## Patron Member, Cohen enjoy brief partnership

In their discussions just before game time Thursday, Patron Member Roberto Verthelyi and Larry Cohen found out they had a few things in common. They are nearly the same age, they both have New York connections and they nearly went to the same college.

Oh, and one other thing: they both love bridge.

Verthelyi is the Patron Member who was picked to play with Cohen in the Educational Foundation Stratified Open Pairs on the opening night of the Summer NABC.

The two finished with a 56% game, good enough to place in the section. The main thing, however, was that they had fun.

"I enjoyed the evening," said Verthelyi, a portfolio manager for a hedge fund in New York City. Unfortunately, Verthelyi said, "the opponents stayed out of trouble."

Still, Verthelyi added, Cohen was an ideal partner. "He was very nice and calm. It was a pleasure to play with him."

Verthelyi, a native of Argentina, arrived in the U.S. to finish school. He earned a bachelor's degree from State University of New York-Binghamton and an MBA from the University of Chicago. He became a naturalized U.S. citizen about a year ago.

He took up bridge more than a decade ago and is a Silver Life Master.

Nowadays, Verthelyi plays bridge about once a week and attends tournaments in New York and the Mid-Atlantic. He has even taught bridge at two senior centers.

Verthelyi's goal in bridge? "To keep improving until you ask me to donate my time to play with a Patron Member."

## Berkowitz, Cohen top qualifiers in LM Pairs

Two-time Life Master Pairs champions David Berkowitz and Larry Cohen took the lead after two qualifying sessions. The longtime partners are seeking their third LM Pairs title. They won in 1987 and 1996.

The leaders were about three-quarters of a board (38 top) ahead of Gary Cohler and Ralph Katz of the Chicago area. They in turn were only two matchpoints ahead of two Canadians, Paul Thurston of St. Catharines ON and Rick Delogu of Waterloo ON.

In fourth place, just a fraction of a matchpoint behind, were Swedes Peter Stromberg and Fredrik Nystrom. They were followed by Daniel Boye of Syracuse NY and Frederic Neuburger of Liverpool NY.

## Women lead finalists in GNT Open clash

Two teams captained by women will battle it out for victory in the Grand National Teams Championship Flight in an all-California final today. Jill Meyers (District 23) will oppose Rose Meltzer with Iftikhar Baqai, Mitch Dunitz, John Mohan and Ed Davis. Meltzer (District 21) will counter with Peter Weichsel, Hugh Ross, Lew Stansby, Chip Martel and Kyle Larsen.

The Ethan Stein team from District 3 kept it close in the first half against Meyers, but the Californians pulled away to win, 191-136. Lou Ann O'Rourke (District 17) never was close against Meltzer, succumbing 155-90.

The Flight A final will pit District 6 (Maryland-Virginia), captained by Lyle Poe, against District 20 (Oregon), captained by Merlin Vilhauer.

It's Michigan against California in the Flight B final. District 12 is captained by Michael Alioto, while Gary Moore will lead the District 23 squad.

An East-West battle will settle the Flight C championship. District 6 (Maryland-Virginia), captained by Kefu Xu, will take on District 20 (California), led by Rohan Coehlo.

## Robson comeback from serious injuries surprises doctors

Five months ago, Andrew Robson's world turned upside down – literally. Out for a morning walk in the hills of the Lake District in northern England, Robson slipped on some black ice and "went careering," falling 70 feet over rocky terrain.

The injuries, too numerous to mention but involving many broken bones, landed the young bridge expert in the hospital for two months. He faced such a long rehabilitation process that no one – except Robson – believed he would be playing bridge any time soon.

"By staying upbeat and optimistic," Robson says, "I've beaten all the surgeons' projections. I'm doing way better than anybody thought."

It didn't look good at first. After Robson's fall, it was three hours before he was rescued and taken by helicopter to the hospital. He is still on crutches, but he's getting around pretty well for a person who has pins in many of his bones.

While he was laid up in the hospital, Robson studied double-dummy bridge problems from a book given to him by a friend. "They were pretty difficult, so that kept me busy," he says.

While recuperating, Robson received support from dozens of bridge friends from around the world, including Rita Shugart, a regular partner with whom Robson has had considerable success in North American tournaments. "We've talked just about every day," says Shugart, beaming with enthusiasm to have Robson back in circulation. "I'm delighted he's here. I'm so excited."

Shugart and Robson played together for the first time at the 1992 Summer NABC in Toronto, and it was the start of a long-running partnership interrupted only by the accident.

