, the committee decided not to spend large sums of money on after-game entertainment because it didn't make sense in a town like San Francisco, where "there's too much going on."

Instead, organizers decided to try to give something away each session. Giveaways have included bananas, raisins, raisin crunch and cookies. Only one session so far has been missed.

"We've found that bridge players love to eat," McIntosh said. "Give them some food and they'll be happy." Tonight's post-game snack, he said, will be baked potatoes. On Saturday night, the snack will be hot dogs.

McIntosh, an independent sales representative, lives in Gilroy, renowned as the garlic capital of the world. One of the Friday giveaways, he said, will be garlic.

The NABC chairman said he has also been pleased with the staff of the Marriott, "who have been outstanding to work with."

Looking forward to the final three days, McIntosh said the tournament needs to average only about 500 tables a session to break the 1990 record. "With a nice weekend we could be close to 14,000 tables."

McIntosh said the work of the 17 units within District 21, combined with the enthusiasm of the players, made for a winning combination. "We have good attendance at the regionals in this district," he said. "We anticipated that the players would be here and they haven't let us down." □

ing, and he believes the future of the game is bright as long as the leadership maintains what he considers the proper focus.

"I've been preaching for 10 years that we have misplaced our emphasis on the expert game at the expense of the recreational players," Schoder said. "The recreational players are the meat and potatoes of this organization, and we need to find a way to satisfy both sides."

Schoder predicts that China will emerge as a dominant power in bridge in the near future. In Rhodes, he observed, there were teams from the Far East in the open and women's finals of the World Team Olympiad -- China in the women's and Indonesia in the open.

Other countries, he said, are ahead of the U.S. in cash-prize tournaments, which serve the dual purpose of helping to promote the game and creating a place for top experts to play.

Looking over the crop of newer tournament directors, Schoder said he is impressed with what he's seen. "We've made giant steps in upgrading the quality of directors. The new ones are much more dedicated and are equipped with the knowledge and abilities they need. I'm proud of a bunch of them."

Schoder, who will turn 65 in January, said he will direct about 100 sessions next year, mostly in Florida.

When he's not traveling, however, he and Bud will be playing bridge and a lot of golf. "Bud has become a golf nut," he said. He will also make good use of his 23-foot fishing boat, *Director!*

Retirement, he noted, doesn't mean inactivity. Said Schoder: "I'll be a young 65." □

The Facts: 3♠ doubled by North went down two, plus 500 for E/W. There was nothing marked about responses to weak two-bids on the East convention card. West had marked that 2NT was a conventional response to a weak two-bid. The Director ruled that the failure to Alert the 3♦ bid suggested that 2NT might be natural or might not be a forcing response to the weak two-bid. The Director ruled that the table result would stand.

The Appeal: N/S appealed the Director's ruling.

The Committee Decision: The Committee assessed a one-quarter board procedural penalty against E/W for inadequate disclosure and failing to have two identical convention cards. The Committee allowed the table result (3♠ doubled down two, plus 500 for E/W) to stand. The N/S deposit was returned.

The Facts: 4♠ by West made four, plus 620 for E/W. 2♠ was explained by East as showing spades and clubs. The explanation was corrected by West prior to the opening lead (note (5) above). The Director was called and ruled that East's explanation had provided unauthorized information to West, and that passing 3♣ was a logical alternative to bidding 3♠. The Director changed the contract to 3♣ by East down two, plus 200 for N/S.

The Appeal: Due to the lateness of the hour, West was the only player to appear before the Committee. The facts were not in dispute. E/W alleged that 3♠ was the normal action for West over 3♣, with or without the misexplanation.

The Committee Decision: The Committee decided that there was unauthorized information available to West after the explanation of the 2♠ bid. The Committee decided that although the 3♠ bid was not an egregious action, a significant number of West's peers (15%-25%) would seriously consider passing. Therefore, pass was a logical alternative and pursuant to Law 12C2, the Committee changed the contract to 3♣ by East down two, plus 200 for N/S and assigned this result to both pairs.

The Facts: 6♠ by North made seven, plus 1010 for N/S. There was a break in tempo before the 5♠ call, as South agreed in response to a question by East before bidding 6♠. Pursuant to Law 16, the Director ruled that pass was a logical alternative to 6♠ and changed the contract to 5♠ made seven, plus 510 for N/S.

The Appeal: N/S appealed on the grounds that 5♦ was an attempt to elicit a 6♦ cuebid from North after which South intended to bid a grand slam. South estimated the break in tempo to be two seconds, North called it a "slight hitch", and West (the only member of her partnership present) declined to estimate the length of the break in tempo other than to note it qualified as a break in tempo. Asked why he chose 5♦ instead of 4NT (Blackwood), South said, "I made a bad bid." The Committee discovered that North had about 1400 masterpoints and South had about 2200 masterpoints.

The Committee Decision: The Committee ruled that having created a trap for his partner by bidding 5♦, South was caught in it after the break in tempo. Noting that it could construct several hands in which the small slam would hinge on a trump finesse that was odds on to lose, the Committee ruled that North's break in tempo had converted a 70% decision into a

99.99% decision. The Committee decided that passing 5♠ was an option that a significant number of South's peers would consider, and changed the contract to 5♠ made seven, plus 510 for N/S. The Committee returned the deposit. They did not doubt that South intended to bid at least a small slam at the point he bid 5♦; however, they found that assertion irrelevant.

The Facts: 3 NT by North made three, plus 600 for N/S. South intended 2NT as natural; North thought it was a puppet to 3♣. The Director ruled that South had unauthorized information and that passing 3♣ was a logical alternative. The Director changed the contract to 3♣ by North down two, plus 200 for E/W.

The Appeal: N/S appealed the Director's ruling, contending that South had little choice but to bid 3NT over 3♣ since at BAM scoring, 3♣ was unlikely to be to play on this auction, even if North had not Alerted 2NT. South stated that he realized at the point his partner Alerted that it was likely his 2NT bid had been construed as Lebensohl. North stated that reasonable defense would have defeated 3NT, suggesting that the damage to E/W was self-inflicted. South stated that he had intended 2NT as natural and that N/S had played together only three times previously and not at all in the past 15 months.

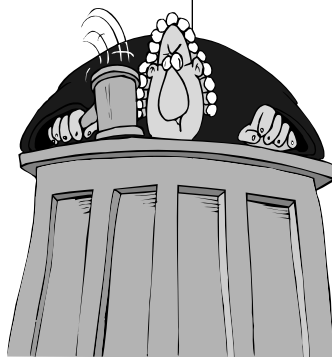
The Committee Decision: The Committee agreed with the Director that a 3♣ bid with no Alert from North would have expressed an interest in playing a club partscore rather than a notrump game. Thus, North had chosen from among logical alternatives (passing and bidding on) the one that could reasonably have been suggested by the unauthorized information (the Alert). Pursuant to Law 12C2, the Committee canceled South's 3NT bid and assigned to N/S the score for 3♣ by North down two, plus 200 for E/W (the most unfavorable result that was at all probable). The Committee rejected the notion that E/W had made an egregious error in defense, which

would have deprived them of the right to redress due to their own fault. 3NT cannot be beaten after the lead of the ♣K, a reasonable lead that was made at this and lots of other tables.

Again, pursuant to Law 12C2, E/W were assigned the same score (3♣ by North down two, plus 200 for E/W), the most favorable result at all likely had the infraction not occurred,