Regarding the Toronto tournament, Robson points to his head and says, "This is where I get to find out whether (the accident) damaged this part of the body."

## Players bear responsibility for defenses to Mid-Chart methods

We have a short message for players who wish to play certain Mid-Chart methods: *there are no more yellow books*.

What does this mean? In case you don't know about the yellow book, it was the publication that contained the defenses to Mid-Chart methods such as the Multi 2♦. Players could pick up yellow books and carry them around for the benefit of their opponents.

Repeat: *there are no more yellow books*.

Instead, a player who wishes to use certain Mid-Chart methods must go to the ACBL web site on the Internet ([www.acbl.org](http://www.acbl.org)) and check the Mid-Chart section under "Conventions" to determine if the method is permitted. If it is, the player is obliged to print out the defense to the method and take it with him to the table.

**Players who do not do this will not be permitted to play Mid-Chart methods that are covered by this regulation.** Mid-Chart methods marked with an asterisk do not require written defenses.

At this tournament, there is a limited supply of printouts from the ACBL web site, but it is the responsibility of the players to determine whether their methods require these procedures and to take appropriate action when required.

## ACBL Hall of Fame through the years

The original Hall of Fame was started by *The Bridge World* in 1964. The original members were Ely Culbertson, Charles Goren, Harold Vanderbilt, Oswald Jacoby, Milton Work, Sidney Lenz, Waldemar von Zedtwitz, Howard Schenken and Sidney Silodor. When *The Bridge World* discontinued its work on the Hall, no members were added until the ACBL inducted the original nine into the new re-established Hall in 1995, then added eight more. The new members were Edgar Kaplan, Al Roth, Bobby Wolff, B. Jay Becker, Easley Blackwood, Barry Crane, John Crawford and Helen Sobel Smith. Additional members were added each year thereafter as follows:

1996 – Eddie Kantar, Norman Kay, Alfred Sheinwold, Josephine Culbertson, Victor Mitchell, Sam Stayman, David Bruce (von Zedtwitz Award) and Lee Hazen (Blackwood Award).

1997 – Edith Freilich, George Rapee, Bill Root, Dick Frey, Jim Jacoby, Lew Mathe, P. Hal Sims (von Zedtwitz Award) and Albert Morehead (Blackwood Award).

1998 – Bill Eisenberg, Mary Jane Farrell, Dorothy Truscott, John Gerber, Sonny Moyses, Peter Pender, Alvin Landy (von Zedtwitz Award) and Dave Treadwell (Blackwood Award).

1999 – Bobby Goldman, Bob Hamman, Theodore Lightner, Al Sobel, Margaret Wagar, Michael Gottlieb (von Zedtwitz Award) and Kathie Wei-Sender (Blackwood Award).

2000 – Sidney Lazard, Ira Rubin, Lou Bluhm, Harry Fishbein, Charles Solomon, Meyer Schliefer (von Zedtwitz Award) and George Rosenkranz (Blackwood Award).

2001 -- Richard Freeman, Lew Stansby; Peter Leventritt, Bobby Nail, Sally Young, Sami Kehela and Eric Murray (each received von Zedtwitz Award), Alan Truscott (Blackwood Award). This group was inducted at Thursday evening's Hall of Fame dinner here.

The von Zedtwitz Award is given to a deceased player who made outstanding contributions to bridge either as a player or in some area outside of playing expertise. The Blackwood Award is given to a player, living or deceased, who has made major contributions to bridge outside the area of bridge expertise. Portraits of all members are housed in a gallery at ACBL Headquarters in Memphis, Tennessee.

## Smoking policy

Toronto lawmakers passed a very strict smoking ordinance in early June, prohibiting smoking in any public building.

Players in the Metro Toronto Convention Centre must go to the street level to smoke. The directing staff is allowing a little extra time during breaks for those who take the hike.

### Nickell shows the way

Nick Nickell and Richard Freeman may occasionally be seen by outsiders as the "third pair" in the all-conquering Nickell team, but then who wouldn't find themselves playing third fiddle to Meckstroth-Rodwell and Hamman-Soloway?

On this deal from the first session of the Life Masters Pairs qualifying round, Nickell demonstrated that he is no mean handler of a dummy himself.

North kicked off with a low club and Nickell put in dummy's 10, which won. A heart to the king held, and now Nickell turned to diamonds. He played ace and another and was gratified when the queen appeared. He cashed dummy's winners in the suit, shedding hearts. When he then led a spade from dummy, South put in the king and Nickell took the ace. These cards now remained:

Reading the position accurately, Nickell next cashed the ace of clubs. What could South do? He pitched his low spade, but Nickell hadn't come this far to misread the ending. He exited with the ♠J. All South could do was to cash the ♥A. Plus 660 was worth 37.5 of 38 matchpoints.

# Canadian renaissance began at Toronto '64

Toronto 1964 was the site of the 36<sup>th</sup> annual Summer North American Bridge Championships – and the first major ACBL tournament staged outside of the United States.

“The bridge-population explosion set records in almost every championship event and came within a thousand tables of the record we thought would be unapproachable,” *Bridge Bulletin* editor Dick Frey reported.

ACBL President Leo Seewald wrote in the *Daily Bulletin*: “It is difficult to find new words to describe the achievement of our hosts at this 36<sup>th</sup> Summer Nationals, except to say that ‘Canadian Hospitality’ must now take its place as one of the superlatives to describe not merely the finest of entertainment but the warmth of those who dispense it. I am sure I speak for all who have come to Toronto, as well as for my wife and myself, when I say we have had a marvelous time.”

“A marvelous time” was also had by the all-Canadian team of Eric Murray, Sami Kehela, Bruce Elliott and Percy “Shorty” Sheardown who won the Spingold – the first (but not last) time an ACBL national team title was taken outside the U.S.

The Spingold, in those days a double-elimination contest, drew 108 squads. The Murray team breezed through their rounds as did the squad captained by Johnny Crawford (George Rapee, Bobby Jordan, Arthur Robinson, Norman Kay and Edgar Kaplan). The two teams, both undefeated, met in the eighth round and Murray crunched out a 7-point win.

Their reward: a ninth-round bye, followed by entry to the semifinals as the only undefeated team. Defeat for Murray in the semifinal would mean a three-team round-robin final with the two semifinal winners. Victory in the semifinal would mean a final where Murray could win in one session but could not be ousted in less than two. Murray won its semifinal match, as did the team captained by Bruce Gowdy (Fred Hoffer, Marvin Altman and Ray Jotcham), to set up an all-Canadian final.

“The fratricidal final fracas was a relatively gentle affair which Murray never seemed likely to lose,” reported Frey. “He strolled quietly home by 36.”

Murray & Co. successfully defended their Spingold title the following year in Chicago. With the win, Murray became the first team ever to repeat with the same four players.

The format for the 1965 competition had changed -- no more double elimination. Instead, the 128-team field was split into 16-team sections, each playing a round-robin of six-board matches at the rate of 30 deals per evening. After three sessions, the top four teams from each section qualified for two-session, sudden-death knockout matches.

Murray, never in trouble in the early rounds, won its quarterfinal match with ease but struggled a bit against Howard Schenken (Peter Leventritt, Lew Mathe, Alfred Sheinwold, Bob Hamman and Albert Weiss). Murray carved out a narrow 5-IMP advantage after the first quarter but by halftime Schenken had shaved this to a thin 1 IMP. In the third quarter, however, disaster struck the Schenken forces as the Murray team, playing steadily and well, jumped ahead by 57. The final quarter was wild but Murray held all but 7 of his margin and won by 50.

In the final, Murray romped off to a 37-12 lead over Edgar Kaplan (B. Jay Becker, Dorothy Truscott and Norman Kay) in the first quarter and added another 37 IMPs before the half ended. Both teams fought on nearly level terms in the third set and Kaplan could retrieve only 3 IMPs.

“When the last card was played shortly before 3 a.m., no one in either room had any doubt about the

outcome,” reported the *Bridge Bulletin*. “Murray had successfully defended the Spingold, winning by 91 IMPs.”

Sheardown and Elliott sailed into the grand slam while their opponents at the other table failed to reach six. One heart ruff was all that was needed to make 13 tricks a laydown.

Murray and Kehela bid their share of slams too. In the semifinal played against the Schenken team, West found the only lead that would present Murray with his optimistic slam contract: the ♥2. Murray won East's ♥10 with his ace and immediately ran the ♥8. When this lost to the king and a third heart went to dummy's queen, Murray was home. He cashed one high club in dummy, followed by two high spades and a spade ruff.

Now he cashed the ♦A and ruffed a diamond, ruffed a spade and cashed another high trump. He ruffed a diamond, drew the last trump and claimed his slam.

\*\*\*

So who were these guys, this Canadian foursome who captured a top team trophy two years running?

Sheardown (1911-1993), a bridge club owner and manager, became Canada's first Life Master in 1948. Teacher and mentor of many of Canada's leading players, he was widely known as Canada's greatest player of the Thirties, Forties and Fifties.

He began his bridge career while a student at the University of Toronto in 1933 and was a consistent winner before the inauguration of tournaments and masterpoint ratings. He served overseas with the Canadian Army during World War II from 1939 to 1945.

Sheardown represented Canada in the World Team Olympiads of 1960 and 1968 and won the Canadian National Open Teams more than a dozen times. In addition to the two Spingold wins, he won the Chicago Board-a-Match Teams (now the Reisinger) in 1936 and 1951. He won the Sally Fishbein Trophy for the best performance by an ACBL member at the Toronto NABC in 1964. In addition to the Spingold, Sheardown and Elliott finished second in the Life Master Pairs.

Elliott was also Sheardown's partner in the two World Team Olympiads. Now retired, Elliott lives in Weston ON and still draws a gallery at his frequent rubber bridge games.

Kehela and Murray were inducted into the Bridge Hall of Fame just before the start of this NABC. Kehela, born in Baghdad, is a semi-retired bridge journalist and teacher who enjoys wine and films. He is the former editor of the Ontario *Kibitzer*, bridge columnist for *Toronto*

*Life*, contributor to ACBL *Bridge Bulletin* and contributing editor to the *Official Encyclopedia of Bridge*.

His record in national and international competition is well known. Kehela and Murray are the only pair in the world to represent their country in the World Team Olympiad since its inception in 1960 thru 1988 (missing only 1984). Their partnership lasted for more than 30 years.

Murray, barrister and solicitor, also has an impressive record in national and international competition. In addition to winning the Spingold in 1964, Murray was also the organizing chairman for the Summer NABC. He was a District 2 director on the ACBL Board of Directors.

The North American team for the 1966 World Bridge Championship was Ira Rubin-Phil Feldsman, Bob Hamman-Lew Mathe and Eric Murray-Sami Kehela (that's the way he spelled Sami back in those days). *The Bridge Bulletin* introduced the team in a three-part series.

Murray wrote “The Sammy Kehela Story” while Kehela penned “The Eric Murray Story.” *Bulletin* editor Richard Frey added this note: “Just to reassure literal-minded readers, the Murray-Kehela style of humor and cigars is used with equal devastation on their opponents.”

Here are a few excerpts:

“Sammy Kehela began his battle with the world in Bagdad in 1935,” wrote Murray. “India was blessed from 1941 until 1951 when California was selected, that state yielding to Jamaica and England in 1955 and subsequently Canada in 1957.

“It is noteworthy that Kehela has never stayed in one country for more than 10 years and Canada may well have additional cause for celebrating its centennial in 1967.

“A dearth of talent permitted Kehela to play for Canada in the 1960 Team Olympiad in Turin, Italy — we lost.

“An inability to understand Kehela's bidding persuaded ACBL authorities that he was an authority on peculiar and complicated systems and he was accordingly appointed coach of the 1963 North American Team for the Bermuda Bowl in Italy — they lost.

“Kehela's indifferent success as coach and player turned him to the pen, but his contributions to the *Bulletin* have not noticeably improved the standard of that publication.”

Kehela countered with:

Murray “discovered bridge in his second year as a freshman when he happened upon four people seated at a table holding cards and screaming at each other at the top of their lungs. Eric Murray was — and is — the possessor of a stout pair of lungs and he was soon the outstanding player in his circle.

“As such he came to the attention of one Harry Bork, a patient man and the leading player in Hamilton, who attempted, without any success whatsoever, to teach Eric some of the finer points of the game. (He did, however, cultivate in him a taste for cheap cigars).

“Murray's early stay in Toronto marked a period of unprecedented prosperity for that city's rubber-bridge players. Penniless and desperate, our hero threw himself at the feet of Douglas Drury. Drury consented to make a disciple of the callow youth and I can pay him no greater tribute than to point out that he and Murray won the National Men's Pair Championship in 1954 and 1955.

“When the burden of carrying Murray alone eventually proved too great, Drury craftily conscripted Percy Sheardown and Bruce Elliott to help. As a team they developed a formidable reputation and, beginning to believe that he was not such a dreadful player after all, Murray demanded that he be permitted to bid notrump once in a while. This was too much for Drury, who fled to San Francisco.”

The Murray-Kehela partnership was formed in 1959 and Kehela added, “Though we have won our share of national titles (including the Spingold Cup in 1964 and 1965), my proudest moment came when I let Eric out on his own for the first time in 1961 and he justified my confidence by winning the Vanderbilt Cup in partnership with Charles Coon and a pick-up pair from Philadelphia (Bobby Jordan-Artie Robinson), and then going on to represent North America in the 1962 Bermuda Bowl.”

# Glossary of bridge terms

New members of ACBL are often confused by the array of terms they hear: knockout teams, red points, rookie. Here's a list of terms and their meanings:

**Knockout Teams:** an event in which a team (of four, five or six players -- with four playing at a time) plays another team. The losers are eliminated or "knocked out" while the winners play other winners until only one winning team remains.

The length of a KO match may vary from a single session to a full day (the Vanderbilt and Spingold) to a multi-day event (the Bermuda Bowl).

**Bracketed Knockout Teams:** a KO event in which teams are divided into groups -- usually of 8, 16 or 32 teams -- based on their masterpoint holdings. The top group -- Bracket I -- and all other groups compete in a separate event with their own set of winners.

**Compact Knockout Teams:** a shorter version of Bracketed KO teams.

**Swiss Teams:** an event in which a team (of four, five or six players -- with four playing at a time) plays other teams in seven-, eight- or nine-board matches. Team A sits North-South at Table 1 and East-West at Table 2 while Team B sits East-West at Table 1 and North-South at Table 2. The results are compared and scored by International Match Points (IMPs).

Pairings for the first round are random. Pairings for succeeding rounds are determined by a team's win-loss record or Victory Point total.

**International Match Points (IMPs):** the most common method of scoring Swiss Team and Knockout matches. If Team A scores plus 620 for bidding and making 4♠ on Board 4 and Team B scores only plus 170 (they didn't bid the game), the difference is 450 -- which converts to 10 IMPs. The IMP chart is shown on the inside of your convention card.

**Victory Points (VPs):** a method of scoring Swiss Team matches. After the scores are compared and converted to IMPs, the IMP total is converted to Victory Points. A team's VP total may be used to determine its next opponents and its final standing.

**Side Game Series:** single-session pair games that pay red points. The Morning Side Game Series, for example, is being played at 9:00 a.m. the first Friday, Saturday and Sunday here. Pairs may play in one, two or three sessions. Only pairs who play in at least two sessions are eligible for overall gold points.

**Flighted pairs:** When flighting is used, the field is divided by expertise or experience or both into several separate games. Flight A -- "unlimited masterpoints" -- will be open to all players while the remaining flights will be limited. Flight B might be 0-

500 MPs or 0-1000 MPs while Flight C might be 0-300 or 0-500.

Each flight is scored individually, and masterpoint awards are made for each flight.

The masterpoint holdings of the players determine their flight. If one player is quite expert while his partner is new to the game, the pair must compete in Flight A.

In flighted events, you may play up but not down. That means you may play in Flight A or Flight B even if your masterpoint holding qualifies you for Flight C. Conversely, you may not play in Flight B or Flight C if you are a Flight A player.

**Stratified Pairs:** The idea is to compete against everyone but to be ranked only with your peers.

Each pair is assigned a stratum or "strat" based on the masterpoint holding of the partner with more masterpoints.

Example: A = 1000+ masterpoints; B = 300-1000 MPs; C = 0-300 MPs.

Thus, the most experienced players are placed in Strat A, intermediate players in Strat B and less experienced players in Strat C. Masterpoints are awarded for placings in all strats but gold points are awarded only in A and B.

The game proceeds normally -- the difference comes when the scores are tabulated and ranked.

In a three-strat game, the scores are ranked three times. The first ranking is done as in a regular open game. These are the Strat A results.

If a B or C pair does well in this ranking, they receive full credit for that performance. It is not at all uncommon for a Strat C pair to place first overall, and they receive the full masterpoint award for that game.

*Note:* A pair is eligible for only one set of

masterpoint awards and automatically receives the highest award.

The second ranking compares the scores of only the B and C pairs -- the scores of the Strat A pairs are eliminated. Once again, if a C pair does well, they receive points for their finishing position in the Strat B results.

The third and final ranking compares the scores of only the C pairs -- all the scores of the Strat A and B pairs are eliminated.

**Strati-flighted Pairs:** The top group plays in a game of their own -- Flight A. The rest of the field is divided into strats and plays as in a regular stratified pairs.

A recent innovation has been stratifying within Flight A. Flight A-1 may be listed as 3000+ MPs while Flight A-2 (or Flight X) may be listed as 0-3000 MPs.
